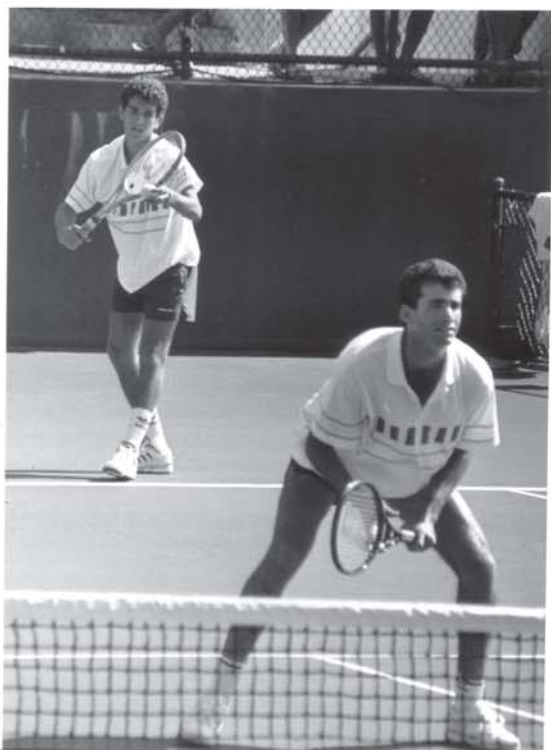

Men's Historical Facts

- Five consecutive men's appearances in the NCAA tournament
- 1925 national champions, the men's team has been ranked in the Top 10 21 times
- The men's team has boasted 18 NCAA singles national champions and 13 doubles champions
- 43 All-Americans

Women's Historical Facts

- 24 consecutive appearances in the NCAA tournament
- Four NCAA women's doubles champions
- 54 All-Americans
- Head coach Jan Brogan is listed as the winningest female coach in NCAA tennis history and has guided the Bears to six undefeated conference seasons (1981-86)
- 19 national Top 10 finishes



Tennis Player of the Decade Lisa Albano is the only Cal woman to reach the NCAA singles final. She was inducted into the Cal Athletic Hall of Fame in 2000.



In 1998, '99 and '00, Amy Jensen became the only player in NCAA history to capture three consecutive NCAA doubles titles, giving Cal its first national championship.

Designed by ELS Architecture and Urban Design with top senior player Larry Dodge, the new transformation of Hellman Tennis Center aims to fulfill three primary goals of the University of California and the Cal Athletic Department:

Maximum Spectator Value. Hellman will retain its intimate atmosphere, but add individual chairback loge seats, viewing lounges and balconies, a modern clubhouse and public restrooms will help strengthen future Cal Tennis bids for NCAA championships, ATP/WTA tournament, as well as for charity and junior tennis events.

First Class Team Facilities. Both the men's and women's teams will gain modern offices, locker rooms, meeting rooms, and equipment storage areas. These new facilities will be instrumental in creating a superior competitive tennis atmosphere, which will attract top players to Cal.

Community Involvement. By adding team rooms that can be converted to classroom space in the evenings, the new facility will enhance the Bear Trax program. Bear Trax is an academic and athletic exchange program which supports disadvantaged students from the Bay Area in their transition from low-income communities to higher education campuses.
