 • Junior Brianna Decker leads the Badgers on offense, as she has a team-best nine goals, 10 assists and 19 points. Senior Hilary Knight is tied with Decker for the team-lead in goals, and her 14 points are good for third-best on the squad. Classmate Brooke Ammerman is second on the Badgers with 15 points (7-8--15).
 • Sophomore Alex Rigsby has started all eight games between the pipes. She owns a record of 7-1-0 with a goals-against average of 2.04 and a save percentage of .930.

TERRIERS AGAINST THE WCHA

• BU is 1-1-0 this season against the WCHA, with the Terriers splitting a pair of home games against North Dakota to open the regular season. They are 2-7-4 all-time against WCHA opponents.

LAST TIME OUT

Sophomore goaltender Kerrin Sperry held strong for the Terriers on Saturday, as she made 36 saves to preserve a 3-2 win at St. Lawrence. Freshman forward Kayla Tutino, junior forward Shannon Mahoney and senior captain Jenn Wakefield all lit the lamp for BU, with Wakefield earning the game-winner. Tutino picked up an assist on Mahoney's goal for a two-point afternoon, while junior forward Cristina Wiley collected her first helper of the year. CHASING THE CENTURY MARK

Senior captain Jenn Wakefield is just one goal shy of 100 for her career. She notched her 40th career goal with the Terriers on Saturday against St. Lawrence. She currently has eight goals and five assists for 13 points this year; the former New Hampshire Wildcat has 162 career points entering this weekend.

SPECTACULAR SPERRY

Sophomore Kerrin Sperry turned in two fantastic performances last weekend in the North Country. She first stopped 32 Clarkson shots to preserve a 2-2 tie before she made 36 saves to lead BU to a 3-2 win at St. Lawrence. The 36 saves are one shy of a season and career-best of 37 saves, set against North Dakota on Oct. 1.

TERRIFIC TUTINO

Freshman forward Kayla Tutino has made an immediate impact on the Terriers this season. She recorded the game-tying goal last Friday against Clarkson before tallying a goal and an assist against St. Lawrence the next afternoon. On Oct. 15 against Union, she recorded the first hat-trick of her collegiate career, also becoming the national leader in shorthanded goals when she potted her second of the season. The Lorraine,

Que., native is tied for second in the nation and tops in the conference among rookie goal-scorers with six.

WICKED GOOD WAKEFIELD

Senior captain Jenn Wakefield has been phenomenal so far for the Terriers, as she is among the national leaders in many categories. The Pickering, Ont., native is first in the country in power play goals with five. Her eight goals are tops in Hockey East and tied for fifth in the nation, and her 13 points (8-5--13) are best in the conference and tied for 12th-best in the NCAA.

HOCKEY EAST HIATUS

BU will be the last team to play a conference contest among Hockey East schools this season, as Northeastern becomes the seventh squad to play its first conference clash on Friday against Maine. The Terriers open their conference campaign on Wednesday when they visit Boston College.

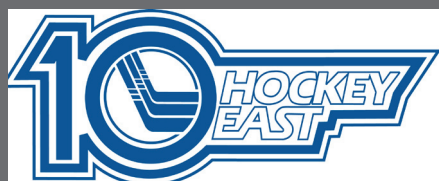
KILLING 'EM SOFTLY

OPENING THEIR ACCOUNTS

Two Terriers earned their first goal or point of the season against St. Lawrence last Saturday. Junior forward Shannon Mahoney lit the lamp for the first time, while classmate Cristina Wiley earned her first point of the year with an assist on Kayla Tutino's tally.

FUN ON FRIDAY

BU has had great success when facing off on Friday over the past two seasons. The Terriers went 9-0-2 last season to close out the work week, and this year BU is 2-0-1. The last time the Terriers lost on a Friday was Jan. 29, 2010, when they dropped a 2-0 decision to Connecticut. Coincidentally, that was also the last time BU was shut out by an opponent.

SUREHANDED WHEN SHORTHANDED

The Terriers have not reverted to just playing defense when on the penalty kill, as they have scored four shorthanded goals in the first six games to vault to the top of the national leaderboard in that category. Seniors Jenn Wakefield and Jenelle Kohanchuk, along with rookie Kayla Tutino, have all lit the lamp while down a player. Tutino leads the nation with two shorthanded strikes.

BALANCE BETWEEN THE PIPES

Entering last weekend, the Terriers have won the past three games with three different starting goaltenders, and in all three games the backstops were brilliant. Sophomore Kerrin Sperry stopped 18 shots to earn a win against Niagara on Oct. 7, which was followed up by a 29-save performance from junior Alissa Fromkin in a 5-2 win over Niagara on Oct. 8. Sophomore Braly Hiller got the nod this past Saturday and made 27 saves for her first collegiate win, 6-2, over Union.

Sperry has since returned to the starting role, making 68 saves in two games last weekend to post a 1-0-1 record.

IDES OF OCTOBER

October 15 has been a productive day in junior Jill Cardella's career at BU. Last season, she notched two assists in a 7-2 win against Wayne State on Oct. 15, 2010. This year, the Terriers faced

Union on Oct. 15, and Cardella once again assisted twice to help the Terriers emerge victorious.

Senior Kasey Boucher has also had success on the Ides of October. She had the game-winning goal against Wayne State last season, and she repeated the feat this year against Union.

MULTI-POINT MANIA

Five Terriers earned multiple points against Union on Oct. 15. Kayla Tutino (3-0--3) and Jenelle Kohanchuk (0-3--3) led the way with three points apiece, while Jenn Wakefield (2-0--2), Jill Cardella (0-2--2) and Kaleigh Fratkin (0-2--2) each recorded a pair of points.

GOING STREAKING

Jenn Wakefield's game-winning goal against St. Lawrence on Saturday extended the senior captain's point streak to five games. Rookie forward Kalya Tutino has lit the lamp in three consecutive games.

IMPRESSIVE INTRODUCTION

Junior transfer Isabel Menard had great success in her two seasons at Syracuse, and she has wasted no time bringing that success to BU. The Ottawa, Ont., native was the only Terrier to notch at least one point in the first four games this season. Despite having her point streak snapped last Saturday, she is second on the Terriers with seven points (2-5--7).

THE WARREN COMMISSION

Senior Carly Warren assisted on sophomore Louise Warren's game-winning goal against North Dakota on Sept. 30, marking the first time the two surname-sharing teammates connected for a goal.

GONE BUT NOT FORGOTTEN

The Terriers lost four members from last year's squad, but all four had a lasting impact on the program. Lauren Cherewyk, Jillian Kirchner, Holly Lorms and Catherine Ward were all key contributors to the Terriers' success in 2010-11. Between the four skaters, BU lost 31 goals, 67 assists and 98 points from the previous year.

TOP RETURNERS

- BU brings back four of its top six scorers from 2010-11.
- Senior captain Jenn Wakefield (32-22--54), sophomore forward Marie-Philip Poulin (24-23-47), senior forward Jenelle Kohanchuk (10-21--31) and senior defenseman Tara Watchorn (6-19--25) finished first, second, fourth and sixth, respectively, on the team in scoring last year.
- Wakefield and Poulin were each nominated for the Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award last year.
- Poulin was the Hockey East Rookie of the Year, and she joined Wakefield as a Hockey East First-Team All-Star.
- Kohanchuk led the Terriers in plus/minus last season, as she registered a plus-27 rating.
- Watchorn is the leading scorer among returning defensemen. Classmates Kasey Boucher (4-10-14) and Carly Warren (3-11--14), along with junior Kathryn Miller (4-10--14) are all tied for second behind

Watchorn with 14 points.

- Sophomore Kerrin Sperry was the 2011 Hockey East Goaltending Champion. She went 21-4-3 and led the Terriers with a 1.63 goals-against average, .929 save percentage and six shutouts.

NEW KIDS AT THE RINK

- The Terriers welcome four newcomers to the program in 2011-12, including three freshmen and a transfer student.
- Sarah Bayersdorfer and Kayla Tutino are freshman forwards, while Shannon Stoneburgh is a rookie defenseman.
- Junior forward Isabel Menard comes to BU by way of Syracuse, where she played the previous two seasons. In 67 games with the Orange, the Ottawa, Ont., native tallied 34 goals and added 46 assists for 80 points.

BU IN THE RANKINGS

- The Terriers were ranked in both national polls' preseason editions.
- In the USCHO.com poll, the Terriers were picked second, their highest preseason ranking in program history.
- In the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine poll, the Terriers grabbed the No. 3 spot.
- BU was the highest ranked Hockey East team in both polls.

ROSTER TIDBITS

- The Terriers return 21 letter winners from their squad that finished as national finalists.
