BATTLE OF COMM. AVE

• Boston University opens its December schedule at Agganis in the opener of a home-and-home series against archrival Boston College.

• The Terriers and Eagles, who are tied atop the Hockey East standings with 14 points apiece, are facing off in the first of four scheduled meetings this season.

• BU is 10-1-4 in its last 15 home contests.



having faced the Terriers 206 times since the 1930-31 season.

• BU began playing hockey during the 1917-18 season and played its lone game that year against BC.

• The two teams have played 38 overtime games in the all-time series, and BC holds a 12-9-17 edge. The Eagles have recorded eight of the 15 shutouts in the 250-game history.

JACK AND JERRY

To add even more to this rivalry, the opposing bench bosses are the top two active coaches in career victories, as BU's Jack Parker has 839 victories, second only to BC's Jerry York at 859. Both coach at their respective alma mater and the two faced off on the ice from 1965-67.

SCOUTING THE EAGLES

• Boston College is coming off an impressive 6-0 shutout home victory against Vermont on Sunday to rebound from a 5-3 loss at Merrimack on Friday.

• After winning its first three games, including a two-game sweep at Denver, the Eagles proceeded to go 3-4-0 over their next seven contests. BC got back on track with an impressive 4-0, 4-1 weekend series sweep of Maine on Nov. 19-21.

• BC ranks second in the nation in both scoring defense (1.93) - just behind Union at 1.92 - and penalty kill, which has a 90.6-percent success rate.

• Junior Cam Atkinson leads all Hockey East

SO FAR, SO GOOD

• BU was the lone unbeaten team left in the country before falling at New Hampshire on Nov. 19.

• The Terriers went undefeated in their first 10 games (6-0-4) for their best start in 33 seasons, as the 1977-78 national title team remarkably won its first 21 games.

• BU reached the six-win mark on Oct. 30, 10 weeks earlier than it did last season (Jan. 8).

SERIES HISTORY

• The Comm. Ave. rivals have met 250 times and the Terriers lead the series, 125-108-17 (.534).

• The teams are an even 5-5-2 in their last 12 meetings, but BU has won five of the last seven.

• BC has fared well at Agganis Arena, as the Terriers are just 2-5-1 against the Eagles at Jack Parker Rink.

• No other opponent has appeared on BU's schedule more often. Northeastern is the next closest,

players in goals with 11 and has added six assists to tie senior Brian Gibbons (6g, 11a) for the team lead in points with 17. Junior Paul Carey (5g, 7a) and senior Joe Whitney (1g, 11a) have added 12 points apiece.

- Senior John Muse has arguably been the best goaltender in the nation thus far this season and currently ranks third in the country in both goals-against average (1.57) and save percentage (.950).
- Jerry York is in his 17th season at the helm of the BC program and has a record of 392-209-58 (.639) at the school.

BEST VS. THE EAGLES

- Juniors David Warsofsky (3g, 4a) and Chris Connolly (1g, 5a) have posted seven and six points, respectively, in eight career games against Boston College.
- Sophomore Wade Megan scored a goal in two of his three games versus the Eagles last year as a rookie.
- Junior goaltender Kieran Millan is 5-2-1 against BC with a 2.48 goals-against average and a .909 save percentage.

LAST SEASON VS. THE EAGLES

- The archrivals split their four meetings last season as BU won the Hockey East series, two games to one, and the Eagles pulled off a 4-3 victory in the Beanpot championship game.
- In front of the largest crowd to ever watch a college hockey game in the eastern United States, the Terriers topped the Eagles, 3-2, at Fenway Park on Jan. 8.
- Each team won in the other's rink, as the

Eagles earned a 4-1 win at Agganis on Dec. 5 and the Terriers pulled off a 5-4 overtime triumph at Conte Forum on Jan. 22.

LAST TIME OUT

- Sophomore Wade Megan scored the game-tying goal with 7:19 left in regulation as Boston University tied upstart Brown, 4-4, at Agganis Arena on Saturday night.
- Brown jumped out to a 2-0 lead with two goals within the first 3:01 of the opening frame. The Terriers then tallied three straight markers during the first and second periods as they skated to a 3-2 advantage. The Bears answered with a pair of goals in the second and third frames to take a 4-3 lead before BU responded with Megan's late equalizer.
- Four different Terriers found the back of the net, including sophomore Ben Rosen, who collected his first collegiate goal. Senior Joe Pereira and sophomore Alex Chiasson each tallied their fifth marker of the season and freshman Garrett Noonan and junior David Warsofsky both earned a pair of assists.
- Junior goaltender Kieran Millan made 19 saves, and Brown netminder Michael Clemente turned aside 38 shots.
- The Terriers were 1-for-7 on the power play, while Brown went 1-for-2. BU outshot the Bears by a 42-23 margin, setting a season high for shots in the process.

NO SOPHOMORE SLUMP FOR CHIASSON

Alex Chiasson has tallied 13 points (5g, 8a) in 11 games this season and leads the team in points per game (1.18).

GILL EARNING HIGH RANKS

- Freshman Sahir Gill ranks tied for first in the country in plus/minus with a +12 rating and has been a +1 in each of the last six contests.
- Gill enters December on a five-game point streak.

POWER-PLAY STRUGGLES

BU's power play is just 4-of-58 (.069) since opening the year with a 3-for-5 performance against Wisconsin.

LEAGUE PLAY

In the 2010 calendar year, the Terriers are 16-6-4 in Hockey East play. They had the best league record after the holiday break last season at 11-5-0.

FIT TO BE TIED

- BU has skated to five ties in its first 13 games. The program record for ties in a season is nine, set in both the 2003-04 and 2006-06 campaigns.
- The Terriers have now had a stretch of three straight ties in three of the last five seasons (2006-07, 2008-09, 2010-11) after never doing so in their first 84 seasons.

BU BACKSTOP

- Kieran Millan ranks 14th in the nation in save percentage at .925 despite allowing a combined 12 goals in his past three starts.
- Millan is one win shy of 50 for his career and has only needed 76 starts to earn his 49 victories between the pipes.

EXTRA SPECIAL

- BU is 6-1-12 in its last 19 overtime games and hasn't lost a regular-season game in extra time since a 2-1 setback against Harvard on Nov. 20, 2007.
- BU has not lost a conference game in overtime since Feb. 21, 2003, at Providence.

PENALTY KILL STEPS UP

- The Terriers have been successful on 58 of their last 64 penalty-kill situations, including a stretch of 32 straight that came to an end on Nov. 13. Merrimack went 0-for-10 on the power play on Nov. 12 and two other opponents (Notre Dame, Providence) went 0-for-7.
- BU's penalty-kill unit currently ranks ninth in the nation, operating at an 88.1-percent success rate (59-of-67).

COMEBACK KIDS

- The Terriers already have five come-from-behind victories this season after only having five all of last season.
- BU is 4-0-1 in the five games this season in which it has allowed the first goal.

BLUE-CHIP BLUELINER

Junior David Warsofsky is one of only seven Division I defensemen averaging at least one point per game.

AN OCTOBER TO REMEMBER

This was the first time a Terrier squad entered November with six wins, as the previous best was four in 2008-09.

CRUNCH TIME

Since February of 2008, the Terriers are 20-5-5 in games in which they are tied after two periods.

YOUNG SQUAD

- The Terriers are one of the youngest teams in the country, as their average age is 20.3 years and underclassmen take up 17 of the 26 spots on the roster.
- Eight players made their collegiate debut at the season-opening Ice Breaker tournament and the opening-night roster against Wisconsin featured six freshmen and seven sophomores.

SCORING BY CLASS

The juniors hold a narrow 38-36 lead over the freshmen in the race for scoring by class.

Thirty-five of the Terriers' last 54 games have been either been decided by a single goal or resulted in a tie and BU is 19-8-8 in those contests.

MIDDLE-PERIOD BONANZA

Nearly half (19) of the Terriers' 40 goals this season have been scored in the second period.

A DIFFERENT TEAM

Last year, BU went 2-9-2 in games in which it trailed after one period. The Terriers are 3-1-2 in that situation this year.

MATCH GAME

After scoring five goals all of last season, senior co-captain Joe Pereira has already matched that total.

QUICK HITS

- Boston University has advanced to the Hockey East semifinals in each of the last nine seasons - a league record.
- Terrier defensemen have garnered a combined seven All-America accolades in the last five years and at least one BU blueliner has been represented on the Hockey East All-Star First Team in each of the last six seasons.
- BU has not missed the NCAA tournament in consecutive seasons since not qualifying for three straight years from 1987-89.
- Junior co-captain Chris Connolly is the Terriers' top returning scorer (10-21--36).
- Redshirt sophomore Ross Gaudet scored 10 goals last season on just 40 shots and all 10 tallies came in conference play.
- BU had the best Hockey East record of any team after the semester break last season, posting an 11-5 record in the second half.
- BU tied for the nation lead in shorthanded goals last season with 10 and then-sophomore David Warsofsky recorded four of them to also share the nation lead.

GILL HONORED FOR STRONG OCTOBER

- After making an immediate impact on the BU lineup, Sahir Gill was named Hockey East Rookie of the Month for October.
- Gill registered eight points (3g, 5a) and a plus-7 rating in the month. In just his second collegiate game, Gill tallied a goal and three assists to lead BU to a 5-4 victory over Notre Dame in the championship game of the Ice Breaker Tournament.
- David Warsofsky was a runner-up for Player of the Month and Kieran Millan was a runner-up for Goaltender of the Month.

CONNOLLY NAMED PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Chris Connolly was named the Hockey East Player of the Week on Nov. 1 after leading BU to a weekend sweep of UMass Lowell.
- Connolly scored the game-winning goal in each of the Terriers' wins over the River Hawks, including a thrilling tally on Saturday at Agganis Arena with 27.5 seconds left in regulation to give BU a 2-1 come-from-behind victory. On Friday in Lowell, Connolly scored a goal and set up Sahir Gill's shorthanded marker in a 5-1 triumph.
- This is the second time Connolly has received the league's top weekly honor, but the first time he's won it outright, as he shared it last Nov. 16.

BU CLAIMS THIRD ICE BREAKER TITLE

- Sean Escobedo scored his first career goal with 1:07 left in regulation to lift BU to a wild 5-4 victory over then-No. 17 Notre Dame in the title game of the Warrior Ice Breaker Tournament on Oct. 10 in St. Louis.
- Sahir Gill turned in an strong performance

with a goal and three assists while David Warsofsky added a goal and a helper to finish the tournament with five points (2g, 3a).

- It marked the third time in four appearances the Terriers have claimed the Ice Breaker title, as they also won the season-opening tournament in 2002 and 2008.

WARSOFSKY, GILL HAUL IN WEEKLY HONORS

- After helping BU claim the title at the Ice Breaker Tournament, David Warsofsky and Sahir Gill were named Hockey East Player and Rookie of the Week, respectively, on Oct. 11.
- Warsofsky also took home Inside College Hockey Player of the Week honors. He was the first Terrier to earn INCH's national weekly accolade since Bryan Ewing on Nov. 11, 2007.
- Warsofsky scored a game-best three points (1g, 2a) in a 4-3 win over No. 14 Wisconsin before adding a goal and an assist in the 5-4 victory against No. 17 Notre Dame in the title game to finish the weekend with five points.
- The defenseman helped the Terriers go 3-of-5 with the man advantage in the Wisconsin game by earning three power-play points.
- Highlighted by a four-point effort (1g, 3a) in the title game against the Fighting Irish, Gill also had five points on the weekend in what was an impressive collegiate debut.
- The forward earned the primary assist on both game-winning goals, first setting up a breakaway for senior Joe Pereira against the Badgers before winning a late faceoff against Notre Dame that directly led to sophomore Sean Escobedo's game-winner.
- Gill earned a plus-5 rating for the tournament, including a plus-4 in the title contest. His four-point effort was the best by a BU rookie since Colin Wilson had a goal and three assists against Merrimack on Jan. 18, 2008.

BETWEEN THE PIPES

For the second straight year, the Terriers return all three of their goaltenders from the previous season. Kieran Millan - the 2009 HCA National Rookie of the Year - enters the year as the No. 1 netminder once again.

WEARING THE "C"

Senior forward Joe Pereira and junior forward Chris Connolly will serve as co-captains of the Terriers this season. Junior David Warsofsky will be an assistant captain.

WELCOME ABOARD

The Terriers welcome eight freshmen to their roster this season, as five forwards and three defensemen join BU. Two members of the class (Yasin Cisse, Charlie Coyle) were

selected in this year's NHL Entry Draft, while two others (Adam Clendening, Matt Nieto) are considered to be first-round prospects for next year's draft.

89TH SEASON

The Terriers are in their 89th season of

intercollegiate play and currently hold a 1391-796-137 (.628) record. BU's 1,391 wins are only surpassed by Minnesota (1,620 wins - 90 seasons) and Michigan (1,510 wins - 89 seasons). The three programs represent a trio of the top NCAA Division I college hockey conferences in the WCHA (Minnesota), CCHA (Michigan) and Hockey East (BU), and hold a combined 19 national titles between them.

COACH PARKER NOTES

38th SEASON ON THE BU BENCH

Terrier head coach Jack Parker is now in his 38th season and holds an overall record of 841-430-109 (.649). His 841 wins mark the most of any college hockey coach at the same institution, while he ranks second among active coaches in wins and fourth in winning percentage.

VS. THE EAGLES

Parker has taken on the Eagles 143 times since the 1973-74 season and holds a 74-57-12 (.559) record. He has coached more games against the Eagles than any team, while his 74 wins mark the second-highest total he's had against any opponent. The only team he's had more wins against is Northeastern (91).

VS. YORK

The two veteran coaches have faced each other 82 times in the past 38 years, and Parker owns a 45-30-7 (.591) record against York. Their rivalry began while York coached at Clarkson, during which time Parker held a perfect 9-0-0 record. From 1980-84, York moved on to Bowling Green, where Parker held a 2-1-0 advantage. Since York arrived at BC in 1994-95, Parker is 34-29-7 (.536).

IN HOCKEY EAST

Parker holds an all-time 379-210-83 (.626) record in Hockey East regular-season play, which is the most wins of any league coach.

PARKER RECEIVES LESTER PATRICK AWARD

- Parker was honored on Oct. 27 at TD Garden as one of four recipients of the Lester Patrick Award, presented by the NHL to people who have made outstanding contributions to the sport in the United States.
- Also honored were Cam Neely, Jerry York and David Andrews.
