
SCOUTING THE SIOUX



GONE BUT NOT FORGOTTEN

The Terriers lost four members from last year's squad, but all four had a lasting impact on the program. Lauren Cherewyk, Jillian Kirchner, Holly Lorms and Catherine Ward were all key contributers to the Terriers' success in 2010-11. Between the four skaters, BU lost 31 goals, 67 assists and 98 points from the previous year.

TOP RETURNERS
