HEAD COACH TIM LANDIS

Tim Landis is in his sixth year as the Bob Odell Head Coach of Bucknell Football in 2008, and he tied Lou Maranzana for sixth place on Bucknell's career games as a head coach list Nov. 1 against Holy Cross.



Landis' teams have achieved .500 or better records in three of his first five seasons at Bucknell, including a 7-4 campaign in 2004.

Having already resurrected programs at Davidson and St. Mary's, Landis arrived at Bucknell in December 2002 to take over a football program that was undergoing a trying period.

As Landis' first spring practice approached, the Bison were still coping with the death of legendary head coach Tom Gadd, and they were still tasting the bitterness of a 2-9 record that ended a school-record run of seven straight winning seasons.

But under Landis' leadership, pride was quickly restored in the program, and the Bison turned in two very good seasons, first going 6-6 in 2003 then improving to 7-4 in 2004. Bucknell placed third in the competitive Patriot League standings both seasons.

Landis has coached both an All-American (DL Sean Conover) and a pair of Academic All-Americans (OL Justin Gibson, DB David Frisbey) during his tenure at Bucknell.

Upon his hiring, Landis, 44, brought to the Bison football program an impressive cache of head coaching experience. He became Bucknell's 25th head football coach since the program's inception in 1883.

Following a seven-year tenure as head coach at Davidson, Landis spent the three seasons prior to coming to Bucknell building a solid program at St. Mary's (Calif.). In both positions, he garnered national accolades for turning modestly successful programs into winners.

BISON NOTES & NOTABLES

WITH A VICTORY OVER LAFAYETTE, BUCKNELL WOULD ...

- ▶ ... snap its first two-game losing streak of the season.
- ▶ ... end a three-game home losing streak.
- ▶ ... surpass its Patriot League win total from all of 2007.
- ▶ ... help **Tim Landis** move past Pete Reynolds and into sole possession of eighth place on the program's win list (28).
- ▶ ... improve to 8-9 in November over the last six years.
- ▶ ... continue its streak of not falling below .500 this year.
- ▶ ... avoid its first four-game home losing streak since 1991

ABOUT THE GAME

Bucknell and Lafayette enter Saturday's contest with different results of late. The Bison have dropped three of their last four games, while the Leopards have won three of their last four. The only loss for Lafayette during that span was to first-place Colgate, which is just outside of the national rankings. Bucknell's only win during its last four outings was against Georgetown, a squad that has posted a 1-7 record this year. The Bison have been outscored by 55 points their last three losses, but have still piled up an impressive 26.1 points per game this season behind a balanced offense that is averaging 155 yards rushing and nearly 200 yards passing. Lafayette, which was ranked No. 21 last week before its 21-13 loss at Colgate, has outscored opponents 137-53 in the first half and is second nationally in scoring defense allowing just over 14 points per contest.

LAST TIME VS. LAFAYETTE

Lafayette 34, Bucknell 7 (Nov. 3, 2007 - Easton, Pa.)

Lafayette's defense forced five turnovers, had a key punt block and allowed only five first downs in a 34-7 Patriot League victory over Bucknell at Fisher Stadium. Matt Ferber rushed for 102 yards and Brandon Mitchell scored a pair of rushing touchdowns to help the Leopards snap a three-game losing streak, while the Bison dropped their fourth in a row. Lafayette came into the game ranked fourth in the nation in total defense and sixth in rushing defense, and they held Bucknell to 66 rushing yards and 156 total yards.

HOLY CROSS GAME RECAP

Holy Cross 34, Bucknell 17 (Nov. 1, 2008 - Worcester, Mass.)

Bucknell held the high-scoring Holy Cross offense without a point until the final seconds of the first half, but the Crusaders overcame a 10-0 deficit and scored the 34 of the game's final 41 points, including 31 straight at one point, to defeat the Bison 34-17 at Fitton Field. Holy Cross quarterback Dominic Randolph was 38 of 49 passing for 398 yards and four touchdowns. Three hundred of his yards came in the final 31 minutes of play. Holy Cross, which was averaging 36 points per game, piled up 532 yards, its second-highest total of the season, while Bucknell totaled 338 yards, including 245 through the air as **Marcello Trigg** threw for 158 before leaving the game late in the first half with a leg injury. **Andrew Lair** came on in relief and was 5 of 11 for 87 yards and one touchdown.

INSIDE THE HOLY CROSS BOX SCORE

► **Shaun Pasternak** totaled 28 receiving yards, pushing his career total to 1,011.

► **Marcello Trigg** completed a 79-yard touchdown pass to A.J. Kizekai marking the longest play from scrimmage for the Bison this year.

► **A.J. Kizekai's** 79-yard touchdown reception in the first quarter was his fourth career touchdown of at least 79 yards.

► Holy Cross won the time of possession battle 35:01-24:59 as it held the ball for more than 20 minutes in the second half.

► Holy Cross scored all 34 of its points in the final 30:01.

► **A.J. Kizekai** totaled 254 all-purpose yards, the second-highest figure of his career and the ninth-best in program history.

► **A.J. Kizekai** piled up 119 kickoff return yards to bring him to within 14 yards of the program record.

► **Josh Lee** had two plays of longer than 30 yards, giving him eight plays of at least 20 yards this season.

► **Casey Williams** led Bucknell with a career high-tying 10 tackles, marking the fifth person in the last five games to lead the Bison in that category.

► **Will Carney** kicked a career-long 47-yard field goal.

► Bucknell committed just one penalty for the second consecutive game.

► Holy Cross had 30 first downs compared to 14 for Bucknell.

KIZEKAI NEARS KICKOFF RETURN RECORD

A.J. Kizekai has an excellent chance to break Bucknell's career kickoff return record Saturday against Lafayette. The junior enters the contest just 14 yards shy of equaling Dan Scocca's 18-year-old record of 1,843. Additionally, Kizekai is 42 yards shy of second place on Bucknell's single-season kickoff return list. He already owns the top spot on that list with more than 1,100 yards last year. On a single-game level, Kizekai, who has registered at least 100 return yards in three of the last four games, owns five of the top nine return marks in Bucknell history.

ALL-PURPOSE A.J.

Rewriting the Bucknell kickoff return record book is not all that **A.J. Kizekai** is doing. He is also etching his name into the all-purpose yards ledger. The junior has totaled at least 190 all-purpose yards each of the last four games, including three outings with more than 200 yards. Kizekai's 182.1 all-purpose yards per game, which rank him fifth nationally, place him atop the Patriot League in that category with only Colgate's Jordan Scott within 50 yards of him. Last time out against Holy Cross, Kizekai piled up a season-high 254 all-purpose yards, the ninth-best single-game mark in program history.

OFFENSE STRONG AT HOME

Bucknell is averaging 31.2 points per game in its four home games this season. The Bison have not averaged more than 30 points per game at home for a full season since 2001.

PASSING ATTACK

Bucknell has been relying on the pass much more than in any of the six years **Tim Landis** has been at the helm. In fact, the Bison have thrown for 1,551 yards, their most since 2001 when they threw for 2,339. **Marcello Trigg**, who is listed fifth in the nation in passing efficiency, leads Bucknell with a career-high 1,438 yards. He is the first Bison to throw for more than 1,000 yards in back-to-back seasons since Todd Wenrich in 2001 and 2002.

FIRST LOSING STREAK SINCE 2007

Bucknell has lost to Colgate and Holy Cross in its last two games. It is the first time the Bison have lost consecutive contests since it snapped a five-game skid with a thrilling victory at nationally ranked Fordham in the final game of the 2007 campaign.

GAME CAPTAINS

In a change from recent years, Bucknell did not name team captains in the preseason. Instead, the Bison will elect captains on a game-by-game basis. Four players will serve in the captain role this Saturday against Lafayette. Senior RB **Kevin Mullen** and junior RB **A.J. Kizekai** will captain the offense, while junior LB **Greg Jones** will be the defensive captain for the fourth consecutive week. Junior LB **Casey Williams** will be the special teams captain. With his selection as captain, Mullen is making his fifth appearance in that role, the most on the team.

PASTERNAK RECEIVING HEADLINES

Sophomore WR **Shaun Pasternak** is putting up numbers that have not been seen at Bucknell in a long time. He is the first Bison with four 100-yard receiving games in the same season since current Iowa assistant coach Lester Erb in 1989. Pasternak leads the Patriot League in receiving yards per game (93.5) and is second in receptions per game (5.9). He is in the top 30 nationally in both categories. Pasternak eclipsed the 1,000-yard mark for his career last Saturday at Holy Cross and his 748 yards this season rank eighth on the program's single-season ledger. Still a sophomore, Pasternak, whose 47 receptions are the most by a Bucknell player since Jim Horan hauled in 59 in 2001, is on pace to join Tom Mitchell and Horan as the only Bison receivers to ever record 2,000 yards in their careers.

PEAKING AT THE END

Bucknell, which has four games this November, is 7-9 (.438) over the last six years in the final month of the football season. The Bison are just 6-14 (.300) in October and 8-11 (.421) in September over that same span. This is the first time Bucknell has had four games on its November schedule since 2003.

CLOSE GAMES

Bucknell's first four games this year, and five of its first six, were decided by less than one touchdown. LONG FIELD GOALS

Will Carney kicked a career-long 47-yard field goal last Saturday at Holy Cross. The senior, who had not connected on a field goal longer than 40 yards since 2006 entering this season, is 2-for-2 from over 40 yards this season. Of Bucknell's three field goals this season, the shortest is 38 yards.

PUNTING - THE GOOD AND THE BAD

It was an up-and-down day punting for Bucknell senior **Phil Azarik** last Saturday against Holy Cross. Azarik punted a total of six times, placed two inside the 20, had one go a career long-tying 61 yards and averaged better than 43 yards per boot. However, two of Azarik's kicks were blocked. It ended a stretch of nine consecutive games where the Bison had not had a punt blocked.

HOME VS. ROAD

Bucknell has done the exact opposite of what is expected by going 1-3 at home and 1-3 on the road. The Bison, who opened their road slate 3-0 for just the eighth time in program history, will be trying to avoid their fourth consecutive home loss Saturday against Lafayette. Bucknell has not lost four consecutive home games since 1991.

FIRST DOWNS

Bucknell has managed just 26 first downs over the last two games, while its opponents have 58. The Bison have not had such a first-down deficit in back-to-back games since consecutive losses to Holy Cross and Lafayette last year when the opponents combined for 56 first downs, compared to 15 for Bucknell.

HIGH-SCORING OPPONENTS

Bucknell has yielded 86 points over its last two games. It is the first time the Bison have given up that many points in back-to-back contests since last September when Stony Brook (48) and Cornell (38) combined for 86 points. Bucknell has seen its opponents score 97 points in its last two outings at Christy Mathewson-Memorial Stadium. The only time back-to-back home opponents scored more were the first two games in program history when Lafayette defeated Bucknell 59-0 in 1883 and Penn State downed the Bison 54-0 in 1887 for a combined 113 points.

PL AWARDS

Bucknell earned at least one Patriot League weekly award after each of its first four games. The Bison have been in a drought of late as they have not earned a weekly honor since the first week of October when **Marcello Trigg** was honored as the Offensive Player of the Week and **Robert De La Rosa** copped Rookie of the Week plaudits.

LEWISBURG, Pa. — Junior quarterback Marcello Trigg completed his first 14 passes and finished 14 of 16 for a career-high 290 yards, and Bucknell parlayed 42 first-half points into a 48-42 victory over Duquesne in its season opener. The Bison piled up 537 yards of total offense in the victory, while the two teams combined for more than 1,000 total yards.

Trigg was trying to become the first Bucknell quarterback since 1994 to record 300 passing yards in a game, but came up 10 yards short.

The Bison used a number of big plays in the first half to jump out to a 42-7 halftime advantage. Josh Lee was a key in the first half as he had a 34-yard run to the 2-yard line that set up a touchdown run by Trigg to put Bucknell up 7-0. He later caught a 44-yard pass from Trigg that made the score 21-0 early in the second quarter.

Lee and Smith were important cogs in the offense new offensive coordinator Harold Nichols was directing, but Trigg and sophomore wide receiver Shaun Pasternak really shined. The two hooked up seven times for a career-high 166 yards and one touchdown.

While the Bucknell offense shined in the first half, Duquesne was strong in the second half, tallying 28 points in the final quarter. Michigan State transfer Connor Dixon was 30-for-47 for 429 yards and a school-record six touchdowns at quarterback for the Dukes, while Alex Roberson caught 11 balls for 154 yards. Of Duquesne's 485 total yards, 357 came after halftime.

MOON TOWNSHIP, Pa. — Sam Nana-Sinkam blocked a Garrett Clawson field goal attempt with three seconds left to seal a 17-14 Bison victory over Robert Morris at a wet Joe Walton Stadium. The Bison improved to 2-0 for the first time since 2003, head coach Tim Landis' first season at Bucknell.

The game was close throughout as neither team led by more than a touchdown. It looked like Bucknell was going to put the game away late in the fourth quarter when Marcello Trigg completed 25-yard 3rd-and-11 pass to A.J. Kizekai for a first down at the Robert Morris 16-yard line with just under three minutes on the clock. However, the Bison were unable to convert another first down and Will Carney had his 30-yard field goal blocked.

Robert Morris took possession and marched down the field, covering 74 yards in 10 plays. Additionally, a couple of penalties helped the Colonials cover the distance in less than two minutes.

Robert Morris had five chances to punch in a touchdown on that final possession, but the Bison defense came up big as Colonial quarterback Erik Gwalinski threw a couple incomplete passes, was tackled on a quarterback draw by Marques Morgan and the offense was whistled for an illegal formation penalty. That series of plays, all within the final minute, set up the potential game-tying field goal. Nana-Sinkam jumped from his middle line position and got a solid piece of Clawson's 27-yard low kick to clinch the victory.

The Bison brought a 10-7 lead into the half thanks to a penalty by the Colonials. Will Carney attempted what would have been a career-best 49-yard field goal, but the kick was wide right. However, Robert Morris was whistled for a running into the kicker penalty, giving Carney another chance, this one from 44 yards. He connected on that field goal, which was the longest of his career.

The momentum Bucknell gained from Carney's boot was short-lived as Myles Russ outran the Bison defense and scored on a 68-yard touchdown scamper on the second play of the second half.

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Marcello Trigg completed 13 of 20 passes for 137 yards and two touchdowns and ran for another score as Bucknell posted a come-from-behind 27-24 victory at Georgetown at Multi-Sport Field.
