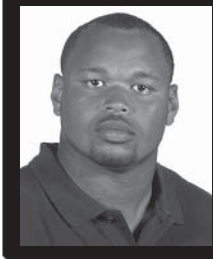

Emerged as one of the better second-string running backs in the nation this fall... erased any doubt of that fact when he averaged 13.2 yards per carry in shredding Washington's defense for 185 yards and one touchdown on only 14 attempts in his second-ever Cal start in place of regular tailback Adimchinobe Echemandu (knee)... has churned out a Pac-10-leading 5.9 yards per rush this season, netting 570 yards on 96 carries in 12 games as league's No. 9 rusher... also has caught 16 passes for 140 yards and has scored seven touchdowns (5 rushing, 2 receiving)... despite limited playing time, was fourth on the team in scoring with 42 points... his 185-yard display vs. Washington tied fellow teammate Terrell Williams (185 at Rutgers, 2001) for the 15th greatest rushing day in Cal history... included in that 185-yard outburst were jaunts of 68 and 51 yards, as he blazed to 157 yards on 10 carries in the first half... the 68-yard run was the longest by a Cal player since Joe Igber raced 80 yards against Arizona State in 2000... also caught a 30-yard pass from Aaron Rodgers in that Cal rout over UW, giving him 215 total yards of offense... prior to that Washington explosion, he enjoyed two other big outings in 2003, rushing for 114 yards on 16 attempts in Cal's 34-2 romp over Southern Mississippi Aug. 30 in Berkeley, and galloping for 92 yards and two TDs on 11 carries in the Bears' 42-14 conquest of Arizona... had a career-high 32-yard catch at Arizona State... also snared two touchdown passes (22 and 7 yards) in the season opener against Kansas State in the BCA Classic in Kansas City Aug. 23... transferred to Cal after two stellar seasons in the JC ranks at College of the Canyons in Santa Clarita.
