### TONIGHT AT JACK PARKER RINK

• Playing in a decisive third game in the Hockey East quarterfinals for the fifth straight season, Boston University looks to complete a comeback after winning 5-2 on Saturday to force tonight's contest.

• The Huskies posted a 4-2 victory over the Terriers on Thursday in game one of the best-of-three series.

• The crosstown rivals are meeting for the fifth time in 10 days.

• BU won two of its three regular-season meetings with the Huskies.

• The Terriers are aiming for their fifth 20-win season in the last seven years.

### SERIES HISTORY

• This will be the 212th meeting between the Terriers and the Huskies since they first took to the ice together during the 1930-31 season. The only team BU has played more games against is Boston College (254).

• BU holds a 150-53-8 (.730) advantage in the series and is 16-4-4 (.750) in the last 24 meetings and 11-3-2 (.750) in last 16.

• The Terriers are 7-3-2 (.667) in the 12 meetings at Agganis Arena and were undefeated in eight straight (6-0-2) before last Saturday's loss.

• The two teams have played 22 overtime games in the all-time series, and BU holds a 10-4-8 edge. The Terriers have recorded 12 of the 15 shutouts in the 211-game history.

### IN THE HOCKEY EAST TOURNAMENT

• BU and Northeastern have now played each other nine times in the Hockey East playoffs, with the Terriers holding a 6-3-0 advantage in those contests (six of which

were held at Water Brown Arena).

• This is the first time in 14 years that the teams have met in the post-season, as the Terriers skated to 6-2 and 7-1 home victories over the Huskies in the 1997 quarterfinal round.

• The rivals also met in the 1990

quarterfinals, with Northeastern earning a 4-3 road victory in game one before BU rebounded with 5-2 and 5-3 wins to capture the series in three games.

• BU topped NU, 5-2, in the 1994 semifinals at Boston Garden.

• In their first Hockey East tournament meeting, the Huskies earned a 3-2 win in a one-game quarterfinal at Walter Brown Arena in 1987.

### SEASON REVIEW

• BU was the lone unbeaten team left in the country before falling at New Hampshire on Nov. 19.

• The Terriers went undefeated in their first 10 games (6-0-4) for their best start in 33 seasons, as the 1977-78 national title team won its first 21 games.

• BU reached the six-win mark on Oct. 30, 10 weeks earlier than it did last season (Jan. 8).

• The Terriers held the top spot in both national polls on Nov. 8.

• After earning six wins in October, the Terriers are just 13-11-7 since, having earned just one victory in both November and December.

### TERRIER TIDBITS

• BU went 8-1-2 in its final 11 Hockey East contests.

• The Terriers are 16-5-5 in their last 26 home games.

• In the Terriers' last 17 games, 11 have been decided by a single goal and two others were ties.

• The win at Providence on Feb. 19 was the 850th of head coach Jack Parker's career and the 1,400th in program history.

### SCOUTING THE HUSKIES

- Northeastern secured the No. 6 seed for the Hockey East playoffs by distancing itself from the bottom of the pack with a 7-4-4 league record after the holiday break.
- Head coach Greg Cronin returned to the Huskies' bench on Thursday after serving a six-game suspension. The team went 2-2-2 over the stretch, including a 2-1-1 mark against BU and BC.
- When BU and NU first met this season in December, the Huskies' offense ranked 56th in the country. Since that game, NU has averaged over three goals per contest and now ranks 31st for the year at 2.75.
- Senior Wade MacLeod has established himself as one of Hockey East's top scorers and leads the Huskies in points (40), goals (19), assists (21), power-play goals (9) and game-winning goals (3).
- Fellow senior Tyler McNeely has added 30 points (12g, 18a) and recently reached the 100-point mark for his career.
- Senior Steve Silva has contributed 28 points (10g, 18a) and freshman Brodie Reid is tied for third in scoring among conference rookies with 24 points (9g, 16a).
- Sophomore Chris Rawlings has started all but three games in goal this season and boasts a 2.57 goals-against average and a .922 save percentage.

### TERRIERS FORCE THIRD GAME

- Boston University extended its season on Friday night at Agganis Arena, posting a 5-2 win over Northeastern to force a third and decisive game.
- After giving up an early goal to the sixth-seeded Huskies, the third-seeded Terriers responded with their first three-goal first period of the season to take a lead they would not relinquish.
- BU got a goal from each class, as senior Joe

Pereira scored two third-period goals after sophomore Ryan Ruikka, freshman Matt Nieto and junior Kevin Gilroy all found the back of the net in the first. In all, 11 different Terriers recorded a point.

- Freshmen Brodie Reid and Jamie Oleskiak each recorded a marker for the Huskies.
- Junior Kieran Millan made 30 saves, including 15 in the first period alone.
- The Terriers forced Northeastern netminder Chris Rawlings out after he stopped only three of the first six shots he faced in just 12:47 of action. Clay Witt replaced Rawlings and recorded 29 saves.
- The Terriers went 1-of-10 on the power play with Nieto's go-ahead tally in the first being the lone conversion. The Huskies opened the scoring on with a power-play tally 3:25 into the game but can up empty on its last six chances with the man advantage.

### HUSKIES TAKE GAME ONE

- Boston University dropped a 4-2 contest to Northeastern in the opener of their Hockey East quarterfinal series on Thursday at Agganis Arena.
- Northeastern was paced by Steve Silva, who notched two goals and added an assist, and a 37-save performance from goaltender Chris Rawlings.
- The Huskies broke a 1-1 late in the first period with a three-goal run in a span of under 11 minutes to break open the game.
- Justin Courtnall and Ryan Ruikka scored goals for the Terriers, who held a 39-30 shot advantage in the contest. Kieran Millan made 26 saves in a losing effort.
- BU scored on one of its nine power-play chances, while NU went 1-of-4 with the man advantage.

### TERRIERS, HUSKIES SPLIT HOME-AND-HOME

- Boston University and Northeastern split a home-and-home series last weekend to wrap up the regular season.
- Each team won at the opposing rink, with BU posting a 3-2 win at Matthews Arena on Friday

before the Huskies responded with a 4-3 victory at Agganis Arena on Saturday.

- On Friday, Sahir Gill scored the game-winner shorthanded with 3:15 left in regulation. Matt Nieto assisted on all three goals and Kieran Millan recorded 39 saves.
- Gill's game-winner came exactly 100 seconds after the Huskies tied the game with a shorthanded tally of their own.
- The Terriers never trailed in the game and got goals from junior Corey Trivino and sophomore Max Nicastro.
- In the regular-season finale on Saturday, the Terriers held a 2-1 lead after the first period, but allowed the Huskies to reel off three straight tallies in a 4-3 loss.
- BU took a 2-0 lead with power-play tallies from Chris Connolly and Nicastro.
- The Huskies tied the game at 2-2 late in the second period on a goal by Drew Daniels before taking

a 4-2 lead with goals 61 seconds apart in the third from Mike Hewkin and Steve Silva.

- BU attempted to mount a third-period comeback when it got within one on a tally by Kevin Gilroy with 2:50 left in regulation. The Huskies hung on, however, to end the Terriers' 10-game unbeaten streak (8-0-2) in Hockey East play.
- Freshman Clay Witt turned in a 41-save performance in goal for Northeastern while junior Kieran Millan stopped 30 shots for the Terriers.

## BACK IN DECEMBER

- Charlie Coyle and Alex Chiasson each had a goal and two assists to lead Boston University to a 5-4 come-from-behind victory over Northeastern on Dec. 8 at Agganis Arena.
- Chiasson provided the late heroics on a power-play tally with 3:27 left in regulation.
- Northeastern recorded 14 of the game's first 15 shots and jumped out to an early 2-0 lead, but

### CURRENT TERRIERS VS. THE HUSKIES

- Sophomore Alex Chiasson has had more success against Northeastern than any other team, tallying nine points (3g, 6a) in nine contests.
- Juniors David Warsofsky (2g, 6a) and Chris Connolly (2g, 5a) have tallied eight and seven points, respectively, versus the Huskies.
- Four (3g, 1a) of junior Kevin Gilroy's 11 career points, including half of his six goals as a Terrier, have come against Northeastern.
- Junior Kieran Millan is 8-3-2 with a 2.30 goals-against average and a .919 save percentage in 13 games against Northeastern.

### IN THE TOURNAMENT

- The Terriers have an overall Hockey East tournament record of 57-31-1 (.646). BU is 39-19-1 (.670) in the quarterfinals, 9-10 (.474) in the semifinals, 2-0 (1.00) in the consolation and 7-2 (.778) in the championship.
- Providence has been, by far, BU's most common opponent in the tournament with 21 meetings. The Terriers have played 14 games in the tournament against Maine and 11 against Boston College.

### IN THE QUARTERFINALS

- Boston University has qualified for all 27 of the Hockey East tournaments since the league's inception in 1984 and finished lower than the fifth seed just twice (6th - 2001, 8th - 2004).
- Overall, the Terriers are 39-19-1 (.669) in quarterfinal action, including a 33-13-1 (.713) record at home (13-6-0 at Agganis, 20-7-1 at Walter Brown).
- BU has won its quarterfinal series the last nine years, with an 18-6 (.750) record over that time.
- This is the 22nd time in 27 years that the Terriers will be hosting the quarterfinal series of the league tournament. Of the previous 21 home series, BU has won 17 times, with the last home series loss coming in 1998 to Merrimack.
- BU hosted the quarterfinals only twice during its final six seasons at Walter Brown Arena, but has earned the right to host in all seven seasons at Agganis Arena.

### THREE-GAME QUARTERFINAL FORMAT

- The format for this weekend's quarterfinal series will be the best two-of-three games, marking the 16th straight year this format is being utilized and the 18th time in the 27-year history of the league.
- The previous years were 1990, 1994 and every year since 1996. Other formats have been a two-game mini-game (1985), a two-game/total-goal series (1986 and 1988), two-game/total points (1993) and single elimination (1987, 1989, 1991, 1992 and 1995).
- Using the best-of-three series, the Terriers are 32-14 (.696).

### CURRENT TERRIERS IN THE TOURNAMENT

- Twenty current Terriers have now played at least one contest in the Hockey East tournament and 13 of them have scored at least one point.
- Senior Joe Pereira leads the group in games played with 15.
- Junior David Warsofsky (1g, 7a) has eight points in 11 contests.
- Junior Kieran Millan was named the Most Valuable Player of the 2009 Hockey East Championship as a freshman after recording a 4-1 record, a 2.20 goals-against average and a .914 save percentage. He posted a 32-save shutout in the 1-0 win over UMass Lowell in the 2009 title game.
- Millan is 7-4-0 all-time in the league playoffs with a .920 save percentage and a 2.37 goals-against average.

## TERRIER NOTES

### MILLAN COMING ON STRONG

- In BU's 14 conference games after the turn of the new year, junior goaltender Kieran Millan went 9-3-2 with a 1.82 goals-against average and a .947 save percentage.
- Millan put together BU's longest shutout skein of the year at 123:05, making 67 straight saves from the first period of a 1-1 draw at Maine on Jan. 29 until giving up a late goal in regulation in a 3-1 victory over UMass Lowell on Feb. 4.

### NO SOPHOMORE SLUMP FOR CHIASSON

- Alex Chiasson has tallied a team-best 33 points (13g, 20a) in 34 games this season and has at least one point in 21 of those contests, including a seven-game point streak that was snapped on Dec. 11.
- Chiasson has nine points (4g, 5a) over his last eight contests.
- Twenty-nine of his points came in Hockey East play, which ranks tied for eighth in the league.
- Chiasson has topped his freshman totals of seven goals, 12 assists and 19 points.
- Nationally, he ranks tied for seventh in game-winning goals (5) and tied for 12th in shorthanded goals (2).

### ROOKIE STANDOUTS

- BU boasts four of the top seven freshman scorers in Hockey East - both overall and in league play.
- Charlie Coyle led all freshmen in league play with 21 points (6g, 15a). Matt Nieto (7g, 11a) and Sahir Gill (5g, 13a) tied for fourth with 18 and Adam Clendenning tied for sixth with 17 (3g, 14a).
- Overall, Coyle is second with 26 points (7g, 19a), Gill (6g, 19a) and Clendenning (5g, 20a) are tied for third with 25 and Nieto is seventh with 22 (9g, 13a). No league rookie has more assists than Clendenning.
- Clendenning is tied for fourth nationally among freshman defensemen in points with 25 and leads the team in plus/minus with a plus-10 rating.
- Coyle put together seven points (2g, 5a) during a six-game point streak immediately after returning from World Juniors.
- Gill had a five-game point streak (2g, 4a) snapped on Friday.

### ON THE KILL

- BU's penalty-kill unit currently ranks fourth in the nation. The Terriers are 171-of-196 on the year for an 87.2-percent success rate and have given up just three goals in their opponents' last 49 chances.
- The Terriers had streak of 25 straight successful kills snapped on Friday, marking the third time this season they had a streak of at least 20 straight.
- The Terriers ended November on a stretch during which they were 58-of-64 (.906) in penalty kill situations, including a string of 32 straight that came to an end on Nov. 13.

### MILLAN MILESTONES

- Junior goaltender Kieran Millan reached the 50-win mark for his career on Dec. 8 and needed just 80 starts reach the milestone.
- Millan ranks second all-time at BU in career wins with 61 and broke the school record for wins against Maine with seven in the Terriers' 4-3 victory over the Black Bears on Jan. 28. Here's a look

## COYLE A STANDOUT FOR U.S. JUNIOR TEAM

- Freshman Charlie Coyle and the U.S. National Junior Team posted a 4-2 win over Sweden on Jan. 5 to claim the bronze medal at the 2011 IIHF World Junior Championship at HSBC Arena.
- The U.S. rebounded from a 4-1 loss to Canada in the semifinals by topping Sweden to earn a medal in back-to-back World Junior tournaments for the

first time ever. Last year, Team USA won the gold with a thrilling overtime victory against Canada. BU's David Warsofsky was a member of that championship team.

- Coyle tied for the team lead in points for the tournament with six on a pair of goals and four assists. He was named one of Team USA's top players of the tournament along with goaltender Jack Campbell and defenseman Jon Merrill.
- By earning the bronze, Coyle became the 12th BU player to medal at World Juniors.
- Freshmen Adam Clendenen and Matt Nieto were named to the U.S. preliminary roster but did not make the team.

## BU ENDS BAD STREAK

BU had allowed at least one goal in 19 straight periods before holding Notre Dame scoreless in the second period of a 3-3 tie at the Shillelagh Tournament on Jan. 2.

## CRUNCH TIME

BU is 58-2-5 in the last 65 games in which it has led after two periods and 23-7-6 in the last 36 games in which it was tied after two periods.

## AN OCTOBER TO REMEMBER

This was the first time a Terrier squad entered November with six wins, as the previous best was four in 2008-09.

## MIDDLE-PERIOD BONANZA

Forty-four of the Terriers' 112 goals this season have been scored in the second period.

## DOWN TO THE WIRE

## SPREADING IT OUT

- BU finished 3-4-2 in non-conference play with wins over Wisconsin, Notre Dame and Harvard.

## YOUNG SQUAD

- The Terriers are one of the youngest teams in the country, as their average age is 21 years and underclassmen take up 17 of the 25 spots on the roster.
- Eight players made their collegiate debut at the season-opening Ice Breaker tournament and the opening-night roster against Wisconsin featured six freshmen and seven sophomores.

## QUICK HITS

- Terrier defensemen have garnered a combined seven All-America accolades in the last five years and at least one BU blueliner has been represented on the Hockey East All-Star First Team in each of the last six seasons.
- BU has not missed the NCAA tournament in consecutive seasons since not qualifying for three

straight years from 1987-89.

- BU tied for the nation lead in shorthanded goals last season with 10 and then-sophomore David Warsofsky recorded four of them to also share the nation lead.

## GILL HONORED FOR STRONG OCTOBER

- After making an immediate impact on the BU lineup, Sahir Gill was named Hockey East Rookie of the Month for October.
- Gill registered eight points (3g, 5a) and a plus-7 rating in the month. In just his second collegiate game, Gill tallied a goal and three assists to lead BU to a 5-4 victory over Notre Dame in the championship game of the Ice Breaker Tournament.

## CONNOLLY NAMED PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Chris Connolly was named the Hockey East Player of the Week on Nov. 1 after leading BU to a weekend sweep of UMass Lowell.
- Connolly scored the game-winning goal in each of the Terriers' wins over the River Hawks, including a thrilling tally on Saturday at Agganis Arena with 27.5 seconds left in regulation to give BU a 2-1 come-from-behind victory.
- This was the second time Connolly has received the league's top weekly honor

## BU CLAIMS THIRD ICE BREAKER TITLE

- Sean Escobedo scored his first career goal with 1:07 left in regulation to lift BU to a wild 5-4 victory over then-No. 17 Notre Dame in the title game of the Warrior Ice Breaker Tournament on Oct. 10 in St. Louis.
- Sahir Gill turned in an strong performance with a goal and three assists while David Warsofsky added a goal and a helper to finish the tournament with five points (2g, 3a).
- It marked the third time in four appearances the Terriers have claimed the Ice Breaker title, as they also won the season-opening tournament in 2002 and 2008.

## WARSOFSKY, GILL HAUL IN WEEKLY HONORS

- After helping BU claim the title at the Ice Breaker Tournament, David Warsofsky and Sahir Gill were named Hockey East Player and Rookie of the Week, respectively, on Oct. 11.
- Warsofsky also took home Inside College Hockey Player of the Week honors. He was the first Terrier to earn INCH's national weekly accolade since Bryan Ewing on Nov. 11, 2007.
- Warsofsky scored a game-best three points (1g, 2a) in a 4-3 win over No. 14 Wisconsin before adding a goal and an assist in the 5-4 victory against No. 17 Notre Dame in the title game to finish the weekend with five points.
- The blueliner helped the Terriers go 3-of-5 with the man advantage in the Wisconsin game by earning three power-play points.
- Highlighted by a four-point effort (1g, 3a) in the title game against the Fighting Irish, Gill also had five points on the weekend in what was an impressive collegiate debut.
- The forward earned the primary assist on both game-winning goals, first setting up a breakaway for senior Joe Pereira against the Badgers before winning a late faceoff against Notre Dame that directly led to sophomore Sean Escobedo's game-winner.
- Gill earned a plus-5 rating for the tournament,



including a plus-4 in the title contest. His four-point effort was the best by a BU rookie since Colin Wilson had a goal and three assists against Merrimack on Jan. 18, 2008.

## BETWEEN THE PIPES

For the second straight year, the Terriers returned all three of their goaltenders from the previous season, including Kieran Millan, the 2009 HCA National Rookie of the Year.

## WEARING THE "C"

Senior forward Joe Pereira and junior forward Chris Connolly serve as co-captains of the Terriers this season. Junior defenseman David Warsofsky is an assistant captain.

## WELCOME ABOARD

The Terriers welcomed eight freshmen - five forwards, three defensemen - to their roster this season. Two members of the class (Yasin Cisse, Charlie Coyle) were selected in this year's NHL Entry Draft, while two others (Adam Clendening, Matt Nieto) are considered to be early-round prospects for next year's draft.

## 89TH SEASON

The Terriers are in their 89th season of intercollegiate play and currently hold a 1403-805-142 (.627) record. BU's 1,402 wins are only surpassed by Minnesota (1,628 wins - 90 seasons) and Michigan (1,528 wins - 89 seasons). The three programs represent a trio of the top NCAA Division

I college hockey conferences in the WCHA (Minnesota), CCHA (Michigan) and Hockey East (BU), and hold a combined 19 national titles between them.

## COACH PARKER NOTES

### 38th SEASON ON THE TERRIER BENCH

BU head coach Jack Parker is now in his 38th season and holds an overall record of 853-440-112 (.647). His 853 wins mark the most of any college hockey coach at the same institution, while he ranks second among active coaches in wins and fourth in winning percentage.

### IN THE HOCKEY EAST TOURNAMENT

Tonight will be Parker's 90th Hockey East tournament game behind the BU bench and he holds a record of 57-31-1. No coach in league history has more wins in the tournament.

### VS. THE HUSKIES

Parker has coached 137 games against the Huskies — second only to his 146 match-ups with Boston College — and has an impressive 94-35-8 (.715) record against them.

### VS. CRONIN

Parker is 17-4-5 (.750) in his 26 contests where he has coached against Greg Cronin, including both games last weekend when Cronin was suspended. This record also includes a 16-4-4 (.750) mark since Cronin took over the post at Northeastern. When Cronin was the interim head coach at Maine during the 1995-96 season, Parker went 1-0-1 against him.

### PARKER RECEIVES LESTER PATRICK AWARD

• Parker was honored on Oct. 27 at TD Garden as one of four recipients of the Lester Patrick Award, presented by the NHL to people who have made outstanding contributions to the sport in the United States.

• Also honored were Cam Neely, Jerry York and David Andrews.
