TONIGHT AT JACK PARKER RINK

In a rematch of last year's national semifinal game, Boston University opens up the December portion of its schedule with a home contest against Vermont.

SERIES HISTORY

- The Terriers and Catamounts have played 58 times since the 1971-72 season, with BU holding a 34-18-6 (.638) advantage.
- BU and Vermont are an even 4-4-1 in their nine meetings at Agganis Arena.
- From 1974-84, the teams shared time in the ECAC, with BU posting a 13-4-1 record against the Catamounts during the span.
- Since the Catamounts joined Hockey East in 2005, the teams have met 17 times and are an even 7-7-3 in those contests.
- Eleven of the games in the all-time series have gone into overtime, and the Terriers are unbeaten (5-0-6) in those decisions.

SCOUTING THE CATAMOUNTS

- Vermont is coming off back-to-back wins, most recently posting a 1-0 home victory over No. 10 Yale on Monday. The Catamounts also visited Boston last Friday, earning a 3-2 road victory over Northeastern.
- Of Vermont's four other wins this season, two have come against Boston College, while the others were against Denver and Providence

- Senior forward Brayden Irwin leads the team in both goals (5) and assists (7), while juniors Jack Downing (3g, 5a) and Wahsontio Stacey (3g, 4a) have added eight and seven points, respectively.

- The Catamounts' power-play unit ranks next-to-last in the country, having converted just five of their 52 chances this season.

- Sophomore Rob Madore and senior Mike Spillane have each earned three wins in goal this season for UVM. Spillane's goals-against average of 2.54 is nearly one goal better than Madore's (3.51)

- Kevin Sneddon is in his seventh season at the helm of the Catamount program and holds a 111-98-32 record at the school.

LAST APRIL IN THE NATION'S CAPITAL

- Colin Wilson broke a 4-4 tie at 14:19 of the third period with his second goal of the night to lift Boston University into the national championship game with a 5-4 win over Vermont in the NCAA Frozen Four on April 9 at the Verizon Center.
- After scoring the first two goals of the game, the Terriers were forced to come back from a pair of one-goal deficits, as Vermont responded with a three-goal run in the second before BU got a goal back in the late stages of the middle period to make it a 3-3 contest. The Catamounts regained the lead on their second power-play goal of the game at 9:40 of the third.

- Chris Higgins, who matched a career high with a game-best four points (1g, 3a), tied the game at 4 with 6:54 to play and then set up the game-winner less than a minute later.
- In a battle of freshman goaltenders, national rookie of the year Kieran Millan made 23 saves for the Terriers, while Rob Madore also recorded 23 stops in the Vermont net.
- Wilson registered two goals and an assist, while Jason Lawrence posted a goal and an assist, as the line of Higgins-Wilson-Lawrence was responsible for nine of the Terriers' 14 points on the night. Vinny Saponari scored arguably the game's biggest goal when he tied the contest late in the second.

LAST YEAR'S HOCKEY EAST SERIES

- After a convincing 7-2 road win over the Catamounts in their first meeting last year on Nov. 1, the Terriers dropped consecutive 4-3 contests at home to Vermont on Nov. 21-22. Vermont become the first opponent to sweep a weekend series at BU since Maine in 1992.
- In the final game of the series, goaltender Kieran Millan made a then-career-best 28 saves in what was his lone loss of the regular-season.

TERRIERS RALLY FOR DRAW AT MSG

- Playing in front of a sold-out crowd at Madison Square Garden, Boston University erased a two-goal third-period deficit en route to a 3-3 draw with then-No. 7/8 Cornell on Saturday evening in the second Red Hot Hockey contest.
- Sophomore Chris Connolly provided the

- game-tying tally on a power play with 51 seconds left in regulation for the Terriers, who earned a 6-3 win over the Big Red in the inaugural Red Hot Hockey event in 2007.
- Junior Nick Bonino tallied the first of BU's two goals in the third period and assisted on the game-tying tally, while sophomore David Warsofsky provided the Terriers' first goal of the contest and finished the night with a game-best plus-2 rating.
- Cornell never trailed, jumping out to an early 2-0 lead before taking a 3-1 advantage into the third period.
- Back-to-back infractions on the Big Red at 16:40 and 18:02 of the third gave the Terriers 38 seconds with a two-man advantage. In addition, BU pulled sophomore goaltender Grant Rollheiser to make it a 6-on-3 situation.
- Cornell got through the 6-on-3, but the Terriers capitalized on the ensuing 6-on-4 to send the game into overtime.
- Ben Scrivens made 32 saves, including 11 in the third period alone, for the Big Red while Grant Rollheiser recorded 14 saves for the Terriers, who more than doubled up the Big Red in shots (35-17).

TERRIER TIDBITS

- The Terriers scored just 12 goals in their first six games this season but have tallied 25 in the seven contests since.
- Over the past six games, 18 different Terriers have scored at least one point and junior Nick Bonino has a team-best eight points (2g, 6a) during the stretch.
- Sophomore Chris Connolly has scored at least

one point in his last five games, notching eight points (5g, 3a) over those contests.

- Junior Kevin Shattenkirk has tallied at least one point in nine of the last 11 games and ranks 10th in the nation amongst defensemen in points per game at 0.92.
- BU is 12-1-1 in its last 14 regular-season non-conference games.
- BU is 34-0-1 in its last 35 games in which it has led after two periods. A draw with UNH on Nov. 21 ended a streak of 34 straight wins in that situation.
- The Terriers have had a balanced scoring attack between periods, scoring 11 goals in both the first and seconds periods and 13 in the third. BU also has two overtime goals this season after tallying just one all last year.
- Sophomore goaltender Grant Rollheiser is 3-0-3 in his last six decisions.
- Last season, the Terriers were 5-0-0 when allowing exactly three goals. This season, BU is 0-4-2 when allowing an opponent to score three goals.

EARLY-SEASON INJURIES

- As a team, the Terriers have missed a combined 22 games this season due to injury or illness.
- Saturday's contest against Cornell marked the first time all season that all 26 players on the roster were healthy enough to play.

PRETTY MUCH A SURE THING

- BU is undefeated in the last 39 games when Nick Bonino has scored at least one point, posting a 34-0-5 mark during the span.
- The last time Bonino notched a point in a loss was Feb. 4, 2008, when he scored a goal in the Beanpot semifinals against Boston College.
- In last year's national title season, BU went 24-0-3 in the games he tallied at least one point.

SHOTS AREN'T EVERYTHING

The Terriers were undefeated (9-0-1) in their previous 10 games in which they had been outshot until UNH held a 27-23 shot advantage in its 4-2 win over BU on Nov. 20. The streak dated back to Jan. 26, 2008, as UNH was also the last team to top BU while recording more shots.

SHUTOUT STORY

- The Terriers went 99 consecutive games without being shut out before being blanked by Notre Dame on Oct. 20. It was the longest active streak in the country.
- BU had not been handed a shutout loss in 112 games (1-0, vs. BC, 12/2/06), as the last time it came up empty was a 0-0 draw with UMass Lowell on Feb. 2, 2007.
- With the 1-0 loss at Northeastern on Nov. 6, the Terriers were shut out in an opposing rink for the first time since March 12, 2004.

NON-CONFERENCE STREAK ENDS

- The Terriers' loss to Notre Dame on Oct. 20 was its first against a non-Hockey East team since Dartmouth on Jan. 15, 2008, which was a span of 10 straight wins.
- BU was the only team in the country to post a perfect non-conference record (9-0-0) during the 2008-09 regular season.

FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING

Sophomore goaltender Kieran Millan suffered his first-ever loss away from Agganis Arena in the season opener at UMass. As a freshman, his record away from home was an incredible 16-0-1.

SOPHOMORES HONORED BY LEAGUE

- After tallying four points and posting a plus-3 rating in BU's split with Merrimack, sophomore forward Chris Connolly was named the Hockey East Co-Player of the Week along with UNH's Bobby Butler on Nov. 16.
- Connolly scored a career-high three points (2g, 1a) in a 6-4 home win over the Warriors. He also earned the primary assist on junior Kevin Shattenkirk's goal in the opening minute of play.
- Classmate David Warsofsky was named Hockey East Player of the Week on Nov. 2 after scoring two goals, including a short-handed tally, in BU's 5-4 overtime victory at UMass Lowell. He added an assist in a loss to the UML the next night and turned in a plus-4 rating for the weekend.

IT'S BEEN A WHILE

BU has not lost a conference game in overtime since Feb. 21, 2003, at Providence.

PRESEASON HONORS

Three Terriers - one at each position - were named to Inside College Hockey's 2009-10 Preseason All-America Second Team. Junior forward Nick Bonino, junior defenseman Kevin Shattenkirk and sophomore goaltender Kieran Millan were the only Hockey East players among the 18 selected to one of INCH's three preseason All-America squads.

SCORING LOAD

Although BU returns just one of its top six scorers from its national title season, all four of its players (Nick Bonino, Colby Cohen, Zach Cohen, Chris Connolly) who scored a goal in the national title game are back for the 2009-10 campaign.

BETWEEN THE PIPES

All three of BU's goaltenders from last season, including reigning national rookie of the year Kieran Millan. Millan had one of the best seasons by a freshman netminder in NCAA history, breaking a single-season school record with 29 victories as part of a remarkable 29-2-3 record. He also posted a 1.94 goals-

OUR HOUSE

The Terriers went 16-4-2 at home last season and are now 26-7-2 in their last 35 contests at Agganis Arena. Since it opened in January 2005, BU has posted a 56-26-10 record in the building.

TERRIERS, EAGLES TO MEET AT FENWAY

The home of the Boston Red Sox will become the Hub's hockey haven in the first week of 2010, as Boston University will face archrival Boston College on Jan. 8 at Fenway Park, just one week after the Boston Bruins take on the Philadelphia Flyers on the same sheet of ice for the NHL Winter Classic.

BU FAVORED TO REPEAT IN HOCKEY EAST

After winning both the Hockey East regular-season and tournament titles last season en route to its fifth national title and a school-record 35 wins, Boston University has been picked to repeat as league champions in 2009-10. The Terriers earned six first-place votes in the preseason coaches' poll to finish with 84 points. UMass Lowell (79) and Boston College (76) rounded out the top three and each received two first-place nods.

NEW YORK STATE OF MIND

For the first time ever, more players on the Terriers' roster are from New York than Massachusetts. Three freshmen (Sean Escobedo, Wade Megan, Ben Rosen) are from the Empire State, joining sophomore Kevin Gilroy and junior Kevin Shattenkirk for a total of five. Just three players on this year's squad (Ross Gaudet, Andrew Glass, David Warsofsky) are from Massachusetts.

WEARING THE "C"

Junior defenseman Kevin Shattenkirk (New Rochelle, N.Y.) will serve as captain of the Terriers this season. He becomes the first junior to wear the "C" since Jack O'Callahan in

1977-78 and the first lone junior captain since Bob Smith during the 1961-62 season. Senior defenseman Eric Gryba (Saskatoon, Sask.) and junior forward Nick Bonino (Unionville, Conn.) will be assistant captains for this year's team.

WELCOME ABOARD

The Terriers welcomed seven freshmen to their roster this season, as four forwards and three defensemen join BU for its defense of the national title. The class was ranked sixth in the country by Inside College Hockey and four members of the group have been drafted by an NHL team.

NHL HOPEFULS

Fourteen of this year's Terriers have been chosen by a professional team in the National Hockey League Entry Draft. The 14 players were taken by 12 different clubs between 2006-09. Three of the them were selected by the Colorado Avalanche (Colby Cohen, Kieran Millan, Kevin Shattenkirk). Only Minnesota (20) and North Dakota (15) have more NHL draftees on their current roster.

PRO PIPELINE

- 13 former Terriers began the 2009-10 NHL season on one of the league's 30 rosters.
- Three players from last year's national championship squad have reached the NHL ranks, as Matt Gilroy earned a spot on the New York Rangers and Colin Wilson (Nashville) and Brandon Yip (Colorado) began the year on injured reserve for their respective clubs.
- The other 10 are Adrian Aucoin (Phoenix), Chris Bourque (Pittsburgh), Rick DiPietro (New York Islanders), Chris Drury (New York Rangers), Mike Grier (Buffalo), Freddy Meyer (New York Islanders), Jay Pandolfo (New Jersey), Tom Poti (Washington), Keith Tkachuk (St. Louis) and Ryan Whitney (Anaheim).
- Gilroy made his NHL debut on Oct. 2 against Pittsburgh, while Wilson played in his first NHL game on Oct. 12 against Edmonton. With Wilson's appearance, 59 former Terriers have now reached the NHL ranks.

89TH SEASON

The Terriers are in their 89th season of inter-collegiate play and currently hold a 1370-785-133 (.628) record. BU's 1,370 wins are only surpassed by Minnesota (1,597 wins - 90 seasons) and Michigan (1,483 wins - 89 seasons). The three geographically separated programs represent a trio of the top NCAA Division I college hockey conferences in the WCHA (Minnesota), CCHA (Michigan) and Hockey East (BU), and hold a combined 19 national titles between them.

COACH PARKER NOTES

37th SEASON ON THE BU BENCH

Terrier head coach Jack Parker is now in his

37th season and holds an overall record of 820-421-103 (.648). His 820 wins mark the most of any college hockey coach at the same institution, while he ranks second among active coaches in wins and fourth in winning percentage.

VS. THE CATAMOUNTS

Parker has coached 54 games against the Catamounts and has a 32-16-6 record (.648) against them. He holds an 8-7-4 edge over Vermont since Kevin Sneddon took over the program.

GAME RECAPS

BU ERASES FOUR DEFICITS IN WILD WIN

- Sophomore Chris Connolly capped a wild contest between cross-town rivals with an overtime winner to lead Boston University to a 6-5 victory over Harvard on Nov. 24 at Bright Hockey Center.
- The Crimson took a 5-4 lead with 1:18 left in regulation on Conor Morrison's fourth goal of the contest, but senior Zach Cohen scored an extra-attacker goal with 19.5 ticks left to send the game into overtime.
- Junior Joe Pereira tallied a career-high four points on two goals and two assists and classmate Nick Bonino recorded three points, including his first goal of the year. Cohen registered the second two-goal game of his career.
- The Terriers scored the first goal of the game, but never held a lead again, as they erased four one-goal advantages by the Crimson before coming through with their second overtime win of the season.
- The Terriers outshot the Crimson by a significant 49-26 margin, as Harvard goaltender Kyle Richter finished the night with a career-high 43 saves. Kieran Millan made 21 saves in goal for BU.
- BU went 3-of-5 on the power play, as its first three goals came with the man advantage. The Terriers committed just three penalties on the night and killed off both of the Crimson's power-play chances.

TERRIERS SALVAGE POINT IN UNH WEEKEND

- BU is coming off a home-and-home weekend against UNH, as the teams battled to a 3-3 draw at Agganis Arena on Saturday after the Wildcats posted a 4-2 home victory on Friday.
- Friday's meeting at the Whittemore Center was the teams' first since last year's NCAA Northeast Regional final.
- Sophomores Vinny Saponari, Corey Trivino and David Warsofsky all scored a goal on Saturday, as Trivino provided the game-tying tally with 8:08 left in regulation. Fellow sophomore Grant Rollheiser made a career-high 27 saves in goal.
- Senior Zach Cohen and sophomore Ross Gaudet each potted a goal for the Terriers in

Friday's loss. UNH never trailed in the game and got goals from four different players.

- Special teams were the difference, as the Terriers came up empty on all five of their chances with the man advantage, while the home team converted on two of its six power plays.
- Sophomore Kieran Millan made 23 saves in a losing effort for the Terriers, while Brian Foster picked up the win in goal for UNH with a 21-save performance.

BU SPLITS SERIES WITH MERRIMACK

- BU split a home-and-home series with Merrimack last weekend, as each team won on its home ice. The Terriers saw their losing skid reach four games on Friday night in a 6-3 loss to the Warriors before posting a 6-4 victory at Agganis Arena on Saturday.
- On Friday in North Andover, freshman Wade Megan opened the scoring at 12:30 of the opening period with his first collegiate goal, but the Warriors scored five unanswered goals.
- Sophomore Vinny Saponari recorded a goal and an assist and classmate Corey Trivino potted his first goal of the season for BU, which scored all three of its goals on the power play.
- Merrimack, which remained a perfect 6-0 at home this season, was led by a two-goal effort from Brandon Brodhag.
- On Saturday, sophomore Chris Connolly tallied two goals and an assist for the Terriers, who jumped out to a 4-0 lead after the opening period.
- Sophomore goaltender Grant Rollheiser made his first start of the year after missing the first month with a high-ankle sprain and recorded a career-high 25 saves, including 12 in the third.
- Merrimack rallied to make it a 5-4 contest midway through the third but the Terriers held on to prevent the Warriors from winning consecutive games for the first time in the all-time series.

TERRIERS EDGED IN ORONO

- Boston University suffered its third consecutive one-goal defeat on Nov. 8, dropping a 3-2 road decision against Maine. It was the Terriers' first regular-season loss against the Black Bears since Jan. 22, 2005.
- Freshman Alex Chiasson and sophomore Chris Connolly each scored a goal for the Terriers, who held a 28-18 shot advantage for the game.
- Maine scored two early goals with the first one coming on a 5-on-3 advantage before Chiasson tallied his team-leading fourth goal of the season to cut the deficit to one before the end of the opening period.
- BU controlled the run of play for the vast majority of the second period but the Black Bears ended up scoring the lone goal of the stanza with what ended up being the game-winning tally.

- The Huskies, who got a 43-save performance from freshman goaltender Chris Rawlings, scored the game's lone goal with 7:29 left in regulation.
- The teams came up empty on the first 11 power plays of the contest until the Huskies cashed in on their sixth and final chance with the man advantage following a BU penalty at the 11:37 mark of the third. TERRIERS SPLIT LOWELL WEEKEND

- BU split a home-and-home series with then-No. 8/9 UMass Lowell on Oct. 30-31.
- On Friday, Colby Cohen netted the game-winner with 1:06 remaining in overtime and David Warsofsky had his first career two-goal game to lead the Terriers to a 5-4 victory over the River Hawks at Tsongas Arena.
- Alex Chiasson opened the scoring in the second period with his third goal of the season, but Lowell tied it up soon after. Warsofsky potted a shorthanded goal to help the Terriers regain the lead only to watch the home team score twice before the stanza ended to take a 3-2 lead into the third.
