## REFLECTING BACK ON THE 2011 CHAMPIONSHIP SEASON



As you all know by now last year was a memorable one for Bucknell Lacrosse. It was record breaking in many ways. We set school records for wins and rankings. We finished with 14 regular season wins which was the most for any division I team for the 2011 season. The 14 wins surpassed the undefeated and “uninvited” Bucknell Lacrosse team of 1996 (12-0). We went 6-0 during the regular season which insured our 2nd regular season Patriot League Championship in the last three years. More importantly, we won our first Patriot League Championship Tournament in program history. We had the 2nd best goal differential of any team in PLC history as we rolled past Lehigh and Colgate

in front of a nice crowd in Christy Mathewson Stadium by a combined score of 23-8.

The accomplishment that I am most proud of however, is our team’s final regular season national ranking. We finished #7 in the USILA coach’s poll. We ended the year ranked ahead of UNC, Virginia (national champs), Maryland (national runner-up) and Princeton – some pretty good teams! Think about it, there were only six teams that were ranked ahead of us! The #7 ranking was the highest of any athletic team in the history of Bucknell Athletics. Additionally, we were the only Division I team in the 2011 season that either moved up or stayed even in the national polls for every week of the season. We never dropped a ranking once all year. Unless you go undefeated it’s almost impossible to do so...

For the fourth consecutive year our senior class graduated as the winningest class in Bucknell Lacrosse History. That makes it four years in a row of graduating the winningest class.

Our two regular season losses happened on Tuesday nights, on the road, and we were unable to stay overnight the night before due to academic reasons. We were tied or winning late in the 4th quarter in both of those games. We were close to going undefeated...

Finally, we gave Virginia (the eventual national champions) everything they could handle, in the first round of the NCAA tournament. It was the kind of game that you would put in a time machine, save, and watch 20 years later. We outshot UVA 50-37. They had 18 turnovers to our 7. We out rode and cleared them, out ground balled them, won the face-offs, and of course out shot them. We had a nice lead of 10-6 late in the 3rd quarter that we could not hold onto and eventually lost in overtime 13-12 - devastating. But as a consolation, I think we made many alumni very proud that day down in Charlottesville.

I attribute our success to a lot of hard work and dedication. Our mantra for the year was mental and physical toughness. We literally “conditioned” mental and physical toughness on a daily basis from September 1st all the way until the last day of practice. The senior leadership of Klipstein, Collett, Clarke, Foreit, Lyons, Danylyshyn, Nies and Christian Tucker was outstanding. The team was exceptionally mentally and physically tough all year long and I thought for 57 minutes of our Virginia game we were too. From a head coaches point of view I could not have been more proud.

## HUGH DONOVAN '96 INDUCTED INTO HALL OF FAME

The 33rd class of the Bucknell Athletics Hall of Fame was officially inducted as part of Homecoming Weekend on October 22. Six new members joined the Hall, including former men’s lacrosse standout Hugh Donovan '96.

Donovan was the 9th lacrosse player to be inducted into the Bucknell Athletics Hall of Fame. He was one of the most talented athletes to ever wear a Bucknell Uniform. Donovan was a dominant Defenseman for the Bison for all four years and led the undefeated team of 1996 to a record-setting year. The defensive goals against average that year was *No. 1* in the nation, only giving up 6.25 goals per game!

Donovan was an All-American, Patriot League Player of the Year and played professional lacrosse as well. He is currently the Head Lacrosse Coach at Harford Community College in Maryland and is doing very well.

## 2011 FALL BALL RECAP

Each year fall ball takes on its own personality and theme. This fall ball was defined more by weather, injuries, and perseverance. It was by far, in my 22 years in Central PA, the worst weather I have ever experienced. Central PA set a record for rain for the month of September with 20 inches. Because of this we were unable to practice on the field designated for men's lacrosse. We had to go into Christy Mathewson Stadium when we could – which in most cases was at 6:00 a.m. Because of many other teams trying to schedule in Christy we were unable to have our normal work for a typical fall.

Injuries took on a new meaning for this team as we lost seven guys to injuries including two ACL's (Charlie Streep '12 and Ben Kellar '15). Streep is hoping to return to the team in late March and Ben Kellar is done for the season.

In addition, first team All-Patriot League defender Michael Huffner '13 was out all fall with a broken foot and did not participate in our fall scrimmage. Because of all the injuries we had to persevere. With any loss there is an opportunity for someone to step up. We shuffled our personnel around significantly. In the first week of fall ball our first midfield consisted of three seniors including two returning first team All Patriot League honorees of Streep and Billy Eiesenreich '12, along with Nick Gantsoudes '12.

Fortunately we have a lot of depth at midfield this year which allowed us to move Billy Eiesenreich to attack. Billy is an exceptionally dynamic player and he has blossomed at attack. He will remain there along with Todd Heritage '14 and Chase Bailey '13.

Moving up to first midfield line is sophomore Peter Burke '14 and freshman Joe Kearney '15. Kearney is the quickest player on the team and possesses the hardest shot on the team. The second midfield consists of Billy Mattimore '13, Tommy Black '14 and David Dickson '15.

Our biggest loss from last year came on the defensive end as we graduated our top three ss-dmids and two starting defensemen. Throw in the two injured starters on defense (Huffner & Kellar) and we were playing defense with a ton of new faces this fall. The group we went with on close defense was Jackson Place '14, Jason Neithamer '12 and Matt Spagnoli '12. Our d-mids are (LSM) John Scally '12, Sam McDonough '14, and Kyle O'Keefe '13 (converted o-mid). Freshman Andrew Dempsey '15 is our third ssdmid and he was outstanding. In goal our #1 net minder is Kyle Feeney '13 who has had a great fall and his back-up is Sam Grinberg '15. Our defensive system is very complicated and I had to start from ground zero for the majority of them. It was challenging but very exciting!

Our one scrimmage this fall was on Sunday, October 16, down at UNC Chapel Hill. The Tar Heels have a very talented team and I would be surprised if they are not ranked in the top-8 for pre-season and at the end of the season. We

played our starters vs. their starters for 3.5 quarters and we lost 11-10. Going into the fourth quarter we were winning 10-9. Our offense played very well all day long. Eiesenreich was a stud (4g, 2a) and Todd Heritage and Chase Bailey played well on attack. We ran two midfield lines and received terrific production from both of those. We lost the majority of face-offs to one of the best face-off teams in the nation, however, our #1 face-off guy Ryan Gutowski '13 is the starting punter for Bucknell's football team and he did not participate.

# MEET THE BISON FRESHMAN CLASS

This year's incoming class comes with high acclaim, and Coach Fedorjaka feels that there are impact players at every position from attack all the way back to goalie. The class features student-athletes from talent-rich areas such as Baltimore, Long Island, Upstate New York, New Jersey and Connecticut, as well as two in-state recruits. More than a quarter of the class earned U.S. Lacrosse High School All-America honors last spring.

"I am very excited about this incoming class," said Fedorjaka, who won Patriot League Coach of the Year honors after leading Bucknell to a school-record 14 wins in 2011. "It is a very talented class both academically and athletically. Most importantly, I think they all chose Bucknell for the right reasons, which is academics first and lacrosse second. It certainly has the potential to be one of the best classes that I have ever been associated with here at Bucknell.

"The thing that impresses me most about this class is its balance. We have potential impact guys in every position, and we have depth in every position. We have two very talented face-off guys in Gavin Sullivan and Joe Kearney; there are a couple of ball-carrying attackmen who ride very well; we have two outstanding goalies who know how to win; we have two defenseman in Cam Bulgione and Ben Kellar who have the capability of starting as first-year players due to our graduation of Alex Lyons and John Collett; we have a couple of very talented short-stick defensive middies in Andrew Dempsey and Mike Ondrusek; and there is plenty of talent coming in at midfield."

“Nick comes to us having a full understanding of what it takes to win games and recruit at Bucknell University,” Fedorjaka said of Marks. “Nick was a terrific player here, and he played at a high

level after he graduated. Nick was one of the toughest players I have ever coached. He was always playing through a significant injury of some sort and was clearly one of the more physical players in the Patriot League during his time here. Nick will be working with the offense, he will be our face-off coach, and he will run our box on game days. Nick is a tireless worker and has already earned the respect from the players on the team.”
