



Bison Facts

- Bucknell competes in the Patriot League, along with American, Army, Colgate, Holy Cross, Lafayette, Lehigh and Navy. The Bison return 10 of 11 letterwinners from last year's team that posted the largest win improvement in the history of the program.

- Bucknell is located in Lewisburg, Pa., a town of about 6,000 nestled along the Susquehanna River. Lewisburg is approximately an hour's drive north of Harrisburg, an hour east of State College, and 25 minutes south of Williamsport, home of the Little League World Series.

- Bucknell captured the Patriot League championship in 2002 and has advanced to the semifinals of the Patriot League Tournament five times in the last seven years.

- Perhaps Bucknell's most famous alum is baseball Hall of Famer Christy Mathewson. Known as a gentleman and a scholar, Mathewson is buried only about 100 yards behind the school's athletic facility, and Bucknell's football stadium is named in his honor.

- Current head coach Kathy Fedorjaka was an assistant coach for the Bison for three seasons from 1990 to 1993. She spent one year as head coach at Connecticut College and three campaigns at nearby Bloomsburg University before returning to Lewisburg prior to the 1997-98 season. In eight years at the helm of the Bison her record is 137-119. She has amassed 204 victories in her 13-year head coaching career.

- Bucknell Athletics has dominated the Patriot League over the years, winning 12 Presidents' Cups in the 16 years of the league, including seven in a row from 1993 to 2004. The Presidents' Cup signifies overall excellence in the 23 sports sponsored by the Patriot League.

- Bucknell has played in one NCAA Tournament, that coming in 2002. The Bison lost to Baylor 80-56 at Ferrell Center in Waco, Texas. They qualified for the tournament by defeating top-seeded Holy Cross 88-74 in the Patriot League championship game.

- Molly Creamer, a 2003 Bucknell graduate, and Desire Almind, a 2004 graduate of Bucknell, have both played basketball professionally in recent years. Creamer, who was drafted by the New York Liberty with the 10th pick in the 2003 WNBA Draft, has played professionally in Israel and in the National Women's Basketball League with the Lubbock Hawks. Almind has played abroad in France and with the NWBL's Birmingham Power.

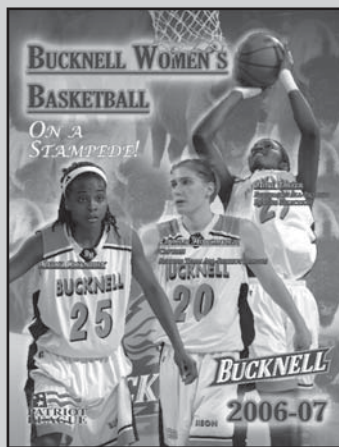

COVERING THE BISON

To receive press notes and releases via e-mail throughout the season, please contact Todd Merriett in the Office of Athletic Communications. If at any time during the season you have any questions regarding Bucknell's media policies, please do not hesitate to contact the Office of Athletic Communications.

CREDENTIALS

Media credentials are required for Bucknell home games and are issued to working members of the press only. Requests for credentials must be made in writing on company letterhead.

Season credentials will be granted to members of the media that cover Bucknell basketball on a regular basis. Requests for season credentials should arrive by November 15, 2005. Requests for single-game credentials should arrive no later than 24 hours prior to the game. All single-game credentials will be left at the media will call table in Sojka Pavilion.

MEDIA SERVICES

Working media at Sojka Pavilion will receive the following:

- Game program, pregame notes, media guides
- Complete halftime statistics ("live" stats available throughout the game on display monitors at press row)
- Complete final statistics
- Complete play-by-play
- Out of town scores

TELEPHONES

Telephones are available in the Sojka Pavilion media room, located just off the playing floor on the south side of the building, and may be used on a first-come-first-served basis. A fax machine is also available for use by members of the working media. Newspapers and radio stations desiring their own private lines to be installed on press row should contact the Office of Athletic Communications for further assistance.

VISITING RADIO

There are two courtside locations for electronic media in Sojka Pavilion, one of which is reserved for the Bison Sports Network. The remaining spot will be reserved for the "official" station of the visiting team, as designated by that institution's director of athletic communications. If there are more than two electronic media organizations broadcasting the game, then at least one broadcast crew may have to work from an auxiliary position, space permitting.

Permission to broadcast games is granted through the Bucknell Office of Athletic Communications, and arrangements for use of a phone line should be made at least one week prior to a game. Bucknell reserves the right to deny any access to organizations giving less than one week's notice of intent to broadcast.

Bucknell provides regular phone lines at a cost of \$100 per line. ALL long distance calls must be made using a credit card, or placed to a toll-free number.

PHOTOGRAPHY POLICY

Photo credentials are issued only to accredited photographers on assignment. Per NCAA rules, photographers are not permitted behind the team bench areas.

PHOTO LIBRARY

The Bucknell Office of Athletic Communications maintains a digital photo library for its student-athletes, and head shots and action photos are available on request. For more information, contact Todd Merriett at 570-577-3488.

POSTGAME INTERVIEW AREA

Postgame interviews will take place in the Sojka Pavilion media room, located just off the court under the south grandstand.

POSTGAME INTERVIEW POLICY

Approximately 10 minutes after the teams have arrived in their locker rooms, following the NCAA-mandated "cooling-off period," the visiting team's press conference will be conducted, followed by Bucknell head coach Kathy Fedorjaka and select Bison student-athletes. Requests for players will be taken by a member of the Athletic Communications staff with approximately five minutes remaining on the game clock. Following the press conferences, additional players may be made available for interview upon request. The Bucknell locker room is closed to all members of the media.

BUCKNELL WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

Once again this winter the Bison Sports Network is your home for Bucknell women's basketball action. Radio broadcasts of all 16 Bucknell regular season Patriot League games, as well as the Patriot League Tournament in March, will be carried live on the Bison Sports Network.

For the third consecutive year Bucknell's student-run station, WVBU-FM (90.5), will serve as the home of the broadcasts.

The broadcasts also have a worldwide audience over the internet, in partnership with SportsJuice.com, on the Bucknell athletics & recreation Web site — www.BucknellBison.com. Fans can also hear the games over the phone through Teamline at 800-846-4700 ext. 1668.

Doug Birdsong, who is in his seventh season as the "Voice of the Bison", will share the play-by-play duties with Trevor Rutledge-Leverenz. A 1987 Marshall University graduate who called play-by-play for college and high school athletics for 17 years before coming to Lewisburg, Birdsong was named Radio/TV Coordinator and Marketing Specialist at the University in July of 2000.

In addition to calling the action for the Bison men's and women's basketball teams, Birdsong is also the play-by-play voice of the Bucknell football team, and he also broadcasts numerous events from nearly all of the university's varsity sports programs.

Birdsong became just the second full-time "Voice of the Bison," replacing Bob Behler who held the position for more than 13 years before leaving to go to the University of Massachusetts.

"When we reevaluated this position, we realized that it is much more than a play-by-play job," stated Bucknell's director of athletics, John Hardt. "We need someone who will become involved in both the campus and Lewisburg communities, and who can help deliver the message about Bucknell athletics. In a pool of candidates that was extremely talented, Doug jumped right off the page. In his former position he displayed the ability to spread a message with an outstanding record of sales and advertising."

Birdsong helped initiate and serves as host of *Bison Live!*, an hour-long radio show performed before a live audience at Damon's Grill every Thursday evening throughout the academic year.

Birdsong came to Bucknell from AVC Com-

munications in Cambridge, Ohio, where, as the Sports Director, he managed the play-by-play crews on five radio stations for the past 12 years. He called play-by-play for Muskingum College football, men's and women's basketball, softball and volleyball, and also handled the same duties plus baseball for area high schools. Birdsong was also responsible for writing and producing 11 daily sportscasts focusing on the six area high schools and Muskingum College.

For his last five years at AVC, Birdsong coordinated advertising and posted an outstanding record, increasing sales by at least 10 percent each year.

Prior to his experience at AVC, Birdsong worked at WTCR in Huntington, W.Va., after graduating from Marshall. While he was a student at Marshall, he worked for WMUL as its Sports Director and called football, basketball and baseball for the Thundering Herd. In addition, Birdsong produced and hosted a weekly one-hour sports talk show.

He has won numerous awards, including citations from the Pennsylvania Association of Broadcasters for "Best Local Sporting Event Coverage" two years in a row. Birdsong has also won four Outstanding Sports Operation for Play-by-Play citations from the Associated Press in Ohio, and two from the Associated Press in West Virginia. In 1999, he was chosen as the Eastern Ohio Interscholastic Athletic Administrators Association Media Person of the Year.

Birdsong will handle play-by-play duties for games that are played as part of a doubleheader with the Bison men's basketball team. Rutledge-Leverenz, a 2001 Bucknell graduate who currently works at Sirius Satellite Radio in New York City, will handle play-by-play responsibilities when the women's basketball team plays at a different site than the men.

For the second consecutive year the Bucknell men's basketball broadcasts will air on Eagle 107 (WEGH 107.3 FM).

BISON LIVE!

Bison Live!, a fast-paced, one-hour live radio show featuring head basketball coaches Kathy Fedorjaka and Pat Flannery, is back on the air with a new day and location in 2006-07. The show, which is hosted by Doug Birdsong, is now staged every Thursday from 7-8 p.m. at Damon's Grill in Lewisburg. Other features include interviews with a variety of coaches, student-athletes and special guests from the world of Bison Athletics.

The live audience is invited to ask questions on the air, with trivia and other prizes given away during breaks. Food and drink specials at Damon's are also available.

BUCKNELL ON TV

For the first time since the 2002-03 campaign, Bucknell is slated to appear on national television this winter. The Bison will host perennial Patriot League power Holy Cross on ESPN on Friday, Feb. 9. The game will tip-off at 4:30 p.m. at Sojka Pavilion and is the first game of a doubleheader with the Bison and Crusaders men's teams.

Bucknell last played on national TV Feb. 16, 2003, against Navy. The Bison defeated the Mids 73-60 at Sojka Pavilion on ESPN2.

In addition to the regular season meeting with Holy Cross, Bucknell has a chance to make an appearance on national TV during the Patriot League Tournament. The championship game, which is slated for Wednesday, March 7, will be aired on an ESPN network.

Setting the Standard of Excellence



The Kenneth G. Langone Athletics & Recreation Center

A major element in ensuring Bucknell's commitment to athletics excellence is the Kenneth G. Langone Athletics & Recreation Center, which opened fully in 2003. One of the finest collegiate athletics facilities of its kind, the center includes the 4,000-seat Sojka Pavilion, the Olympic class Kinney Natatorium, the Krebs Family Fitness Center and the Berger Family Weight Room. A new Hall of Fame area, a display of Bucknell's Medal of Honor recipients, a sports medicine suite, modern offices for coaches and staff, and new locker room and classroom space are also included in the facility's layout.

Bucknell has captured the Patriot League Presidents' Cup, signifying the league's all-sports champion, 12 times in the 16-year history of the affiliation, including eight of the last nine years. Bucknell captured both the overall and women's Cup standings in 2005-06, an extraordinary year in which Bison teams won a school-record eight Patriot League titles. It was the ninth straight year, and 12th time overall, that the Bison captured the women's title. In 2005-06, Bucknell won titles in men's basketball, women's swimming & diving, women's cross country, women's indoor and outdoor track & field, women's soccer, men's golf and women's rowing.

Bucknell Student-Athletes Among Nation's Best

Bucknell takes great pride in its commitment to excellence on and off the playing fields. From Presidents' Cups to Academic All-Americans to graduation rates that are ranked annually the national top-10, Bucknell is clearly at the head of the class when it comes to upholding the scholar-athlete ideal.

- Bucknell **LED THE NATION** in graduation rates in the 2003 survey conducted by the NCAA and the U.S. Department of Education. Bucknell graduated 100% of the student-athletes who entered school in 1996. It was the third time Bucknell has led the nation in graduation rates, and the Bison annually finish among the national leaders.

- Bucknell claimed its 100th Patriot League Scholar-Athlete of the Year in the spring of 2005. The Bison now have 103 Scholar-Athletes, which is more than twice the next-highest total.

- Bucknell student-athletes comprised nearly **one-fourth** of the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll in 2005-06. A total of 330 Bison recorded a GPA of 3.2 or better during their sport's competition season. Among all BU student-athletes, 239 made the Dean's List with GPAs of 3.5 or better in the spring of 2006.

- Twenty-four of Bucknell's 27 varsity squads posted team GPAs of 3.0 or better in the spring of 2006, including all 14 women's programs.

- In addition to the 111 ESPN the Magazine Academic All-Americans produced since 1970, Bucknell has also claimed 229 Academic All-District honorees over the same span, including 16 last year.

- With a school-record eight Patriot League championships in 2005-06, Bucknell has now earned 59 crowns in 16 years in the league. In addition, Bucknell has had 79 conference players of the year, 71 PL coaches of the year and a whopping 414 individual league champions from sports such as cross country, track & field, swimming & diving, tennis and golf.

- Bucknell's men's basketball team made history in 2005, writing national headlines with a stirring 64-63 upset of Kansas at the NCAA Tournament. It was the first NCAA men's basketball win in school and Patriot League history. The victory earned Bucknell an ESPY Award in the "Best Upset" category. The Bison won another first-round NCAA game in 2006 and achieved its first-ever national ranking.



BUCKNELL WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

The Bucknell University Department of Athletics and Recreation prides itself on setting the standard of excellence when it comes to success both on the playing fields and in the classroom. With 12 Patriot League Presidents' Cups in 16 years, national leadership in graduation rates, 111 Verizon Academic All-Americans in 35 years and 103 Patriot League Scholar-Athletes in 16 years, Bucknell is clearly at the head of the class in terms of upholding the scholar-athlete model.

The 2003 addition of the Kenneth G. Langone Athletics and Recreation Center, one of the finest collegiate athletics and recreation venues of its kind, ensures the continuation of that success.

The facility enhances each of Bucknell's 27 varsity programs and greatly expands the scope of its growing intramural and recreational sports offerings. A visually appealing structure located along Moore Avenue on the "downhill" side of campus, the Langone Athletics and Recreation Center was designed to reach out to all members of the campus community, including the student body, varsity student-athletes, faculty, staff and alumni.

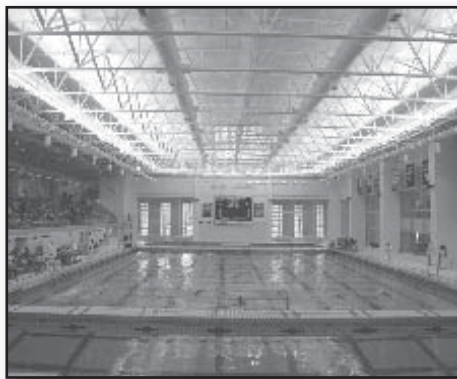


Three primary venues lie within the facility: the Arthur D. Kinney Jr. Natatorium, the 4,000-seat Gary A. Sojka Pavilion and the Krebs Family Fitness Center. Other features include a new location for the Bucknell Athletics Hall of Fame, a display of Bucknell's Congressional Medal of Honor recipients, a sports medicine and athletic training suite, classrooms, modern offices for coaches and staff and increased locker room space for varsity and recreational athletes.

The facility is named in honor of Ken Langone, a 1957 Bucknell graduate who, along with his wife Elaine, pledged \$11 million toward the center's construction. Langone was a member of the university Board of Trustees from 1980 to 1996.

One of the special qualities of the Langone Athletics and Recreation Center is the manner in which it supplements the pre-existing facilities. The brand new construction surrounds Gerhard Fieldhouse and historic Davis Gymnasium, which has been restored as a competition venue for the Bison volleyball and wrestling teams, as well as intramural, recreation and other varsity practice activities.

As Bucknell continues to strive toward its mission of setting the standard of excellence in college



athletics, the Langone Athletics and Recreation Center becomes the centerpiece in an already impressive cache of athletics facilities that includes the 13,100-seat Christy Mathewson-Memorial Stadium and its FieldTurf and 8-lane track surface; the scenic Bucknell Golf Club; Depew Field, the home of the Bison baseball team; the spacious West Fields for softball, soccer and other club and intramural activities; and, just introduced in the Fall of 2003, Graham Field, a brand new artificial turf playing surface for the Bison field hockey and women's lacrosse teams.

A closer look behind the walls of the Kenneth G. Langone Athletics and Recreation Center:

RAMER SCHAFFNER MEMORIAL HALL

Ramer Schaffner Memorial Hall greets guests as they enter the Langone Athletics and Recreation Center. The entry hall features the busts of 2nd Lt. George H. Ramer and 1st Lt. Dwite H. Schaffner, Bucknell's Congressional Medal of Honor recipients, and provides access to Gerhard Fieldhouse and the Krebs Family Fitness Center on the ground level. Guests may proceed to the second level to enter Davis Gym, administrative offices and the Hall of Fame, which celebrates Bucknell's Patriot League championships and other athletics accomplishments.

KREBS FITNESS CENTER

Promoting lifetime wellness, the Krebs Family Fitness Center contains state-of-the-art cardiovascular and strength conditioning equipment. The 16,000-square-foot center includes over 175 positions for equipment within three distinct areas. The first-level cardiovascular and pin-select equipment is open for student, faculty and staff use at all times. Directly above, the mezzanine also contains cardio equipment, with scenic views of the campus and natatorium.

The third area, the Berger Family Weight Room, sits on the former site of Freas-Rooke Pool, and is used for instructional free-weight training and varsity workouts.

KINNEY NATATORIUM

Kinney Natatorium features a 50-meter by 25-yard Olympic class pool, which accommodates four varsity programs — men's and women's swimming and diving and men's and women's water polo — while enhancing the recreational aquatics op-

portunities for the Bucknell community. The pool itself features two moveable bulkheads, allowing for multiple team practices and recreational swimming to occur simultaneously.

Natatorium amenities include seating for 500 spectators, restrooms, separated varsity and visiting team locker rooms, a poolside classroom, sauna, steam room and concession stands.

Already Kinney Natatorium has played host to several major events — the 2003 and 2005 Patriot League Swimming and Diving Championships, the 2004 Eastern Women's Water Polo Championship and an exhibition game against the U.S. women's water polo national team — drawing rave reviews at each. In the spring of 2005 and 2006, the Pennsylvania state swimming championships came to Kinney Natatorium, while the NCAA Men's Water Polo Championship was held there last fall.

The facility has proven to be quite a home pool advantage for Bucknell, which became the first institution in league history to capture both the men's and women's swimming and diving championships in the same season in 2003. A total of 20 meet records and 16 league marks fell that weekend.

SOJKA PAVILION

Sojka Pavilion provides the Bison men's and women's basketball programs with one of the finest arenas in the East. A "first-class" venue capable of seating 4,000 spectators for sporting and other campus events, the pavilion has walk-down access to all seats and unobstructed views of the playing surface or concert stage for all spectators. The seating bowl features approximately 1,500 fixed seats and 2,500 retractable seats, enabling an "expandable" open floor area with sufficient space for three basketball courts for recreational activities and varsity practices. The spacious upper-level concourse includes two concession areas, restrooms, handicapped seating and several suites that overlook the floor.

Behind the scenes, on the floor level, Sojka Pavilion provides a green room for performance acts and other functions, a catering kitchen for special events, ticket windows, locker room space for home and visiting teams and officials, and a loading dock capable of accommodating team buses and production trucks for televised events.

Nine nationally televised basketball games have already been aired from Sojka Pavilion, including the ESPN broadcast of the 2006 Patriot League championship game and an ESPN360 airing of the Bucknell-Villanova men's game that drew a school-record crowd of 4,433.



BUCKNELL WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

Bucknell plays its home games in Sojka Pavilion, which is in its fourth full season in 2006-07. The 4,000-seat arena opened Wednesday, Jan. 15, 2003, when the Bison lost to Lehigh, 74-67, in a Patriot League contest.

The building was dedicated in honor of Dr. Gary A. Sojka, former president of Bucknell University and retired faculty member in the biology department. Sojka oversaw Bucknell's highly successful move into the Patriot League in the mid-1980s. He is also a former NCAA Faculty Athletics Representative at the university.

Sojka Pavilion represented the final major piece of Bucknell's state-of-the-art Recreation and Athletics Center when it opened in 2003. In use since the fall of that year was the Krebs Fitness Center and Kinney Natatorium, as well as the new sports medicine center and administrative and coaches' offices.

The pavilion includes "walk-down" access and unobstructed views of the playing surface from all seating areas. Many of the 4,000 seats are fixed in place, while others are retractable to allow for an expandable open floor area with sufficient space for three regulation basketball courts for recreational use as well as varsity practice. The facility also features concession areas, ticket windows, restrooms, handicapped seating, team and officials locker rooms, a media room and other meeting areas.

Behind the scenes, on the floor level, Sojka Pavilion provides a green room for performance acts and other functions, a catering kitchen for special events, ticket windows, locker room space for home and visiting teams and officials, and a loading dock capable of accommodating team buses and production trucks for televised events.

Since the opening of Sojka Pavilion, nine Bucknell games have been broadcast on television, including a 70-63 women's basketball victory over Navy in 2003. The men's squad saw a pair of contests televised that season, and three more were broadcast each of the last two years. At handful of men's games and at least one women's contest will be broadcast nationally this year.


After posting a 4-2 record in its inaugural year at Sojka, Bucknell tallied an 8-5 mark in its first full season in its new home. With an overall record of 27-17 (.614) the Bison have won at a much higher clip than they did at their previous home of 28-and-one-half years, Davis Gym. Bucknell compiled a 168-118 (.587) mark while playing in the venue that housed Bison basketball since it was built in 1938 and is now home to the Bucknell volleyball and wrestling programs. In 1995-96 the Bison went undefeated at home, going 12-0 in the 2,200-seat arena.

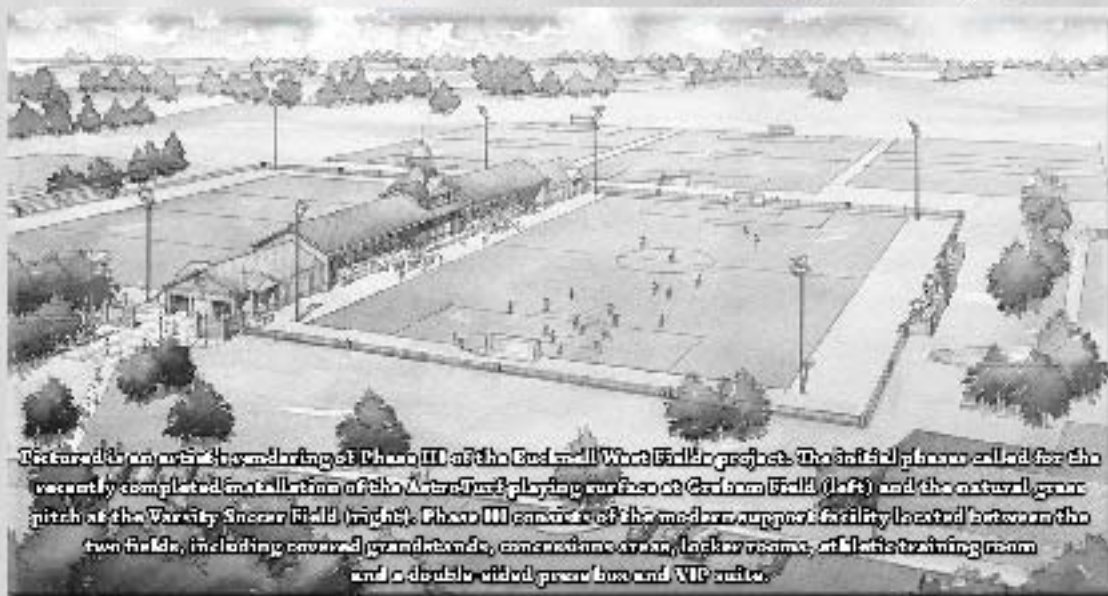

BUCKNELL CAPTURES SCHOOL-RECORD EIGHT PATRIOT LEAGUE TITLES IN 2005-06

Buoyed by a school-record eight Patriot League championships in 2005-06, Bucknell captured the Patriot League Presidents' Cup for the 12th time in the 16-year history of the conference last spring. The Bison compiled 115.75 points in the Cup standings, the most ever for Bucknell and the third-most in league history.

In 2005-06, Bucknell captured Patriot League titles in women's soccer, women's cross country, women's indoor and outdoor track and field, women's swimming and diving, men's basketball, men's golf and women's rowing.

Two Bison programs — men's golf and women's rowing — won Patriot League titles for the first time, while others continued dynasties. The women's swimming and diving team won its fourth straight league title. Women's indoor track and field won its fifth championship in a row and 10th overall, while the women's outdoor track and field squad won for the third straight year and eighth time overall.

Men's basketball won its second straight Patriot League title, becoming the first team in league history to go unbeaten in league play at 14-0. The Bison, who won a school-record 27 games last season, also won an NCAA Tournament game for the second straight year and finished the season ranked No. 25 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Poll.

Bucknell has now won 59 championships since the Patriot League's inception. Army is the only other league school to have won more than 36.

The eight championships bettered the previous school record of six, set in 2001-02. Bucknell has claimed five league championship teams five times.

PATRIOT LEAGUE SCHOLAR-ATHLETE



Lori Houck

Lori Houck, a graduate of the Class of 2000, ended a brilliant career for the Bison by earning the Patriot League's Women's Basketball Scholar-Athlete Award and adding the overall Patriot League Scholar-Athlete of the Year Award. She became the first Bucknell women's basketball player to earn the award in her sport and the first Bucknell female ever to win the Scholar-Athlete of the Year Award.

Houck was a four-year starter who averaged 15.8 points per game as a senior, leading the Bison into the Patriot League championship game for the first time in the League's 10-year history.

Her greatest accomplishments, however, were in the classroom where she graduated with a 3.60 cumulative grade-point average as an accounting and mathematics major.

THE CHARLES WHITE MEMORIAL AWARD

As a sophomore in 1997-98, graduate **Lori Houck** was named the 1998 recipient of the annual Charles F. White Memorial Prize at Bucknell. The award is given to student-athletes who, at the completion of their sophomore year, have exhibited excellence in scholarship and promise and achievement in athletics.

Houck completed her academic career with a cumulative grade point average of 3.60 as an accounting and mathematics major. A candidate for Academic All-American honors, Houck was also named to the All-Patriot League Team each of the four seasons she competed.

NCAA POST-GRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP

K.C. Vlah, a 1996 Bucknell graduate and former three-time captain for the Bison, was a recipient of the prestigious NCAA Post-Graduate Scholarship. The scholarship is a national award given annually to ten women who show interest in pursuing a career in intercollegiate athletics. Vlah deferred the scholarship for a year, and returned to her alma mater in 1997-98 to pursue her master's degree while serving as a graduate assistant with the basketball program.

A member of the first-ever regular-season Patriot League championship team, Vlah finished her career with 312 steals, just four shy of the Bucknell record. She ranks seventh in school history in career assists with 268 and totaled 750 career points.
