EAST CAROLINA (15-16, 5-11)

- **Next Game:** Season Complete
- The Pirates won their opening C-USA Championship game for the second year in a row, defeating No. 7 seed Rice, 68-66. ECU is 3-2 in C-USA tournament games under head coach **Jeff Lebo**.
- Last year, ECU knocked out top seed UAB in the C-USA quarters and almost did the same to No. 2 seed Southern Miss this season. The Pirates tied the C-USA tournament mark with 15 three-pointers, but dropped an 81-78 overtime decision to the Golden Eagles.
- Junior G **Miguel Paul** scored a career-high 28 points in the quarterfinal for his ninth 20-point game of the season. Paul also dished out a career-best 12 assists to set a C-USA tournament single-game record.
- Junior F **Maurice Kemp** registered his team-best seventh double-double with 22 points and 10 rebounds to lead the Pirates to a 66-49 road victory at Tulane in the regular season finale March 3. Senior F **Darrius Morrow** added 19 points and seven boards in the win.

- **Next Game:** Season Complete
- Houston earned the No. 9 seed in the 2012 C-USA Championship and the first-round tournament match-up was against No. 8 seed UTEP. The Cougars defeated UTEP in the 2010 C-USA Championship final.
- Sophomore F **Alandise Harris** scored a career-high 25 points, with a career-best 11 field goals made, but UH fell to UTEP, 67-62, in overtime of this season's tournament meeting. Harris also tied his career-high with 12 rebounds for his second double-double of the season. All-Freshman Team selection **TaShawn Thomas** also registered a double-double against UTEP with 15 points and 12 rebounds (eighth season double-double).
- Senior G **Darian Thibodeaux** drained two free throws with 2.1 seconds remaining to lift the Cougars to the 76-75 win over rival Rice in the regular season finale March 3. Thibodeaux finished with a game- and career-high 21 points and became the fifth different Cougar player to score at least 20 points in a game.

- **Next Game/NIT:** Season Complete
- Marshall advanced to the C-USA Championship for the first time since joining the league in 2005. The Thundering Herd was a No. 6 seed and defeated SMU, Tulsa (in triple OT) and Southern Miss to earn the chance to play Memphis for the crown.
- Sophomore G **DeAndre Kane** and junior F **Dennis Tinnon** were both named to the C-USA All-Tournament Team. Kane set a C-USA single-game tournament record with 40 points in the win over Tulsa and has more than 1,000 for his career. Tinnon also set a tourney mark with 44 total boards and ranks 23rd in the nation for rebounding, averaging 9.9 per game.
- Marshall made its fifth NIT appearance and first since 1988, a span of 24 years. The Herd fell to host Middle Tennessee, 86-78. Tinnon registered his 11th double-double with 18 points and 11 rebounds.
- Senior **Shaquille Johnson** scored a career-high 25 points in the quarterfinal game with Tulsa. He is MU's all-time leader in games played, passing Darryl Merthie and missing just one career contest (134 games).

- **Next Game/NCAA:** Season Complete
- Memphis won its sixth C-USA Championship in seven seasons to earn an automatic berth to the NCAA Championship. Head coach **Josh Pastner** becomes the first Memphis coach to win two conference titles in his first three seasons.
- Sophomores **Will Barton**, **Tarik Black** and **Joe Jackson** were named to the All-Tournament Team. Jackson was named MVP, making him the first player in C-USA history to earn back-to-back honors.
- Memphis shot .591 (26-of-44) from the field and .926 (25-of-27) from the free throw line to set championship final game records for both categories. The Tigers did hold the previous records as well.
- Barton scored a career-high 30 points in the Tigers' regular-season finale at Tulsa. That output included his 1,000th career point, making him only the ninth Tiger in school history to achieve that within two years.
- Memphis has compiled its 12th 20-win season in a row.

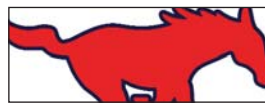

- **Next Game/CIT:** March 20 at Oakland - 6:00 p.m. CT
- Rice hosted its first postseason game in program history Saturday as the Owls defeated Drake, 74-68, in the second round of the College-Insider.com Tournament (CIT). C-USA All-Freshman Team member **Dylan Ennis** led the Owls with 17 points, six rebounds and six assists.
- Junior F **Arsalan Kazemi** added to his C-USA record for career double-doubles with 45 following an 11-point, 13-rebound effort in the Drake game. His 18 on the season ties for the 10th most nationally.
- Sophomore C **Omar Oraby** already set the Rice single-season record for blocks (54) and can add to his total during Tuesday's CIT game.
- Head coach **Ben Braun** earned his 600th career win Feb. 22 against UCF to become the 40th NCAA Division I coach to reach the milestone and only the 12th active coach to achieve the feat.
- Seniors **Connor Frizzelle** and **Lucas Kuipers** earned their third-straight selection to the C-USA All-Academic Team.

- **Next Game:** Season Complete
- Senior G **Rodney Clinkscales** closed out his Mustangs career with a career-high 17 points in SMU's 74-56 first-round loss to eventual C-USA tournament runner-up Marshall.
- Senior F **Robert Nyakundi** added 10 points and eight rebounds against the Herd. Nyakundi scored 1,353 points for his career and ranks 15th on the school's career scoring chart. Nyakundi leads C-USA in 3-point percentage at 41.4% (84-203) (25th NCAA) and ranks second in threes made (2.7) and seventh in scoring (14.8). He led C-USA and was second in the NCAA in 3-point percentage last season (.497). He could become just the second person to lead C-USA in 3FG percentage two times. Drake Diener of DePaul led the league in 2003-04 (.459) and 2004-05 (.462).
- The Mustangs set a new SMU single-season record for scoring defense at 60.1. They also finished second all-time with 348 three-pointers on the year and held opponents to just 30.8 three-point field percentage.

- The Golden Eagles earned their first NCAA Championship bid since 1991, but fell to No. 8 seed Kansas State, 70-64. Sophomore G **Neil Watson** led Southern Miss with 16 points, **LaShay Page** had 15 and **Darnell Dodson** scored all 14 of his points in the second half.
- Southern Miss earned the No. 2 seed at the C-USA Championship, its highest seed since 2001. The 26 wins are the most wins since joining Division I and is just the second time since joining C-USA that it won at least 10 conference games. Watson was voted to the all-conference second team and named C-USA Newcomer and Sixth Man of the Year.
- Southern Miss wrapped up the regular season with a perfect 15-0 home record and was the only school in the nation to not lose a home game in football or men's basketball this season.
- The Golden Eagles' 58-56 win over Rice Feb. 25 was C-USA Gene Bartow Coach of the Year **Larry Eustachy's** 400th career victory.

- **Next Game:** Season Complete
- Sophomore F **Josh Davis** led the Green Wave with 20 points, but No. 5 seed UAB defeated No. 12 Tulane, 72-64, in the first round of the C-USA Championship. It was Davis' third 20-plus point game of the season and 19th game scoring in double figures. Freshman F **Lotanna Nwogbo** also scored a career-best in the game with eight points.
- Freshman G **Ricky Tarrant** became the first freshman in C-USA since former Memphis standout Tyreke Evans to be named to the all-conference first team. He was also the unanimous selection as the 2012 C-USA Freshman of the Year.
- Tarrant posted the top two offensive performances of the season, scoring 33 points against UAB and SMU. His 33 set the school record for most points a freshman, a record previously held by Anthony Reed's 32 points. In the UAB game, Tarrant - a native of Pleasant, Grove, Ala. - scored 29 of those 33 points in the second half as he returned to his home state.

- **Next Game:** Season Complete
- No. 3 seed Tulsa fell in the C-USA Championship quarterfinals to No. 6 Marshall, 105-100, in the first triple overtime game in tournament history. The teams also set the records for most points combined. The game featured 19 lead changes and 21 ties.
- Freshman G **Eric McClellan** scored a career high 25 points to lead the Golden Hurricane. As a team, Tulsa set tournament records for free throws made (40) and free throws attempted (58). Senior **Steven Idlet** (14), McClellan (10) and sophomore C **Kodi Maduka** (8) all established career-bests for free throws made.
- Sophomore G **Jordan Clarkson**, an All-Conference USA first-team selection, added 14 points in the Marshall game. He scored in double digits in 28-straight games to end the season.
- Tulsa has won at least 10 conference games in four straight seasons, finishing third this year.

- Senior F **Cameron Moore** was named to the All-Conference USA first team this season, after earning second-team honors a year ago, and the C-USA Defensive Player of the Year.
- Moore and **Ovie Soko** combined to produce 42 of UAB's 72 points and 26 of its 34 rebounds in the 72-64 win over Tulane in the first round of the C-USA Championship. Moore had 22 points and 14 rebounds for his 14th double-double of the season, while Soko tallied 20 points and 12 boards. Soko finished with 18 points and 11 rebounds in the quarterfinal loss to UCF for his eighth double-double of the season.
- UAB won its fourth-straight game and seven of its last eight with a 68-64 decision over Tulsa Feb. 29. Sophomore F **Jordan Swing** scored 22 points for UAB, including knocking down four 3-pointers.
- Moore leads C-USA in blocked shots (2.4) and rebounds (10.5) and is one of only two players to average a double-double with 16.1 ppg.

- Junior F **Keith Clanton** was named to the All-Conference first team, after earning third-team honors last season. He was also named to the C-USA All-Defensive Team. Clanton led the Knights and ranks 10th on the C-USA scoring chart with 14.5 points per game and sixth in rebounding (8.1 rpg).
- The Knights made their first NIT appearance in school history, but fell in a road game to Drexel.
- Senior **A.J. Rompza**, a 2012 C-USA All-Academic Team selection, finished his career with 211 career steals to move into second place on the UCF chart and seventh on the C-USA career chart. He also ranks third in school history and ties for 10th in C-USA with 487 career assists.
- The Knights were 16-1 this season at the UCF Arena.
- UCF's 22 regular-season are the third-most for the program since the university moved to the Division I level in 1984.

- Senior G **Gabriel McCulley** scored 18 points to lead the Miners in a 67-62 overtime win against Houston in the first round of the C-USA Championship. It was the sixth time this season that UTEP had won after trailing with five minutes remaining in a game.
- With the win over Houston, UTEP advanced to the quarterfinals against top seed Memphis. The Miners were the only conference team to defeat the Tigers at FedExForum this season with a 60-58 decision on Feb. 18, but Memphis advanced with a 65-47 decision. Sophomore C **John Bohannon** led the team in scoring for the 10th time this season with 15 points, while junior G **Jacques Streeter** added 11 with eight free throws.
- Freshman **Julian Washburn** scored a career-high 21 points, but the Miners fell to SMU, 57-48, in the March 3 regular season finale in Dallas. Washburn, who hails from nearby Duncanville, Texas, was named C-USA Freshman of the Week for his performance and was selected to the All-Freshman Team.

2011-12 ALL-CONFERENCE USA TEAMS ANNOUNCED

Players from five different schools are represented on the 2011-12 All-Conference USA men's basketball first-team, featuring one senior and four underclassmen. Voting on the awards was done by the C-USA head coaches and media members in each conference city.

The lone senior was UAB forward **Cameron Moore**, the 2011 C-USA Preseason Player of the Year. Moore is the league's top rebounder, averaging 10.4 per game. Regular-season champion Memphis placed sophomore guard **Will Barton** on the first team, after earning third-team honors as a freshman. Barton leads the conference in scoring and became just the ninth player in Memphis history to score 1,000 career points in two seasons. Tulsa sophomore point guard **Jordan Clarkson** strung together 28 straight games scoring in double-figures and his 16.6 average ranks second in C-USA. UCF junior forward **Keith Clanton** has paced the Knights in scoring and rebounding this season. Seven-time C-USA Freshman of the Week selection **Ricky Tarrant** rounds out the first-team and is the first freshman to make the squad since Memphis' Tyreke Evans in 2009.

ALL-STAR COACHES

Conference USA head coaches have combined for more than 2,700 career wins through the 2011-12 season. Check out the credentials of this season's C-USA leading men:

- UCF coach **Donnie Jones** was on staff for the 2006 and 2007 Florida national championship teams.
- Rice head coach **Ben Braun** has earned 600 career victories, while **Larry Eustachy** of Southern Miss registered his 400th win. **Tim Floyd** of UTEP also has more than 350 career wins. Memphis head coach **Josh Pastner** is the only coach in school history to compile 75 wins in his first three seasons.

EUSTACHY NAMED GENE BARTOW COACH OF THE YEAR

In his eighth season at Southern Miss, Eustachy takes home his first C-USA Gene Bartown Coach of the Year award after guiding the Golden Eagles (25-8) to its highest win total as a Division I school (surpassing the 1986-87 squad) and a second place finish in the regular season with an 11-5 league mark to tie the 2011 Southern Miss squad for its best regular season showing as a member of C-USA.

On February 25, Eustachy posted his 400th career victory with a win over Rice, becoming the 43rd active head coach to reach that milestone. He enters the C-USA Championship with a career record of 401-256 in 21 seasons as a head coach. At Southern Miss, Eustachy is currently at 142 wins, and is behind only M.K. Turk (301) and Lee Floyd (246). His average of 17.6 wins a season is tied for second with Floyd and behind only Fred Lewis (17.8).

This is the fifth conference Coach of the Year award for Eustachy, who was twice named Big West Coach of the Year at Utah State and twice earned Big 12 Coaching honors at Iowa State. In 2000, he was the Associated Press National Coach of the Year and was the runner-up for that same award in 2001. The C-USA Coach of the Year award is named in honor of Gene Bartow, the legendary former coach at Memphis and UAB, along with other schools, who passed away in January.

TRIPLE THREAT

During this year's C-USA Championship at FedExForum in Memphis, a record three games were decided in overtime. Included was the first triple overtime game in championship history as No. 6 seed Marshall defeated No. 3 seed Tulsa, 105-100. It was also the first time that both teams had scored 100 points in a tournament game, making the combined total of 205 points yet another tournament record.

THREE EARN USBWA ALL-DISTRICT HONORS

The U.S. Basketball Writers Association has released its 2011-12 Men's All-District Teams, based on voting from its national membership. Three student-athletes represent Conference USA: Memphis sophomore guard **Will Barton**, Rice junior forward **Arsalan Kazemi** and SMU senior forward **Robert Nyakundi**.

Barton, chosen to the District IV team that covers the states of Alabama, Georgia, Florida, Kentucky and Tennessee, leads the team and Conference USA in scoring with an 18.7 average. The 6-foot-6 guard is also ranked among the league leaders in rebounding (6th), field goal percentage (7th), free throw percentage (13th), assists (13th), steals (4th) and minutes played (4th). He is the only guard ranked in the top-10 of C-USA's rebounding leaders.

A Wooden Award and Naismith Trophy midseason candidate, Barton reached the 1,000-point milestone for his career with his 30 points in the regular-season finale victory over Tulsa Mar. 3. He is one of nine players in Tigers history to reach the 1,000-point plateau in only two seasons. The Baltimore, Md., native has 10 double-doubles this season and is one of three players in the nation to average at least 16.0 points, 7.0 rebounds and 2.5 assists.

Kazemi is one of two players in C-USA to average a double-double this season and heads into this week's conference tournament averaging 12.5 points and 10.3 rebounds. He also leads Conference USA in steals with 60 (2.1 spg) and also ranks among the top 15 in the conference in blocked shots (29 for the season).

During his junior season, Kazemi set a Conference USA career double-double record with a 12-point, 11-rebound performance in the Owls' 68-61 road win at UTEP last week. With his 43rd career double-double, he broke the former record established by Memphis' Kelly Wise (1998-2002).

Nyakundi, an SMU team captain, ranks sixth in C-USA in scoring (15.0) and leads the league in 3-point percentage (42.5). He also ranks second in C-USA for threes made (2.7) and fourth in free throw percentage (.800).

Nyakundi is leading SMU in rebounds (4.7), while ranking 12th in the league in field goal percentage (46.8). He also adds 1.1 steals and nearly an assist per game.

Kazemi and Nyakundi were each chosen to the USBWA District VII team that covers Texas, Arkansas and Louisiana.

NABC ALL-DISTRICT TEAMS ANNOUNCED

The National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) selected its All-District 11 Team, featuring 10 student-athletes from Conference USA. The 240 student-athletes, from 24 districts, are eligible for the NABC Coaches' Division I All-America teams.

BRAUN NAMED AUERBACH FINALIST

Rice head coach **Ben Braun** has been named one of three finalists for the 2012 Red Auerbach College Coach of the Year Award, which is given annually to the nation's top Jewish College coach as voted on by the members of the Jewish Coaches Association (JCA). The finalists winner will be presented with the award at the Final Four in New Orleans next month.

In his fourth season, Braun has led the Owls back to postseason play for the first time since 2005. The Owls will open play in the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament March 14 at Louisiana-Lafayette. Rice is 19-15 overall and posted an 8-8 record in Conference USA play. The Owls' .500 record in league play comes after the team had a combined 10 league wins over the last four seasons.

The other two finalists for the Red Auerbach Award are Kent State coach Rob Senderoff and Emmanuel College women's coach Andy Yosinoff.

CONFERENCE USA ON TELEVISION
