BEANPOT TUESDAY

• Boston University plays host to the 34th annual Women's Beanpot this year, the second time BU has hosted the event as a varsity program.

• The Terriers open the tournament against No. 8/9 Harvard at 8 p.m., with Boston College and Northeastern skating in the first game at 5 p.m.

BU IN THE BEANPOT

• The Terriers have claimed one Beanpot title, as they won the 1981 tournament as a club team.

• Overall, BU is 12-45-2 in the Tournament; as a Division I program, BU has posted a 4-6-2 mark.

• As a varsity program, The Terriers have advanced to the title game twice and have never finished fourth.

• This is the second time BU has hosted the Beanpot at Walter Brown Arena as a varsity squad. The first time, in 2008, the Terriers advanced to the title game but fell short against No. 1 Harvard, 3-1.

CATCHING UP WITH THE CRIMSON

• Harvard has won five of its last six games,



including a current stretch of three straight triumphs.

• Junior goaltender Laura Bellamy has been unbeatable in the last three wins, as she has compiled a shutout streak

of 11 periods.

• Offensively, junior Jillian Dempsey leads the Crimson in goals (13), assists (13) and points (13).

• A quartet of sophomores has provided much of the scoring this season, as Lyndsey Fry (11g, 11a), Marissa Gedman (5g, 12a), Kalley Armstrong (4g, 12a) and Gina McDonald (10g, 6a) are all having strong seasons.

ALL-TIME SERIES AGAINST HARVARD

• The Terriers are 1-3-0 all-time against Harvard. The Crimson owns a 3-0-0 record against BU in the Beanpot, but the Terriers are 1-0-0 in non-tournament competition.

LAST TIME AGAINST HARVARD

• BU defeated Harvard, 5-3, on Dec. 10, 2010, at Bright Hockey Center.

• Marie-Philip Poulin scored twice while Jenn Wakefield notched one goal and two assists in the victory.

• Jenelle Kohanchuk added three assists.

- The third period was the charm for BU, as the Terriers tallied a trio of goals in the final frame to knock off No. 6 Northeastern, 3-2, at Agganis Arena on Saturday.

- BU tied the game twice in third before Jenn Wakefield gave the Terriers their first lead of the contest with 1:49 remaining in regulation.

- Sophomore Kerrin Sperry stopped 28 shots to earn her third straight victory.

BUSY AGAINST BOSTON

- While BU officially hosts the Beanpot tonight, the Terriers have held an unofficial prequel to the proceedings over the past week.

- BC visited Walter Brown on Wednesday night, while the Eagles' opening round opponent, Northeastern, skated at Agganis Arena on Saturday.

- This is the first time that BU has faced each Beanpot team back-to-back-to-back as a varsity program.

SPERRY HONORED BY HOCKEY EAST

- Sophomore goaltender Kerrin Sperry was named Hockey East Co-Player of the Week on Monday after two stellar performances between the pipes.

- She stopped 30 shots to earn her first shutout of the season against BC on Wednesday before she held Northeastern

to just two goals on Saturday.

- This is the third time the North Reading, Mass., native has been recognized by the league.

- She reaped Defensive Player of the Week laurels on Oct. 3 and Nov. 7.

TOP OF THE HOCKEY EAST CLASS

- BU boasts three Hockey East Top Performers for the week of Jan. 30.

- Junior forwards Taylor Holze and Isabel Menard join senior captain Jenn Wakefield as the honorees.

- Holze had three points (1g, 2a) against BC on Wednesday before she contributed an assist on Saturday.

- Menard notched her 100th and 101st point on Wednesday and scored a goal on Saturday.

- Wakefield scored a shorthanded goal on Wednesday before she assisted on the tying goal and notched the game-winner on Saturday.

FANTASTIC IN THE FINAL MINUTES

- The Terriers have not given away late leads this season, as BU is 10-1-0 when ahead after two periods.

- What's even more impressive is that in games decided by two goals or fewer, the Terriers have out-scored their opponents, 9-1, in the final six minutes of the third period.

- Several Terriers currently have multi-game point streaks entering tonight.
- Senior captain Jenn Wakefield has notched at least one point in her last 10 games (7g, 10a).
- Sophomore Marie-Philip Poulin has points (3g, 2a) in her last four tilts.
- Junior Isabel Menard is enjoying a three-game streak (2g, 2a).

BLOWING OUT BOSTON COLLEGE

- BU got its third win against a ranked opponent this season when the Terriers dominated No. 4 BC to the tune of a 6-0 win on Wednesday night.
- Junior forward Isabel Menard notched her 100th and 101st career point.
- Six different Terriers lit the lamp, while four BU skaters mustered multiple points.
- Sophomore goaltender Kerrin Sperry made 30 saves to earn her first shutout of the season.

MENARD REACHES A MILESTONE

- Junior forward Isabel Menard became the Terrier to reach the 100-point plateau on Wednesday night with a second period assist.
- The Ottawa, Ont., native added another assist in the third period.
- She is the second BU skater to reach a major milestone against BC this season, as Jenn Wakefield scored her 100th career goal against the Eagles on Nov. 2, also in a Terrier victory.

SUPER IN EVERY SITUATION

- BU scored a goal no matter how many skaters were on the ice on Wednesday against BC.
- The Terriers scored three straight even strength goals before they converted a pair of power play chances to make it 5-0.
- Jenn Wakefield finished the trifecta with a shorthanded goal to make it 6-0.

TRIO OF POINTS FOR TAYLOR

- Junior forward Taylor Holze had the scoring touch on Wednesday, as she factored in three of the Terriers' six goals against BC.
- The Lynbrook, N.Y., native's three points is a career-best in a single game.
- She now has four goals and five assists for nine points this season.

NO SCORER LEFT BEHIND

- The score sheet from Wednesday's 6-0 win over BC had plenty of variety, as six different skaters lit the lamp for the Terriers.
- Taylor Holze, Caroline Campbell, Marie-Philip Poulin, Tara Watchorn, Louise Warren and Jenn Wakefield all scored for BU.
- It is the first time BU has had six different goal scorers since Nov. 26, 2010, when eight different Terriers scored to defeat Princeton, 8-2.
- Coincidentally, that 8-2 victory came before the Terriers played at Agganis Arena.

HOCKEY EAST HONORS FOR WAKEFIELD

- Senior forward Jenn Wakefield was named Hockey East Player of the Week by the league office on Monday.
- The Pickering, Ont., native notched seven points (4g, 3a) in two games during the week.
- It is the third time this season that Wakefield has been named Player of the Week.
- She also received Player of the Month honors for her stellar play in October.

HATS OFF TO JENN

• Senior Jenn Wakefield recorded her first collegiate hat trick on Jan. 21 as part of a six-point effort against Vermont.

- Wakefield had 29 two-goal games prior to Saturday's offensive outburst.
- She is the second Terrier to notch a hat trick this season, as freshman Kayla Tutino accomplished the feat on Oct. 15 against Union, also in a 6-2 win.
- Wakefield also topped her previous single-game high of five points on Saturday. She had scored five points just once, on Jan. 16, 2009, against Dartmouth.

CAN'T STOP CARDELLA

- Junior forward Jill Cardella has been on a roll over the past five games.
- The Rochester, N.Y., native has notched three goals and two assists during that stretch, including a three-game point streak that was snapped on Wednesday.
- Cardella scored the first goal of the game on Saturday against Northeastern.

- It was her longest point streak since she compiled a three-gamer in February 2010.

POWER SURGE

- BU has recently found its groove with a player advantage.
- The Terriers have scored a power play goal in 11 of the last 16 games and seven of the last nine contests.
- They were 2-of-3 with a player advantage on Wednesday against BC.
- BU has been particularly strong on the power play in conference contests, as the Terriers rank first in Hockey East with a 19.5 percent conversion rate in league games.

KILLING 'EM SOFTLY

- The Terriers have the fourth-best penalty killing unit in the nation, as BU has successfully killed off 130 of 147 power play chances (.884) it has faced this season.
- BU has held its last nine league opponents to an 6-of-62 (.097) mark on the power play, including a stretch of 25

- What makes the Terriers' ranking even more impressive is that they have killed off the most penalties among the top-20 teams statistically.

TERRIFIC TUTINO

- Rookie forward Kayla Tutino has made a tremendous impact on the Terriers this season.
- After she notched a goal and added an assist on Saturday, Tutino now has points in six of the last eight games (3g, 2a).
- The Lorraine, Que., native is ninth in the league in scoring with 22 points and third among Hockey East rookies.
- She is also tied for fifth among league goal scorers.

FRATKIN ON FIRE

- Sophomore Kaleigh Fratkin has been a key part of the BU offense over the past few games.
- She put together her second career multi-point game on Wednesday when she registered two assists in the 6-0 victory.
- Fratkin also scored her second goal of the season on Jan. 19 at New Hampshire.
- Overall, the Burnaby, B.C., native has two goals and five assists for seven points.

POULIN PICKS UP WHERE SHE LEFT OFF

- Sophomore forward Marie-Philip Poulin returned to the lineup on Wednesday after missing three games due to injury.
- Poulin, who had tallied two goals and an assist in her previous two games, collected the Terriers' third goal of the game against BC and followed that up with an assist on Jenn Wakefield's game-winner on Saturday.
- The Beauceville, Que., native now has three goals and two assist for five points in six contests.

THE WARREN COMMISSION

- Sophomore Louise Warren has three points over the last two games, including an assist on Jenn Wakefield's game-winner on Saturday.
- Warren recorded her second multi-point game of the season on Wednesday against BC (1g, 1a).
- She had previously had a pair of helpers against Providence on Dec. 3.

MENARD AND WATCHORN AT MECO CUP

- Junior forward Isabel Menard and senior captain Tara Watchorn missed helped Team Canada win a bronze medal at the 2012 Meco Cup in Germany.
- Senior Jenelle Kohanchuk and sophomore Marie-Philip Poulin were also invited, but both skaters were unable to attend.
- Watchorn, the Team Canada captain at this tournament, had two goals and one assist, while Menard finished with one goal and two assists.
- Menard assisted on Watchorn's strike in a 6-0 win over Switzerland.

FINISHING THE JOB

- When the Terriers get ahead after two periods, don't expect a letdown.
- BU is 10-1-0 when leading after two periods this year.
- Counting last season, the Terriers are 34-1-1 when leading after the second stanza.

FRESHMEN FINISHERS

- With her 10th goal of the season on Dec. 4, freshman forward Kayla Tutino became the ninth Terrier to notch at least 10 goals in her rookie campaign.
- Tutino is the ninth BU rookie to reach the 10-goal plateau in program history.
- Marie-Philip Poulin accomplished that feat last season, finishing the year with 24 goals.

A LITTLE HELP FOR HER FRIENDS

- Senior captain Jenn Wakefield has tallied an assist in eight of the last 10 games.
- She had three against Vermont on Jan. 21 and one on Saturday against Northeastern.
- Wakefield is second in Hockey East with 20 assists, while she leads all league skaters in conference competition with 14 helpers.

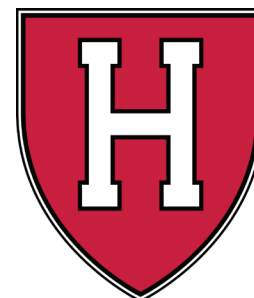
