PATRIOT LEAGUE MEN'S LACROSSE TOURNAMENT — FIRST ROUND

In a battle of top-15 teams, Bucknell and Army meet Friday afternoon in the second semifinal game of the second annual Patriot League Men's Lacrosse Tournament. Host Navy takes on first-time tournament participant Lehigh in the opener of the twin bill. Bucknell matched Army and Navy with a 5-1 Patriot League regular-season record, but the Midshipmen claimed the No. 1 seed via a rarely used goal-differential tiebreaker. The Bison are no strangers to the heights of the Patriot League standings, having shared or won outright four straight league titles from 2000-03. In last season's inaugural PL Tournament, Bucknell also entered as the No. 3 seed and dropped a heartbreaking 10-9 decision to eventual NCAA Tournament participant Hobart. The Bison enter the postseason having won six of their last eight games, with the two losses both coming by one goal each to Army and Penn State. Then ranked fourth nationally, Army scored the tiebreaking goal with 21 seconds left to secure a 7-6 decision over Bucknell at Michie Stadium on Apr. 9. It was the third straight meeting between the two teams decided by just a single goal. Sunday's championship game will be televised live by College Sports Television (CSTV).

How They Got Here

Bucknell claimed a three-way piece of the Patriot League regular-season title, joining Army and Navy with a 5-1 conference record. The Midshipmen narrowly had the best goal differential against the two other teams involved in the tie — the second-to-last link in the Patriot League's tiebreaker chain — and claimed the No. 1 seed. Army gained the second seed based on its 7-6 win over the Bison on Apr. 9. Bucknell became the first team to hand second-year member Navy a Patriot League loss with an 8-7 overtime decision on March 12. The Mids then only needed to defeat Army by two goals or more on Apr. 16 to clinch the goal-differential tiebreaker, and they did so with a 12-9 victory. Lehigh finished 3-3 in Patriot League play and clinched the final playoff spot with a 9-7 win over arch-rival Lafayette in the season finale last Saturday.

With a Win over Army, Bucknell Would ...

- ... advance to the Patriot League Championship game, played Sunday at 1 p.m. against the winner of the Navy/Lehigh game and broadcast live on College Sports Television (CSTV).
- ... appear in the championship game for the first time.
- ... defeat a top-10 opponent for the second time this season.
- ... reach nine victories in a season for the fifth time in school history.
- ... snap a three-game losing streak against the Black Knights.

Bison Among Patriot League's Elite

Bucknell either shared or won outright each of the last four Patriot League titles that were decided by regular-season finish. In 2000, Bucknell and Hobart both finished atop the PL with 5-1 records; in 2001 the Bison went a perfect 6-0 in league play; in 2002, Bucknell, Army and Hobart ended in a three-way tie for first at 5-1; and last season Bucknell and Army both finished 5-1. The Bison, who also won the league championship in 1996, posted a 21-3 PL record from 2000-03 and are 30-8 this century. Bucknell's lone NCAA Tournament appearance came in 2001. BU lost to Notre Dame 12-7 in the first round at West Point.

Head Coach Sid Jamieson

A legend in the college lacrosse coaching circle and the only mentor in the 38-year history of Bucknell Lacrosse, **Sid Jamieson** has announced his retirement following the 2005 season. It was announced last week that Jamieson will receive the prestigious Spirit of Tewaaron Award on June 2 in Washington, D.C., in recognition of his contributions to the sport of lacrosse. Jamieson, who first came to Bucknell as a graduate housefellow just after graduating from Cortland State in 1964, earned Patriot League Coach of the Year accolades for the third time this season. In 2001 he directed the Bison to their second conference title and first NCAA Tournament appearance. He was the USILA national Coach of the Year in 1996 after leading BU to an undefeated (12-0) season. Jamieson, who last year was inducted into the Pennsylvania Lacrosse Hall of Fame, has a 242-231 career record and ranks 10th among active coaches in career victories. The son of parents who were raised on the Six Nations Indian Reservation in Brantford, Ontario, Jamieson has been an avid spokesman on the Native American influence on the sport, and he coached the Iroquois National Team from 1983-86 and served as its executive director at the 1990 World Championships in Perth, Australia.

Frank Fedorjaka Named Next Bison Head Coach

Longtime Bucknell assistant coach **Frank Fedorjaka** has been named **Sid Jamieson's** successor as Bison head coach. Fedorjaka is currently in the seventh season of his second stint at Bucknell. A former long-stick middle on three Division III national championship teams at Hobart and an All-America wide receiver for the Statesmen football team, Fedorjaka compiled a 39-31 record in five years (1994-98) as head coach at Franklin & Marshall, and he was named USILA D-III Coach of the Year in 1995. He returned to Bucknell in 1999 — he also worked with Jamieson in 1992-93 — and has primarily served as the team's defensive coordinator. Fedorjaka's wife, Kathy, is Bucknell's head women's basketball coach.

Bucknell vs. Army, Part I

On Apr. 9 at West Point's Michie Stadium, Chris Larsen snapped a 6-all tie with 21 seconds left in the game, leading then-fourth-ranked Army to a come-from-behind 7-6 win over No. 13 Bucknell. The Bison jumped out to a 3-0 lead and held a 4-1 cushion after outshooting Army 14-2 in the first period. But the Black Knights scored the only three goals of the second quarter to pull even, then outlasted the Bison in an evenly played second half. Both teams played excellent defense, with each side getting just one goal from its Tewaaron Trophy nominee. Bucknell's **Chris Cara** was held to just a single goal, but Army star John Walker tallied just once as well. Jim Wagner potted three for Army, while **Kirk Klett** scored a pair for the Bison.

The Bucknell-Army Series

Army holds a 21-4 lead in a series that began in 1979. The series has evened up in recent years, however, as all four of Bucknell's victories have come since 1996. The Bison's four wins over Army came in 1996 (14-10), 2000 (10-9), 2001 (11-10) and 2002 (8-5). The Black Knights have captured the last three meetings, all by one goal — 10-9 in 2003, 11-10 in double overtime in 2004 and 7-6 earlier this season.

Chris Cara Named Tewaaron Trophy Nominee

Senior attack **Chris Cara**, who is in a heated race with Albany's Merrick Thomson for defense of his national scoring title, was named one of 16 nominees for the Tewaaron Trophy on Monday. The award, which goes to the outstanding college lacrosse player, will be pared to five finalists before the winner is announced on June 2. Army's John Walker and Navy's Mitch Hender are also representing the Patriot League on the list of 16.

Cara, Abou Jaoude Head List of Bucknell All-PL Picks

Chris Cara became the second player in league history to repeat as Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year, and four other Bison earned their first-ever All-Patriot League citations this week. Cara and junior defenseman **Michael Abou Jaoude** were first-team picks, while senior attack **Patrick Christensen**, senior defensive middle/faceoff specialist **Ryan Goodman** and junior goalie **Matt Baran** earned spots on the second team. In addition, head coach **Sid Jamieson** was selected by his peers as Patriot League Coach of the Year for the third time (1996, 2001).

Cara Watch

Christensen Among Top Snipers

While **Chris Cara** has garnered much of the headlines for his scoring prowess, senior attack **Patrick Christensen** has quietly put together a terrific career. Christensen, a potent finisher around the crease, ranks fifth in the Patriot League with 27 goals this season, and he now has 90 in his career, sixth-most in school history. Christensen's career-high 38 goals in 2004 rank seventh on Bucknell's single-season chart.

Guarding the Goal

Junior **Matt Baran**, a second-year starter, has enjoyed an outstanding season in goal for Bucknell. Baran leads the league with a .593 save percentage and ranks second with an 8.00 goals-against average. He has recorded at least as many saves as goals allowed in every game this season, with a season-high 17 saves coming against Maryland. He ranks 13th nationally in save percentage and 18th in GAA.

Sophomore Sensations

Bucknell has received significant contributions from an outstanding sophomore class in 2005. Offensively, attackmen **Kirk Klett** (27-3-30) and middies **Steve Case** (12-16-18) and **Brian Gargan** (11-2-13) have been stalwarts all season. Defensively, **Greg Sowyrda** has started four games at close defense, and **Paul Stansik** plays a key role at long-stick defensive midfield.

Rookie Crop

Even with 10 seniors set to graduate after this season, the future looks bright thanks to a promising freshman class, many of whom have already contributed. Most notably, 6'5" defenseman **Evan Burns** has started eight games as a rookie and could be a future all-star. Another long pole — defensive middle **Tommy Orr** — will see significant field time against Army. Middies **Mark Lane** (1-2-3) and **Nick Marks** (8-0-8) have both started games this season and are improving offensive threats. Other rookies who will likely play this weekend are second-line middies **Rick Carolan** (3-0-3) and **John Schlicher** (2-0-2), EMO specialist **Tommy Moore** (1-4-5) and No. 2 faceoff man **Austin Sanders** (53.3%).

Last Year at the Patriot League Tournament

At the inaugural Patriot League Tournament in 2004, Hobart scored the final three goals of the game to deal Bucknell a heartbreaking 10-9 defeat in the semifinals at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium. **Patrick Christensen** scored three goals and **Chris Cara** had two goals and two assists for the Bison, who finished the season at 6-8. Bucknell, seeded third in the tournament, led throughout the majority of the contest. Christensen's tally with 4:43 left in the third quarter gave the Bison their second three-goal lead of the day at 7-4. But Hobart rallied with three straight — two from Patrick Meade and one from Chris Scanlon — to draw even at 7-7 with 11:45 left to play. The resilient Bison jumped right back ahead 13 seconds after the Scanlon equalizer, when **Steve Case** dug the ball out of a faceoff scrum, sprinted to the goal and scored with a high shot. Another 2:28 later, Christensen scored his third of the day on a perfect thread-the-needle pass from Wes Fetchet. Hobart's winning rally began with Mike Conklin's goal from eight-yards out with 8:26 to play. Conklin scored again with 5:02 left in an unsettled situation. Bison goalie **Matt Baran** made a great kick save on Conklin's initial shot, but the Hobart sophomore tracked down the loose ball and flipped in an off-balance shot for the tying goal. With 2:50 to play, Chris David was able to take advantage when a Bucknell defensive middle slipped on the grass and walked in and scored from 10-yards out. Baran protected the one-goal deficit with a terrific save with 1:13 to play and the Bison forced a turnover seconds later to regain possession. On the clearing attempt Hobart's David took a cross-checking penalty, giving Bucknell's vaunted man-up unit a chance to tie with 58 seconds to play. But Stateseman defender Matt Murphy intercepted a pass with 35 seconds left and Hobart was able to run out the clock.

Making History

Senior defensive middle **Daryl Seymour** is a former member of the Iroquois National Team — he scored a goal against Team USA with his long stick at the 2002 World Championships in Australia — and is set to become the first Native American to graduate from Bucknell with an engineering degree. Seymour's first taste of the sport came in the indoor variety of box lacrosse.

Bison Migration

Bucknell's 35-man roster is represented by players from 13 different states, led by New York with 10.
