### TONIGHT IN AMHERST

The Terriers kick off a stretch of seven straight Hockey East contests with the first half of a home-and-home weekend against Massachusetts. The teams will meet at Agganis Arena on Saturday.



Terrier captain Joe Pereira - have each contributed five points. All of Pereira's goals came in a hat-trick performance in the win over Bentley.

• Hobbs (12-16--28), Snyder (9-18-27) and Pereira (12-13--25) were the Minutemen's top three scorers last season.

### SERIES HISTORY

• The Terriers and Minutemen head into Friday's contest having met 62 times since first facing off in BU's second season of competition (1919-20). The Terriers hold an impressive 49-9-4 (.823) advantage. However, four of UMass' nine wins have come in the last 15 meetings.

• The Terriers are 18-6-2 (.731) in their 26 visits to Mullins Center, but are 3-3 in their last six games in Amherst.

• The teams have met 51 times in Hockey East play, with the Terriers holding a 39-8-4 (.804) record in those contests.

• In the seven overtime competitions in the series, BU has a slight 2-1-4. BU has earned all five of the shutouts that have occurred in the series.

### SCOUTING THE MINUTEMEN

• UMass has dropped its last two contests - both in league play (Boston College, Providence) - and enters the weekend with a record of 1-2-0. Its lone win thus far came in its home opener against Bentley on Oct. 14

• Senior T.J. Snyder leads the team in points (7) and assists (6) while classmates Danny Hobbs (3g, 2a) and Michael Marcou (1g, 4a) and sophomore Michael Pereira (3g, 2a) - the younger brother of 2010-11

### BEST VS. UMASS

• Ten current Terriers have recorded at least one goal against the Minutemen and 12 have at least one point.

• Seniors Chris Connolly (2g, 6a) and Corey Trivino (2g, 6a) and junior Alex Chiasson (4g, 4a) have all scored eight points against UMass in their BU careers. Chiasson has played in only six games versus the Minutemen while Trivino and Connolly have played in nine and eight, respectively.

• Senior goaltenders Kieran Millan and Grant Rollheiser have a combined .899 save percentage and a 2.76 goals-against average in nine contests with UMass.

• Dating back to last season, three Terriers are currently on a six-game point streak (Alex Chiasson, Matt Nieto, Corey Trivino).

- Nieto had 13 points (4g, 9a) in the last 11 games of the 2010-11 season after tallying two points (1g, 1a) in his first 11 contests.
- Nieto has scored a goal in all four contests this season. The last time a Terrier scored in four consecutive games was Colby Cohen from Jan. 29 - Feb. 12, 2010. Brandon Yip and Jason Lawrence were the last forwards to achieve the feat, both during the 2008-09 campaign.

### TERRIER TIDBITIS

- BU leads the nation in shorthanded goals with three.
- Prior to the win over then-No. 3 Denver, the last time the Terriers had defeated a top-three team was the 2009 Beanpot championship game when they topped then-No. 3 Northeastern, 5-2.
- All four of the Terriers' goals against Denver came on special teams (4-on-4, power play, 2 shorthanded).
- Dating back to last season's Beanpot consolation game, the Terriers have scored at least one power-play goal in 12 of its last 14 contests.
- The Terriers have had at least six players record at least one point in all four games this season.

### TERRIERS TRIPPED UP BY HOLY CROSS, 5-4

- Boston University suffered a 5-4 loss at the hands of Holy Cross last Saturday evening at Agganis Arena.
- Junior Alex Chiasson tallied two goals and an assist for the Terriers. Sophomore Matt Nieto scored a goal for the fourth straight game and added an assist while classmate Sahir Gill potted his first goal of the season. Senior Corey Trivino and sophomore Charlie Coyle each registered a pair of assists.
- After giving up an early goal, BU scored goals

40 seconds apart to take a 2-1 lead. The Crusaders responded with four unanswered goals, including three on the power play, to jump out to a 5-2 advantage.

- The Terriers tried to rally back with two third-period goals, but it was too little, too late, and the Crusaders escaped with the victory.
- Holy Cross was paced by sophomore Adam Schmidt who helped the visitors take the lead for good with the first two tallies of the four-goal run. Senior Andrew Cox contributed a goal and two assists.
- Each team recorded 31 shots on the evening, as senior Kieran Millan made 26 saves for the Terriers and freshman Matt Ginn stopped 27 BU shots in goal for the Crusaders.
- The Crusaders took advantage of BU penalties throughout the night, going 3-of-6 on the power play. The Terriers (0-for-3) were held without a power-play goal for the first time this year.

### LOOKING BACK AT 2010-11

- Boston University posted a record of 19-12-8 last season and went 15-6-6 (36 pts.) in Hockey East play to finish third in the league standings.
- BU faced crosstown rival Northeastern five times in 10 days to end the season and lost the teams' Hockey East quarterfinal series in three games.
- The Terriers finished 17th in the final USCHO.com national poll and received votes in the final USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine top-15 national poll.
- BU was the lone unbeaten team left in the country before falling at UNH on Nov. 19.
- The Terriers went undefeated in their first 10 games (6-0-4) for their best start in 33 seasons.
- BU reached the six-win mark on Oct. 30, 10

weeks earlier than it did in the 2009-10 season (Jan. 8).

- The Terriers held the top spot in both national polls on Nov. 8.
- After earning six wins in October, the Terriers went just 13-12-7 afterwards, posting just one victory in both November and December.
- BU went 8-1-2 in its final 11 Hockey East contests.
- In the Terriers' last 18 games, 12 were decided by a single goal and two others were ties.
- BU missed the NCAA tournament in back-to-back seasons for the first time since not qualifying for three straight years from 1987-89.

## BULK IS BACK

- The Terriers return 85 percent of their scoring from last season as this year's group totaled 267 points (92g, 175a) last year.
- BU lost just one player at each position from last year: Joe Pereira (forward), David Warsofsky (defenseman), Adam Kraus (goaltender).

## CHIASSON LEADS THE WAY

- Through four games, junior Alex Chiasson leads the team lead in points with seven and shares the lead in goals (4) with sophomore Matt Nieto.
- Chiasson tallied a team-best 34 points (14g, 20a) in 35 games last season and had at least one point in 22 of those contests.
- Chiasson had 10 points (5g, 5a) over his last nine games.
- Twenty-nine of his points came in Hockey East play, which ranked tied for eighth in the league.

## ROOKIE STANDOUTS

- BU boasted four of the top seven freshman scorers in Hockey East - both overall and in league play - last season.
- Charlie Coyle - the reigning Hockey East and New England Rookie of the Year - led all freshmen in league play with 21 points (6g, 15a). Matt Nieto (7g, 11a) and Sahir Gill (5g, 13a) tied for fourth with 18 and Adam Clendening tied for sixth with 17 (3g, 14a).
  - Overall, Coyle (7g, 19a) and Clendening (5g, 21) tied for third with 26 points each. Gill tied for fifth with 25 points (6g, 19a) and Nieto was seventh with 23 (10g, 13a). No league rookie had more assists than Clendening.
  - Clendening tied for fourth nationally among freshman defensemen in points with 26 and shared the team lead in plus-minus with Gill and junior Chris Connolly at plus-8.

## ON THE KILL

- BU has successfully killed off 20 of its opponents' 24 power plays thus far this season and the penalty kill ranks tied for 22nd in the nation at 83.3 percent
- BU's penalty-kill unit finished last year ranked fourth in the nation. The Terriers were 175-of-202 on the year for an 86.6-percent success rate.
- The Terriers had three streaks of 20 or more consecutive successful kills on the year, including one that reached 32 straight.

## ON THE POWER PLAY

- BU is 3-of-21 (.143) on the power play so far this season.
- Dating back to last season, the Terriers have had at least one man-up goal in 12 of its last 14 contests.
- The Terriers' power play ranked just 47th in the country last season at 14.9 percent (32-of-215) but converted on 15 of its last 66 chances.

## MILLAN MILESTONES

- Kieran Millan broke BU's all-time record for career goaltending wins with his 63rd in the victory over Denver on Oct. 15.
- Millan reached the 50-win mark for his career last Dec. 8 and needed just 80 starts reach the milestone.
- No other goaltender in school history has more wins against Maine (7) than Millan.

## BU HOLDS OFF #3 DENVER

- Boston University held off a third-period Denver rally to post a 4-3 victory over the third-ranked Pioneers on Oct. 15 at Agganis Arena.
- Four different Terriers found the back of the net to help the home team build a 4-0 lead through two periods before the Pioneers scored a trio of goals and threatened to tie in the closing minutes.
- Senior Kieran Millan recorded 35 saves and earned his 63rd career victory to become the winningest goaltender in BU history.
- After junior Alex Chiasson scored the lone goal of the first period on a breakaway, the Terriers extended their lead with three goals in the first three minutes of the second period.
- Senior Corey Trivino and sophomore Matt Nieto recorded shorthanded goals 43 seconds apart early in the middle stanza. It was the first career shorthanded goal for both players and each of them have scored in all three contests thus far this season.
- Junior Wade Megan backhanded a deflected puck past Denver netminder Adam Murray at 2:58 of the second on a power play to complete the spurt and push the Terriers' lead to 4-0.
- The Pioneers eventually solved Millan and the

BU defense when Luke Salazar scored at 6:01 of the third. John Lee made it 4-2 game when he scored from outside the blue line at the 13:09 mark.

- With Murray pulled in favor of an extra attacker, the Pioneers made it a one-goal affair when Drew Shore knocked in a rebound with 2:21 left in regulation.
- Denver continued their late barrage in search of an equalizer, but the Terriers hung to claim an important non-conference win over a highly ranked opponent.
- The Pioneers held a slim 38-37 advantage in shots and got a 33-save performance from Murray. BU went 1-of-7 on the power play and successfully killed off all six of Denver's chances with the man advantage.

### TERRIERS FALL TO FRIARS, 5-3

- Boston University drew even after an early 3-0 deficit, but Providence regained the lead and hung on for a 5-3 victory on Oct. 21 at Schneider Arena.
- Faced with a 3-0 deficit entering the second period, the Terriers got tallies from sophomore Matt Nieto and senior Corey Trivino in the middle stanza before sophomore Garrett Noonan completed the comeback with a mark just 3:13 into the third.
- PC, however, regrouped and used a power play to regain the lead at 4-3 at 5:42 of the third before adding another tally just over five minutes later.
- Senior Kieran Millan recorded 25 saves for the Terriers, who went 1-of-6 on the power play. The Friars also converted on one of six chances with the man advantage and got a 23-save performance from senior Alex Beaudry.
- The Friars, who were playing in their season opener under first-year head coach Nate Leaman, scored twice within a span of 34 seconds in the opening minutes and then tacked on another with 3:36 left in opening frame.

### TERRIERS BLANK UNH IN OPENER

- Backed by a 35-save shutout from senior Kieran Millan, Boston University opened its 2011-12 campaign with a 5-0 victory over then-No. 12 New Hampshire on Oct. 8 at Agganis Arena.
- It marked the first season-opening shutout by the Terriers since a 6-0 win over RPI on Oct. 18, 1997.
- The Terriers broke a scoreless tie early in the second period with goals by junior Wade Megan and senior Corey Trivino.
- Sophomore Matt Nieto, junior Alex Chiasson and senior Kevin Gilroy all tacked on third-period markers to complete the scoring.
- Senior Chris Connolly and freshmen Charlie Coyle and Sahir Gill each recorded two assists on the night.
- With his performance, Millan recorded his 62nd career victory at BU to tie the program record held by Sean Fields '04. It was the sixth shutout of his career.

### LEAGUE PLAY

- BU went 10-3-2 in its final 15 league games last season after dropping both ends of a home-

and-home series to Boston College on Dec. 3-4.

- In the 2010 calendar year, BU went 17-8-4 in Hockey East play. It had the best league record after the holiday break both in 2009-10 (11-5-0) and in 2008-09 (12-1-3).

### EXTRA SPECIAL

- BU is 7-2-15 in its last 24 overtime games.
- The Terriers' last two overtime losses during the regular season have come in the opening round of the Beanpot against Boston College (2008, 2011).
- BU has not lost a conference game in overtime since Feb. 21, 2003, at Providence.

### COMEBACK KIDS

- The Terriers recorded 11 come-from-behind victories last season after only having five during the 2009-10 campaign.
- BU was an even 8-8-3 in the 19 games in which it allowed the first goal in 2010-11.

### CRUNCH TIME

BU is 60-2-5 in the last 67 games in which it has led after two periods and 23-7-6 in the last 36 games in which it was tied after two periods.

### DOWN TO THE WIRE

Fifty-two of BU's last 82 games have been either been decided by a single goal or resulted in a tie and BU is 27-14-11 in those contests.

### SPREADING IT OUT

The Terriers had 22 of their players score at least one point last season and led the league with 20 different goal scorers.

### BETWEEN THE PIPES

Senior Kieran Millan returns as the Terriers' primary goaltender. He and classmate Grant Rollheiser have combined to earn 126 starts in the BU goal over the past three-plus seasons.

### WEARING THE "C"

- Senior forward Chris Connolly will serve as the team's captain this season after sharing captain duties with Joe Pereira last season.
- Connolly will be the first two-year captain at BU since Jack O'Callahan '79.
- Junior forwards Alex Chiasson and Justin Courttnall will serve as assistant captains.

### WELCOME ABOARD

The Terriers welcome three freshmen - two forwards (Cason Hohmann, Evan Rodrigues), one defenseman (Alexx Privitera) - to their roster this season in addition to sophomore Anthony Moccia, who joins the roster after serving as a practice goalie last year as a freshman.

The three programs represent a trio of the top NCAA Division I college hockey conferences in the WCHA (Minnesota), CCHA (Michigan) and Hockey East (BU), and hold a combined 19 national titles between them.

## COACH PARKER NOTES

### 39th SEASON ON THE TERRIER BENCH

BU head coach Jack Parker is now in his 39th

season and holds an overall record of 855-443-112 (.647). His 855 wins mark the most of any college hockey coach at the same institution, while he ranks second among active coaches in wins and fifth in winning percentage.

## VS. THE MINUTEMEN

Parker has coached 57 games against the Minutemen and holds a record of 46-8-4 (.828), including a 39-8-4 (.804) mark in league play.

## VS. CAHOON

• Parker has coached against Don Cahoon 42 times between his former assistant's stints at Princeton and UMass and has a 28-10-4 (.714) advantage in those contests.

• Parker was an assistant coach with the Terriers when Cahoon played at BU, including the 1971 and 1972 national championship runs.

## IN HOCKEY EAST

Parker holds an all-time 390-216-85 (.626) record in Hockey East regular-season play, which is the most wins of any league coach.
