**HEAD COACH TIM LANDIS**

Tim Landis is in his sixth year as the Bob Odell Head Coach of Bucknell Football in 2008, and by the end of the season he will become the eighth-longest-tenured head coach in program history.



Landis' teams have achieved .500 or better records in three of his first five seasons at Bucknell, including a 7-4 campaign in 2004.

Having already resurrected programs at Davidson and St. Mary's, Landis arrived at Bucknell in December 2002 to take over a football program that was undergoing a trying period.

As Landis' first spring practice approached, the Bison were still coping with the death of legendary head coach Tom Gadd, and they were still tasting the bitterness of a 2-9 record that ended a school-record run of seven straight winning seasons.

But under Landis' leadership, pride was quickly restored in the program, and the Bison turned in two very good seasons, first going 6-6 in 2003 then improving to 7-4 in 2004. Bucknell placed third in the competitive Patriot League standings both seasons.

Landis has coached both an All-American (DL Sean Conover) and a pair of Academic All-Americans (OL Justin Gibson, DB David Frisbey) during his tenure at Bucknell.

Upon his hiring, Landis, 44, brought to the Bison football program an impressive cache of head coaching experience. He became Bucknell's 25<sup>th</sup> head football coach since the program's inception in 1883.

Following a seven-year tenure as head coach at Davidson, Landis spent the three seasons prior to coming to Bucknell building a solid program at St. Mary's (Calif.). In both positions, he garnered national accolades for turning modestly successful programs into winners.

**BISON NOTES & NOTABLES**

**WITH A VICTORY OVER ROBERT MORRIS, BUCKNELL WOULD ...**

- ▶ ... start the season 2-0 for the first time since 2003.
- ▶ ... win its second consecutive road game.
- ▶ ... win its road opener for the third time in six years under **Tim Landis**.
- ▶ ... post its first three-game winning streak since claiming the final four contests of the 2004 campaign.
- ▶ ... defeat a team from the Northeast Conference for the second consecutive week.

**ABOUT THE GAME**

Bucknell had one of its most impressive halves of football in recent memory in the first half against Duquesne and it hopes to carry that momentum over to its first road contest of the year Saturday at Robert Morris. The Bison offense really clicked on Saturday as it scored more points than any Bucknell team in a season opener since 1926. With new offensive coordinator **Harold Nichols** directing the spread option offense, the Bison recorded 290 yards through the air, their most since a 1995 meeting with Lehigh that featured Jim Fox completing 24 passes for 291 yards. Bucknell also managed a solid 247 yards on the ground, with A.J. Kizekai's 98 leading the way. Robert Morris will also be looking to move to 2-0 as it is coming off a 27-13 home victory over Morehead State. The Colonials, who have three of their first four games at Joe Walton Stadium, also had a strong first half in their contest as they led 20-0 at the half before holding on for the 14-point victory.

**DUQUESNE GAME RECAP**

Junior quarterback **Marcello Trigg** completed his first 14 passes and finished 14 of 16 for a career-high 290 yards, and Bucknell parlayed 42 first-half points into a 48-42 victory over Duquesne in its season opener last Saturday night at Christy Mathewson-Memorial Stadium. The Bison piled up 537 yards of total offense in the victory, while the two teams combined for more than 1,000 total yards. Trigg threw for a pair of touchdowns and ran for two more.

**INSIDE THE DUQUESNE BOX SCORE**

- ▶ Bucknell scored 42 points in the first half, its highest point total in a half since 1987
- ▶ **Marcello Trigg** came 10 yards shy of becoming the first Bison quarterback to throw for 300 yards in a game since 1994
- ▶ **Shaun Pasternak** piled up 166 receiving yards, the seventh-highest total in program history
- ▶ Bucknell registered 537 yards of total offense, 15 shy of the seventh-best mark in program history
- ▶ **Will Carney** saw his school-record consecutive PAT streak end at 64
- ▶ Bucknell and Duquesne combined for more than 1,000 yards of total offense
- ▶ **Sam Nana-Sinkam** recorded a team-high eight tackles after missing all of 2007 with a shoulder injury
- ▶ Bucknell led 48-7 before Duquesne scored the final 35 points of the game
- ▶ **Marcello Trigg** completed his first 14 pass attempts.
- ▶ Bucknell had two freshmen and two sophomores start on the offensive line
- ▶ **Tim Landis** improved to 5-0 all-time against Duquesne.

**PATRIOT LEAGUE PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

Junior QB **Marcello Trigg** was named the Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week on Monday after his outstanding performance against Duquesne. The Tampa, Fla., native completed his first 14 passes and finished 14 of 16 for a career-high 290 yards. Trigg reached the 290-yard mark late in the third quarter and attempted only two passes the rest of the game. It was the most yards for a Bison quarterback since Jim Fox threw for 291 yards in a 1994 game against Lehigh. Trigg also accounted for four touchdowns, throwing for two and rushing for two others. Trigg's Offensive Player of the Week honor was the first for a Bison since Dante Ross earned the award in 2005. Trigg was also named the Damon's Bison Athlete of the Week.

**HIGH SCORING**

Bucknell piled up 48 points, including 42 in the first half, against Duquesne last Saturday. It is the most points the Bison have scored in a season opener since they registered 53 against Blue Ridge in 1926. Additionally, the 90 combined points by Bucknell and Duquesne were the most ever in a Bison season opener and the fourth-most in any game involving Bucknell.

**HIGH SCORING OPPONENT**

Duquesne's 42 points against Bucknell on Saturday mark the second-most points by a Bison opponent in a loss. Only the 1954 Lehigh squad, which lost to Bucknell by a 48-46 score, scored more in a loss to the Bison.

**86 POINTS**

Thanks to a 38-point output against Fordham in the final game of the 2007 campaign, Bucknell has now scored 86 points in its last two contests. The Bison last had more points in back-to-back outings in 2001 when they defeated St. Mary's (Calif.) 38-6 and Towson 51-10 on consecutive weekends. Current Bucknell head coach **Tim Landis** was at the helm of St. Mary's in 2001.

**POINTS IN A HALF**

Bucknell piled up 42 points in the first half of last Saturday's victory over Duquesne. It marked the most points in a half for the Bison since they equaled the program record of 49 in the first half of a 62-20 win against Columbia during Homecoming in October of 1987.

**AMONG THE NATIONAL LEADERS**

Bucknell's offensive explosion in its season opener against Duquesne has helped a number of Bison rank among the national leaders in a handful of offensive statistical categories. **Marcello Trigg** tops the country in passing efficiency (281.0) and is fifth in total offense (309). **Shaun Pasternak** is first in the nation in receiving yards per game (166.0) and is tied for 15th in receptions per game (7.0). Trigg and **Ryan Smith** are tied for eighth in scoring, having each registered a pair of touchdowns on Saturday, while **A.J. Kizekai** rounds out the list of Bison ranked in the top 25 of a category by standing 24th in rushing yards per game (98.0).

**SEASON OPENER SUCCESS**

Thanks to its 48-42 victory over Duquesne last Saturday, Bucknell improved to 85-37-1 in season openers. The Bison have won four of six season openers under head coach **Tim Landis**. They also updated their record in home openers to 91-30-1.

**BIG PLAYS**

Bucknell has produced a number of thrilling plays for its fans in its last two games. The Bison have scored seven touchdowns on plays of longer than 30 yards and have had 14 plays overall go for more than 20 yards in last year's season finale opposite Fordham and this year's opener with Duquesne.

**PASTERNAK'S BIG DAY**

Bucknell has traditionally been known as a running team, making **Shaun Pasternak's** performance in last Saturday's win over Duquesne much more impressive. Pasternak caught seven passes for 166 yards and one touchdown. The 166 yards rank seventh on the Bison single-game list. The last Bucknell player to record more receiving yards in a contest was David Berardinelli in 1992, while the last to reach 100 yards in one game was Daniel Zvara in 2005.

**PASTERNAK'S BIG DAY, PART TWO**

**Shaun Pasternak's** 166 receiving yards in the season opener would have ranked second on the Bison twice in the last three years. In 2005 Daniel Zvara led Bucknell in receiving with 292 yards. He led again in 2006 with 186 yards. The second-place receiver in 2005 was Sean Conover (102 yards), while A.J. Kizekai was second in 2006 with 156 yards.

**WINNING STREAK**

It might not seem like it since more than nine months separated the victories, but Bucknell is in the midst of a two-game winning streak. It is the first time the Bison have won consecutive games since the final contest of 2006 and the first of the 2007 campaign. The last time Bucknell won three in a row was when it claimed the final four outings of 2004.

**FRESHMEN ON OFFENSIVE LINE**

Bucknell started two freshmen, two sophomores and one junior on the offensive line in its season opener against Duquesne. The last time the Bison did not have a senior start on the offensive line in the season opener was 2000. Since the Colonial League changed its name to the Patriot League in 1990 Bucknell had only had one freshman (Luman Bauta - 1999) start on the offensive line in the season opener. That same year three sophomores (Carson Book, Jon Churchill, Garry Reynolds) were part of the offensive line's opening day starting unit, marking the only other time in the last two decades the Bison have fielded an offensive line that challenges the youth of the one that is expected to take the Christy Mathewson-Memorial Stadium field on Saturday.

Bucknell is in the midst of its 123rd season of football. Only Princeton (139), Yale (136), Harvard (134), Penn (132), Dartmouth (127), Lafayette (127), Massachusetts (126), Lehigh (125) and Richmond (125) have played longer among FCS teams. Bucknell ranks 17th among all FCS programs with 556 all-time victories.

**TOUGH TESTS**

Seven of Bucknell's 11 2008 opponents had .500 or better records last season, with those seven schools combining for a 47-29 record. All told, Bucknell's 11 foes had a 60-59 ledger a year ago.

**NEWCOMERS**

In addition to the 30 freshmen on the roster, Bucknell has a trio of new coaches on staff in 2008. During the offseason **Harold Nichols** was hired as the team's new offensive coordinator, while **Bill McCord** was added as the cornerbacks coach. Additionally, **Aaron Lewis** joined the staff and works with the outside linebackers.

**NIGHT GAMES AT CHRISTY MATHEWSON-MEMORIAL STADIUM**

After not playing a home night game for 16 years, Bucknell entertained Cornell below the lights in 2002. The Bison have played at least one night game at home every year since, including two in 2004 and 2007 and three in 2006. Bucknell is 8-3 in night games at Christy Mathewson-Memorial Stadium since 2002, including the 48-42 victory over Duquesne last Saturday. Last year the Bison were 2-2 overall under the lights and 1-6 during the day.

**RECORD WATCH**

- ▶ Junior **A.J. Kizekai** needs 687 yards to equal the school record. He has 1,156 career kickoff return yards, including 1,113 last year. The current record-holder is Dan Scocca, who logged 1,843 yards from 1987-90. Kizekai also needs 561 all-purpose yards to move into the top seven on Bucknell's career list in that category.
- ▶ Elsewhere, senior **K Will Carney** needs 56 points to equal the school mark for points by a kicker. The current record is 192 by Chris Lundberg (1999-2002). Carney brought a school-record streak of 58 straight made PATs into the 2008 season, and extended that to 64 before missing one against Duquesne. He needs 23 more conversions this season to match Lundberg's record total of 96.
- ▶ Senior **P Phil Azarik** broke the school record with a 41.1-yard punting average last season. Thanks to an average of over 50 yards per punt in the opener against Duquesne, Azarik now has a career average of 40.3. No Bison punter has ever finished a career with a 40-yard average. The current career mark is 38.2 by Ken Durr (1979-81).

**HOMETOWN OPPONENT**

For the second consecutive week Bucknell is playing a team based in the Pittsburgh area. That makes a number of Bison happy as they get to head back to their Western Pennsylvania roots on Saturday.

**GAME CAPTAINS**

In a change from recent years, Bucknell did not name team captains in the preseason. Instead, the Bison will elect captains on a game-by-game basis. Captains for last Saturday's game against Duquesne were seniors **Kevin Mullen** and **Todd Manjuck**. Captains for Saturday's game at Robert Morris will be juniors **Marcello Trigg** and **Sam Nana-Sinkam**.

**WIN IMPROVEMENT**

Bucknell has won three or fewer games three times in the last 15 years, with the most recent coming last season when the Bison posted a 3-8 record. The previous two times Bucknell failed to surpass three wins in a campaign it bounced back the following season, improving on its win total by at least four each time. The 2002 squad went 2-9, which was followed by a 6-6 mark in Tim Landis' first season with the Bison. In 2005, Bucknell went 1-10 and was hampered by injuries. The following campaign Bucknell posted a five-win improvement, equaling the best one-year turnaround in program history.

**KIZEKAI LONE RETURNING ALL-PATRIOT LEAGUER**

Bucknell had a pair of First Team All-Patriot League selections last year (OL Chad Glasser, **RS A.J. Kizekai**) and one second-teamer (DL Josh Eden). The lone returning all-league choice is Kizekai, who led the team in rushing (432 yards), receiving (363 yards) and kick returns (1,113 yards).

**ALTERNATING GAMES**

Two years ago Bucknell went through the entire season alternating wins and losses to finish 6-5. This year the Bison will alternate home and road games throughout the season. In a scheduling oddity, they will never play two straight home games or two consecutive road contests.

**EDEN MISSING**

Bison fans might notice that Josh Eden, a 6'4" defensive lineman from nearby State College, Pa., is no longer listed on the roster. That's because last year's top sack artist is away on a two-year Mormon mission. He will return to Bucknell in 2010 as a junior. Eden has started all 22 games of his career and has 90 tackles and 8.5 sacks over that span.

**IN THE CLASSROOM**

Bucknell posted a solid 3.07 combined team grad-point average last semester, and in the fall of 2007 the Bison placed 20 student-athletes on the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll (let-terms with a 3.20 GPA or higher). Last year starting defensive lineman and 2008 Bucknell graduate Ryan Walsh earned ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District honors, while classmate Nick Mozal was selected by the National Football foundation and College Hall of Fame as one of 153 semifinalists across all divisions of college football for the Draddy Trophy, which is often referred to as the "Academic Heisman."

**CONOVER NO LONGER A TITAN...BUT HE IS A FALCON**

Sean Conover, a 2006 Bucknell graduate who was the 2004 Patriot League Defensive Player of the Year, was cut by the Tennessee Titans near the end of preseason so they could get down to the appropriate roster size. However, he was quickly signed to the Atlanta Falcons' practice squad. In two seasons with the Titans, Conover appeared in 11 games, starting two, and totaled 25 tackles. Conover ranks tied for fifth on Bucknell's career sacks list with 17.5.

# BUCKNELL 48 DUQUESNE 42

**LEWISBURG, Pa.** — Junior quarterback Marcello Trigg completed his first 14 passes and finished 14 of 16 for a career-high 290 yards, and Bucknell parlayed 42 first-half points into a 48-42 victory over Duquesne in its season opener. The Bison piled up 537 yards of total offense in the victory, while the two teams combined for more than 1,000 total yards.

Trigg was trying to become the first Bucknell quarterback since 1994 to record 300 passing yards in a game, but came up 10 yards short.

The Bison used a number of big plays in the first half to jump out to a 42-7 halftime advantage. Josh Lee was a key in the first half as he had a 34-yard run to the 2-yard line that set up a touchdown run by Trigg to put Bucknell up 7-0. He later caught a 44-yard pass from Trigg that made the score 21-0 early in the second quarter.

Lee and Smith were important cogs in the offense new offensive coordinator Harold Nichols was directing, but Trigg and sophomore wide receiver Shaun Pasternak really shined. The two hooked up seven times for a career-high 166 yards and one touchdown.

While the Bucknell offense shined in the first half, Duquesne was strong in the second half, tallying 28 points in the final quarter. Michigan State transfer Connor Dixon was 30-for-47 for 429 yards and a school-record six touchdowns at quarterback for the Dukes, while Alex Roberson caught 11 balls for 154 yards. Of Duquesne's 485 total yards, 357 came after halftime.
