**HEAD COACH TIM LANDIS**

Tim Landis is in his sixth year as the Bob Odell Head Coach of Bucknell Football in 2008, and he tied A.E. Humphreys for eighth place on Bucknell's career games as a head coach list Sept. 20 against Cornell.



Landis' teams have achieved .500 or better records in three of his first five seasons at Bucknell, including a 7-4 campaign in 2004.

Having already resurrected programs at Davidson and St. Mary's, Landis arrived at Bucknell in December 2002 to take over a football program that was undergoing a trying period.

As Landis' first spring practice approached, the Bison were still coping with the death of legendary head coach Tom Gadd, and they were still tasting the bitterness of a 2-9 record that ended a school-record run of seven straight winning seasons.

But under Landis' leadership, pride was quickly restored in the program, and the Bison turned in two very good seasons, first going 6-6 in 2003 then improving to 7-4 in 2004. Bucknell placed third in the competitive Patriot League standings both seasons.

Landis has coached both an All-American (DL Sean Conover) and a pair of Academic All-Americans (OL Justin Gibson, DB David Frisbey) during his tenure at Bucknell.

Upon his hiring, Landis, 44, brought to the Bison football program an impressive cache of head coaching experience. He became Bucknell's 25<sup>th</sup> head football coach since the program's inception in 1883.

Following a seven-year tenure as head coach at Davidson, Landis spent the three seasons prior to coming to Bucknell building a solid program at St. Mary's (Calif.). In both positions, he garnered national accolades for turning modestly successful programs into winners.

**BISON NOTES & NOTABLES**

**WITH A VICTORY OVER MARIST, BUCKNELL WOULD ...**

- ▶ ... start the season 3-1 for the first time since 2004.
- ▶ ... equal its win total from all of 2007.
- ▶ ... post a win following a bye week for the fourth time in the last five years (3-2 overall under **Tim Landis**)
- ▶ ... win its first two road games for the first time since 1999
- ▶ ... defeat the Red Foxes for the fourth consecutive year
- ▶ ... help **Tim Landis** draw even with Lou Maranzana for ninth place on the program's win list (26).

**ABOUT THE GAME**

Bucknell is coming off a bye week, while Marist will be playing its sixth game in as many weeks as the two teams square off for the fourth consecutive season. The Bison suffered a tough one-point loss at home to Cornell two weeks ago, but is still off to its fourth 2-1 start in head coach **Tim Landis'** six years at the helm. Averaging 20 pass attempts and more than 200 yards per game, the Bison are focusing on the pass unlike any other in recent memory. The Red Foxes enter Saturday's game having lost two games in a row and are 0-3 at home this season. They have struggled in the middle two quarters, being outscored 84-31 in those two frames. Marist actually holds a 57-55 advantage in the first and third quarters.

**BUCKNELL VS. MARIST SERIES NOTES**

- ▶ Bucknell leads 3-0.
- ▶ Bucknell leads in Poughkeepsie by a 1-0 margin.
- ▶ Bucknell and Marist met for the first time in 2005 and this is the fourth consecutive year they will play.
- ▶ Bucknell has won the first three games in the series by an average score of 38-11. The closest game was decided by 20 points.
- ▶ **Marcello Trigg** has four career rushing touchdowns vs. Marist.

**LAST TIME VS. MARIST**

**Bucknell 38, Marist 7 (Sept. 29, 2007 - Lewisburg, Pa.)**

Bucknell quarterbacks Marcello Trigg and Terrance Wilson combined for five rushing touchdowns, and Wilson and Justin Pulgrano both went over 100 yards rushing. All told, eight Bucknell ballcarriers combined for a season-high 362 rushing yards, and the Bison outgained Marist 414-274. Fullback Josh DeStefano, making his first start of the season, carried a team-high 20 times for 86 yards.

**CORNELL GAME RECAP**

**Cornell 21, Bucknell 20 (Sept. 20, 2008 - Lewisburg, Pa.)**

Nathan Ford completed 21 of 26 passes for 207 yards and two touchdowns and Randy Barbour rushed for 114 yards and a score to lead Cornell to a narrow 21-20 victory. For Bucknell, Marcello Trigg completed 19 of 27 passes for 219 yards and two touchdowns, both going to Shaun Pasternak, who had a career night with 11 catches for 117 yards, two touchdowns and a two-point conversion. Graham Rihn blocked a Bucknell extra point early in the fourth quarter, sealing the game for the Big Red, who denied the Bison their first 3-0 start since 1994.

**INSIDE THE CORNELL BOX SCORE**

- ▶ **Sam Nana-Sinkam** recorded a career-high 18 tackles. He had three times as many tackles as any other Bison and it was the most stops by a Bucknell player since Stephane Pluviose totaled 18 in 2001.
- ▶ **Shaun Pasternak** caught 11 passes for 117 yards. It was the most receptions for a Bison since Jim Horan in 2001. It was the second 100-yard game of the season for Pasternak.
- ▶ After averaging nearly eight penalties a game through the season's first two contests, Bucknell was whistled for just two penalties vs. Cornell.

**ANOTHER WEEKLY AWARD**

Junior LB **Sam Nana-Sinkam** picked up his second consecutive Patriot League weekly award following Bucknell's last game against Cornell. One week after earning the Special Teams Player of the Week Award, Nana-Sinkam was named the Defensive Player of the Week. The Lititz, Pa., native registered a career-high 18 tackles and one interception against the Big Red. It was the most tackles in a game by a Bison since Stephane Pluiose also had 18 in a 2001 game against Colgate.

**PASTERNAK RECEIVING HEADLINES**

Sophomore WR **Shaun Pasternak** is putting up numbers that have not been seen at Bucknell in a long time. He caught 11 passes for 117 yards two weeks ago against Cornell. It was his second 100-yard game of the season and was the most receptions by a Bison player since Jim Horan hauled in 12 passes Oct. 27, 2001 against Fordham. Pasternak, who is the first Bucknell player with two 100-yard games in the same season since Albert Marquardt in 2002, leads Bucknell with 21 catches for 343 yards. The 343 yards are the fourth-most during head coach **Tim Landis'** tenure at Bucknell, while the 21 receptions are tied for third by a Bucknell player under Landis.

**CLOSE LOSSES**

Bucknell lost to Cornell by a slim one-point margin two weeks ago. It marked the first one-point loss for the Bison since Oct. 16, 2004, when they dropped a 14-13 decision to Lafayette. Bucknell is now 0-4 in its last four one-point games with its last victory coming Oct. 13, 2001, in a 17-16 victory at Lafayette.

**SEASONED OPPONENT**

One game after facing a Cornell team that was playing its first contest of the season, Bucknell will be facing a Marist squad that will be participating in its sixth game in 2008. The Red Foxes are currently 1-4 and will be playing their third contest of a five-game homestand. Saturday is also Homecoming at Leonidoff Field.

**2-1 STARTS**

Bucknell is off to its fourth 2-1 start in six years under head coach **Tim Landis**. The Bison have started 3-1 or better just once under Landis. They achieved that feat in 2004 and finished with an overall record of 7-4.

**LANDIS MOVING UP PAIR OF LISTS**

Sixth-year Bucknell head coach **Tim Landis** has increased his victory total as the Bison coach to 25 thanks to the 2-1 start to the season. He is just one victory shy of tying Lou Maranzana for ninth place on the program's all-time list. Additionally, the 44-year-old coach will be on the sidelines for his 60th game at Bucknell on Saturday. That will bring him within three games of equalling Bob Odell for seventh place in program history. Bucknell's head coaching position is named after Bob Odell.

**BYE WEEK PREPARATIONS**

Sixth-year Bucknell head coach **Tim Landis** has proved to be successful at preparing for an opponent coming off a bye week. The Bison are 3-2 under Landis in games immediately following a bye, including 3-1 in the last four years. Bucknell has won those three games by an average of nearly 10 points.

**GAME CAPTAINS**

In a change from recent years, Bucknell did not name team captains in the preseason. Instead, the Bison will elect captains on a game-by-game basis. Captains for Saturday's contest against Marist will be FB **Kevin Mullen** and LB **Sam Nana-Sinkam**. It is the third time this season Nana-Sinkam will serve as captain on the defensive side of the ball, while it is Mullen's second stint as game captain.

**DOUBLE-FIGURE COMPLETIONS**

**Marcello Trigg** has opened the season completing at least 10 passes in each of the first three games. It marks the first time since 2002 a Bison quarterback has accomplished that feat. That season Cole Ciesnolewicz had at least 10 completions in three straight games, while Todd Wenrich opened the campaign with at least 10 completions in the first six contests.

**CAREER MONTH FOR TRIGG**

**Marcello Trigg** is on pace to smash his career highs in nearly every category through the season's first three games. The junior quarterback has already completed 43 passes for 639 yards and five touchdowns. His career highs in those categories came last year when he totaled 64 completions, 1,130 yards and eight touchdowns. He is less than 100 completions, 500 yards and only eight touchdowns from joining Bucknell's career top-10 lists in those categories. His current 72.9 completion percentage would top the Bucknell single-season list.

**AMONG THE NATIONAL LEADERS**

**TWO-POINT CONVERSIONS**

After missing its first extra-point attempt of the game, Bucknell decided to make up for it by going for a two-point conversion late in the first half against Cornell. **Marcello Trigg**, who had teamed up with **Shaun Pasternak** on the touchdown, found Pasternak in the back right corner of the endzone for the conversion to send the game to halftime tied at 14-all. It was the first two-point conversion for the Bison since Ryan Ahern found Josh DeStefano in a loss at Stony Brook in 2005. The last time Bucknell rushed for a two-point conversion was Don McDowell against Towson in 1999.

**CLOSING IN ON 3,000 YARDS**

Junior **A.J. Kizekai** is closing in on 3,000 all-purpose yards in his career. With a team-high 445 yards (148.3/game), Kizekai now has 2,971 all-purpose yards in his three year career. He is now just 253 yards shy of passing Brad Myers for seventh place on the Bison career list.

**100+ TACKLES**

Thanks to his career-high 18 tackles against Cornell, LB **Sam Nana-Sinkam** is on pace for more than 110 stops this season. Only two players have tallied more than 100 tackles since 2003, the year **Tim Landis** took over as head coach. Kevin Ransome recorded 116 tackles in 2003, while Dorian Petersen totaled 102 in 2006.

**2-0 ON THE ROAD?**

Bucknell will be attempting to win its second consecutive road game to start the season against Marist. The Bison have not started 2-0 on the road since 1999. In fact, they have opened their road slate 2-0 just three times in the last 30 years.

**PENALTY REDUCTION**

Last year Bucknell was the least-penalized team in the nation. The Bison were flagged only 29 times all season. This year, Bucknell has not shown the same discipline and earned 15 penalties in the season's first two games. The Bison reverted to last year's form against Cornell as they were whistled just twice for 25 yards. Bucknell's 192 yards of penalties is nearing the 2007 final figure of 263 yards.

**123 POINTS**

Despite managing just 37 in its last two games, Bucknell has scored 123 points in its last four games dating back to the final contest of 2007. The last time the Bison scored more points in a four-game stretch was in 2004 when they tallied 135 points in successive wins over Holy Cross, Fordham, Colgate and Duquesne.

**LEWISBURG, Pa.** — Junior quarterback Marcello Trigg completed his first 14 passes and finished 14 of 16 for a career-high 290 yards, and Bucknell parlayed 42 first-half points into a 48-42 victory over Duquesne in its season opener. The Bison piled up 537 yards of total offense in the victory, while the two teams combined for more than 1,000 total yards.

Trigg was trying to become the first Bucknell quarterback since 1994 to record 300 passing yards in a game, but came up 10 yards short.

The Bison used a number of big plays in the first half to jump out to a 42-7 halftime advantage. Josh Lee was a key in the first half as he had a 34-yard run to the 2-yard line that set up a touchdown run by Trigg to put Bucknell up 7-0. He later caught a 44-yard pass from Trigg that made the score 21-0 early in the second quarter.

Lee and Smith were important cogs in the offense new offensive coordinator Harold Nichols was directing, but Trigg and sophomore wide receiver Shaun Pasternak really shined. The two hooked up seven times for a career-high 166 yards and one touchdown.

While the Bucknell offense shined in the first half, Duquesne was strong in the second half, tallying 28 points in the final quarter. Michigan State transfer Connor Dixon was 30-for-47 for 429 yards and a school-record six touchdowns at quarterback for the Dukes, while Alex Roberson caught 11 balls for 154 yards. Of Duquesne's 485 total yards, 357 came after halftime.

**MOON TOWNSHIP, Pa.** — Sam Nana-Sinkam blocked a Garrett Clawson field goal attempt with three seconds left to seal a 17-14 Bison victory over Robert Morris at a wet Joe Walton Stadium. The Bison improved to 2-0 for the first time since 2003, head coach Tim Landis' first season at Bucknell.

The game was close throughout as neither team led by more than a touchdown. Robert Morris had five chances to punch in a touchdown on that final possession, but the Bison defense came up big as Colonial quarterback Erik Cwalinski threw a couple incomplete passes, was tackled on a quarterback draw by Marques Morgan and the offense was whistled for an illegal formation penalty. That series of plays, all within the final minute, set up the potential game-tying field goal. Nana-Sinkam jumped from his middle line position and got a solid piece of Clawson's 27-yard low kick to clinch the victory.

The Bison brought a 10-7 lead into the half thanks to a penalty by the Colonials. Will Carney attempted what would have been a career-best 49-yard field goal, but the kick was wide right. However, Robert Morris was whistled for a running into the kicker penalty, giving Carney another chance, this one from 44 yards. He connected on that field goal, which was the longest of his career.

The momentum Bucknell gained from Carney's boot was short-lived as Myles Russ outran the Bison defense and scored on a 68-yard touchdown scamper on the second play of the second half.
