PATRIOT LEAGUE WOMEN'S BASKETBALL ON THE AIR:

Broadcasts of all Bucknell women's basketball Patriot League games will be carried live on the Bison Sports Network, which includes flagship station WMLP (AM-1380) in the Lewisburg area.

Doug Birdsong is in his fourth season as play-by-play announcer and is joined on the broadcast team by Chris Duffany for games on the road, and Evan Gropper at home.

Each broadcast will begin with a pre-game show 15 minutes prior to tip-off and conclude with a post-game show, featuring interviews with head coach Kathy Fedorjaka and select players.

PRESEASON PROGNOSTICATIONS: Bucknell was picked to finish seventh in the Patriot League in a preseason poll of head coaches and sports information directors. Defending champion Holy Cross is the preseason favorite, followed by American, Navy, Colgate, Army, Lehigh, Bucknell, and Lafayette.

Senior **Desire Almind** was also selected to her first preseason all-league squad, joining the Preseason Player of the Year, Katie Macfarlane from Army. Also on the early season team were Navy's Courtney Davidson, American's Chanel Hunt, and Maggie Fontana of Holy Cross.

BUCKNELL CELEBRATES NATIONAL GIRLS AND WOMEN IN SPORTS DAY: National Girls and Women in Sports Day was this past Wednesday, February 4, and Bucknell has been holding a weeklong array of events in conjunction with this year's "Play Fair" theme. Co-sponsored by the Bucknell Women's Resource Center, the celebration is also a tribute to 30 years of women's athletics at Bucknell.

The athletic department is extending that celebration to today's game. Admission to the women's basketball game is free to girls and boys 12 years old and younger, and there is pregame face painting, snacks and tee-shirt giveaways, as well as a postgame autograph session with members of each of Bucknell's women's sports teams. At halftime, Bucknell's women athletes will be recognized, and past women athletes of the month will be honored.

Bucknell fielded its first varsity women's teams in the sports of basketball and field hockey in the fall of 1973. Thirty years later, Bucknell fields 14 varsity teams and has captured the Patriot League's women's overall sports championship trophy nine times in 13 years.

ABOUT THE AMERICAN GAME: Bucknell enters this afternoon's game with American looking to stop a two-game slide. The Bison went 2-5 in the first round of Patriot League play, and are hoping to get the second cycle started with a victory.

The Eagles come into Sojka Pavilion with a 10-10 overall record after most recently dropping a game at Maryland Eastern Shore on Wednesday. American did, however, post a 5-

2 record in conference action the first time around and sit in a four-way tie for first place.

THE AMERICAN SERIES: Bucknell and American have met 10 times in the 21-year history of the series with the Eagles holding a 7-3 lead.

Since AU joined the Patriot League, the Orange and Blue have gone 2-3 against the Eagles with one of those victories coming at home.

American is playing in Sojka Pavilion for the first time today, becoming the seventh and final Patriot League team to appear in the year-old arena. The Eagles handed BU a heartbreaking 75-74 defeat at the buzzer last season in the final game in Davis Gym.

HOLLOBAUGH RECOGNIZED BY PATRIOT LEAGUE: For the league-leading sixth time this season, rookie **Lindsey Hollobaugh** was selected as the Patriot League Freshman of the Week for the week ending February 2.

Hollobaugh averaged 13.5 points per game and 7.0 rebounds per game in a two-game week for the Bison.

ALMIND UP FOR NATIONAL AWARD: Senior Desire Almind is leading the country in rebounding at 13.9 rpg, is second in the nation in double-doubles with 14, and the 6-0 co-captain in among the Patriot League leaders in six other categories.

Because of her play this season, and in January to be more specific, the Patriot League office has nominated Almind for the WBCANCAA Division I Player of the Month award.

The Women's Basketball Coaches Association reintroduced the player of the month program in December after several years of hiatus. The January player of the month will be announced by the WBCA later this month.

FIRST CYCLE DONE: For the first time since 1993-94, the Bucknell women's basketball team is just 2-5 in Patriot League play after the first cycle of league games has been played. The team has started 3-3 or better in the past ten years.

BU finished the 1993-94 season with a 3-11 conference record.

One encouraging statistic for Bucknell is that in seven of the last eight seasons, the Bison have opened the second-half of league play with a victory. The 2002-03 season features the only loss during that time.

THEY SAY IT'S YOUR BIRTHDAY: Junior **Brooke Tomovich** is celebrating her 21st birthday today as the Bison face the Eagles.

Tomovich joins sophomore **Lindsey Geosits** as the only two players who have their birthday on game-day this season. Geosits turned 20 on December 21, 2003, the day Bucknell defeated Albany, 62-45.

BUCKNELL AND THE RPI: The RPI (Ratings Percentage Index) is the measure of strength of schedule and how a team does against that

MEET THE CAPTAINS



Senior Desire Almind is playing in her final year for the Orange and Blue. The 6-0 guard/forward has enjoyed an impressive career in her three years at Bucknell.

As a freshman, Almind made an immediate impact on not only the Bison squad, but the Patriot League, garnering the conference's Rookie of the Year award and a spot on the all-league second-team. She finished that season second on the team, and third in the league, in scoring with 15.1 points per game.

Almind suffered through an injury and illness plagued sophomore season to again finish among the team leaders in scoring with a 10.4 ppg clip.

As a junior, the talented player made the switch from guard to forward and enjoyed the best season of her career to date. With a career-best 15.4 ppg scoring clip and a career-high 9.0 rebounds per game, Almind earned herself a spot on the All-Patriot League second-team for the second time. She was also named to the Patriot League All-Tournament team at the conclusion of the conference finals after averaging 20.0 points per game and 14.5 rebounds per game in the tournament. Her career-high 19 caroms against Navy in the semifinals set a conference tournament record.

Almind amassed 1,079 career points entering her final season.



Senior Katie Hettler begins her third year with the Bucknell team as a co-captain for the squad.

A transfer from UNC-Wilmington, Hettler has played in 42 games for the Bison since her career in the Orange and Blue began in 2001.

The 5-8 guard saw time in 16 games her first season. As a junior, Hettler played in 26 of Bucknell's 28 games, earning her first career start at American.

Hettler played in 11 consecutive games for the Orange and Blue entering the season-opener.

In the latest RPI rankings, updated Saturday, February 7, Bucknell is ranked 244 of 324 schools. Of the eight Patriot League schools, Bucknell is the sixth-highest ranked team. Today's opponent, American, is fourth in the conference at 215.

As a conference, the Patriot League is 24th out of 32 conferences.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET IN DAVIS:

Today's game against American marks the first time the Eagles are playing in Sojka Pavilion. AU was the last team to play in Davis Gymnasium last year, handing Bucknell a heartbreaking 75-74 loss in the historic gym's finale.

Molly Creamer scored 41 points in her final game in Davis Gymnasium, but it was not enough as the Eagles of American spoiled Bucknell's Patriot League opener.

Bucknell led 30-23 at halftime, after leading by as many as 10 in the frame.

American slowly chipped away at the deficit, and took a 61-59 lead on two free throws by Chanel Hunt with 5:31 to go. Bucknell's last lead of the game came with 21 seconds remaining when junior **Desire Almind** hit two foul shots to put the host team ahead, 74-73.

American's **Katryn Costenbader** fired off a three-point attempt with nine seconds left, and a battle for the rebound led to a jump ball in American's favor. After an Eagles timeout with five ticks left on the clock, Costenbader found herself open for a baseline jumper that put American ahead 75-74 with three seconds left.

ALMIND APPROACHING MILESTONES:

Senior **Desire Almind** needs just two more assists to reach 200 helpers in her career. When she hands out her 200th assist, Almind will become the first player in Bucknell history to score over 1,400 points, grab 700 rebounds and hand out 200 assists.

In addition, the co-captain needs 13 more steals to reach 200 in her career, becoming just the second Bucknell player to accumulate over 1,400 points, 700 rebounds, and 200 steals.

PUTTING IT TOGETHER FOR A FULL 40:

Bucknell has not led from start to finish in any game this season. Of their nine victories, the closest the squad has come to leading the whole way through was in a 69-61 win over Winthrop in the Cornell Classic.

In that contest, the Lady Eagles were ahead just one time, a 10-9 score with 11:39 to play in the first.

HOLDING ON: Another fact of note is that in every Patriot League game this season, Bucknell has led at some point. In fact, the Orange and Blue have held **AT LEAST** an eight-point first-half lead on every Patriot League team except Holy Cross (2/1/04). In three of the five conference losses, the squad even led at some point in the second half before falling.

0-FOR FROM DOWNTOWN: In Bucknell's loss to Holy Cross last Sunday, the Bison went 0-12 from three-point territory, marking the first time since 2001-02 that the team has not made at least one trey in a game.

The last time it happened was January 26, 2002, when the Orange and Blue hosted Lehigh and went 0-7 in a 71-63 win.

BU had two games that season with an 0-7 performance from downtown, but ironically, both were victories. In fact, the last time the Bison lost a game in which they did not make a three-pointer was January 24, 2000 - a 65-44 loss at Stony Brook.

LEAGUE PLAY HARD ON HOLLOBAUGH: Freshman **Lindsey Hollobaugh** is having an all-star caliber rookie season, sitting second on the team in scoring (15.1) and rebounding (5.4).

The newcomer rolled through the non-conference season, averaging 16.9 ppg and shooting .503 (95-189) from the field. In her Patriot League debut, Hollobaugh led the team with 17 points on a 6-of-11 performance from the field.

Since that game, however, Hollobaugh has been held to 10.7 ppg on 23-of-90 shooting (.256). The team's leading three-point shooter, she is just 3-of-26 (.115) from downtown in that time.

ALMIND REACHES 1,400: With her 15 point effort at Lafayette (1/25/04), senior **Desire Almind** became just the fifth player in school history to reach 1,400 points.

The 6-0 guard/forward is just 21 points away from moving ahead of 2000 graduate Lori Houck for fourth place on the Bucknell career scoring list.

HOLLOBAUGH'S FREE THROW FUNK: Freshman **Lindsey Hollobaugh** has made quite an impression on the Bucknell women's basketball team so far this season. The 5-9 guard is second on the team in scoring (15.1) and rebounding (5.4).

The biggest area Hollobaugh has struggled in has been her performance from the free throw line. Since opening the season 12-for-12 from the stripe, Hollobaugh has gone 27-for-48 (.563) at the line and has missed at least one free throw in every game she has gone to the line.

BUCKNELL GETS TO THE LINE: Against Navy (1/17/04), seven different Bucknell players made a trip to the free throw line, including a Sojka Pavilion record 15 times by senior **Desire Almind**.

The Bison scored 20 of their 41 second-half points at the charity stripe, and ended the game with a 29-of-36 performance (.806), including 14 from Almind.

ALL ALMIND, ALL THE TIME: Senior **Desire Almind** got her first breather in a Patriot League game this season when she left the Lafayette game for four minutes. She also sat down for one minute against Holy Cross.

In seven conference contests, Almind has played the entire 40 minutes in five of those. In fact, in a possible 440 minutes in the last 11 games, Almind has played all but eight of them.

ALMIND'S 20/20 GAME: It was only a matter of time before Bucknell senior **Desire Almind** pulled down 20 rebounds in a game, as the 6-0 guard/forward had reached 19 once this season, and pulled in 18 on two occasions.

On January 6 at Iona, Almind finally reached 20 caroms in a game, becoming just the sixth women's player in school history to achieve the feat. The last player to do so was Jenny Burke with a 20 rebound effort at Messiah on December 9, 1982.

In addition, with her 29 points, Almind is just the third Bucknell women's player to post at least 20 points, and pull down at least 20 rebounds in a game. Jill Henry was the last Bison player to do so with 22 points and 22 rebounds against Rochester on December 6, 1980, while Liz Rabenhold was the first BU player to do it with 24 markers and 24 caroms against Pitt-Johnstown on December 3, 1978.

HOLLOBAUGH MOVING INTO ROOKIE CHARTS: Freshman **Lindsey Hollobaugh** has scored 301 points through the first 20 games of her career. The rookie has jumped into the Bucknell top-10 for points by a first-year player, standing in 6th. In addition, her current 15.1 points per game average ranks third on the

SETTING THE STANDARD OF EXCELLENCE:

With a perfect 100% graduation rate according to the latest NCAA/USA Today survey, Bucknell is a national model of scholar-athlete success. Bucknell, which recently garnered a USA Today Academic Achievement Award for leading the nation in graduation rates, also ranks third among all Division I institutions (behind Nebraska and Notre Dame) in total number of Academic All-Americans, with 107 since 1970. Bison teams also get it done on the playing fields, winning the Presidents' Cup - the Patriot League's all-sports crown - in 10 of 13 years, including the last six in a row.

SOJKA PAVILION: Bucknell will be playing its first full season in its brand new, 4,000-seat arena - Sojka Pavilion (pronounced SOY-ka). The facility is a part of the new Kenneth G. Langone Athletics & Recreation Center, which also includes a 16,000-square foot fitness

center, a state-of-the-art natatorium featuring a 50-meter-by-25-yard pool, a new sports medicine center and new office suites for coaches and staff. The Bison debuted in Sojka Pavilion last Jan. 15 vs. Lehigh and went 4-2 in their new digs over the last six weeks of the season.

WELCOME NEWCOMERS: With merit aid in place for the first time at Bucknell, Kathy Fedorjaka has brought in two talented scholarship players, as well as a third recruited newcomer. In addition to the freshmen, the Bison welcome a transfer student to the fold. The first merit-aid recipients in Bucknell women's basketball history are Rachel Hanley, a 6'0" guard/forward from Charlottesville, Va. (Albemarle) and Lindsey Hollobaugh, a 5'9" guard from Loganton, Pa. who played at Central Mountain. In addition, Bucknell also welcomes 5'8" guard Amanda Fleming of nearby Sunbury, Pa., who attended Shikellamy High School. Joining the freshmen is junior transfer Lillian Drumgold. A 5'9" guard from Baltimore, Md., Drumgold played two seasons at UNC-Wilmington before coming to Bucknell.

NEW FACES ON THE SIDELINES: Kathy Fedorjaka welcomes two new faces to her coaching staff this season. **Russ Sarfaty** joins the staff after serving as an assistant at Winthrop and James Madison University's. **Jackie Smith** joins the Bison after a successful career at Furman University and a brief stint in Europe and Israel in the professional leagues.

MERIT AID APPROVED AT BUCKNELL: In November of 2002, the Bucknell University Board of Trustees approved a three-year pilot program that immediately implemented merit aid for the first time in school history. Bucknell awarded 42 merit scholarships to the incoming members of the Class of 2007, with six targeted to the basketball programs — three to the men's program and three to the women's program.

The merit scholarships will not take away from Bucknell's current need-based financial aid program. The merit aid plan is intended to help Bucknell enroll even more top academic students; increase campus diversity; support performing arts talent, such as music, theatre and dance; protect recent gains in Bucknell's first-year class profile; and strengthen Bucknell's competitive position with the Patriot League in men's and women's basketball.

COLLYMORE SIGNS NLI FOR BUCKNELL: Bucknell head coach **Kathy Fedorjaka** recently announced the signing of Kristina Collymore, a recruit from Montclair, N.J.

Collymore has scored 1,169 career points entering her senior season, and is a three-time all-conference and all-county player.
