HEAD COACH TIM LANDIS

Tim Landis is in his sixth year as the Bob Odell Head Coach of Bucknell Football in 2008, and he tied A.E. Humphreys for eighth place on Bucknell's career games as a head coach list Sept. 20 against Cornell.



Landis' teams have achieved .500 or better records in three of his first five seasons at Bucknell, including a 7-4 campaign in 2004.

Having already resurrected programs at Davidson and St. Mary's, Landis arrived at Bucknell in December 2002 to take over a football program that was undergoing a trying period.

As Landis' first spring practice approached, the Bison were still coping with the death of legendary head coach Tom Gadd, and they were still tasting the bitterness of a 2-9 record that ended a school-record run of seven straight winning seasons.

But under Landis' leadership, pride was quickly restored in the program, and the Bison turned in two very good seasons, first going 6-6 in 2003 then improving to 7-4 in 2004. Bucknell placed third in the competitive Patriot League standings both seasons.

Landis has coached both an All-American (DL Sean Conover) and a pair of Academic All-Americans (OL Justin Gibson, DB David Frisbey) during his tenure at Bucknell.

Upon his hiring, Landis, 44, brought to the Bison football program an impressive cache of head coaching experience. He became Bucknell's 25th head football coach since the program's inception in 1883.

Following a seven-year tenure as head coach at Davidson, Landis spent the three seasons prior to coming to Bucknell building a solid program at St. Mary's (Calif.). In both positions, he garnered national accolades for turning modestly successful programs into winners.

BISON NOTES & NOTABLES

WITH A VICTORY OVER GEORGETOWN, BUCKNELL WOULD ...

- ▶ ... avoid its first losing streak of the season.
- ▶ ... surpass its win total from all of 2007.
- ▶ ... help **Tim Landis** draw even with Pete Reynolds for eighth place on the program's win list (27).
- ▶ ... win its Patriot League opener for the first time since 2004 (vs. Georgetown).
- ▶ ... open its road schedule 3-0 for the first time since 1997.
- ▶ ... win a game that is played outside of Pennsylvania or New York for the first time since winning at Georgetown in 2006.

ABOUT THE GAME

Bucknell and Georgetown were picked to finish sixth and seventh, respectively, in the Patriot League Preseason Poll. The two teams have combined for just seven Patriot League wins since the beginning of the 2005 campaign, but that does not mean they haven't played some competitive games. The last three meetings between the two teams have been decided by a total of 16 points, with two going to overtime. Bucknell enters the contest looking to avoid its first losing streak of the season and improve to 3-0 on the road this year, while Georgetown hopes to snap a four-game losing streak and avoid an 0-3 Patriot League start. With a win, the Bison will vault into a five-way tie atop the Patriot League standings at 1-0. Bucknell and Georgetown are the only Patriot League teams to be playing a league game this week.

BUCKNELL VS. GEORGETOWN SERIES NOTES

LAST TIME VS. GEORGETOWN

Georgetown 20, Bucknell 17 (Oct. 20, 2007 - Lewisburg, Pa.)

A 38-yard field goal by Eric Bjonerud with 10 seconds left handed Bucknell its second consecutive tight Patriot League loss as the Bison fell by a 20-17 margin to Georgetown in front of a Homecoming crowd of 6,084 at Christy Mathewson-Memorial Stadium. **Marcello Trigg** completed 16 of 25 passes for 207 yards, all of which were career highs, and a pair of touchdowns to freshman **Shaun Pasternak** for Bucknell, including a game-tying score with just 43 seconds remaining.

HOFSTRA GAME RECAP

Hofstra 45, Bucknell 31 (Oct. 11, 2008 - Lewisburg, Pa.)

Brock Jackolski carried nine times for 170 yards and three touchdowns, and quarterback Cory Christopher ran for two scores and threw for another to lead Hofstra to a 45-31 victory over Bucknell. Bison quarterback **Marcello Trigg** competed 11 of 16 passes for 119 yards and a touchdown, while **Andrew Lair** came on after Trigg went out with a sprained ankle and ran for a career-high 78 yards and a two touchdowns on 13 carries.

INSIDE THE HOFSTRA BOX SCORE

- ▶ **Andrew Lair** rushed for a career-high 78 yards and a career-high two rushing touchdowns.
- ▶ **A.J. Kizekai** equaled the Bucknell single-game record with seven kickoff returns.
- ▶ **A.J. Kizekai's** 175 kickoff return yards rank second on Bucknell's single-game list. Kizekai now holds four of the top eight spots on that list.
- ▶ **A.J. Kizekai's** 235 all-purpose yards were 20 shy of seventh place on Bucknell's single-game list.

- ▶ Bucknell was 7-for-13 on third downs, while Hofstra was 2-for-7.
- ▶ Bucknell earned a season-high 24 first downs.
- ▶ Bucknell won the time of possession battle by nearly 10 minutes one game after losing it by nearly 13 minutes, a swing of more than 11 minutes.
- ▶ Bucknell had seven plays of at least 20 yards.
- ▶ Bucknell had three drives of at least 10 plays and scored on each.

KIZEKAI'S KICK RETURNS

Quietly, **A.J. Kizekai** had a big day returning kicks against Hofstra. The junior tied the Bucknell record with seven kick returns, becoming the first Bison to reach that figure since Earl Beecham in 1985. Additionally, Kizekai piled up 175 return yards, which is the second-highest total in program history. Kizekai now owns four of the top eight single-game return yardage marks. As a team, Bucknell moved from 93rd nationally in kick returns entering the Hofstra game to 54th entering Saturday's outing at Georgetown.

ALL-PURPOSE A.J.

Thanks to his 175 yards on kickoff returns, **A.J. Kizekai** recorded 235 all-purpose yards against Hofstra. That number helped increase his career total to 3,289 as he jumped over Brad Myers and Lester Erb and into sixth place on the program's ledger. With just 195 more yards, Kizekai, who is just a junior, will move into fourth place.

HOME/ROAD SPLITS

Bucknell is averaging 33.0 points and 383.3 yards per game in its three home games this season. The road is a different story as the Bison are averaging 19.0 points and 326.0 yards in their two away contests.

LAST TEAM TO START PL PLAY

Each of the other six teams in the Patriot League have already played at least one conference game, but Bucknell is just opening its league slate vs. Georgetown. They Hoyas would be playing their fourth Patriot League contest if their matchup with Colgate two weeks ago had not been canceled due to a virus spreading around the Georgetown campus. The last time Bucknell opened its Patriot League schedule later than Oct. 18 was in 1996 when it opened with Holy Cross on Oct. 26. The Patriot League only played five conference games then.

PATRIOT LEAGUE OPENERS

Bucknell is 12-10 all-time in Patriot League openers. The Bison are 2-3 under sixth-year head coach **Tim Landis** and have lost their last three.

RETURN OF RUNNING GAME

After totaling just 135 yards rushing in its previous two games, the vaunted Bucknell rushing attack returned last week against Hofstra. The Bison piled up 229 yards on the ground, their second-highest total of the season. Bucknell's season average went from 143 yards per game to 160, while its national ranking jumped from 53 to 42. The Bison ran for 200 yards just three times in all of 2007.

CLOSING SEASON VS. PATRIOT LEAGUE

Bucknell plays its final six games against Patriot League foes. The last time the Bison played their entire conference schedule consecutively at the end of the season was 2002, when their final seven games were against Patriot League opponents.

TRAVELING OUTSIDE KEYSTONE AND EMPIRE STATES

This is the sixth year **Tim Landis** has been head coach at Bucknell and this Saturday's game at Georgetown is just the seventh time Bucknell will be playing outside of Pennsylvania or New York. The Bison are 4-2 in those contests, with wins against Delaware State, Georgetown (twice) and Holy Cross. The two losses have come to Holy Cross and Richmond.

LAIR PROVIDES RELIEF

Senior QB **Andrew Lair** stepped in for an injured **Marcello Trigg** against Hofstra and rushed for a career-high 78 yards and a career-high two scores. It was the most rushing yards by a Bison quarterback since Terrance Wilson registered 108 yards and two touchdowns last year at Marist. Lair had just 170 career rushing yards entering the contest.

PATRIOT LEAGUE SHUTOUT

For the first time this season, Bucknell failed to earn a Patriot League weekly award on Monday. The Bison have picked up five weekly honors from the league this year, including at least one after each game leading up to Hofstra.

PASTERNAK RECEIVING HEADLINES

Sophomore WR **Shaun Pasternak** is putting up numbers that have not been seen at Bucknell in a long time. He is the first Bison with three 100-yard receiving games in the same season since current Iowa assistant coach Lester Erb had four in 1989. Pasternak leads the Patriot League in receiving yards per game (97.8) and is 15th in the nation in that category. LEWISBURG, Pa. — Junior quarterback Marcello Trigg completed his first 14 passes and finished 14 of 16 for a career-high 290 yards, and Bucknell parlayed 42 first-half points into a 48-42 victory over Duquesne in its season opener. The Bison piled up 537 yards of total offense in the victory, while the two teams combined for more than 1,000 total yards.

Trigg was trying to become the first Bucknell quarterback since 1994 to record 300 passing yards in a game, but came up 10 yards short.

The Bison used a number of big plays in the first half to jump out to a 42-7 halftime advantage. Josh Lee was a key in the first half as he had a 34-yard run to the 2-yard line that set up a touchdown run by Trigg to put Bucknell up 7-0. He later caught a 44-yard pass from Trigg that made the score 21-0 early in the second quarter.

Lee and Smith were important cogs in the offense new offensive coordinator Harold Nichols was directing, but Trigg and sophomore wide receiver Shaun Pasternak really shined. The two hooked up seven times for a career-high 166 yards and one touchdown.

While the Bucknell offense shined in the first half, Duquesne was strong in the second half, tallying 28 points in the final quarter. Michigan State transfer Connor Dixon was 30-for-47 for 429 yards and a school-record six touchdowns at quarterback for the Dukes, while Alex Roberson caught 11 balls for 154 yards. Of Duquesne's 485 total yards, 357 came after halftime.

MOON TOWNSHIP, Pa. — Sam Nana-Sinkam blocked a Garrett Clawson field goal attempt with three seconds left to seal a 17-14 Bison victory over Robert Morris at a wet Joe Walton Stadium. The Bison improved to 2-0 for the first time since 2003, head coach Tim Landis' first season at Bucknell.

The game was close throughout as neither team led by more than a touchdown. It looked like Bucknell was going to put the game away late in the fourth quarter when Marcello Trigg completed 25-yard 3rd-and-11 pass to A.J. Kizekai for a first down at the Robert Morris 16-yard line with just under three minutes on the clock. However, the Bison were unable to convert another first down and Will Carney had his 30-yard field goal blocked.

Robert Morris took possession and marched down the field, covering 74 yards in 10 plays. Additionally, a couple of penalties helped the Colonials cover the distance in less than two minutes.

Robert Morris had five chances to punch in a touchdown on that final possession, but the Bison defense came up big as Colonial quarterback Erik Cwalinski threw a couple incomplete passes, was tackled on a quarterback draw by Marques Morgan and the offense was whistled for an illegal formation penalty. That series of plays, all within the final minute, set up the potential game-tying field goal. Nana-Sinkam jumped from his middle line position and got a solid piece of Clawson's 27-yard low kick to clinch the victory.

The Bison brought a 10-7 lead into the half thanks to a penalty by the Colonials. Will Carney attempted what would have been a career-best 49-yard field goal, but the kick was wide right. However, Robert Morris was whistled for a running into the kicker penalty, giving Carney another chance, this one from 44 yards. He connected on that field goal, which was the longest of his career.

The momentum Bucknell gained from Carney's boot was short-lived as Myles Russ outran the Bison defense and scored on a 68-yard touchdown scamper on the second play of the second half.

Looking for insurance, the Big Red chewed up more than six minutes off the clock and marched inside the Bucknell 10, but Sam Nana-Sinkam, who had a career-high 18 tackles in the game, intercepted Ford's pass at the goal line and returned it out to the 26.

Bucknell could not take advantage, however, going three-and-out on its next series. The Bison punted the ball back to Cornell with 3:13 to play, and thanks to Barbour's hard running the Big Red ran out the clock. The biggest play came on a third-and-4 from midfield with 1:41 left and Bucknell out of timeouts, when Barbour rumbled 32 yards for a first down. Cornell took a knee three times and walked off with a one-point win.

Bucknell parlayed a big defensive play in to the game's first points, when defensive lineman Todd Rinaldo smothered a screen pass at the Cornell 45 and returned it inside the 10. Ford stripped Rinaldo from behind, but a hustling Will Braaf recovered for the Bison at the Cornell 5. On the very next play, Trigg scampered off right tackle for the touchdown, but Will Carney's extra point was off target and the lead was just 6-0.

POUGHKEEPSIE, N.Y. — Four completions by Marcello Trigg to Shaun Pasternak in the final two minutes helped Bucknell come from behind to defeat Marist 21-17. The first Bison lead came when Pasternak caught his fourth touchdown of the season in traffic along the back of the end zone with 1:03 to play.

Despite trailing most of the game and managing just 46 yards in the second and third quarters, Bucknell improved to 3-1 on the season thanks to a pair of touchdowns on its two fourth-quarter drives.

Trailing 17-14, the Bison took possession of the ball for the final time with less than three minutes on the clock in the fourth quarter after a punt pinned them at their own six-yard line. LEWISBURG, Pa. — Brock Jackolski carried nine times for 170 yards and three touchdowns, and quarterback Cory Christopher ran for two scores and threw for another to lead Hofstra to a 45-31 victory over Bucknell on a picturesque football Saturday at Christy Mathewson-Memorial Stadium.

Bison quarterback Marcello Trigg competed 11 of 16 passes for 119 yards and a touchdown, while Andrew Lair came on after Trigg went out with a sprained ankle and ran for a career-high 78 yards and a two touchdowns on 13 carries. It was the first two-touchdown game of his career.

Both teams moved the ball well offensively for most of the day. Hofstra, bouncing back from a 56-0 drubbing at the hands of No. 1 James Madison a week earlier, finished with 467 total yards, 319 coming on the ground. Bucknell collected 24 first downs, the same number as the Pride, and finished with 348 total yards, including 229 rushing. The Bison were hampered by three turnovers, however, including a rare Trigg interception near the Hofstra goal line on the first possession of the day.

Trigg, who had thrown only one interception on 85 pass attempts coming in, marched the Bison into the red zone on the opening series, but Nick Altomare picked him off at the 3-yard line.

Four plays later, Jackolski broke loose for a 78-yard touchdown run on his first carry of the day to give Hofstra a quick lead. Jackolski also had TD runs of 31 and 29 yards, as the Pride scored on five of six first-half possessions en route to a 31-17 lead at halftime.
