THIS WEEK'S STORYLINE: BISON, HOYAS BATTLE IN SEASON FINALE

Bucknell this week plays a 12th game in a season for the first time since 1916 as Georgetown invades Christy Mathewson-Memorial Stadium on Senior Day. The Bison have dropped two straight and have slipped below .500 for the first time all season following last week's 45-9 loss to Lehigh. Georgetown has won four of its last seven games after an 0-4 start. Bucknell is looking to avenge an excruciating 32-31 loss to the Hoyas last season. The Bison led 17-0 at the half and allowed 12 points in the final 5:41 of that contest.

TOURING THE HERD

• **ON THE SIDELINE:** Head coach **Tim Landis** earned a win in his Bucknell debut on Aug. 30 against Duquesne, and Oct. 4 at Fordham he secured a victory in his very first PL contest. Landis is now 58-58-1 (.500) in his career, which also includes head coaching stints at Davidson (1993-99) and St. Mary's (2000-02). This will be Landis' second game opposite Georgetown. He picked up a win over the Hoyas during his stint at Davidson.

• **THE OFFENSE:** After posting a season-low 88 yards at Lafayette two weeks ago, the Bison spread option attack bounced back last week with a 273-yard showing against Lehigh. The Bison rank second in the Patriot League and 13th nationally in rushing offense at 234.7 yards per game. Bucknell completed only 4 of 11 passes last week, however, two of which were costly interceptions that set up Lehigh touchdowns.

• **UNDER CENTER:** Junior **QB Daris Wilson** last week returned to the starting lineup for the first time since Oct. 18, after missing the better part of three games with an ankle injury. Faced with a tough task against Lehigh's vaunted defense, Wilson was held in check with 36 rushing yards and 18 passing yards. The dynamic signal caller does have four 100-yard rushing games this season and ranks fifth in the Patriot League with 667 ground yards. Junior **QB John Henry Jackson**, listed No. 2 on the depth chart, is also healthy again after missing the Lafayette game with an injury. He came on late in the fourth quarter against Lehigh and directed the Bison on their only touchdown drive of the afternoon.

• **BACKS & RECEIVERS:** Four different Bison backs have already posted 100-yard rushing efforts (**Wilson** four times, **FB Blamah Sarnor** four times, **FB Frank Lazio** and **SB Raphael Darrington**) and Bucknell has had at least one 100-yard rusher in 8 of 11 games. Sarnor led the team with a career-high 148 yards on 22 carries last week against Lehigh, as Bucknell averaged 4.9 yards per attempt. The Herd managed only four pass completions last week, with leading receiver **WR Albert Marquardt** (30-598-2) limited to one catch for seven yards.

• **THE O-LINE:** **RT Eric Becker**, a starter in seven games, injured his knee in practice prior to the Lafayette game and has been replaced by **Steve Kerr**. **LT Jon Scharf** has started the last two games after moving ahead of **Justin Gibson** on the depth chart. After starting six straight games at center, **Stephen Watts** moved to left guard last week, with **Andrew Cinamella** starting at center. Cinamella and guards **Watts** and **Rashad Stallworth** had a solid day blocking for **Sarnor**, who gained most of his 148 yards up the middle.

• **THE DEFENSE:** After yielding a total of only 34 points in its previous three contests, Bucknell's young defense has allowed 161 in the last four weeks, including 45 to Lehigh last week. Bucknell allows an average of 25.8 points and 412.8 yards per game.

• **DEFENSIVE FRONT:** A lack of a pass rush has hurt the Bison in recent weeks. Bucknell has a league-low nine sacks all season, has gone four straight games without a sack and has only two in the last six weeks. The Bison could not muster a single tackle for loss against Lehigh last week. Junior **LB Kevin Ransome** is having an all-league type season, however. He leads the conference with 112 tackles and has hit double digits in seven of his last nine games.

• **DEFENSIVE SECONDARY:** Bucknell has registered an impressive 19 interceptions in 11 games this season. The Bison got a boost from the return of **FS Virgil Rush** from an ankle injury last week. Rush is the team's third-leading tackler with 71. **CB Joe Glenn** ranks 11th nationally with six interceptions. Senior **CB Jerome Acy** has four picks this season, while **Rush** has three and **LB Mike Leatherman** and **DB Dante Ross** two each.

• **SPECIAL TEAMS:** **Ross** has emerged as one of the Patriot League's premiere return men. He dominated against Holy Cross three weeks ago, returning two kick-offs for 130 yards, the first going for 81 yards and the next for 49. Both runs set up go-ahead TDs in the first half. **Ross**, who nearly broke a punt return for a TD last week against Lehigh, leads the Patriot League in both kickoff and punt returns. Freshman **K Ryan Korn** booted his 13th field goal of the season last week, tying **Chris Lundberg's** single-season mark set in 2000. Korn, who made a 43-yarder against Holy Cross two weeks ago, has made 13 of 18 FGs and 19 of 22 PATs this season.

THE LAST MEETING: GEORGETOWN 32, BUCKNELL 31 (10/26/02)

WASHINGTON, D.C. – Bucknell's nightmare season continued as Georgetown used a 32-point second half to erase a 17-point deficit and shock the Bison 32-31. David Paulus' fifth TD pass of the half, a 19-yard strike to Walter Bowser with 13 seconds remaining, capped the comeback. The Hoyas, who had been 0-10 all-time in PL games, trailed 31-20 until scoring twice in the final 5:41. Behind a solid performance from sophomore **QB Cole Ciesnolewicz** in his first collegiate start, Bucknell built a 17-0 halftime lead. Georgetown managed only 61 total yards in the first half, but rallied for 307 in the second. Ciesnolewicz completed 22 of 35 passes for 288 yards, one touchdown, and no interceptions, and he also ran for a score. His 30-yard TD pass to **WR Albert Marquardt** with 8:07 remaining gave the Bison the 31-20 lead. **RB Blamah Sarnor** and **RB Raphael Darrington** had short TD runs, and senior **K Chris Lundberg** booted a 29-yard FG to become Bucknell's all-time leading scorer among kickers. The day belonged to Paulus and talented **WR Luke McArdle**, however. Paulus completed 31 of 48 passes for 350 yards and was not intercepted, while McArdle finished with a school record 14 catches for 188 yards and two touchdowns.

BISON FOOTBALL NOTES & NOTABLES:

• **WRAPPING THINGS UP:** Bucknell concludes its 118th season of football this week against Georgetown. The Bison have not fared well in season finales in recent years, dropping three straight, two to Colgate and one to Fordham.

• **SENIOR SALUTE:** Prior to this week's contest, Bucknell will pay tribute to 13 seniors, who will be participating in the final game of their collegiate careers. The 2003 seniors include: **DL Joe Bering, OL Andrew Cinamella, WR Ryan Colton, WR Evan Crawford, RB Tim Johnson, OL Steve Kerr, LB Mike Leatherman, WR Albert Marquardt, LB Jared Marsilio, DL Jim Ruhlin, OL Rashad Stallworth, DL Shawn Tidwell and LB Brock Williamson.**

• **BISON AMONG THE NATION'S MOST IMPROVED:** After suffering through a disappointing 2-9 season in 2002, Bucknell more than doubled its victory total this fall and ranks among the nation's most improved I-AA programs. Only 10 teams have improved their victory total by more games than the Bison (3) at this point in the season.

• **MARKED MAN:** In order to beat Georgetown, one player that must be neutralized is sensational WR Luke McArdle, who leads the nation in all-purpose yardage with an average of 188.0 per game. McArdle, who sat out last week's game against Davidson with a shoulder injury, has 54 catches for 1,019 yards and 12 touchdowns this season. He is also one of the league's most dangerous punt and kickoff returners, setting the stage for what could be a fun showdown between McArdle and Bucknell's electrifying return man, **Dante Ross**. McArdle set a Georgetown record with 14 catches for 188 yards and two TDs against the Bison last year.

• **KORN TIES FIELD GOAL RECORD:** Bucknell freshman **K Ryan Korn** last week tied the school record with his 13th field goal of the season. His record-setting boot came on the team's opening drive of the game, and later he missed on a chance to break the record when his 35-yard attempt was pulled wide right. Chris Lundberg initially set the record of 13 during an all-conference season in 2000. Al Yuknus, who owns the Bucknell career record (37), had 12 field goals in 1981.

• **STOP, THIEF!** Bucknell's 19 interceptions this season is one of the top marks in program history. The 1951 team, which posted a perfect 9-0 record, recorded 29 interceptions. No team since then has recorded more than 21 in a season.

• **TOUCHDOWN, BLAMAH:** Sophomore **FB Blamah Sarnor** has scored six of Bucknell's last 11 touchdowns, and he leads the team with seven TDs this season. That is the most rushing touchdowns by a Bison since Jabu Powell had seven in 2001.

• **DEFENSE STRUGGLING:** Bucknell's defense, which enjoyed a terrific three-game stretch in midseason when it allowed a total of only 34 points in successive games against high-powered offenses in Fordham (10), Penn (14) and Towson (10), has struggled since then. The Bison have yielded 161 points in their last four games (40.3 per game) and is just 1-3 in that stretch. Bucknell's red zone defense, which was the league's best through seven games (11-25, .440), has allowed 20 scores (18 touchdowns) in opponents' last 21 trips (.952) inside the 20-yard line.

• **RANSOME NOTES:** Bucknell junior **LB Kevin Ransome** has eclipsed the 100-tackle mark for the first time in his career. It is the 36th time a Bucknell player has accomplished the feat and the first since Vince Ficca had 102 in 2000. Ransome is currently tied for 17th on Bucknell's single-season tackle chart with 112.

• **GROUND FORCES:** Bucknell's 2,582 rushing yards are now the second-most in school history. The 1951 Bison team that posted a perfect 9-0 record set the all-time rushing mark with 2,909 yards. The 2003 Bison need 327 yards this week against Georgetown to match that record.

• **TURNOVERS ARE KEY TO SUCCESS:** Through 11 games, one statistic that can clearly be viewed as a difference maker is turnover margin. The Bison rank 15th in the country in takeaways with 30, 20th in turnover margin (+10) and fifth in interceptions (19). In five victories the Bison have a +15 ratio (21 takeaways, 6 miscues), while in the four losses they are just -5 (9 takeaways, 14 turnovers). Bucknell recorded seven takeaways against Fordham, their most since a 29-22 win over Columbia in 1992.

• **MARQUARDT MOVES UP:** With 1,735 career receiving yards, senior **WR Albert Marquardt** now stands in sixth place on Bucknell's all-time list. He also ranks eighth in total receptions with 101.

Lewisburg, Pa. — Blamah Sarnor rushed for a career-high 147 yards and a touchdown and Bucknell's opportunistic defense forced four turnovers, including a fumble recovery at their own 6-yard line in the final minute of a 28-21 victory over Duquesne before 5,762 at Christy Mathewson-Memorial Stadium.

Bucknell's victory marked a successful debut for first-year head coach Tim Landis. The win also snapped a seven-game losing streak dating back to last season.

But on fourth-and-three from the 10, Loebig scrambled near the first-down marker but lost control of the ball.

The last of Glenn's trio of interceptions set up Bucknell's winning touchdown. After his 25-yard return to the Duquesne 10, Raphael Darrington rushed up the middle for the go-ahead touchdown on the very next play.

On Bucknell's opening drive of the second half, Korn kicked a 39-yard field goal to knot the game at 14, and Sarnor's 18-yard burst up the middle with 6:11 left in the third gave the Bison a 21-14 edge. Duquesne tied it on Mike Hilliard's 2-yard run in the opening minutes of the fourth quarter, capping a 12-play, 91-yard drive.

Ithaca, N.Y. — Cornell quarterback Mick Razzano threw for 216 yards and a touchdown and also ran for two scores to lead the Big Red to a tense 21-19 victory over Bucknell at Schoellkopf Field.
