**BORDER WAR**

This weekend's tournament features a slate of regional foes, as all four opponents hail from Utah and Montana. The Broncos hold a winning record over all four opponents, leading the all-time series against Montana (3-1), Southern Utah (8-2), Utah Valley (4-2) and Weber State (10-6).

**REVENGE IS A DISH BEST SERVED COLD**

This season will offer Boise State a shot at redemption as they play Weber State on Sunday, the team they fell to in the Ogden Region final of the NISC to end the 2017 season. The Broncos played four games against the Wildcats on the season, with three being a loss.

**WEEK OF REST**

Boise State is coming off of a week of rest after they were unable to compete in their previously scheduled tournament, UCA Tournament, after travel issues. During the 2017 season, Boise State had six games cancelled. Boise State won the game following after every cancellation, with wins coming against Weber State (Feb. 17), Southern Utah (Feb. 19), North Dakota (March 10), and Nevada (May 5).

**MANCHA PHENOMEONAL IN THE CIRCLE**

Freshman Gianna Mancha has quickly established herself as Boise State's ace through two tournaments. The Fresno, Calif. native is 2-2 on the season with two complete games under her belt. She went 2-1 at the Marucci Desert Classic, striking out 23 batters in 17.0 innings of work. On the season, Mancha is averaging 1.13 strikeouts per inning, and her nine strikeouts against Hawai'i (Feb. 18) were the most strikeouts any Boise State pitcher has had in a game since Kelsey Broadus fanned 10 last season against Utah State (April 2, 2017).

Mancha's 7.9 strikeouts per seven innings is currently first in the Mountain West, and 69th nationally.

**LEAVE IT IN VEGAS**

The Broncos went 2-3 in Las Vegas at the Marucci Desert Classic, winning games against UTEP (8-2) and Buffalo (7-3), but dropping contests against Iowa State (7-2), Long Beach State (5-1) and Hawai'i (3-1). Boise State is currently on a two-game losing streak.

**SEARCHING FOR A STREAK**

Through eleven games, Boise State has yet to sustain a winning streak longer than two games, and the team has yet to finish a day on a winning streak, as their last two-game winning streak was snapped after dropping an afternoon game to Northwestern at the Kajikawa Classic (Feb. 10). The team's longest under head coach Cindy Ball was 10 games during the 2017 season (Feb. 17, 2017 – Feb. 25, 2017)

**THREE UP THREE DOWN**

Boise State went 3-3 to open the season at the Kajikawa Classic (Feb. 8-11), their best start to a season since opening the 2015 season, 3-3 at the North Texas Tournament. Boise State nabbed wins over South Dakota (11-3) and Saint Mary's (13-5), while also surviving a 7-6 game against Big Ten opponent Indiana.

**OPERATION ROARING THUNDER**

The batting power of Boise State's lineup was on full display at the Kajikawa Classic. The Broncos hit six home runs on the weekend, including four in a 13-5 win over Saint Mary's. All five of Boise State's home runs came from different players, including first career home runs for Halle Harger, Isabelle Butler, Kora Wade and Jessica McKay. Junior Rebekah Cervantes also hit the 22nd home run of her career.

**CERVANTES NAMED AN ALL-AMERICAN**

Junior Rebekah Cervantes will enter the 2018 season as a preseason All-American, according to Fast Pitch News. The outlet named the shortstop to their 15-member first-team preseason All-American. Cervantes is one of two Mountain West players to enter the season on the first-team, and one of four players from mid-major conferences.

**BOUNCE BACK YEAR**

2017 was a bounce back year for the Broncos. After opening her career with a 26-80 record through her first two seasons, head coach Cindy Ball led a historic turnaround of the program. Boise State saw the largest turnaround nationally in both RPI and overall record – rising 131 spots in the RPI from 2016, as well as seeing a 19-win improvement.

**HISTORIC SEASON**

The Broncos reached the postseason for the first time in program history in the 2017 season. Boise State reached the Ogden Regional Final of the National Invitational Softball Championship (NISC) – the softball version of the NIT. The Broncos ended the season with a 33-20 record. The 33 wins rank tied for second in program history with 2011 season (33-20), and is one win shy of the program record of 34-20 (2012).

**TOP 25 IN THE NATION**

Boise State ranked in the top 25 nationally in three separate categories in 2017. The 32 double plays on the season ranked 5th nationally, while the Broncos were also 8th in batting average (.327). The 5.57 runs scored per game was good for 23rd nationally.

**CERVANTES, LAMB EARN MW HONORS**

Boise State landed a pair of position players on the All-Mountain West team. Sophomore shortstop Rebekah Cervantes was named First-team All-MW for the second-straight year, while sophomore Morgan Lamb made the All-Mountain West second-team for the first conference honors of her career. Lamb hit .375 with 18 hits and a pair of home runs in conference play.

**BANNER SEASON FOR CERVANTES**

A year after earning Mountain West Freshman of the Year honors, shortstop Rebekah Cervantes put together one of the best seasons in school history in her sophomore season. Cervantes was one of three players to start all 53 games. The Visalia, Calif.-native hit .432 with 70 hits and 50 RBIs. Cervantes ranked in the top 50 nationally in three different categories: batting average (17th), slugging percentage (40th) and RBIs per game (47th).

**NEW FACES**

Boise State will have the first-ever meeting against eight different opponents during the 2018 season. The Broncos will open the season against South Dakota at the Kajikawa Classic (Feb. 8) in the first-ever meeting between the two schools. At the Demarini Classic, Boise State will play Buffalo for the first time (Feb. 17). In Central Arkansas, all five opponent will be the first-ever meeting between the two schools: Louisiana-Monroe (Feb. 23), Kansas (Feb. 23), South Dakota State (Feb. 24), Arkansas-Pine Bluff (Feb. 24) and Austin Peay (Feb. 25).

The 2018 season will also have first-ever meetings against Colgate (March 9) and Columbia (March 10), at the Highlander Classic.

**QUICK ACLIMIZATION**

The Broncos will open the 2018 season on Feb. 8, and in the first month of the season, Boise State will play 21 games in 31 days, while logging over 9,528 miles of travel. The Broncos will 11 games in the first 10 days of the season.

**SWITZERLAND WOULD BE PROUD**

Boise State was 15-4 (.790) in neutral site games during the 2017 season. If 2018 plays out in the same manner, the Broncos will enter Mountain West play in good position. Of Boise State's 50 games on the 2018 schedule, 23 will be played at a neutral site.

**COMPETITIVE NONCONFERENCE SLATE**

Six opponents on the nonconference scheduled ended 2017 in the top 100 of the NCAA RPI, led by No. 12 Tennessee. The first weekend of the season will present the Broncos with a stiff challenge, as Northwestern (65) and Stanford (83) also ended last year in the top 100.

**CERVANTES CONTINUES UPWARD****SWING**

Junior Rebekah Cervantes will continue her assault on the Bronco record book in 2018. The shortstop is a two-time All-MW First-team selection, and led the team in runs, hits, doubles, RBIs and batting average. Cervantes' experience will continue to propel the Broncos to new heights.

Cindy Ball, the second head coach in program history, begins her fourth season at the helm of the Boise State softball program in 2018.

In only her third season as head coach, Ball took the Broncos to their first postseason appearance in program history. The 2017 Broncos reached the Regional Title Game of the National Invitational Softball Championship.

After a combined 26-80 record in her first two seasons, Ball led a turnaround of the program, finishing 2017 with a 33-20 record. The 33 wins are tied for second for the most in a season in program history. Under her watch, the 2017 team finished the season ranked in the top 25 nationally in three categories: batting average (8th), double plays (5th) and runs scored per game (23rd). Ball also helped Boise State finish with a 12-12 record in Mountain West play, the most conference wins in her tenure.

Ball's first season as the Bronco boss concluded with a 12-42 record and a 4-20 mark in Mountain West play. Boise State, however, ended the season strong at home, capturing two of its final three home series in conference play (Nevada, Colorado State).

Along with the performances of All-Mountain West payers Devon Bridges and Jordan Kreiger, Ball helped develop the next wave of Broncos as freshmen Sara Ketelsleger (.278, 45 hits, 12 doubles, 26 RBI) and Makenzie Sullivan (.259, 37 hits, 13 doubles, six home runs, 30 RBI) as well as junior-college transfer Teaua Hughes (.263, 36 hits, nine doubles, four home runs, 17 RBI) had strong campaigns in 2015.

Ball brought four years' experience as a head coach as well as eight years as a Division I assistant coach with her to Boise. She spent the 2013-14 seasons as an assistant at Cal State Northridge, and served on the coaching staff at Washington for the 2011-12 campaigns after serving as head coach at Cosumnes River College in Sacramento, Calif. from 2008-10.

At Cal State Northridge, Ball worked primarily with the pitching staff while also assisting with the Matador outfielders. Ball helped develop two NFCA All-West Region selections in 2014, as freshman outfielder Taylor Glover earned a spot on the first team, becoming the first Matador field player named all-region since 2004, and junior pitcher Brianna Elder was tabbed for the third team. Glover and Elder were each named to the All-Big West First Team while Glover also earned a spot on the Big West All-Freshman Team.

In two seasons at Washington, Ball served as recruiting coordinator and was responsible for the development of a Husky pitching staff which produced second-team All-American Kaitlin Inglesby in 2012. The Huskies went 76-35 during Ball's two seasons in Seattle and reached a pair of NCAA Super Regionals.

She began her collegiate head-coaching career at Modesto Junior College in Modesto, Calif., where in 2007 she led the program to a 16-win improvement from the prior campaign, going 25-22 and capturing a regional title. Ball then took the helm at Cosumnes River College, overseeing the restart of the program after a year's break in 2007. Over three seasons Ball guided the Hawks to a 111-44 record, highlighted by an appearance at the Cal JC State Final Four Tournament in 2010.

Ball began her coaching career in the season following her graduation from the University of Pacific in 2002. While working towards her master's degree in education, she served on the Pacific staff during the 2003-06 seasons.

At Pacific, Ball served as pitching coach while helping scout, assist with practice plans, monitor students academics and promoting and organizing camps. Over her four years in Stockton the Tigers accumulated an overall record of 126-97 with a 41-39 mark in the Big West.

During her four-year playing career at Pacific (1999-2002), Ball was twice named an NFCA All-American (2001-02) and Big West Pitcher of the Year (2001-02) as the Tigers went 162-77 and made three NCAA Tournament appearances (1999, 2001-02). She enjoyed her best season in 2001, going 33-9 while helping lead Pacific to a still-standing school-record 50 wins. Ball remains the most decorated pitcher in school history, holding nine career-pitching records through the 2014 season: appearances (149), starts (116), innings pitched (883.1), wins (91), saves (10), strikeouts (761), strikeouts per seven innings (6.03), complete games (104) and shutouts (45).

She was just as dangerous at the plate as in the circle, batting .275 over four seasons with 19 home runs, 111 runs batted in and drawing 76 walks. The latter three marks remain top-seven career marks in the Pacific record book through 2014. Ball also established single-season records in pitching appearances (49, twice), starts (39), wins (33), saves (6), strikeouts (291), strikeouts per seven innings (7.21), complete games (37), shutouts (18) and RBI's (46). Of those marks, seven still stand through 2014.

On March 3, 2012, Ball was one of the first two players in program history to have her number retired (No. 9) in recognition of her contributions on and off the field to the growth and endurance of the Pacific program.

Ball graduated from Pacific in 2002 with a bachelor's degree in sports sciences and earned her master's in education in 2006.

She played professionally in Italy in 2002, leading Team Bussolengo to the playoffs while pacing the squad in batting, home runs and earned-run average. In 2004, Ball played for the Stockton-Sacramento Sunbirds in the National Pro Fastpitch League, and from 2008-10 participated in the Canada Cup where she was an All-Star in 2008.

Ball and her husband, Bobby Malone, reside in Boise with their sons, Four (Robert Malone IV), Ryder and daughter, Sawyer.
