Cindy Ball, the second head coach in program history, begins her fourth season at the helm of the Boise State softball program in 2018.

In only her third season as head coach, Ball took the Broncos to their first postseason appearance in program history. The 2017 Broncos reached the Regional Title Game of the National Invitational Softball Championship.

After a combined 26-80 record in her first two seasons, Ball led a turnaround of the program, finishing 2017 with a 33-20 record. The 33 wins are tied for second for the most in a season in program history. Under her watch, the 2017 team finished the season ranked in the top 25 nationally in three categories: batting average (8th), double plays (5th) and runs scored per game (23rd). Ball also helped Boise State finish with a 12-12 record in Mountain West play, the most conference wins in her tenure.

Ball brought four years' experience as a head coach as well as eight years as a Division I assistant coach with her to Boise. She spent the 2013-14 seasons as an assistant at Cal State Northridge, and served on the coaching staff at Washington for the 2011-12 campaigns after serving as head coach at Cosumnes River College in Sacramento, Calif. from 2008-10.

At Cal State Northridge, Ball worked primarily with the pitching staff while also assisting with the Matador outfielders. Ball helped develop two NFCA All-West Region selections in 2014, as freshman outfielder Taylor Glover earned a spot on the first team, becoming the first Matador field player named all-region since 2004, and junior pitcher Brianna Elder was tabbed for the third team. Glover and Elder were each named to the All-Big West First Team while Glover also earned a spot on the Big West All-Freshman Team.

In two seasons at Washington, Ball served as recruiting coordinator and was responsible for the development of a Husky pitching staff which produced second-team All-American Kaitiin Inglesby in 2012. The Huskies went 76-35 during Ball's two seasons in Seattle and reached a pair of NCAA Super Regionals.

She began her collegiate head-coaching career at Modesto Junior College in Modesto, Calif., where in 2007 she led the program to a 16-win improvement from the prior campaign, going 25-22 and capturing a regional title. Ball then took the helm at Cosumnes River College, overseeing the restart of the program after a year's break in 2007. Over three seasons Ball guided the Hawks to a 111-44 record, highlighted by an appearance at the Cal JC State Final Four Tournament in 2010.

Ball began her coaching career in the season following her graduation from the University of Pacific in 2002. While working towards her master's degree in education, she served on the Pacific staff during the 2003-06 seasons.

At Pacific, Ball served as pitching coach while helping scout, assist with practice plans, monitor students academics and promoting and organizing camps. Over her four years in Stockton the Tigers accumulated an overall record of 126-97 with a 41-39 mark in the Big West.

During her four-year playing career at Pacific (1999-2002), Ball was twice named an NFCA All-American (2001-02) and Big West Pitcher of the Year (2001-02). On March 3, 2012, Ball was one of the first two players in program history to have her number retired (No. 9) in recognition of her contributions on and off the field to the growth and endurance of the Pacific program. Ball graduated from Pacific in 2002 with a bachelor's degree in sports sciences and earned her master's in education in 2006.

Ball and her husband, Bobby Malone, reside in Boise with their son, Four (Robert Malone IV) and daughter Sawyer.

## Bounce Back Year

2017 was a bounce back year for the Broncos. After opening her career with a 26-80 record through her first two seasons, head coach Cindy Ball led a historic turnaround of the program. Boise State saw the largest turnaround nationally in both RPI and overall record -- rising 131 spots in the RPI from 2016, as well as seeing a 19-win improvement.

## Historic Season

The Broncos reached the postseason for the first time in program history in the 2017 season. Boise State reached the Ogden Regional Final of the National Invitational Softball Championship (NISC) -- the softball version of the NIT. The Broncos ended the season with a 33-20 record. The 33 wins rank tied for second in program history with 2011 season (33-20), and is one win shy of the program record of 34-20 (2012).

## Top 25 in the Nation

Boise State ranked in the top 25 nationally in three separate offensive categories in 2017. The 32 double plays on the season ranked 5th nationally, while the Broncos were also 8th in batting average (.327). The 5.57 runs scored per game was good for 23rd nationally.

## Cervantes, Lamb Earn MW Honors

Boise State landed a pair of position players on the All-Mountain West team. Sophomore shortstop Rebekah Cervantes was named First-team All-MW for the second-straight year, while sophomore Morgan Lamb made the All-Mountain West second-team for the first conference honors of her career. Lamb hit .375 with 18 hits and a pair of home runs in conference play.

## Banner Season for Cervantes

A year after earning Mountain West Freshman of the Year honors, shortstop Rebekah Cervantes put together one of the best seasons in school history in her sophomore season. Cervantes was one of three players to start all 53 games. The Visalia, Calif.-native hit .432 with 70 hits and 50 RBIs. Cervantes ranked in the top 50 nationally in three different categories: batting average (17th), slugging percentage (40th) and RBIs per game (47th).

## National Ace in Washington

Boise State's turn around season was aided by the addition of senior transfer, Christina Washington. Washington, in her lone season of eligibility after transferring from Cal State-Fullerton, put together one of the best seasons ever from a Bronco pitcher. Washington threw the only perfect game in program history (Maryland-East Shore, Feb. 25, 2017). The senior was twice named MW Pitcher of the Week, and went 16-10 on the season, leading the team with 144.2 innings of work, and a 3.44 ERA.

## Academic Excellence

11 Broncos earned NFCA All-American Scholar honors at the conclusion of the 2017 season. Jenna Bassler, Isabelle Butler, Rainey Dyerson, Corey Hendrickson, Karlee Johnson, Sara Ketelsleger, Micaela Leal, Veronica Lynch, Elaina Mayer, Jessica McKay and Izzy Serrano all garnered the honor by maintaining a GPA of 3.5 or higher.

# 2018 SEASON PREVIEW

## SCHEDULE

### New Faces

Boise State will have the first-ever meeting against eight different opponents during the 2018 season. The Broncos will open the season against South Dakota at the Kajikawa Classic (Feb. 8) in the first-ever meeting between the two schools. At the Demarini Classic, Boise State will play Buffalo for the first time (Feb. 17). In Central Arkansas, all five opponent will be the first-ever meeting between the two schools: Louisiana-Monroe (Feb. 23), Kansas (Feb. 23), South Dakota State (Feb. 24), Arkansas-Pine Bluff (Feb. 24) and Austin Peay (Feb. 25).

The 2018 season will also have first-ever meetings against Colgate (March 9) and Columbia (March 10), at the Highlander Classic.

### Quick Acclimation

The Broncos will open the 2018 season on Feb. 8, and in the first month of the season, Boise State will play 21 games in 31 days, while logging over 9,528 miles of travel. The Broncos will play 11 games in the first 10 days of the season.

### Switzerland Would be Proud

Boise State was 15-4 (.790) in neutral site games during the 2017 season. If 2018 plays out in the same manner, the Broncos will enter Mountain West play in good position. Of Boise State's 50 games on the 2018 schedule, 23 will be played at a neutral site.

### Competitive Nonconference Slate

Six opponents on the nonconference schedule ended 2017 in the top 100 of the NCAA RPI, led by No. 12 Tennessee. The first weekend of the season will present the Broncos with a stiff challenge, as Northwestern (65) and Stanford (83) also ended last year in the top 100.

## INFIELD

### Senior Transfer Brings Big Bat

Boise State gained plenty of offensive firepower with the addition of senior transfer, Madison Anthony. Anthony played for Oregon State in 2016, but made the most of her limited time with the Beavers. The then junior started 45 games, tying for first on the team with nine home runs, while ranking second in slugging percentage (.500) and RBIs (32).

### Cervantes Continues Upward Swing

Junior Rebekah Cervantes will continue her assault on the Bronco record book in 2018. The shortstop is a two-time All-MW First-team selection, and led the team in runs, hits, doubles, RBIs and batting average. Cervantes' experience will continue to propel the Broncos to new heights.

### Plenty of Experience Back

Of the five players to start in the infield (C, 1B, 2B, 3B, SS) in the NISC Regional Title game for Boise State, four return for 2018. The only member of Boise State's starting infield to graduate last season was third baseman Tatiana Sorokina, and with the addition of Madison Anthony, Boise State will return a total of 540 Division 1 starts in the infield.

## OUTFIELD

### Who's in the Outfield?

Whereas the infield returns players at all but one position, the Bronco outfield is filled with question marks. The only returning starter from the NISC Regional Title Game is junior Kora Wade. Senior Shaelee Pearson has started at second base, catcher and in the outfield, but the only other returners for Boise State will be Bri Ambrose and Elaina Mayer, who appeared in a combined 42 games in 2017.

### .975 the Magic Number

Of the five players expected to contribute in the outfield, three combined for a fielding percentage of .975 during the 2017 season. Freshman Ashlyn Adams and sophomore Elaina Mayer did not contribute to fielding percentage last season, but are expected outfield contributors.

## PITCHING

### Broadus' Turn

With the graduation of Christia Washington, sophomore Kelsey Broadus enters 2018 as Boise State's ace. As a freshman, Broadus made eight starts while going 7-2 on the season with five saves. Broadus led the Bronco staff in ERA (2.99) and strikeouts (88) in 2017, and is poised to put together a successful 2018 campaign.

### Plenty of Question Marks

Boise State enters 2018 with five full-time pitchers on staff, while Micaela Leal and Gianna Mancha also see time in the infield. Other than Broadus' 70.1 innings last season, the Broncos only return 109.1 innings in the circle for 2018.

### Freshmen Could See Time

The Broncos brought in a pair of dominant prep pitchers for 2018 in Tori Bivens and Gianna Mancha. Both figure to see action in the circle for Boise State this spring.
