• BU hits the road for the first time this season as the Terriers travel to Potsdam, N.Y., to take on the Clarkson Golden Knights. Puck drop is scheduled for 3 p.m.



BU VS. CLARKSON

• The Terriers are 2-1-0 all-time against Clarkson. The home team has won all three times the teams have met, with BU getting the best of Clarkson, 3-2, last season at

Walter Brown Arena. Last time the Terriers visited Cheel Arena, the Golden Knights defeated BU, 7-2.

SCOUTING THE GOLDEN KNIGHTS

• Clarkson is in the midst of a four game unbeaten streak (3-0-1), including a sweep of Syracuse last weekend in a home-and-home series. The Golden Knights' only loss came against St. Lawrence, the Terriers' opponent tomorrow afternoon.

• Sophomore Jamie Lee Rattray leads Clarkson in points (12) and assists (9), and is tied with three teammates for the team-lead in goals with three. Classmate Carly Mercer (3-4-7) is second in points, followed by junior Danielle Skirrow (3-3-6).

• Sophomore goaltender Erica Howe has started all six games for the Golden Knights this season. She owns a 3-1-2 record with 2.59 goals-against average and a .902 save percentage.

TERRIERS AGAINST THE ECAC

• BU went 8-0-0 against ECAC foes last year, including a 4-1 win against Cornell in the NCAA semifinals. Last weekend, the Terriers dispatched their first ECAC opponent of the season, Union, 6-2. The Terriers have not lost to an ECAC opponent since dropping a 3-1 decision to Princeton on Nov. 27, 2009.

LAST TIME OUT

The Terriers hosted Union this past Saturday at Walter Brown Arena. Paced by freshman forward Kayla Tutino's first collegiate hat-trick, BU defeated the Dutchwomen, 6-2. Senior forward Jenn Wakefield potted a pair of power play goals, and classmate Jenelle Kohanchuk tallied a trio of assists. Sophomore Braly Hiller stopped 27 shots to earn her first collegiate win.

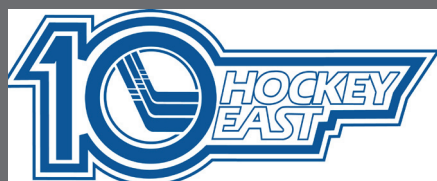

HIGH PRAISE FROM HOCKEY EAST

For the third consecutive week, a BU skater was honored by Hockey East. This time it was rookie sensation Kayla Tutino, who reaped Rookie of the Week laurels for her hat-trick against Union on Saturday. Senior captain Jenn Wakefield was Player of the Week two weeks in a row prior to this weekend.

TERRIFIC TUTINO

Freshman forward Kayla Tutino has made an immediate impact on the Terriers this season, and her playmaking abilities were on display last weekend. She recorded the first hat-trick of her collegiate career, and on top of that became the national leader in shorthanded goals when she potted her second of the season on Saturday. The Lorraine, Que., native is third in the nation and tops in the conference among rookie goal-scorers with four.

WICKED GOOD WAKEFIELD

Senior captain Jenn Wakefield has been phenomenal so far for the Terriers, as she is among the national leaders in many categories. The Pickering, Ont., native is first in the country in power play goals with five. Her seven goals are tops in Hockey East and second in the nation, and her 11 points (7-4--11) are best in the conference and tied for fifth-

best in the NCAA.

SUREHANDED WHEN SHORTHANDED

The Terriers have not reverted to just playing defense when on the penalty kill, as they have scored four shorthanded goals in the first five games to vault to the top of the national leaderboard in that category. Seniors Jenn Wakefield and Jenelle Kohanchuk, along with rookie Kayla Tutino, have all lit the lamp while down a player. Tutino leads the nation with two shorthanded strikes.

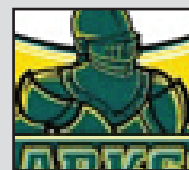
BALANCE BETWEEN THE PIPES

The Terriers have won the past three games with three different starting goaltenders, and in all three games the backstops were brilliant. Sophomore Kerrin Sperry stopped 18 shots to earn a win against Niagara on Oct. 7, which was followed up by a 29-save performance from junior Alissa Fromkin in a 5-2 win over Niagara on Oct. 8. Sophomore Braly Hiller got the nod this past Saturday and made 27 saves for her first collegiate win, 6-2, over Union.

IDES OF OCTOBER

October 15 has been a productive day in junior Jill Cardella's career at BU. Last season, she notched two assists in a 7-2 win against Wayne State on Oct.

15, 2010. This year, the Terriers faced Union on Oct. 15, and Cardella once again assisted twice to help the Terriers emerge victorious.

Senior Kasey Boucher has also had success on the Ides of October. She had the game-winning goal against Wayne State last season, and she repeated the feat this year against Union.

KILLING 'EM SOFTLY

The Terriers have been excellent on the penalty kill this season, as they have killed off 32-of-34 (94.1%) power play chances they have faced. The third-best PK in the nation has scored more goals than it allowed, as BU has tallied four markers while down a player.

MULTI-POINT MANIA

Five Terriers earned multiple points against Union on Saturday. Kayla Tutino (3-0--3) and Jenelle Kohanchuk (0-3--3) led the way with three points apiece, while Jenn Wakefield (2-0--2), Jill Cardella (0-2--2) and Kaleigh Fratkin (0-2--2) each recorded a pair of points.

POINT STREAKS APLENTY

Several BU skaters are currently enjoying a point streak as the Terriers embark on a five-game road trip. Jenelle Kohanchuk, Kathryn Miller and Jenn Wakefield are each on a three-game streak. Wakefield has multiple points in all of those games, while Kohanchuk and Miller registered at least two points in two of the three contests.

Kasey Boucher is working on two straight games with a point, as she had a helper on Oct. 8 against Niagara before she lit the lamp on Oct. 15 against Union.

SUPER SATURDAY FOR SARAH

Rookie forward Sarah Bayersdorfer notched her first collegiate point on Saturday against Union, as she assisted on Kasey Boucher's game-winning goal. The Short Hills, N.J., native was integral in the BU attack all game, as she registered five shots and finished with a plus-1 rating.

MILLER TIME

Junior defenseman Kathryn Miller has been terrific in not only preventing

the opposition from getting on the scoreboard, but she's also been a huge help to her teammates as they light the lamp. The Milverton, Ont., native has five assists this season, all of which have come in the past three games. She recorded a pair of assists in each of the two wins against Niagara before adding another one to her resume against Union on Saturday.

FUN ON FRIDAY

BU has had great success when facing off on Friday over the past two seasons. The Terriers went 9-0-2 last season to close out the work week, and this year BU is 2-0-0. The last time the Terriers lost on a Friday was Jan. 29, 2010, when they dropped a 2-0 decision to Connecticut. Coincidentally, that was also the last time BU was shut out by an opponent.

OFF TO THE POLLS

For the third week in a row, BU is ranked fourth in both the USCHO.com poll and the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine poll. The Terriers join No. 5/6 Boston College and No. 8 Northeastern as the representatives from Hockey East in the polls.

DEFENSIVE DISTRIBUTION

The BU blue-liners have been a big reason why the offense has been so productive. Between the six regular defensemen that have played on the back end this season, they have combined for one goal and 10 assists for 11 points. Kathryn Miller leads the group with five assists so far this year.

IMPRESSIVE INTRODUCTION

TOP RETURNERS

- BU brings back four of its top six scorers from 2010-11.
- Senior captain Jenn Wakefield (32-22-54), sophomore forward Marie-Philip Poulin (24-23-47), senior forward Jenelle Kohanchuk (10-21--31) and senior defenseman Tara Watchorn (6-19--25) finished first, second, fourth and sixth, respectively, on the team in scoring last year.
- Wakefield and Poulin were each nominated for the Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award last year.
- Poulin was the Hockey East Rookie of the Year, and she joined Wakefield as a Hockey East First-Team All-Star.
- Kohanchuk led the Terriers in plus/minus last season, as she registered a plus-27 rating.
- Watchorn is the leading scorer among returning defensemen. Classmates Kasey Boucher (4-10-14) and Carly Warren (3-11--14), along with junior Kathryn Miller (4-10--14) are all tied for second behind Watchorn with 14 points.
- Sophomore Kerrin Sperry was the 2011 Hockey East Goaltending Champion. She went 21-4-3 and led the Terriers with a 1.63 goals-against average, .929 save percentage and six shutouts.

NEW KIDS AT THE RINK

- The Terriers welcome four newcomers to the program in 2011-12, including three freshmen and a transfer student.
- Sarah Bayersdorfer and Kayla Tutino are freshman forwards, while Shannon Stoneburgh is a rookie defenseman.
- Junior forward Isabel Menard comes to BU by way of Syracuse, where she played the previous two seasons. In 67 games with the Orange, the Ottawa, Ont., native tallied 34 goals and added 46 assists for 80 points.

BU IN THE RANKINGS

- The Terriers were ranked in both national polls' preseason editions.
- In the USCHO.com poll, the Terriers were picked second, their highest preseason ranking in program history.
