THE GAME: Boise State will close the 2013 season with its 12th-consecutive bowl appearance, squaring off against Oregon State in the Sheraton Hawai'i Bowl, Dec. 24.

The Broncos (8-4) and Beavers (6-6) are slated to kick off at 6 p.m. (MT) at Aloha Stadium, and the game will be nationally-televised by ESPN.

THE SERIES: Oregon State leads the all-time series 4-3, but the Broncos have won each of the last two games, and are 3-2 against the Beavers since joining what is now the Football Bowl Subdivision in 1996.

Boise State defeated OSU 42-14 in 2006 (Sept. 7) and 37-24 in 2010 (Sept. 25). The last loss to the Beavers came in 2005 (30-27; Sept. 10). The teams have never met in a bowl game.

Broncos in the Polls

IT'S BEEN A WHILE: The Broncos did not receive a vote in either the Associated Press or USA Today Coaches' Polls Sept. 22, ending a streak of 125-consecutive polls with at least one vote.

It marked the first time the Broncos had been without a point in each since Oct. 16, 2005.

BRONCOS IN THE POLLS: Boise State entered the 2013 season ranked No. 19 in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches' Preseason Polls.

Boise State is one of only 11 schools to open each of the last five seasons - dating back to 2009 - ranked in the Coaches' Poll, and one of only 12 to open each of the last five seasons ranked in the AP Poll.

A DOZEN YEARS IN THE RANKINGS: When Boise State opened the 2013 season ranked in both the USA Today Coaches' and Associated Press Preseason Polls, it marked the 12th-consecutive season the Broncos had been ranked for at least one week in each of the top-25 polls.

SUCCESS WHEN RANKED: Boise State has an all-time record of 88-11 (.889) when ranked in the top 25 of the media and/or coaches polls. A complete breakdown of every game played while ranked can be found on page 15.

IT'S ABOUT WHERE YOU FINISH: Boise State has started each of the last five seasons - including 2013 - ranked in each major preseason poll. But the Broncos have also finished each of the last five seasons (2008-12) in each, tied for the second-longest streak in the country with Alabama. Only Oregon (six) has a longer streak.

BRONCO GAME NOTES

ALL-MW: The Broncos had 10 individuals named to the 2013 All-Mountain West Teams, including first-team honorees Jay Ajayi (RB), Charles Leno, Jr. (OL), Demarcus Lawrence (DL) and Ricky Tjong-A-Tjoe (DL). Matt Paradis (OL), Donte Deayon (CB) and Jeremy Ioane (S) were named second team, while Dan Goodale (K), Matt Miller (WR) and Shane Williams-Rhodes (WR) were named honorable mention. Williams-Rhodes earned the accolade as both a wide receiver and return specialist.

VS. THE PAC-12: Boise State is 6-2 against schools from the Pac-12 since 2006, not including wins against Utah in both 2006 and 2010. The only losses have come to Washington, in both 2007 and earlier this season. The Broncos are 7-11 all-time against the Pac-12.

VS. BCS SCHOOLS: The Broncos are 9-3 against schools from BCS automatic-qualifying conferences since 2006. Included was a streak of six-consecutive victories, which was snapped in the 2012 season opener against Michigan State. The only other losses during that time were to Washington, in both 2007 and earlier this season. Boise State is 11-19 all-time against BCS schools.

NON-SATURDAY GAMES: Boise State is 41-10 all-time in games played on any day other than Saturday, including a 6-4 record in bowl games and a 3-1 record on Tuesdays. A complete breakdown of the Broncos' non-Saturday history can be found on page 23 of the game notes.

ESTABLISHING A LEGACY: The Broncos are the winningest football program in the country since 2000, with an overall record of 155-25 (.861).

Oklahoma (152-34; .817), Ohio State (144-34; .809), Texas (140-39; .782) and LSU (142-40; .780) round out the top five.

16-YEAR WINNING STREAK: Including this season, Boise State is riding a streak of 16-consecutive winning seasons. The Broncos went 5-6 in 1997, the last season sans a winning record for the Broncos.

BOWL GAMES: Boise State will be making its 12th-consecutive bowl appearance, tied for the seventh-longest active streak nationally.

The Broncos will have played in a bowl game in 14 of the last 15 seasons, winning nine - including each of the last four.

SENIOR SUCCESS: Boise State's class of 2013 is the 12th-straight group of seniors to win at least 40 games in their careers - an average at least 10 wins per season. This year's class won its 40th game against Nevada (Oct. 19), and has now won 43 games.

SCORING OUTPUT: The Broncos are averaging 38.8 points per game on the season, a mark that ranks 16th-nationally and second in the Mountain West. Over the course of the final 11 games of the regular season, Boise State scored 459 points - an average of 41.7 points per game.

Boise State has scored 40-plus in seven games this season. Included was a four-game stretch with at least 40 points - the longest streak since scoring 40-plus in seven straight during the 2010 season.

Boise State is the highest-scoring team in the country since 2000, averaging 40.33 points per game. Boise State is the only school to average more than 40 points per game during that time. Oregon is second at 37.42 points per game since 2000.

RED ZONE: Boise State has scored on 58-of-64 red zone possessions, the 10th-best mark in the country (.906). Of the 58 scores, 45 were touchdowns.

TD DRIVES: Boise State has scored touchdowns on 59 of its 159 offensive drives in 2013, or nearly 40 percent of the times it has had the ball and is trying to score (.371).

ANOTHER...BRONCO...FIRST DOWN: Boise State has 299 first downs - the 21st-most in the country. Much of this can be attributed to the Broncos' ability to convert on third down. Boise State ranks 20th-nationally in the statistical category, converting 87-of-185 third-down opportunities (.470).

AVOIDING PENALTIES: Boise State has been penalized just 47 times this season, ranking ninth-nationally in fewest penalties per game (3.92). The team's 36.42 penalty yards per game are the 18th-fewest in the country.

BRONCO GAME NOTES

The Broncos were penalized just 59 times during the 2012 season, tied for 18th-nationally in fewest per game (4.54).

COMPLETION PERCENTAGE: Boise State ranks second-nationally in team completion percentage. The Broncos completed 297-of-422 pass attempts during the regular season (.704), trailing only East Carolina (.707).

Boise State completed 29-of-31 passes against Air Force (Sept 13), a completion percentage of .936. The mark broke the NCAA record - minimum 25 completions - which had stood since 1983 (UCLA vs. Washington; 25-of-27).

Included was a conference and school record 27-of-29 (.931) performance from Joe Southwick. Grand Hedrick went 2-for-2.

Southwick has completed 151-of-208 (.726) in 2013, and Hedrick is 135-of-198 (.682). Nick Patti (8-of-11; .727), Thomas Sperbeck (0-of-1), Trevor Harman (2-of-2) and Matt Miller (1-of-2) have each also attempted a pass for the Broncos.

PUNT RETURNS: Boise State ranks second-nationally in punt returns, and seventh-nationally in punt return defense. Boise State, North Carolina and Bowling Green are the only three teams in the country to rank in the top 10 in each category.

The Broncos are averaging 15.70 yards per return, trailing only North Carolina (17.07).

Boise State is allowing just 3.15 yards per return, and has given up just 41 yards this season on 13 returns. Prior to giving up a 41-yard return for a touchdown against San Diego State, the Broncos had allowed negative return yardage through 10 games.

HOME RECORD: Boise State went a perfect 6-0 at home in 2013, the team's first perfect home record since 2010. Boise State lost once at home in both 2011 and 2012, but prior to that had put together five-straight perfect seasons at Bronco Stadium, and nine-straight perfect regular seasons at home. The only home loss during that time came in the 2005 MPC Computers Bowl against Boston College (27-21).

Boise State has the best home winning percentage in the country since the start of the 2000 season with a record of 86-4 (.956).

CONFERENCE RECORD: Since the 2000 season, Boise State is 99-9 (.917) in league games, the highest winning percentage in the country during that time. Oklahoma is second on the list with a record of 99-22 (.818).

MW LOSSES: Boise State has lost just four league games since joining the Mountain West in 2011 - by a combined seven points: TCU in 2011 (36-35); San Diego State in 2012 (21-19); Fresno State (41-40) and SDSU (34-31, OT) in 2013.

Prior to this season, Boise State hadn't lost two league games in a season since 2001, when the team went 6-2 in the team's first season in the Western Athletic Conference.

Prior to the losses against SDSU in both 2012 and 2013, Boise State has not lost a game to the same team in consecutive seasons since falling to Washington State in both 2000 (42-35) and 2001 (41-20). The Broncos had not to a league opponent in back-to-back seasons since North Texas in 1998 and 1999.

RUSH DEFENSE: Boise State allowed fewer than 100 yards rushing in two of its final three games of the regular season: 55 to Wyoming (Nov. 16) and 61 to San Diego State (Nov. 23). The last time Boise State held consecutive opponents to less than 100 yards rushing was in the final two games of 2011. New Mexico picked up 52 yards (Dec. 3), and Arizona State was held to negative-11.

INTERCEPTIONS: Boise State has 15 interceptions in 2013, tied for 27th-nationally.

Included are five from Donte Deayon, tied for the 15th-most in the country, and four each from Bryan Douglas and Darian Thompson, tied for the 34th-most nationally.

Boise State has multiple interceptions in four games this season.

OPPONENT DRIVES: Of the 160 total opponent drives in 2013, 56 have gone for less than 10 yards (.350), and 74 have gone for fewer than 20 yards (.463).

PROLIFIC RECEIVERS: Matt Miller and Shane Williams-Rhodes are tied for the team high with 77 catches in 2013, the second set of teammates to record 70-plus catches in the season all-time at Boise State. Titus Young

and Austin Pettis each had 71 in 2010.

Boise State has had a 100-yard receiver in six games this season, including a streak of four-consecutive games - the longest since a five-game stretch in 1975. The streak ended against Nevada (Oct. 19).

Miller has four 100-yard games this season, Geraldo Boldewijn has two and Jay Ajayi and Williams-Rhodes each have one.

Williams-Rhodes has three games with 10-or-more receptions, the most since Rodney Smith had four such games in 1997. Miller also has one 10-catch game in 2013.

THREE-AND-OUTS: Defensively, Boise State is forcing an average of 4.0 three-and-outs per game (48 in 12 games).

BLOCKED FIELD GOALS: Boise State has blocked three field goal attempts this season, tied for the 20th-most blocked kicks in the country.

Demarcus Lawrence blocked two against Southern Miss (Sept. 28), one of only two individuals in the country to block multiple kicks in a game (Shaquil Barrett; Colorado State). Charles Leno, Jr. blocked a field goal against Utah State (Oct. 12).

The three field goal blocks are the most by a Bronco team since blocking four in 2007.

TURNOVERS: The Broncos have forced 26 turnovers this season, tied for 19th-nationally. The team's turnover margin this season is 0.3, tied for 39th-nationally.

Boise State's turnover margin of 1.54 in 2012 ranked second-best nationally. The Broncos forced 36 turnovers, the fourth-most in the country. Included were 18 interceptions, tied for the 12th-most nationally, and 18 fumble recoveries, the most in the country. Boise State lost just 16, tied for the 20th-fewest nationally.

100 PLAYS: Boise State ran 100 offensive plays against Fresno State, Sept. 20 - tied for the 13th-most run by a team in a college game this season, and one of only 16 such performances on the season. Boise State hadn't run 100 plays since playing Louisiana Tech, Oct. 4, 2003 (106), and it was just the second such performance by the Broncos since Sept. 13, 1975 (Cal State East Bay; 101).

Colorado State ran 109 plays against the Broncos (Nov. 2), tied for the third-most run by a team in 2013.

SHUTOUT STREAK: Boise State has not been shutout in 210-consecutive games, the 18th-longest streak in NCAA history, and the eighth-longest active streak nationally. The last shutout came on the road against No. 15 Washington State, Sept. 27, 1997 (58-0).

The loss to the Cougars is one of only two shutouts the Broncos have suffered since becoming a four-year institution in 1968.

WIDE MARGIN: The Broncos defeated Southern Miss 60-7 (Sept. 28), the largest margin of victory since defeating New Mexico State 59-0, Oct. 2, 2010.

LEAGUE OPENERS: Boise State has won 14-consecutive league openers, the second-longest streak in the country. Alabama owns the nation's longest streak, having won 21-straight.

PROTECTING THE QB: Though the Broncos have given up more sacks this season (21) than they did in 2012 (10), the Broncos have been one of the best teams in the country in protecting the quarterback the last few years.

Boise State, ranked tied for No. 45 this season (1.75 per game), is one of only two schools to rank in the top-10 nationally in sacks allowed each of the last three seasons (2010-12; Air Force). The Broncos led the country in the statistical category in 2011, allowing 0.62 sacks per game. Boise State was also third-nationally in 2010 (0.62) and sixth-nationally in 2012 (0.77).

The Broncos averaged just 0.67 sacks allowed per game the from 2010-12, second only to the Falcons (0.59) during that time. However, the Broncos threw the ball 1,295 times, compared to just 523 attempts for Air Force.

Boise State gave up just 26 sacks from 2010-12 (combined), fewer than 46 teams allowed in 2012 alone.

The Broncos entered 2013 with just 52 returning starts along the offensive line, a mark that ranked 82nd-nationally according to Phil Steele.

BRONCO GAME NOTES

OCTOBER SUCCESS: Prior to the loss against BYU (Oct. 25), Boise State had won 50-consecutive games during the month of October, dating back to a 45-14 loss to Rice, Oct. 6, 2001.

NO PUNTS: The Broncos did not punt against Air Force (Sept. 13), just the second time in the last three seasons the team did not punt in a game. The only other time Boise State did not punt from 2011-13 was against Miami (Ohio), Sept. 15, 2012.

DOESN'T HAPPEN OFTEN: Boise State's game against UT Martin (Sept. 7) marked just the second time in 2,898 days that a Boise State squad took the field with a sub-.500 record. The Broncos were 0-1 when playing Miami (Ohio) Sept. 15, 2012, before evening their record with a 39-12 victory.

Prior to last season, the last time a Boise State team took the field with a record below .500 was in 2005. The Broncos were 1-2 before evening their record against Hawaii with a 44-41 win (Oct. 1, 2005).

10-WIN SEASONS: Boise State's streak of 10-win seasons ended this season at seven. The streak was the longest in the nation, and the tied for the fifth-longest in the modern era (USC; 2002-08). The only longer streaks belong to Florida State (14; 1987-2000), Texas (nine; 2001-09), Virginia Tech (eight; 2004-11) and Miami (eight; 1985-92).

ONCE IN 100-PLUS YEARS: With two losses in 2012, the Broncos failed to reach 12 wins for the first time since 2007. Boise State had won at least 12 games from 2008-11, becoming the first program since 1900 to accomplish the feat. Only USC (2003-05) and Oklahoma (2002-04) had reached 12 wins in three-straight years.

A YOUNG SQUAD: Entering 2013, Boise State had just 16 seniors on its roster. There were only 22 schools with fewer seniors throughout the country.

ELITE-LEVEL DEFENSE: In Pete Kwiatkowski's first three seasons as defensive coordinator (2010-12), opponents averaged just 15.74 points per game – the third-best mark in the country during that time. Only Alabama (10.87) and LSU (15.69) allowed fewer points per game.

scoring defense in 2010, 12th in 2011 and eighth in 2012, one of only six schools in the country to finish each season ranked in the top 25 in the statistical category.

The Broncos were one of only seven teams in the country to finish in the top 25 in total defense each year, ranking second-nationally in 2010, 16th in 2011 and 12th in 2012.

During that time, Boise State was also one of only six teams in the nation to average fewer than 300 yards allowed. Opponents averaged just 297.05 yards per game against the Broncos from 2010-12, a mark that trailed only Alabama, LSU and Florida State.

BRONCOS IN THE NFL: There are currently 18 Broncos on a National Football League roster, and at least one Bronco on 15 teams. Since Chris Petersen took over as head coach in 2006, 17 Broncos have been selected by 15 teams in the NFL Draft – including four first-rounders in a five-season span.

Boise State was one of 24 schools with multiple former student-athletes named to the 2013 Pro Bowl. Left tackle Ryan Clady (Denver Broncos) earned his third Pro Bowl nod last season, while running back Doug Martin (Tampa Bay Buccaneers) made it in his rookie season.

AMONG THE GREATEST: Boise State began the 2013 season with the third-best all-time record among NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision teams. The Broncos' all-time record at the four-year level entering 2013 was 388-148-2 (.723). Michigan led the list with an all-time record of 903-315-36 (.734), followed by Notre Dame at 865-301-42 (.733).

CONFERENCE TITLES: Boise State has won 17 league titles since joining the Big Sky Conference in 1970: six in the Big Sky (1970-95), two in the Big West Conference (1996-2000), eight in the Western Athletic Conference (2001-10) and one in the Mountain West Conference (2011-Present).

The Broncos won five-straight league titles in the WAC from 2002-06, and have captured at least a share of the conference championship

JAY AJAYI RS SOPHOMORE RB

...Jay Ajayi eclipsed 1,000 for the season against Colorado State, the 20th 1,000-yard season in school history, and the fifth-consecutive season with a 1,000-yard rusher for Boise State. Ajayi is the 13th Bronco in school history with a 1,000-yard rushing season.

Ajayi accomplished the feat in nine games, the fewest to 1,000 yards since Ian Johnson reached 1,000 in eight games in 2006. Ajayi also accomplished the feat in 168 carries, the fewest to 1,000 yards since Doug Martin did it in 158 carries in 2010.

...Ajayi has 1,328 rushing yards this season, the fourth-most in school history. He was one of the first 16 players in the country to reach 1,000 yards in 2013, and his 110.7 yards per game ranks 19th-nationally. The mark is also fourth amongst underclassmen.

...Ajayi has 17 touchdowns this season, the third-most in school history and tied for the seventh-most in the country. His scoring average of 9.0 points per game is 20th-nationally, and is ninth amongst running backs.

He has multiple rushing TDs in four games this season, and three games with three-or-more.

...Jay Ajayi caught four passes for 105 yards and a touchdown - all career highs - and added 147 rushing yards against New Mexico (Nov. 30), becoming the first Bronco with both 100 yards rushing and receiving in a game since Karlin Adams accomplished the feat against Eastern Washington, Nov. 4, 1995. Ajayi is just the fourth individual in school history to accomplish the feat.

...Ajayi set career highs in carries (24) and rushing yards (222), in addition to scoring three rushing touchdowns against Nevada, Oct. 19. The yardage total is the fifth-highest in school history, and the most by a Bronco since Ian Johnson had 240 yards against Oregon State, Sept. 7, 2006. Ajayi is the 10th Bronco with a 200-yard rushing performance in school history, and the first since Doug Martin had 200 against Colorado State, Oct. 15, 2011. Included was

a career-high-tying 71-yard run in the third quarter that gave Boise State a 20-17 lead, its first of the game.

...Ajayi has six 100-yard rushing games this season - tied for the eighth-most in school history - and seven for his career.

Included was a streak of three-straight, the longest by a Bronco running back since Doug Martin rushed for 100-plus in each of the final four games of the 2011 season.

Ajayi rushed for 118 yards (on six carries) against New Mexico in 2012, recording his first-career 100-yard game in just his second appearance as a Bronco. It was the first 100-yard game by a Bronco freshman since Matt Kaiserman accomplished the feat against Hawai'i in 2009. Ajayi picked up 71 yards on his first carry against the Lobos, which was also just his second carry as a Bronco.

...Of Ajayi's 82 carries in 2012, only six resulted in lost yardage: two against Southern Miss, and one each against UNLV, Wyoming, Hawai'i and Colorado State.

Through the 2013 regular season, he has been stopped for loss just 16 times in 226 carries (.071).

...Ajayi averaged 6.68 yards on 82 carries in his debut season with the Broncos (2012). The mark is the highest single-season average by a Bronco all-time (minimum 75 attempts).

His 548 yards rushing were the most by a Bronco freshman since Ian Johnson picked up 663 in 2005.

GERALDO BOLDEWIJN RS SENIOR WR

...Geraldo Boldewijn caught six passes for 106 yards against Fresno State (Sept. 20), the first 100-yard receiving game of his career. He followed with three receptions for 104 yards against Southern Miss (Sept. 28), giving him back-to-back 100-yard performances.

...He has 37 catches for 510 yards this season - both career highs. He had eclipsed his previous career highs in five games this season.

...Boldewijn had back-to-back games with a 50-plus-yard reception (Fresno State and Southern Miss), the first Bronco to accomplish the feat since Titus Young had three-straight games with a 50-yard reception, Oct. 26-Nov. 12, 2010.

DONTE DEAYON SOPHOMORE CB

...Donte Deayon has a team-high five interceptions in 2013, tied for the 15th-most nationally. The mark is also the most by a Bronco since Brandyn Thompson had six in 2009.

Included was a streak of three-consecutive games with an interception, the longest by a Bronco since linebacker Korey Hall also had one in three-straight in 2006.

...Deayon is averaging 1.2 pass break-ups per game (14 total in 2013), tied for 29th-nationally.

...Deayon had four passes defended against Colorado State (Nov. 2), tied for the 14th-most in a single game in the NCAA this season (three pass break-ups, one interception).

BRYAN DOUGLAS RS JUNIOR CB

...Bryan Douglas has four interceptions in 2013, tied for the second-most on the team and tied for 34th-nationally. The mark also matches second-round NFL Draft selection Jamar Taylor's team-leading total from 2012.

Included were two against UT Martin (Sept. 7), one of which he returned 33 yards for a touchdown - the first such score since defensive tackle Mike Atkinson accomplished the feat against BYU, Sept. 20, 2012. The multiple-interception game was the first by a Bronco since former cornerback Jerrell Gavins hauled in two against Tulsa, Sept. 24, 2011.

...Douglas tied the school record with a 100-yard kickoff return for a touchdown against San Diego State (Nov. 23), the first such score by a Bronco since Doug Martin returned one against Arizona State in MAACO Bowl Las Vegas, Dec. 22,

2011. Martin's was also a 100-yard return. Douglas' is the fourth 100-yard kickoff return in school history.

DAN GOODALE RS JUNIOR K

...Dan Goodale ranks tied for 20th-nationally in field goal percentage, having converted 14-of-16 attempts (.875). He made 12-straight before missing one against San Diego State.

...He made a career-long 47-yard field goal against Wyoming, the longest by a Bronco since Kyle Brotzman hit a 50-yarder against Fresno State, Nov. 19, 2010.

...Dan Goodale has converted 55 PATs in 2013, a career high and the 10th-most in school history.

GRANT HEDRICK RS JUNIOR QB

...Since stepping in for the injured Joe Southwick, Grant Hedrick has completed 123-of-182 (.676) for 1,329 yards, 14 touchdowns and five interceptions in six games.

Counting only the last six games, his 20.5 completions per game would rank tied for 20th-nationally, and his 221.5 yards per game would rank 45th.

...On the season, Hedrick is completing 68.2 percent of his passes, ranking eighth-nationally. His pass efficiency rating of 149.3 ranks 26th.

...In just his second-career start, Hedrick accounted for each of Boise State's six touchdowns, leading the Broncos to a 42-30 victory. Hedrick threw five touchdown passes, tied for the second-most in school history, and added a rushing score. His six touchdowns are the most by a Bronco quarterback since Ryan Dinwiddie also accounted for six against Nevada, Nov. 29, 2003.

Hedrick completed 19-of-27 passes for 305 yards against the Rams, his first-career 300-yard performance. In addition to the five touchdown passes, he did not throw an interception. He threw touchdown passes

to four different receivers, including a 68-yarder to sophomore Shane Williams-Rhodes - the longest pass play for Boise State since Kellen Moore hit Doug Martin for a 71-yarder against Toledo, Sept. 16, 2011.

...Hedrick has six rushing touchdowns this season, the most by a Bronco quarterback since Jared Zabransky also had six in 2006.

...Hedrick took over at quarterback against Nevada when Joe Southwick was injured on the Broncos' first offensive play, and made his first-career start against BYU (Oct. 25). He is the first back-up quarterback to start a game due to injury since B.J. Rhode in 2002 (Wyoming; Sept. 14).

...Against the Wolf Pack he completed 18-of-21 passes for 150 yards and an interception, and rushed eight times for 115 yards and two touchdowns. His completion percentage (.857) in the game is the seventh-highest single-game mark in school history, and he was the first quarterback to run for more than 100 yards since Jared Zabransky did it against Hawai'i, Oct. 29, 2004 (123).

Hedrick had completed 26-for-36 passes for 249 yards and a touchdown on his career entering the Nevada game.

...He completed 25-of-42 passes against the Cougars. Each is the most by a quarterback in his first start since Boise State joined FBS in 1996. His 232 yards are the third-most by a Bronco in his first-career start since 1996.

DEMARCUS LAWRENCE RS JUNIOR DL

...Demarcus Lawrence has 10.5 sacks in 2013, tied for the 10th-most nationally, the second-most in the MW and tied for the fifth-most in a single season in Boise State history. His average of 1.0 sacks per game is eighth-nationally.

Additionally, his 19.5 tackles-for-loss ranks ninth-nationally, and his average of 1.8 per game is second in the country and leads the MW. He is just half a TFL shy of cracking Boise State's all-time single-season list.

...Lawrence had sacks in six-consecutive games before San Diego State, recording 9.5 during the streak. He has a sack in seven of

his 11 games this season, and in 14 of his 22 career games.

His 20.0 career sacks are tied for the seventh-most in school history, and rank 15th amongst active players in the NCAA.

...Lawrence recorded a career-high 3.5 sacks against Nevada (Oct. 19), tied for the fourth-most in a single game in the NCAA in 2013.

His 3.5 sacks equated to 29 lost yards for the Wolf Pack, and are the most by a Bronco since Chris Wing had 4.0 against Portland State Sept. 7, 1996.

...Lawrence has twice been named MW Defensive Player of the Week, one of only two players to earn multiple defensive honors (Brett Bowers; New Mexico).

...Lawrence posted 9.5 sacks in 11 games played in 2012, ranking tied for 18th-nationally and first in the Mountain West in the statistical category (0.86 per game).

...Lawrence blocked two field goals against Southern Miss (Sept. 28), the first Bronco to block two in the same game since Daryn Colledge blocked two against Hawai'i, Oct. 1, 2005. He is one of only two players in the country to block two kicks in a game (Shaquil Barrett, Colorado State).

His first block was the first of the season - of any kind - for Boise State, and the first by a Bronco since Lawrence blocked a field goal against Wyoming, Oct. 27, 2012 - the only blocked kick by a Bronco in 2012.

CHARLES LENO, JR. RS SENIOR LT

...Charles Leno, Jr. has started 38-consecutive games for Boise State, the longest streak on the team. He started each of the last 25 games at left tackle, and each of the team's 13 games in 2011 at right tackle.

...Leno blocked a field goal against Utah State, Oct. 12. He is the first offensive lineman to block a kick for the Broncos since Nate Potter accomplished the feat against Southern Miss, Oct. 11, 2008.

MATT MILLER RS JUNIOR WR

...Matt Miller now has 205 career catches, the second-most in school history. He trails only Austin Pettis (229) on the all-time list.

The total is also the eighth-most by a non-senior in the NCAA, trailing only East Carolina's Justin Hardy (257), USC's Marquise Lee (241), Fresno State's Davante Adams (224), Clemson's Sammy Watkins (224), Marshall's Tommy Shuler (221), Oregon State's Brandin Cooks (218) and Ball State's Willie Snead (214).

Miller moved into the Boise State's career receptions top 10 in the season opener against Washington, hauling in six passes against the Huskies to give him 134 for his career.

...His 77 receptions in 2013 are tied for the team high and are the third-most in a single season at Boise State all-time. He trails the Boise State single-season record by five (82; Jeremy Childs, 2007).

...Miller eclipsed 2,000 receiving yards against Colorado State (Nov. 2), just the 14th player in school history to do so. Now with 2,382 yards, Miller ranks sixth all-time at Boise State.

...Miller caught a career-high three touchdowns against Wyoming (Nov. 16), moving into the all-time top-10 list at Boise State. He matched the total against New Mexico (Nov. 30), and now has 25 - tied for the fourth-most in school history and tied for 10th-most by an active player in the NCAA.

His 11 touchdowns in 2013 are tied for the fifth-most in a single season all-time at Boise State.

...With his career-high 10 catches against Air Force, Miller recorded the first double-digit reception game since Tyler Shoemaker caught 10 against San Diego State, Nov. 18, 2011.

...He currently ranks tied for 25th-nationally in receptions per game, averaging 6.4.

...Miller has four 100-yard receiving games this season, tied for the 10th-most in school history:

112; Air Force
107; Southern Miss
143; Wyoming
111; New Mexico

He has five career such games. His first came against Nevada (Dec. 1, 2012), when he caught seven passes for 127 yards.

...Miller caught seven passes against Wyoming Oct. 27, 2012, eclipsing 100 receptions for his career in just his 21st game as a Bronco. The Broncos' all-time leader in receptions, Austin Pettis (229), took 27 games to reach 100.

Miller had 128 catches entering 2013, tied for the 12th-most all-time by a Bronco, and the most by a Bronco through his sophomore season in school history.

JOE SOUTHWICK RS JUNIOR QB

...Joe Southwick, the nation's active career leader in completion percentage (.694), was injured on the Broncos' first offensive play against Nevada (Oct. 19). He returned to start on Senior Day against New Mexico (Nov. 30), and played the first drive. He led the Broncos on a three-play, 65-yard touchdown drive, throwing a 1-yd touchdown pass to Matt Miller to end his career on The Blue.

The following notes were entering the game in which he was injured:

...Southwick ranked fourth-nationally in completion percentage (.723), and ninth-nationally in completions per game (24.83). The marks ranked first and third, respectively, in the MW.

He had thrown for 1,589 yards this season, the 23rd-most in the country.

...Southwick set a school and Mountain West record against Air Force (Sept. 13), completing 27-of-29 passes for a completion percentage of .931. He eclipsed TCU's Andy Dalton, who had held the league record since going 21-of-23 (.913) against Baylor Sept. 18, 2010, and fellow

Bronco Jared Zabransky, who had held the school record since going 21-of-23 against Utah State, Nov. 18, 2006.

...Southwick rushed for a 1-yard touchdown against Air Force (Sept. 13), the first such score of his career. He has three rushing scores this season.

...Southwick threw five touchdown passes against UT Martin (Sept. 7), a career best and just the 17th game by a Bronco quarterback with five-or-more passing touchdowns. He is the 11th quarterback in school history to accomplish the feat.

...Southwick moved into second all-time in career completion percentage at Boise State, completing 437-of-631 (.693) through his four seasons. He trails only Kellen Moore, who went 1,157-for-1,358 (.697).

...In 2012, Southwick completed 248-of-371 passes for 2,730 yards, 19 touchdowns and seven interceptions. His completion percentage (.669) was the fifth-highest single-season mark in school history.

Over his last seven games, Southwick completed 141-of-201 passes (.701) for 1,493 yards, 10 touchdowns and three interceptions.

And over his final four games, he completed 79-of-113 passes (.699) for 888 yards, nine touchdowns and no interceptions.

...Southwick entered 2013 with the fourth-longest streak in the country without an interception. His 131-straight attempts since his last interception - which came on the first attempt of the second half against San Diego State, Nov. 3, 2012 - trailed only Brett Smith of Wyoming and Blake Bortles of Central Florida, whose streak was at 174, and Jalen Whitlow of Kentucky (133).

Southwick threw an interception on his second attempt of 2013, halting the streak at 133.

BEN WEAVER RS FRESHMAN LB

...Ben Weaver moved into the starting lineup for the Broncos against Fresno State (Sept. 20), and started six-straight before missing Wyoming due to injury.

...Despite starting just six games in his debut season - and seeing action in only 11 - Weaver leads the Broncos with 86 tackles (49 solo).

His 7.8 tackles per game is the eighth-highest average by a freshman in the NCAA in 2013.

SHANE WILLIAMS-RHODES SOPHOMORE WR

...Shane Williams-Rhodes is averaging 7.0 receptions per game, a mark that leads Boise State and ranks 17th-nationally. The mark is also the third-most nationally amongst underclassmen.

His 77 receptions in 2013 are tied for the team high and are the third-most in a single season at Boise State all-time. He trails the Boise State single-season record by five (82; Jeremy Childs, 2007).

...He set career highs in both receptions (13) and receiving yards (150), in addition to catching a 2-yard touchdown pass against Utah State, Oct. 12. The reception total was the highest by a Bronco since Tim Gilligan had 16 catches against Louisiana Tech, Oct. 4, 2003, and tied for the sixth-most in school history. His yardage total was the highest by a Bronco since Tyler Shoemaker had 180 receiving yards against Colorado State, Oct. 15, 2011.

He had eclipsed his previous career high in yardage by halftime, registering 106 yards by intermission. He is the first Bronco with 100-plus yards by halftime since Tyler Shoemaker had 116 against San Diego State, Nov. 19, 2011.

...He has returned 16 punts for 233 yards this season, an average of 14.6 yards per return. The mark ranks tied for 12th-nationally, and leads the MW. Included was a 43-yarder against UT Martin (Sept. 7) - the longest by a Bronco in nearly two years (Mitch Burroughs; 64 - Colorado State, Oct. 15, 2011).

...Williams-Rhodes has three games with at least 10 receptions this season, the most since Rodney Smith had four such games in 1997.

Bronco Stadium - and Lyle Smith Field - is the home of Boise State football and the annual Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.

Smith is the undisputed father of Bronco football, who from 1946-67 built one of the top junior college programs in the country. When he retired from his head coaching position to become the athletic director, Smith had a record of 156-6-6 (.846).

Completed during the summer of 1970 as a cost of \$2.2 million, Bronco Stadium originally had a seating capacity of 14,500. Since that time the stadium has expanded four times to its current capacity of 36,387.

Boise State established a first in 1986 by installing the first blue AstroTurf in the country at Bronco Stadium. The second blue AstroTurf field was installed in 1995, with the third prior to the 2002 season.

The first Blue FieldTurf surface was installed in 2008. A second Blue FieldTurf field was installed prior to the 2010 season, making a total of five different blue fields at the stadium.

Boise State's was the first collegiate stadium to have the entire field produced in a special color.

GRADUATION RATE: The Broncos posted the eighth-highest NCAA Graduation Success Rate among Football Bowl Subdivision schools. Information released by the NCAA includes the 2003-06 cohorts. Ninety-one percent of the football student-athletes who entered Boise State in 2006 earned a bachelor's degree.

BRONCOS IN THE APR: For the second-straight year, the Boise State football team posted the second-highest Academic Progress Rate (APR) in the country among Football Bowl Subdivision schools, the NCAA announced June 11.

The statistical analysis covers a four-year period for the academic years of 2008-09 through 2011-12. The football team's multi-year APR score was a team-record 993, trailing only Northwestern (996).

The score is up from last year's total of 989, which ranked tied for second nationally with Duke, and behind Northwestern (995).

The Broncos have posted the top APR team score among its conference members in each of the last six seasons.

PUBLIC RECOGNITION AWARD: Boise State has received a Public Recognition Award from the NCAA for having its multi-year Academic Progress Rate score rank amongst the top-10 percent of Football Bowl Subdivision schools in each of the last three seasons.

Boise State was one of six schools among the 13 recognized by the NCAA at the FBS level in 2013 that also finished in the top 25 of the final 2012 on-the-field rankings.

HIGHER ED WATCH: Boise State has ranked amongst the top three in each of the last three years of the Higher Ed Watch Academic Formula, which ranks teams academically that are participating in a bowl game.

This past season the Broncos were No. 3 behind Northwestern and Northern Illinois. The Broncos ranked No. 2 in both 2010 and 2011.

BRONCOS WITH DEGREES: Boise State boasts seven individuals who have already earned a college degree entering 2013. There are just nine schools nationally with more individuals with college degrees.
