HEAD COACH TIM LANDIS

Tim Landis is in his sixth year as the Bob Odell Head Coach of Bucknell Football in 2008, and he tied Carl Snavelly for fifth place on Bucknell's career games as a head coach list Nov. 15 against Lehigh.



Landis' teams have achieved .500 or better records in three of his first five seasons at Bucknell, including a 7-4 campaign in 2004.

Having already resurrected programs at Davidson and St. Mary's, Landis arrived at Bucknell in December 2002 to take over a football program that was undergoing a trying period.

As Landis' first spring practice approached, the Bison were still coping with the death of legendary head coach Tom Gadd, and they were still tasting the bitterness of a 2-9 record that ended a school-record run of seven straight winning seasons.

But under Landis' leadership, pride was quickly restored in the program, and the Bison turned in two very good seasons, first going 6-6 in 2003 then improving to 7-4 in 2004. Bucknell placed third in the competitive Patriot League standings both seasons.

Landis has coached both an All-American (DL Sean Conover) and a pair of Academic All-Americans (OL Justin Gibson, DB David Frisbey) during his tenure at Bucknell.

Upon his hiring, Landis, 44, brought to the Bison football program an impressive cache of head coaching experience. He became Bucknell's 25th head football coach since the program's inception in 1883.

Following a seven-year tenure as head coach at Davidson, Landis spent the three seasons prior to coming to Bucknell building a solid program at St. Mary's (Calif.). In both positions, he garnered national accolades for turning modestly successful programs into winners.

BISON NOTES & NOTABLES

WITH A VICTORY OVER FORDHAM, BUCKNELL WOULD ...

- ▶ ... snap a four-game losing streak.
- ▶ ... snap a four-game home losing streak, its longest since 1991.
- ▶ ... defeat the Rams for the third consecutive season.
- ▶ ... help **Tim Landis** move past Pete Reynolds and into sole possession of eighth place on the program's win list (28).
- ▶ ... finish a season with at least five wins for the fourth time in six years under head coach **Tim Landis**.
- ▶ ... win its final regular-season game for the third straight year and fifth time in the last six seasons.
- ▶ ... finish fifth in the Patriot League standings.

ABOUT THE GAME

Bucknell and Fordham close out the 2008 campaign on Saturday with the winner earning sole possession of fifth place in the final Patriot League standings. The two teams faced each other in their final contests of the 2007 season as well. Bucknell won that contest at Jack Coffey Field by a 38-24 score over the nationally ranked Rams. That victory snapped a five-game losing streak for the Bison, who enter Saturday's contest having lost four in a row. Bucknell has struggled with injuries in the latter part of the year as starting quarterback **Marcello Trigg** went down Nov. 1 against Holy Cross and junior linebacker **Sam Nana-Sinkam** was lost for the season in mid-October. At the time he was among the nation's leading tacklers. **Marques Morgan** and **Robert De La Rosa**, stalwarts in the defensive lineup, did not start last week at Lehigh, while key contributors **Will Braaf**, **Brigham Farrand** and **Todd Manjuck** have also missed some time recently. After struggling defensively of late (opponents were averaging more than 500 yards of total offense over previous three games), Bucknell limited Lehigh to a season-low 204 yards, including just 67 in the first half, last Saturday. Fordham has alternated wins and losses over its last six contests and is coming off a 17-0 win over last-place Georgetown. The Rams have scored more than 17 points just once in their last five games, but rank 23rd nationally in passing offense. Even with a strong passing attack, RB Xavier Martin leads the Patriot League in rushing with 1,090 yards and has seven touchdowns to his credit.

LAST TIME VS. FORDHAM

Bucknell 38, Fordham 24 (Nov. 17, 2007 - Bronx, N.Y.)

Bucknell's **Marcello Trigg** needed only five pass completions to throw for 214 yards and two long touchdowns, and Corin Erby rushed for 129 yards and a score in his final collegiate game to lead the Bison to a 38-24 upset of 18th-ranked Fordham. One of Trigg's big plays was an 82-yard touchdown pass to **A.J. Kizekai**, who broke the Bucknell single-season all-purpose yardage record. With 82 receiving yards, 57 rushing yards and 64 kickoff return yards, the sophomore logged 203 all-purpose yards on the day. That gave him 1,908 for the season, breaking Hall of Famer Ken Jenkins' 27-year-old record of 1,884. Fordham quarterback John Skelton completed 34 of 50 passes for 366 yards, but the Bison intercepted him twice in the second half. Asa Lucas caught 10 passes for 178 yards to lead all receivers. Bucknell held Fordham to only 81 rushing yards - 111 below its season average. Jonte Coven, who came in with 891 rushing yards, led the Rams with 35. Bucknell outgained Fordham 475-447 on the day, compiling 261 rushing yards and 214 through the air en route to a season-high for total offense. After giving up a go-ahead touchdown with only 11 seconds left in the first half, Bucknell took over the game after halftime, scoring 24 straight points to win its season finale for the fourth time in the last five years.

INSIDE THE LEHIGH BOX SCORE

- ▶ Freshman QB **C.J. Hopson** made his first career start for Bucknell.
- ▶ **Shaun Pasternak** broke the Bucknell single-season record with his 11th touchdown reception.
- ▶ **Travis Nissley** equaled his career high with his team-high nine tackles.
- ▶ **Todd Rinaldo** had a career-high two sacks, the most for a Bison since Josh Eden in 2006.
- ▶ **Tim Bolte** had his first career interception in his third career game.
- ▶ Bucknell limited Lehigh to 204 yards, the fewest by an opponent since 2004.
- ▶ **C.J. Hopson's** 32 pass attempts were the most for a Bison quarterback since 2002.
- ▶ **Marlon Woods** recorded Bucknell's first blocked punt since 2005, which also occurred against Lehigh.
- ▶ Bucknell recorded its first safety since 2003.
- ▶ **Shaun Pasternak** caught nine passes for 97 yards as he just missed his fifth 100-yard game of the season.
- ▶ Bucknell registered more first downs than its opponent for the first time since Oct. 18 vs. Georgetown.

ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Freshman QB **C.J. Hopson** made his first career start last Saturday at Lehigh and has already been honored by the Patriot League despite being just two games into his career. The Maryland native was named the Patriot League Rookie of the Week on Monday after completing 17 of 32 passes for 151 yards and one touchdown. He also ran 21 times for a game-high 76 yards and one touchdown. His 76 yards rushing were more than double anyone else on either team, while his 32 pass attempts were the most by a Bucknell quarterback since Cole Ciesnolevich was 23-for-36 in a tight 32-31 loss to Georgetown in 2002. Hopson was Bucknell's second Rookie of the Week selection this year, following **Robert De La Rosa**. Overall, the Bison have had five different players honored by the Patriot League this season.

TOUCHDOWN RECORD

Freshman **C.J. Hopson** found sophomore **Shaun Pasternak** for Bucknell's first touchdown last Saturday at Lehigh. While it was the first career touchdown pass for Hopson, it marked the 11th score of the season for Pasternak, breaking the Bison single-season standard. Lester Erb held the previous record with 10 touchdown grabs in 1990. Pasternak now has 13 career receiving touchdowns, just five shy of the career record and he still has two more years to play.

MORE RECEIVING RECORDS ON HORIZON FOR PASTERNAK

While **Shaun Pasternak** broke the Bucknell single-season record for touchdown receptions against Lehigh, that is not the only record he might have at the end of Saturday's contest with Fordham. Pasternak enters the final game of the campaign just 10 receptions shy of the single-season record, while he is just 102 yards short of first place in the Bison record books in that category. With 73 yards against Fordham Pasternak will become the first Patriot League player since 2003 to record at least 1,000 receiving yards in a season, although Colgate's Pat Simonds enters the weekend with 960 yards this year to pace the league.

LAST GAMES

Bucknell has had success under sixth-year head coach **Tim Landis** in its final games of the season. The Bison have won the season finale four of the last five years, including two straight. Last year Bucknell defeated Patriot League champion and No. 18 Fordham 38-24 in the final game of the season.

STARTING STREAKS

Defensive stars **Marques Morgan** and **Robert De La Rosa** did not appear in last Saturday's game at Lehigh. It brought Morgan's consecutive starts streak of 14 to an end, while De La Rosa's stopped at nine. That leaves **Rob Gerlach** as the only Bison defensive player to start all 10 games this season. **A.J. Kizekai's** 16 consecutive appearances in the starting lineup paces the squad.

WHO WILL FINISH FIFTH?

The winner of Saturday's Bucknell-Fordham contest will finish fifth in the final Patriot League standings. The two teams enter the contest with matching 1-4 league records. The winner will not be able to jump over Lafayette or Lehigh, which are tied for third with 3-2 records. The loser will not fall behind Georgetown, which is 0-5, but has concluded its season.

STRONG DEFENSE

Bucknell limited Lehigh to 204 yards of total offense last Saturday. It marked the lowest total for a Bison opponent since Georgetown managed just 162 in 2004. The last time a Bucknell opponent had fewer than 204 yards and still won was Fordham in 2001. The Rams posted a 17-12 win over the Bison despite just 193 yards of total offense.

HIGH-SCORING OFFENSE

Bucknell's offense has been clicking this year. In fact, the Bison are averaging 24.5 points per game, their second-highest total this decade. The 1999 squad averaged 29.1 points per game and since that time only the 2004 team (26.9 points per game) has averaged more than the current edition of the Bison.

HIGH-SCORING OFFENSE - PART 2

Bucknell has tallied at least 15 points in each of its 10 games this year. Only five times has Bucknell avoided a single-digit score for an entire season.

LONG TOUCHDOWNS

A.J. Kizekai set a Bucknell record with a 100-yard kickoff return for a touchdown two weeks ago against Lafayette. The junior now has five career plays of at least 79 yards, including two in the last three weeks. His two career kickoff returns for touchdowns ties a Bucknell and Patriot League record.

FIRST LOSING STREAK SINCE 2007

Bucknell is in the midst of a four-game losing streak, marking its first losing skid since it snapped a five-game streak with a thrilling victory at nationally ranked Fordham in the final game of the 2007 campaign.

PASSING ATTACK

Bucknell has been relying on the pass much more than in any of the six years **Tim Landis** has been at the helm. In fact, the Bison have thrown for 1,834 yards, their most since 2001 when they threw for 2,339. **Marcello Trigg**, who is listed fourth in the nation in passing efficiency, leads Bucknell with a career-high 1,438 yards, but was lost for the season with injury against Holy Cross. He is the first Bison to throw for more than 1,000 yards in back-to-back seasons since Todd Wenrich in 2001 and 2002.

100-YARD GAMES FOR PASTERNAK

Sophomore WR **Shaun Pasternak** is putting up numbers that have not been seen at Bucknell in a long time. He is the first Bison with four 100-yard receiving games in the same season since current Iowa assistant coach Lester Erb in 1989. Pasternak is second in the Patriot League in receiving yards per game (92.7) and is first in receptions per game (6.3). He is in the top 25 nationally in both categories. Pasternak is within range of becoming the second Bison with 1,000 yards in a season. Still a sophomore, Pasternak, whose 63 receptions are the third most by a Bucknell player, is on pace to join Tom Mitchell and Jim Horan as the only Bison receivers to ever record 2,000 yards in their careers.

REDUCED RUSHING

With its reliance on the pass more this year, Bucknell has failed to rush for at least 100 yards in a game four times this season. In the first five years of head coach **Tim Landis'** tenure, the Bison did not rush for at least 100 yards six times, and never did they fail to record 100 yards on the ground in back-to-back games, something that has happened twice this season.

KIZEKAI SHOWERED WITH AWARDS

Following his performance two weeks ago against Lafayette that featured a Bucknell-record 210 kickoff return yards, **A.J. Kizekai** was named The Sports Network National Special Teams Player of the Week, the Patriot League Special Teams Player of the Week and the Damon's Bison Athlete of the Week. The highlight of Kizekai's day came when he returned a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown, setting a new Bucknell record. Overall, he had six returns for 210 yards and totaled 285 all-purpose yards in the contest. Kizekai has registered at least 100 return yards in four of the last six games and currently owns six of the top 10 return marks in program history.

ALL-PURPOSE A.J.

Rewriting the Bucknell kickoff return record book is not all that **A.J. Kizekai** is doing. He is also etching his name into the all-purpose yards ledger. The junior has totaled at least 190 all-purpose yards in five of the last six games, including four outings with more than 200 yards. Kizekai's 184 all-purpose yards per game, which rank him fourth nationally, place him atop the Patriot League in that category with second-place Matt McGowan more than 50 yards behind. Kizekai, who is averaging more than 215 all-purpose yards per game at home, posted a career-high 285 yards against Lafayette, the seventh-best mark in program history.

LEWISBURG, Pa. — Junior quarterback Marcello Trigg completed his first 14 passes and finished 14 of 16 for a career-high 290 yards, and Bucknell parlayed 42 first-half points into a 48-42 victory over Duquesne in its season opener. The Bison piled up 537 yards of total offense in the victory, while the two teams combined for more than 1,000 total yards.

Trigg was trying to become the first Bucknell quarterback since 1994 to record 300 passing yards in a game, but came up 10 yards short.

The Bison used a number of big plays in the first half to jump out to a 42-7 halftime advantage. Josh Lee was a key in the first half as he had a 34-yard run to the 2-yard line that set up a touchdown run by Trigg to put Bucknell up 7-0. Lee and Smith were important cogs in the offense new offensive coordinator Harold Nichols was directing, but Trigg and sophomore wide receiver Shaun Pasternak really shined. The two hooked up seven times for a career-high 166 yards and one touchdown.

While the Bucknell offense shined in the first half, Duquesne was strong in the second half, tallying 28 points in the final quarter. Michigan State transfer Connor Dixon was 30-for-47 for 429 yards and a school-record six touchdowns at quarterback for the Dukes, while Alex Roberson caught 11 balls for 154 yards. Of Duquesne's 485 total yards, 357 came after halftime.

MOON TOWNSHIP, Pa. — Sam Nana-Sinkam blocked a Garrett Clawson field goal attempt with three seconds left to seal a 17-14 Bison victory over Robert Morris at a wet Joe Walton Stadium. The Bison improved to 2-0 for the first time since 2003, head coach Tim Landis' first season at Bucknell.

The game was close throughout as neither team led by more than a touchdown. That series of plays, all within the final minute, set up the potential game-tying field goal. Nana-Sinkam jumped from his middle line position and got a solid piece of Clawson's 27-yard low kick to clinch the victory.

The Bison brought a 10-7 lead into the half thanks to a penalty by the Colonials. Will Carney attempted what would have been a career-best 49-yard field goal, but the kick was wide right. However, Robert Morris was whistled for a running into the kicker penalty, giving Carney another chance, this one from 44 yards. He connected on that field goal, which was the longest of his career.

The momentum Bucknell gained from Carney's boot was short-lived as Myles Russ outran the Bison defense and scored on a 68-yard touchdown scamper on the second play of the second half.

LEWISBURG, Pa. — Nate Eachus rushed for 214 yards on 36 carries and three touchdowns to lead Colgate to a 52-28 victory over Bucknell in a steady rain at Christy Mathewson-Memorial Stadium. Shaun Pasternak caught eight passes for 150 yards and Brigham Farrand registered a career-high 18 tackles for the Bison.

Bucknell, which had three touchdown drives in the first half that were each less than 45 seconds in length, trailed just 24-21 in the waning minutes of the first half, but turnovers on its final possession of the second quarter and its first of the third quarter helped Colgate jump out to a 38-21 advantage. The Raiders scored 35 consecutive points at one juncture as they came back from a 21-17 deficit to lead 52-21.

Eight of the game's 11 scores occurred in a wild first half that featured six lead changes and ended with Colgate leading 31-21.

Colgate managed to record 522 yards, its second consecutive game with at least 500 yards, while Bucknell registered just 296, 117 of which came on Kizekai's run and Pasternak's touchdown reception. The Raiders, who tallied their most points in the series and the second-most against a Tim Landis-coached Bison team, also accumulated 28 first downs to Bucknell's 12.

HOLY CROSS 34 BUCKNELL 17

WORCESTER, Mass. — Bucknell held the high-scoring Holy Cross offense without a point until the final seconds of the first half, but the Crusaders overcame a 10-0 deficit and scored the 34 of the game's final 41 points, including 31 straight at one point, to defeat the Bison 34-17 at Fitton Field. Holy Cross quarterback Dominic Randolph was 38 of 49 passing for 398 yards and four touchdowns. Three hundred of his yards came in the final 31 minutes of play.

Bucknell suffered its first road loss of the season and dropped its fourth consecutive contest to the Crusaders.

Holy Cross, which was averaging 36 points per game, piled up 532 yards, its second-highest total of the season, while Bucknell totaled 338 yards, including 245 through the air as Marcello Trigg threw for 158 before leaving the game late in the first half with a leg injury. Andrew Lair came on in relief and was 5 of 11 for 87 yards and one touchdown.

Randolph, who threw for 63 of his 161 first-half yards on the drive, found Jon Brock in the right corner of the endzone from 20 yards out to make the score 10-7 going into halftime.

The Crusader offense got in gear in the second half as it scored the first 24 points of the stanza to go up 31-10 in the fourth quarter. Overall, Holy Cross scored on five of its six second-half possessions and held the ball for more than 20 minutes.

LEWISBURG, Pa. — In his first career start, Lafayette quarterback Marc Quilling was 17 of 26 passing for 274 yards and three touchdowns and Tyrell Coon rushed 30 times for 169 yards as the Leopards defeated Bucknell 38-21. The Bison were plagued by three turnovers as they lost their fourth consecutive home game.

A.J. Kizekai was a bright spot for Bucknell as he broke the Bison career and single-game records for kickoff yards. He also opened the Bison scoring with a 100-yard kickoff return in the first quarter, breaking the program record of 99. Kizekai totaled 210 return yards on his six returns, giving him 2,039 in his career.

Bucknell hung tight with Lafayette, which did not commit any turnovers, despite the Leopards outgaining the Bison 474-222 in the game. Bucknell, trailed just 24-21 midway through the third quarter, but Lafayette added the final two touchdowns of the game.

The Bison trailed 14-7 midway through the second quarter after a Lafayette punt. BETHLEHEM, Pa. — Bucknell limited Lehigh to 204 yards of total offense and won the time of possession category, but the Bison dropped a 31-15 decision to the Mountain Hawks at Goodman Stadium. Bucknell lost to Lehigh for the 11th consecutive time.

C.J. Hopson earned his first career start at quarterback for Bucknell and completed 17 of 32 passes for 151 yards and one touchdown. He also rushed 21 times for a game-high 76 yards and one touchdown as he played a part in both of the team's offensive scores. Hopson's first career appearance came late in last Saturday's contest against Lafayette when the Leopards totaled 472 yards of offense. Bucknell and Lehigh combined for 486 yards of offense.

Shaun Pasternak caught nine passes for 97 yards as he fell just shy of his fifth 100-yard receiving game of the season. He also caught his Bucknell-record 11th touchdown of the season.

On the sixth play of Bucknell's ensuing possession Woods took a pitch from Hopson and fumbled. Matt Cohen, who later had an interception, scooped up the loose ball and returned it 38 yards to make the score 14-0 just over six minutes into the contest.
