

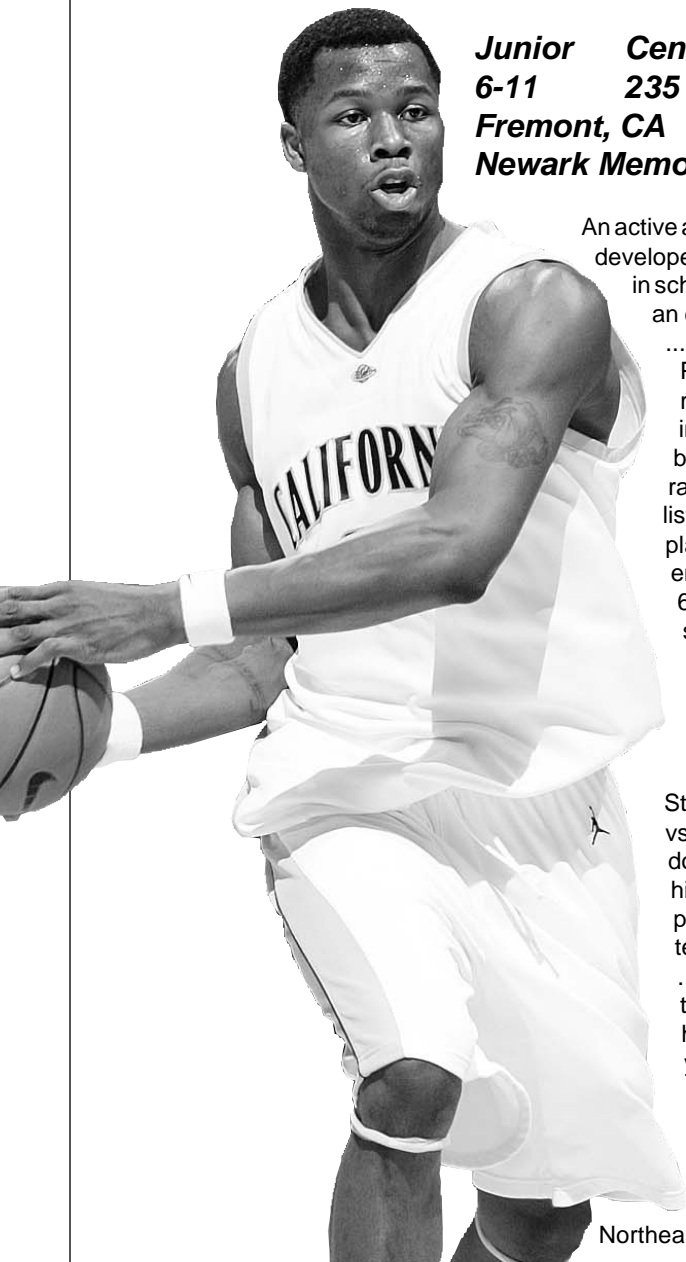

## DeVon Hardin

An active and athletic center who has already developed into one of the top shot-blockers in school history, Hardin gives the Bears an experienced big man in the middle ... earned honorable mention All-Pac-10 honors last season after ranking among the league leaders in rebounding (5th, 6.6 rpg) and blocks (4th, 1.55 bpg) ... already ranks sixth on Cal's all-time blocks list with 74 and will move into second place with 49 more blocked shots ... enters the season with 43 starts in 60 career games ... underwent left shoulder surgery in April and was cleared for full contact in September ... attended the Pete Newell Big Man Camp over the summer.

**As a Sophomore in 2005-06:** Started all but one game (Senior Day vs. USC) for the Bears ... nearly doubled his scoring average from his freshman year, going from 4.3 ppg to 7.3 ppg, and received the team's Most Improved Player honor ... produced double-doubles in three of his first four games and had five double-doubles on the year ... led Cal in rebounding 11 times (includes ties) ... broke his career scoring high in consecutive outings vs. Long Beach State (14 points) Nov. 21, Northern Colorado (21) Nov. 25 and Northeastern (23) Nov. 26 early in the year

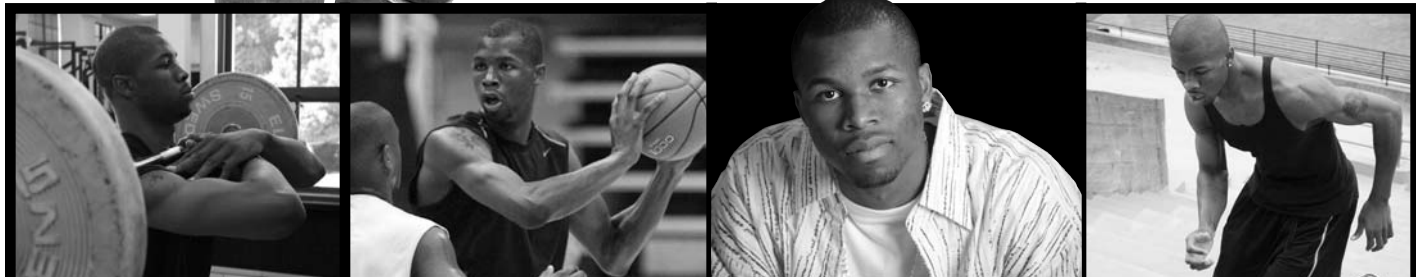

... also finished the Northeastern game with a personal-best 14 rebounds ... for his performances against Northern Colorado and Northeastern, was named both Golden Bear Classic MVP and Pac-10 Player of the Week ... blocked four shots in a game three times: vs. Northern Colorado Nov. 25, vs. Arizona Feb. 16 and vs. Arizona State Feb. 18 ... his 48 blocks place him fifth on the school's season chart ... improved his free throw shooting from 38.6 percent to 62.5 percent ... played a big role in Cal's win at UCLA Dec. 31 with 10 points and eight boards ... also grabbed 10 rebounds in a win at Arizona State ... added another 10 points and eight rebounds at Oregon and totaled 13 points and 10 caroms at home vs. ASU ... scored 10 points and corralled 11 boards in the home finale vs. USC ... although he did not score vs. Oregon in the Pac-10

Tournament semifinals, tied for team honors with six rebounds ... also added eight points and seven boards in the title game vs. UCLA.

**As a Freshman in 2004-05:** Ranked third on the team in rebounding with 4.5 per game despite averaging 16.1 minutes per contest ... blocked 26 shots on the year, second on the team and ninth in the Pac-10 (0.90 per game) ... played well against Southern with eight points and seven rebounds, then earned his first start the next game at BYU Nov. 27 ... came through with his best night of the year against the Cougars with 12 points (4-7 FG, 4-6 FT), 12 rebounds and three blocks in 32 minutes ... swatted away four shots vs. Fairleigh Dickinson ... also reached double digits at San Diego State Dec. 11, finishing with 11 points and five boards and earning MVP honors for the San Diego

SLAM ... averaged 8.0 ppg in two regular-season games vs. Arizona ... shot 50.5 percent from the floor.

**High School:** Averaged 12.9 points, 11.4 rebounds and 4.4 blocks as senior at Newark Memorial HS to earn first team All-ANG Newspapers and All-Bay Area from the *San Francisco Chronicle* ... led his team to a 29-5 record and the NorCal semifinals of the state tournament ... rated as the No. 29 power forward in the country by Rivals.com, No. 64 player overall by Hoop Scoop and No. 3 power forward on the West Coast by TheInsiders.com ... recorded the only triple-double in his school's history with 25 points, 17 rebounds and 14 blocks in one game ... a two-time first team all-league choice ... as a junior, averaged 13 ppg, 10 rpg and 4.2 bpg.

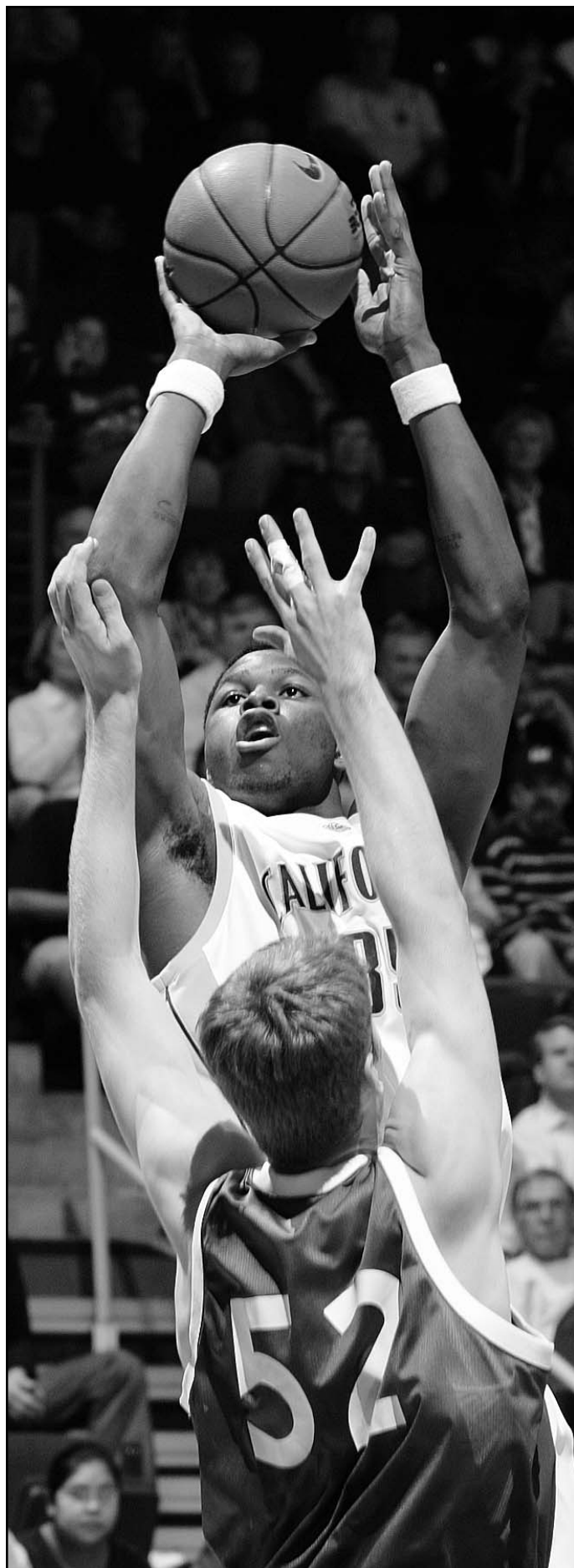

Knezevic gained valuable experience as a mid-year addition to the Bears last season, adding depth to Cal's point guard position ... sees the floor well and is an adept passer ... also a solid defender on the perimeter ... injured his right knee in a summer workout and had surgery to repair loose cartilage June 26 ... expected to be ready by the start of the season following a 12-week recovery period.

**As a Freshman in 2005-06:** Joined the team from Belgrade after the end of the fall semester, gaining eligibility for Cal's Dec. 21 game vs. DePaul (DNP) ... served as the Bears' primary backup at point guard ... appeared in all but one Pac-10 game (at Oregon State) ... saw his first significant action vs. Oregon Jan. 5 when he scored four points in 17 minutes ... dished out three assists in a home win over Stanford and came through in the Bears' next game vs. Arizona with four assists in six minutes of action ... played well the final weekend of the regular season, finishing with five points and two assists vs. UCLA and three points and four assists (no turnovers) against USC.

**High School:** Rated the No. 3 point guard and No. 17 overall player at the adidas Superstar Camp in the summer of 2005 ... played for the Serbia-Montenegro Junior National team at the Under 18 European Championships in 2004 ... as a member of his Beovuk '72 club team, helped the squad to a pair of Serbian titles and two Serbia-Montenegro championships.

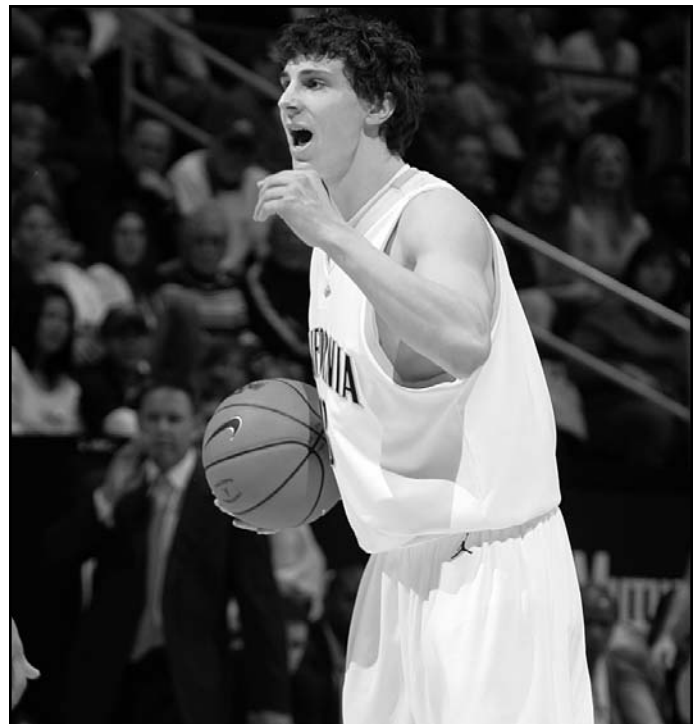

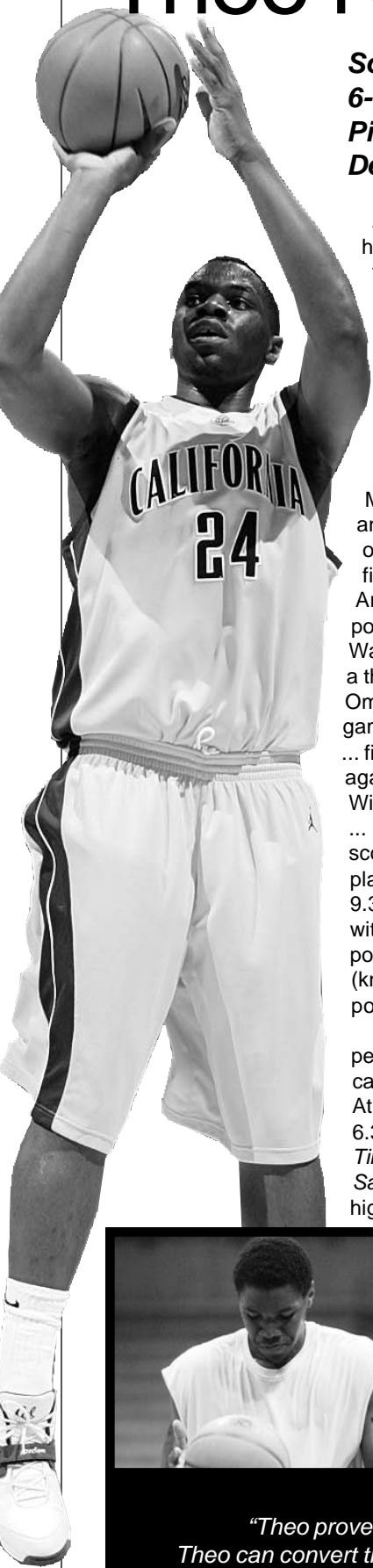
