**HEAD COACH TIM LANDIS**

Tim Landis is in his sixth year as the Bob Odell Head Coach of Bucknell Football in 2008, and he tied A.E. Humphreys for eighth place on Bucknell's career games as a head coach list Sept. 20 against Cornell.



Landis' teams have achieved .500 or better records in three of his first five seasons at Bucknell, including a 7-4 campaign in 2004.

Having already resurrected programs at Davidson and St. Mary's, Landis arrived at Bucknell in December 2002 to take over a football program that was undergoing a trying period.

As Landis' first spring practice approached, the Bison were still coping with the death of legendary head coach Tom Gadd, and they were still tasting the bitterness of a 2-9 record that ended a school-record run of seven straight winning seasons.

But under Landis' leadership, pride was quickly restored in the program, and the Bison turned in two very good seasons, first going 6-6 in 2003 then improving to 7-4 in 2004. Bucknell placed third in the competitive Patriot League standings both seasons.

Landis has coached both an All-American (DL Sean Conover) and a pair of Academic All-Americans (OL Justin Gibson, DB David Frisbey) during his tenure at Bucknell.

Upon his hiring, Landis, 44, brought to the Bison football program an impressive cache of head coaching experience. He became Bucknell's 25<sup>th</sup> head football coach since the program's inception in 1883.

Following a seven-year tenure as head coach at Davidson, Landis spent the three seasons prior to coming to Bucknell building a solid program at St. Mary's (Calif.). In both positions, he garnered national accolades for turning modestly successful programs into winners.

**BISON NOTES & NOTABLES**

**WITH A VICTORY OVER HOFSTRA, BUCKNELL WOULD ...**

- ▶ ... start the season 4-1 for the first time since 2001.
- ▶ ... surpass its win total from all of 2007.
- ▶ ... defeat Hofstra for the first time since 1969.
- ▶ ... help **Tim Landis** draw even with Pete Reynolds for eight place on the program's win list (27).
- ▶ ... post two winning streaks in the same season for the first time since 2004.
- ▶ ... defeat a team currently in the Colonial Athletic Association other than former Patriot League member Towson for the first time since 1985.
- ▶ ... win four non-league games for the first time since 2000.

**ABOUT THE GAME**

Bucknell and Hofstra played completely different games last week with the Bison needing two late scores to come from behind and defeat Marist on the road. Hofstra faced No. 1 James Madison and lost 56-0 at home. While last week's results would seem to favor the Bison, Hofstra did defeat a Stony Brook team that Bucknell lost to in 2007 (48-20) by a 43-3 score just two weeks ago. Long-known for its running game, Bucknell has manged just 135 yards on the ground the last two games, but QB Marcello Trigg has thrown for 436 yards over that same span. He now has more than 2,600 yards in his career and with another 200-yard passing day could move into the top 10 in program history in passing yards. Hofstra will be playing its third straight road game and will not return home until Oct. 25 when it hosts Delaware. The Pride are 1-2 on the road this season with all three contests resulting in lopsided scores. In the two losses, Hofstra has been outscored 91-3 (James Madison, Connecticut), while the one victory was a 40-point win at Stony Brook. The Pride has done a solid job at taking care of the ball this year, turning the ball over just six times while forcing 13.

**BUCKNELL VS. HOFSTRA SERIES NOTES**

- ▶ Hofstra leads 4-2.
- ▶ Five of the six games have been decided by at least 20 points.

**LAST TIME VS. HOFSTRA**

**Hofstra 45, Bucknell 21 (Sept. 10, 1994 - Lewisburg, Pa.)**

Hofstra's run-and-shoot offense piled up nearly 600 yards in total offense as Bucknell suffered a 45-21 loss in its 1994 season opener. Carlos Garay completed 15 of 27 passes for 207 yards and rushed 14 times for 106 yards and a touchdown to lead Hofstra. Rich Lemon led the Bison, who held a 7-0 advantage in the first quarter, with 103 yards rushing, while Rob Glus passed for 139 yards and a touchdown.

**MARIST GAME RECAP**

**Bucknell 21, Marist 17 (Oct. 4, 2008 - Poughkeepsie, N.Y.)**

Four completions by **Marcello Trigg** to **Shaun Pasternak** in the final two minutes helped Bucknell come from behind to defeat Marist 21-17 last Saturday afternoon at sun-splashed Tenney Field at Leonidoff Stadium. The first Bison lead came when Pasternak caught his fourth touchdown of the season in traffic along the back of the end zone with 1:03 to play. Despite trailing most of the game and managing just 46 yards in the second and third quarters, Bucknell improved to 3-1 on the season thanks to a pair of touchdowns on its two fourth-quarter drives.

**INSIDE THE MARIST BOX SCORE**

► **Marcello Trigg** threw for 200 yards for the third time in four games. He also equaled his career high with two touchdown passes, the sixth time he has reached that figure in his career.  
 ► **Shaun Pasternak** registered his third 100-yard receiving game of the season. He is the first Bison to record at least three 100-yard games in the same season in nearly 20 years.  
 ► Bucknell piled up 141 of its 306 total yards in the fourth quarter alone. Trigg passed for 143 of his 217 yards in the fourth quarter.  
 ► Bucknell was 2-for-8 on third downs, while Marist was 8-for-17.  
 ► **Robert De La Rosa** tallied a career-high nine tackles and earned Patriot League Rookie of the Week honors.  
 ► Bucknell had the ball for just over eight minutes in the second half as Marist won the time of possession battle, 36:37-23:23.  
 ► **Marcello Trigg** equaled his career high with 19 completions.  
 ► Bucknell managed just 46 yards of offense in the second and third quarters.  
 ► Bucknell's first lead came with 1:03 to play.

**FOUR GAMES, FIVE PATRIOT LEAGUE AWARDS**

Each week Bucknell has played a game in 2008 it has come away with some hardware from the Patriot League. The Bison have had at least one player honored in the Patriot League's weekly awards each week, including two this week. **Marcello Trigg** was named the Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week on Monday, while freshman **Robert De La Rosa** picked up Patriot League Rookie of the Week plaudits. It was the second Offensive Player of the Week honor this season for Trigg, while De La Rosa is the third Bison freshman to be honored in the last two years, following **Shaun Pasternak** and **Tyler McFarlane** in 2007. Trigg was 19 of 26 passing for 217 yards and two touchdowns, while De La Rosa was third on the team with a career-high nine tackles at Marist. Trigg and De La Rosa are the first pair of Bison to be honored in the same week since **A.J. Kizekai** (Special Teams) and McFarlane (Rookie) earned awards last October.

**PASTERNAK RECEIVING HEADLINES**

Sophomore WR **Shaun Pasternak** is putting up numbers that have not been seen at Bucknell in a long time. He is the first Bison with three 100-yard receiving games in the same season since current Iowa assistant coach Lester Erb had four in 1989. Pasternak leads the Patriot League in receptions per game (6.8) and receiving yards per game (110.8) and is fifth in the nation in receiving yards and 16th in receptions.

**3-1 STARTS**

Bucknell is off to its second 3-1 start under sixth-year head coach **Tim Landis**, and its first since 2004. The Bison started at least 3-1 for five consecutive years (1997-2001), but this is just the second time they have accomplished that feat since 2002.

**LANDIS MOVING UP PAIR OF LISTS**

Sixth-year Bucknell head coach **Tim Landis** has increased his victory total as the Bison coach to 26 thanks to the 3-1 start to the season. He is just one win shy of tying Pete Reynolds for eighth place on the program's all-time list. Additionally, the 44-year-old coach will be on the sidelines for his 61st game at Bucknell on Saturday. That will bring him within two games of equaling Bob Odell for seventh place in program history. Bucknell's head coaching position is named after Bob Odell.

**TRIGG HAVING CAREER YEAR**

Two-time Patriot League Offensive Player of the Week **Marcello Trigg** is having an outstanding season and is on pace to break into the Bucknell record book in a number of passing categories. He has three 200-yard passing games already this season, the most by a Bison quarterback since Todd Wenrich reached the 200-yard plateau six times in 2001. Since the beginning of the 2002 campaign Bucknell quarterbacks have thrown for 200 yards in a game just 11 times, with Trigg recording five of those.

**PUNT RETURNS**

Last year Bucknell ranked 25th nationally in punt returns, averaging better than 11 yards per return. This year the Bison are averaging just over three yards per return, which ranks 107th nationally, but is fifth in the Patriot League.

**FIRST TO 20 POINTS WINS**

In each of Bucknell's three games this year in which at least one team registered 20 points, the first team to reach 20 earned the victory. Overall, that trend has been true dating back to the final game of the 2006 campaign, a 31-28 come-from-behind Bison victory over Colgate. Another Bucknell come-from-behind win over Fordham in 2004 was the second-most recent time that trend proved false.

**GAME CAPTAINS**

In a change from recent years, Bucknell did not name team captains in the preseason. Instead, the Bison will elect captains on a game-by-game basis. For the first time this season Bucknell will have three captains for Saturday's outing at Hofstra. QB **Marcello Trigg** and WR **Shaun Pasternak** will represent the offensive side of the ball, while LB **Sam Nana-Sinkam** will again be the captain on the defensive side. It is the fourth consecutive week Nana-Sinkam will serve in the captain role, while Trigg is making his second appearance as a game captain. Pasternak, the only sophomore to be elected captain this year, is serving in that role for the first time.

**BYE WEEK PREPARATIONS**

Sixth-year Bucknell head coach **Tim Landis** has proved to be successful at preparing for an opponent coming off a bye week. The Bison, who defeated Marist 21-17 last week following an idle Saturday, are 4-2 under Landis in games immediately following a bye, including 4-1 in the last five years.

**FRESHMAN TACKLES**

Patriot League Rookie of the Week **Robert De La Rosa** piled up nine tackles against Marist. That figure was a career high and was nearly double his season total entering the game. It was the most tackles by a Bison freshman since current sophomore **Ankiel White** registered nine at Colgate last October.

**CLOSE GAMES**

Each of Bucknell's four games this year have been decided by less than one touchdown. Interestingly, the Bison have fared nearly the same in close games as they have in contests decided by more than one touchdown since **Tim Landis** took over as coach prior to the 2003 campaign.

**DOUBLE-FIGURE COMPLETIONS**

**Marcello Trigg** has opened the season completing at least 10 passes in each of the first four games. It marks the first time since 2002 a Bison quarterback has accomplished that feat. That season Todd Wenrich opened the campaign with at least 10 completions in the first six contests.

**AMONG THE NATIONAL LEADERS**

Four different Bison are among the national leaders in a particular individual statistical category this year. QB **Marcello Trigg**, WR **Shaun Pasternak**, LB **Sam Nana-Sinkam** and P **Phil Azarik** all show up in the national rankings. Two of those players are juniors, while Azarik is a senior. Pasternak represents the sophomore class.

**LEWISBURG, Pa.** — Junior quarterback Marcello Trigg completed his first 14 passes and finished 14 of 16 for a career-high 290 yards, and Bucknell parlayed 42 first-half points into a 48-42 victory over Duquesne in its season opener. The Bison piled up 537 yards of total offense in the victory, while the two teams combined for more than 1,000 total yards.

Trigg was trying to become the first Bucknell quarterback since 1994 to record 300 passing yards in a game, but came up 10 yards short.

The Bison used a number of big plays in the first half to jump out to a 42-7 halftime advantage. Josh Lee was a key in the first half as he had a 34-yard run to the 2-yard line that set up a touchdown run by Trigg to put Bucknell up 7-0. He later caught a 44-yard pass from Trigg that made the score 21-0 early in the second quarter.

Lee and Smith were important cogs in the offense new offensive coordinator Harold Nichols was directing, but Trigg and sophomore wide receiver Shaun Pasternak really shined. The two hooked up seven times for a career-high 166 yards and one touchdown.

While the Bucknell offense shined in the first half, Duquesne was strong in the second half, tallying 28 points in the final quarter. Michigan State transfer Connor Dixon was 30-for-47 for 429 yards and a school-record six touchdowns at quarterback for the Dukes, while Alex Roberson caught 11 balls for 154 yards. Of Duquesne's 485 total yards, 357 came after halftime.

**MOON TOWNSHIP, Pa.** — Sam Nana-Sinkam blocked a Garrett Clawson field goal attempt with three seconds left to seal a 17-14 Bison victory over Robert Morris at a wet Joe Walton Stadium. The Bison improved to 2-0 for the first time since 2003, head coach Tim Landis' first season at Bucknell.

The game was close throughout as neither team led by more than a touchdown. It looked like Bucknell was going to put the game away late in the fourth quarter when Marcello Trigg completed 25-yard 3rd-and-11 pass to A.J. Kizekai for a first down at the Robert Morris 16-yard line with just under three minutes on the clock. However, the Bison were unable to convert another first down and Will Carney had his 30-yard field goal blocked.

Robert Morris took possession and marched down the field, covering 74 yards in 10 plays. Additionally, a couple of penalties helped the Colonials cover the distance in less than two minutes.

Robert Morris had five chances to punch in a touchdown on that final possession, but the Bison defense came up big as Colonial quarterback Erik Cwalinski threw a couple incomplete passes, was tackled on a quarterback draw by Marques Morgan and the offense was whistled for an illegal formation penalty. That series of plays, all within the final minute, set up the potential game-tying field goal. Nana-Sinkam jumped from his middle line position and got a solid piece of Clawson's 27-yard low kick to clinch the victory.

The Bison brought a 10-7 lead into the half thanks to a penalty by the Colonials. Will Carney attempted what would have been a career-best 49-yard field goal, but the kick was wide right. However, Robert Morris was whistled for a running into the kicker penalty, giving Carney another chance, this one from 44 yards. He connected on that field goal, which was the longest of his career.

The momentum Bucknell gained from Carney's boot was short-lived as Myles Russ outran the Bison defense and scored on a 68-yard touchdown scamper on the second play of the second half.

**LEWISBURG, Pa.** — Nathan Ford completed 21 of 26 passes for 207 yards and two touchdowns and Randy Barbour rushed for 114 yards and a score to lead Cornell to a narrow 21-20 victory over Bucknell.

Marcello Trigg completed 19 of 27 passes for 219 yards and two touchdowns, both going to Shaun Pasternak, who had a career night with 11 catches for 117 yards, two touchdowns and a two-point conversion.

Pasternak, who also had a nifty touchdown catch and run negated by a holding penalty in the third quarter, hauled in an 8-yard TD reception with 10:56 left in the fourth quarter to bring Bucknell within 21-20. But Graham Rihn blocked the extra point, keeping Cornell in the lead.

**POUGHKEEPSIE, N.Y.** — Four completions by Marcello Trigg to Shaun Pasternak in the final two minutes helped Bucknell come from behind to defeat Marist 21-17. The first Bison lead came when Pasternak caught his fourth touchdown of the season in traffic along the back of the end zone with 1:03 to play.
