The Cal Athletic Department and website partner CSTV (College Sports Television) launched a Heisman Trophy promotional website for junior wide receiver **DeSean Jackson** entitled the 1towatch.com. "The 1 to Watch" features flash animation for the introduction before taking the viewer to the main page. Once on the site, fans can navigate eight tabs to find such information as up-to-date video highlights, a player profile and photo galleries. (AP) -- Nov. 3 -- Everything went so right for Louis Rankin that even his one big mistake didn't end up hurting Washington. Rankin ran for 255 yards and a touchdown in the best performance by a Washington running back in 11 years, helping the Huskies avenge a humiliating loss to Stanford last year and win their first Pac-10 game this season, 27-9 over the Cardinal on Saturday. The only blunder for Rankin came when he lost a fumble at his own 1 in the second quarter with the Huskies (3-6, 1-5) leading 10-3. But Byron Davenport forced a fumble by Corey Gatewood and Mesphin Forrester recovered for Washington at the 1, preserving the lead and absolving Rankin for his mistake. Rankin did the rest, carrying the ball 36 times to help the Huskies finish with a season-high 388 yards on the ground and snap a six-game losing streak. Rankin's total was the most for a Huskies back since Corey Dillon ran for 259 yards against Oregon in 1996 and fourth most since 1947.

**#4 Thomas DeCoud - S**

Sr., 6-2, 204, Pinole, Calif./Pinole Valley HS

Anchors the Golden Bear secondary from his free safety position ... ranks third on the team with 67 tackles ... posted a season-best 12 tackles in the Oregon State game ... tallied nine tackles (eight solo) against Arizona State ... registered his first career sack and first career interception in the victory over Arizona - his sack caused a fumble that Tyson Alualu recovered for a touchdown ... finished the Arizona game with 10 tackles ... posted six solo tackles, including his 100th career takedown, against Louisiana Tech ... ran down a Tennessee back at the three-yard line and then was part of the goal-line stand which helped preserve the Cal advantage in the season-opening victory ... finished the UT game with nine tackles.

Jr., 6-4, 231, Seattle, Wash./O'Dea HS

The Pac-10's third-leading tackler with 9.6 takedowns per game (86 total) ... has registered at least nine tackles in eight of nine games this year, including four double-figure games ... posted 12 stops in the Oregon State game and added 10 (all solo) against UCLA ... recorded his first career interception in the fourth quarter of the Oregon game to set up Cal's game-winning touchdown (a Pontiac Game-Changing Moment) ... had his second straight double-figure tackle day with 10 against Louisiana Tech ... tallied a career-high 13 tackles with a pair of sacks in the Colorado State win - one sack caused a key fumble which was recovered by the Bears ... added nine takedowns in the season-opening win over Tennessee ... Freshman All-American two years ago, battled injuries throughout 2006.

Jr., 6-2, 232, Clovis, Calif./Clovis HS

Hard-hitting junior has forced seven fumbles in his career, including a bone-jarring sack on the first drive against Tennessee which caused a fumble which was recovered by Worrell Williams for a touchdown ... strong game against Washington State, sparking the defense with six tackles, three pass break-ups, a sack and constant pressure on the QB ... missed the second half of the Louisiana Tech game and all of the Arizona and Oregon games due to a neck stinger ... returned to record five tackles and a fumble recovery against Oregon State ... recorded a season-best 10 takedowns including three tackles for loss and a sack, against UCLA ... posted five tackles in the win over Colorado State ... a Pac-10 all-conference selection as a non-starter in 2006 ... candidate for the Butkus Award.

**#20 Justin Forsett - RB**

Sr., 5-8, 196, Arlington, Texas/Grace Prep HS

Leads the Pac-10 in touchdowns (12 sixth in a season at Cal) and ranks second in rushing (111.7 yards per game) ... posted his sixth 100-yard rushing game of the season against Washington State with 132 yards on a career-best 32 carries, capping the evening with a game-clinching 44-yard touchdown run with 2:42 remaining ... against an Oregon State defense which entered the game leading the nation in rushing defense, tallied 150 yards on 28 carries, his fifth 100-yard game of the season, while running for a TD for the seventh game in a row ... ran for 101 yards on 23 carries against Oregon while scoring a pair of second-half touchdowns ... added 117 yards and two TDs on 23 carries in the Arizona win ... recorded 152 rushing yards (including his 2,000th career rushing yard) on 23 carries (6.6 yards per carry) with a career-best three touchdowns in the victory over Louisiana Tech ... in his first game as the Bears' primary tailback, rushed for 156 yards on 26 carries to go with a touchdown against Tennessee ... has 11 career 100-yard games (fifth in Cal history) and has cracked Cal's all-time top 10 in rushing and rushing TDs ... Doak Walker Award candidate.

**#7 Lavelle Hawkins - WR/KR**

Sr., 5-11, 185, Stockton, Calif./Edison HS

Rated as the No. 1 senior receiver in the country by ESPN's Mel Kiper, Jr. ... leads the Bears with 53 catches (third in the Pac-10 with 5.89/game) and receiving yards with 681 (third in Pac-10 with 75.7 per game) ... matched his career-high with nine catches for 78 yards against Washington State ... monster game against Oregon State with nine catches for 192 yards (sixth-most in school history) including a 64-yard TD reception and a 10-yard scoring grab ... had just two catches against Oregon, but both came on third-and-long and led to Cal touchdowns ... recorded six catches for 95 yards in the win over Arizona ... returned the opening kickoff 90 yards for a touchdown in the victory over Louisiana Tech ... also added seven catches for 87 yards in the win over the Bulldogs ... paced the Golden Bears with seven catches for 90 yards, including a three-yard TD reception, in the win over Tennessee ... also serves as Cal's primary kick returner and ranks fifth in the Pac-10 in kickoff return average at 23.0.

**#1 DeSean Jackson - WR/PR**

Jr., 6-0, 172, Los Angeles, Calif./Long Beach Poly HS

Recognized by many as the most exciting player in the nation ... rated as the No. 1 junior receiver in the country by ESPN's Mel Kiper, Jr. ... ranks sixth all-time at Cal in receptions, fifth in receiving yards and third in receiving touchdowns ... has catches in 25 straight games for the Bears ... had five grabs for 88 yards and a touchdown against Arizona State ... snagged nine passes for 136 yards and a pair of touchdowns against UCLA ... registered career-bests of 11 catches and 161 yard, including two impressive touchdown grabs, to lead the Bears to a crucial road victory over No. 11 Oregon ... dazzled fans with a career-best 73-yard end-around TD run in the win over Colorado State ... added to his reputation in the season-opener against Tennessee with 143 yards on just six touches (23.8 yards per touch), including a 77-yard punt return touchdown - his sixth career PR TD ... also had a 19-yard run in the win over the Volunteers ... for his career has 47 plays of 20 or more yards (24.7% of his 190 touches).

Sr., 5-11, 171, Oakland, Calif./Hayward HS

Leads the team with 34 career starts ... ranks seventh at Cal in career receptions and 10th in receiving touchdowns ... owns the Cal record for consecutive games with a reception (38, fourth-longest active streak in the nation) ... missed the UCLA game due to a shoulder injury ... returned against Arizona State for a season-best 85 yards on five catches ... finished the Oregon State game with five grabs for 68 yards, including a season-long 37-yard reception in the fourth quarter ... snagged five passes for 33 yards in the Oregon win ... recorded five receptions for 47 yards in the win over Louisiana Tech ... tallied a pair of catches against Tennessee, including a short catch and jump over the defense for a four-yard touchdown.

**#11 Andrew Larson - P**

Sr., 6-2, 197, Mission Viejo, Calif./Laguna Hills HS

One of the top punters in the nation ... averaging 41.6 yards per punt with a net punting mark of 39.0 (best in the Pac-10) ... opponents have attempted just 16 returns against Cal - for a total of 50 yards (3.1 yards per return) ... averaged 44.8 yards on five punts against Arizona State with three downed inside the 20 ... had a career day against Oregon State, setting a school record with an average of 55.8 yards on four punts, including a career-long 73-yarder and a 64-yarder ... punted seven times at Oregon, averaging just 38.1 yards, but placing four inside the 20 ... had three punts for 136 yards (45.3 avg) against Arizona - the returns went for -4 yards giving him a net punting average of 46.7 for the game ... placed two of his four punts against Louisiana Tech inside the 20 ... punted five times for an average of 43.6 yards with just one punt returned for six yards against Tennessee ... helped the Bears to a 38.3 net-punting average in 2006 (tops in the Pac-10).

Jr., 6-5, 233, Canyon Country, Calif./Canyon HS

Ranks seventh all-time at Cal in passing touchdowns and 10th in passing yardage ... missed the Oregon State game due to an injury suffered late in the Oregon contest ... returned against UCLA and connected on 22-of-34 passes for 232 yards and three touchdowns ... threw for 275 yards and a TD against Arizona State ... completed 26-of-39 passes to direct the Cal offense to victory against Washington State ... established career-highs of 28 completions on 43 attempts in his 285-yard, two-TD performance in the victory over Oregon ... threw for 235 yards and a touchdown in the win over Arizona ... had a streak of 102 passes without an interception snapped on his first pass of the fourth quarter against Louisiana Tech ... completed 22-of-33 passes for 230 yards and a pair of TDs in the victory over the Bulldogs ... directed Cal's convincing season-opening victory over No. 15 Tennessee by completing 19-of-28 passes for 241 yards and a pair of touchdowns while also running for another score ... on preseason watch lists for the Davey O'Brien Award, the Manning Award and the Walter Camp Award.

Jr., 6-5, 300, Santa Barbara, Calif./San Marcos HS

A top candidate for the Rimington Trophy as the top center in the nation ... selected as the midseason first-team All-American center by Phil Steele's Magazine as well as a midseason first-team All-American by SI.com and Rivals.com ... rated as the No. 1 junior center by Mel Kiper ... semifinalist for the Rotary Lombardi Award ... anchors offensive line which has allowed just eight sacks this year (best in the Pac-10) ... Cal is averaging 166.3 rushing yards per game including six individual 100-yard efforts ... helped pave the way to 471 yards of total offense, including 230 on the ground, against Tennessee ... opened the hole for QB Nate Longshore to duck into the end zone for a two-yard score against the Volunteers ... Cal leads the Pac-10 and ranks third in the nation in sacks allowed over the last two years (21).

Sr., 6-5, 258, San Pedro, Calif./Peninsula HS

Cal led 38-21 early in the third quarter, but the Volunteers pulled within seven points on Daniel Lincoln's field goal in the opening minute of the fourth. Forsett's TD run with 9:10 to play pushed Cal back to a comfortable lead, and the defense finished off the Bears' eighth straight home victory since 2005.

**FORT COLLINS, Colo.** - DeSean Jackson is spectacular from scrimmage and on special teams. The junior wide receiver scored on a 73-yard reverse and 10th-ranked Cal held off scrappy Colorado State 34-28 on Saturday. Jackson, who opened the season with an electrifying 77-yard punt return TD against Tennessee, again flashed his Heisman Trophy credentials when he circled left, deked cornerback Joey Rucks at midfield and raced all alone down the Rams' sideline for Cal's first touchdown. Jackson, who had 143 all-purpose yards on only six touches against Tennessee, collected 141 all-purpose yards against the Rams despite a throbbing thumb that resulted in a couple of drops. **EUGENE, OR** - Cal receiver DeSean Jackson is back. The preseason Heisman hopeful got off to a slow start this season -- troubled in part by a sprained thumb -- but he emerged with 11 catches for 161 yards and two scores in sixth-ranked California's 31-24 victory over No. 11 Oregon Saturday. The receptions and the yards were career-bests, and the receiving touchdowns were his first of the season. "This game was the one where I needed to do that and I stepped up and made big plays," said Jackson, who was touted by Cal as a Heisman candidate with a Web site. Justin Forsett ran for 101 yards and another two scores, and Nate Longshore completed 28 of 43 passes for 285 yards and two scores for the Golden Bears (5-0, 2-0 Pacific-10 Conference). California snapped a seven-game losing streak at Autzen Stadium -- they hadn't won there since 1987 -- and needed a close call to go their way to hang on to the victory. The loose ball went through the end zone and was ruled a touchback and possession for Cal. The play was reviewed, the call stood and time ran out for Oregon (4-1, 1-1). "That had huge significance right there, so they had to get it right," Cal coach Jeff Tedford said. "We knew when we saw it on the big board that there was no way it would be overturned."

**BERKELEY** - Yvenson Bernard leaped into the end zone on fourth down from the 1 with 8:30 remaining and Oregon State delivered the latest shocker in an upset-filled season, beating the second-ranked Golden Bears and backup quarterback Kevin Riley 31-28 Saturday. The win wasn't sealed until Riley was forced to scramble to avoid the pass rush from the 12 with 14 seconds remaining and no timeouts. He was tackled after a 2-yard gain and the clock ran out before the field goal unit could get on the field. Riley had orchestrated a near-perfect drive up to that point from his own 5 with 1:27 remaining. Oregon State (4-3, 2-2 Pac-10) denied Cal (5-1, 2-1) a chance to seize the top ranking for the first time in 56 years. No. 1 LSU lost in triple overtime at Kentucky earlier in the day, but the Bears were unable to handle their own business, becoming the 10th team ranked in the top 10 to lose to an unranked team already this season. This marked the first time the top two teams lost on the same day since Sept. 21, 1996, when No. 1 Nebraska was beaten 19-0 by Arizona State and No. 2 Tennessee fell 35-29 to Florida. "We just have to keep our heads up," said receiver Lavelle Hawkins, whose 64-yard TD with 2:31 to go started Cal's comeback from a 10-point deficit. Oregon State recovered the onsidess kick after Hawkins' late touchdown and pinned Cal at its own 5 with 1:27 left and no timeouts. Riley, showing great poise after some early game jitters, completed a 19-yard pass to Hawkins on fourth-and-18 and a 37-yarder to Jordan. A pass interference call moved the ball to the 12 with 14 seconds left before the final fateful play.
