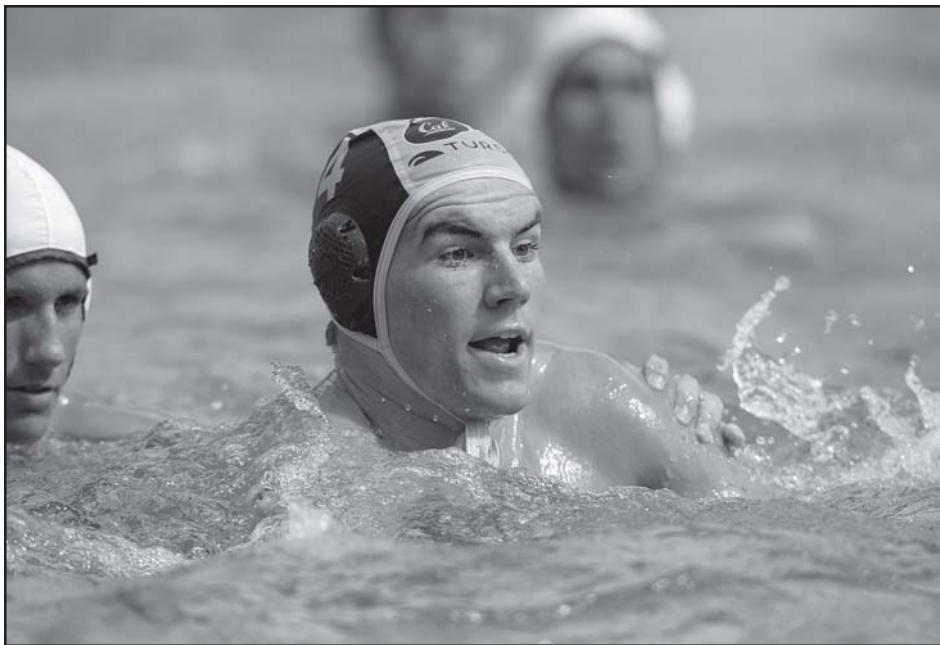


2005 SEASON IN REVIEW



The 2005 California men's water polo team had a solid 2005 campaign, finishing 21-7 and ending with a No. 3 nationally ranking. However, the season all came down to the semifinals of the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Tournament, where the Golden Bears fell, 10-8, to No. 1-ranked and eventual national champion USC. From there, Cal rebounded to defeat UC Irvine, 9-7, to conclude the MPSF Tournament in third place, but was not selected as one of the two teams from the MPSF to advance to the NCAA Tournament. Of the Bears' seven losses during the 2005 campaign, four came in the hands of the national champion Trojans.

Still, Cal had some impressive individual accomplishments. Junior John Mann scored a team-high 56 goals on the year and was named first-team All-American, first-team All-MPSF, and was a member of the MPSF All-Tournament team. Mann scored five goals in the three MPSF tournament matches, and earlier was the Oct. 4 MPSF Player of the Week after leading Cal to three victories and scoring four goals in the Bears' 9-5 victory over Stanford on Oct. 1.

Senior goalie Nate Bennett and sophomore attacker Michael Sharf were tabbed as third-team All-Americans. Bennett had an outstanding 2005 campaign, recording 211 saves in 28 matches with 26 saves during the MPSF Tournament. He was the Oct. 25 MPSF Player of the Week after recording a career-high 20 saves in Cal's 9-2 conference victory over UC Irvine. Earlier named third-team All-MPSF, Bennett finished his

college career with 522 saves. Sharf was second in scoring for the Bears as a sophomore, tallying 31 goals in 27 matches. He netted three goals in a match on four occasions during the season, including Cal's narrow losses to top-ranked USC on Oct. 16 and Nov. 12.

Junior Marty Matthies was slated as an honorable mention All-American after he scored 19 goals in 24 matches, including a team-high six goals during the MPSF Tournament. Matthies also notched a score in the Bears' victory over Stanford. He had earlier been selected second-team All-MPSF.

At the annual team awards banquet, Mann was picked as the team MVP, while sophomores Jeff Tyrrell and Zac Monsees were tabbed Most Improved, junior Jon

John Mann was the Bears' leading scorer in 2005, tallying 56 goals and earning first-team All-America, first-team All-MPSF and MPSF All-Tournament honors.

Marshall was the winner of the Golden Bear Coaches Award, and Sharf and junior Brian Bacharach were the recipients of the Academic Achievement Award. Tyrrell and Monsees received the Peter J. Cutino Water Polo Trophy as the team's most improved players. Monsees finished the 2005 campaign with 16 goals in 27 matches, and Tyrrell tallied 11 goals in 27 contests, including two goals in the Bears' 9-7 victory over UC Irvine in the MPSF third-place match. Marshall is the third-ever recipient of the Golden Bear Coaches' Award after competing in six matches last fall, notching goals against Santa Clara and UC Santa Cruz.

Sharf and Bacharach were honored for their scholastic achievements. Both Sharf and Bacharach were members of the 2005 MPSF All-Academic team. Sharf had a 3.589 GPA through fall 2005 semester, and Bacharach, majoring in molecular and cellular biology, had a 3.338 cumulative GPA through the fall.

Cal also had six players recognized by MPSF as members of the 2005 All-Academic Team. Bacharach, sophomore Adam Haley, Monsees, Sharf, Tyrrell and junior Andrija Vasiljevic were all noted by the MPSF for their academic achievements. To be eligible for MPSF All-Academic, an athlete must have a 3.0 or better cumulative GPA, must be at least a sophomore academically, and must have competed in fifty percent or more of a team's matches. Vasiljevic was a second-team All-MPSF pick as well.



Nate Bennett concluded an outstanding college career in 2005, earning third-team All-America accolades and finishing with 522 career saves.

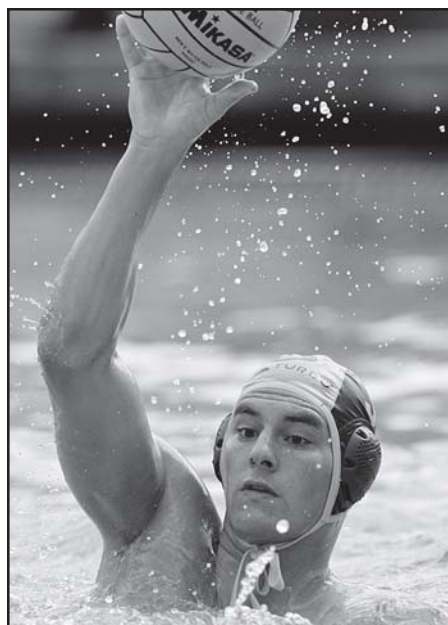

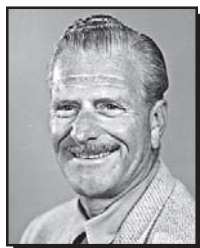

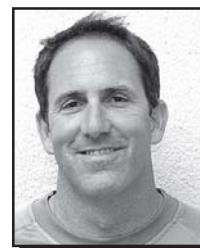

SPIEKER AQUATICS COMPLEX



Serving as home to the California water polo and swimming teams is the Spieker Aquatics Complex, one of the finest outdoor facilities in the United States.

Located on the corner of Dana and Bancroft on the south side of Haas Pavilion, the one million dollar facility was completed in the fall of 1982. It was made possible through the Cal Sports '80s project and

was named after former Cal water polo letterman Edward "Ned" Spieker, who provided the major portion of the funds for the project.

The facility replaced the antiquated Harmon Pool, which served as the home for California aquatics for 50 years. The primary aspect of the extensive remodeling project was the joining of the two previously existing tanks to provide for the 50-meter by 25-yard pool of deep water, suitable for major national and international water polo and swimming championships. Spieker Aquatics Complex has served as the site of the United States Senior National Water Polo Championship in 1984 and '86, the National Qualifying Tournament for collegiate women's water polo in 1997 and 2000, the men's Mountain Pacific

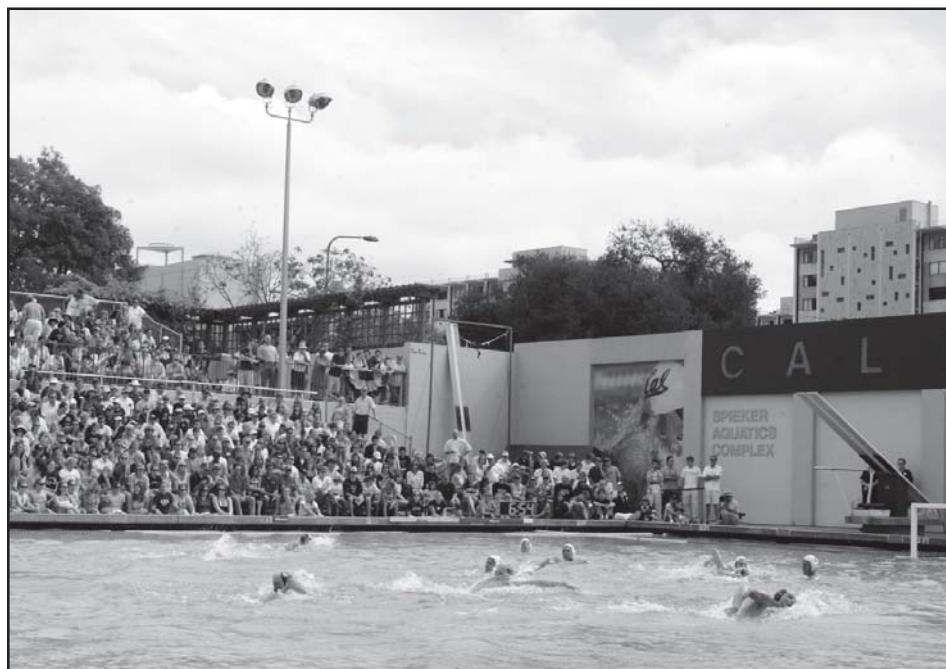
Sports Federation Tournament in 2001, and most recently the women's MPSF Tournament in 2005.

One thing that hasn't changed with the Bears move into Spieker is Cal's dominance at home. Between 1976 and '81, the Bears' men's water polo team lost just one league match at home. Since the Cal men played their first match in the Spieker Aquatics Complex in the middle of the 1982 season, the Bears have compiled a 174-43 (.802) record. In 1991 and '92, the Cal men went through the home season unbeaten, winning all 19 of their matches at Spieker.

The Bear women played their first home matches as a varsity sport in Spieker during the 1996 season and have compiled a home record of 59-17 (.776).

RULES, REGULATIONS & TERMS

INTRODUCTION

Water polo, the oldest team sport in the Olympics, is a game of skill, endurance and swimming ability played in a 20 by 30 meter pool. There are seven players, six in the field and one goalkeeper. The object of the game is to shoot a the ball into a one-by-three meter goal. One point is scored for each goal. A player may shoot for a one-point goal, without a fake or a hesitation, after an ordinary foul outside of seven meters. The game consists of four, eight-minute quarters, with each team allowed 35 seconds to take a shot.

GAME PLAY

The game starts with both teams lined up on the opposite ends of the pool. They sprint for the ball dropped in the middle of the field of play by the referee. Teams advance the ball by passing, or dribbling (swimming with it). Only one hand may be used on the ball at one time, with the exception of the goalkeeper. Defensively teams will play man-to-man and zone defenses. No player is allowed to hold, sink, pull back or otherwise interfere with the free limb movement of an opponent unless the player has his hand on the ball. It is the object of the defense to play the ball and not the man. The timing of the foul is critical in all defensive plays. Poor timing often results in ejection fouls.

FOULS

The referee indicates a foul by blowing a whistle and pointing with the hand toward the team that has possession, indicating the direction of the team's attack. That team may receive a free throw. There are ordinary fouls and major fouls.

Ordinary fouls - offending team gets a free throw from the point of the infraction.

1. Two hand touch of the ball.
2. Taking the ball underwater and touched by an opposing player.
3. Impeding the progress of a player who does not have the ball.
4. Pushing off of an opponent.
5. Stalling.

Major fouls - Offending player ejected for 35 seconds or until a goal is scored or there is a possession change.

1. Kick/strike an opponent.
2. Interfere with a free throw.
3. Hold, sink or pull back an opponent without the ball.
4. Misconduct, disrespect.
5. Ordinary foul in dead time (the time between the call of the foul and the actual putting the ball into play).

TERMINOLOGY

Back Door: An offensive drive from the wing position on the weak side (away from the ball).

Ball Under: A minor foul (see #2 under ordinary fouls).

Center Throw: A free throw from in front of the goal at the two-meter line, awarded when the ball goes over the goal line last touched by a defensive player.

Counter Attack: A fast break.

Dry Pass: Pass from one player to another without the ball touching the water.

Extra Man: A man up situation, usually six on five and a "power play" situation.

Inside Water: The offensive player has an advantageous position in front of the defender, with nothing but open water in front of him and the goal.

Moving Pick: Moving screen intended to free an offensive player for a release pass and/or shot.

Natural Goals: Goals scored when both teams have an even amount of players.

Penalty Shot: A free shot taken by the offensive player from the four-meter line, awarded when a foul occurs inside the four-meter line preventing the probable scoring of a goal.

Point: Position at the top, of the 12 o'clock area of the offensive set-up, in the center of the pool.

Release: A player making himself available for a pass.

Switch: Defenders switching defensive responsibilities.

Wet Pass: A pass from one player to another that lands near the receiver in the water.

Wet Shot: A shot attempt while the ball is controlled in the water, usually a quick wrist shot. Also called off the water shot.

Friends of Cal Aquatics evolved from the efforts provided by four generous visionaries and alumni: Rick Cronk, Don Fisher, Warren Hellman and Ned Spieker, who founded the Splash Club Endowment Fund in the 1980's by providing a leadership gift of matching funds which raised a total



of \$2 Million for the programs. Another prominent Cal Aquatics endowment fund was established in honor of the legendary Cal Swimming and Water Polo Coach Pete Cutino. The Peter J. Cutino Scholarship Fund enables the men's water polo program the opportunity to attract nationally prominent water polo players to Cal.

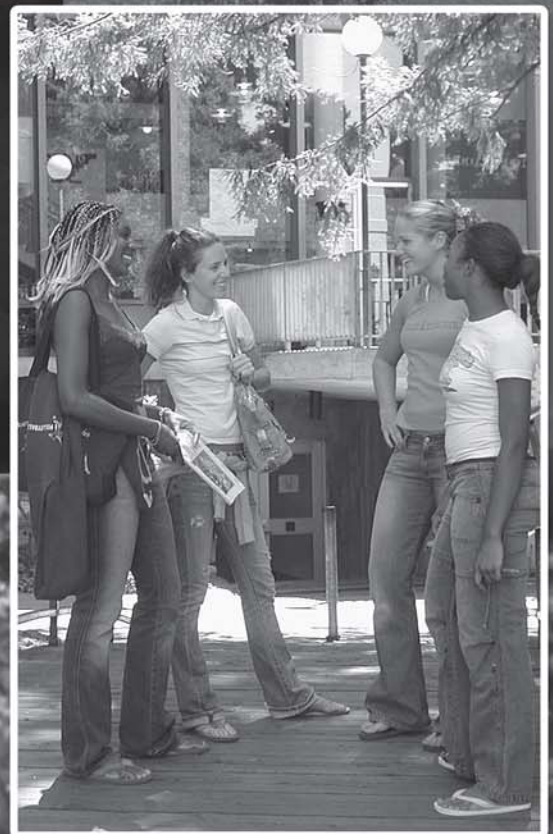
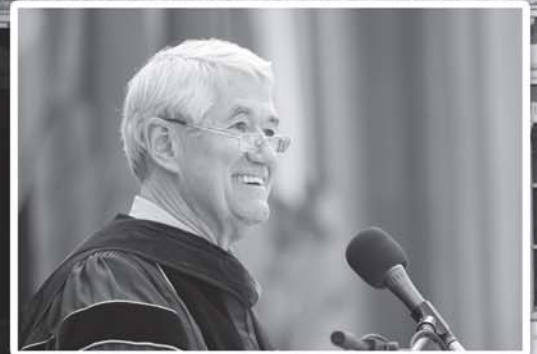

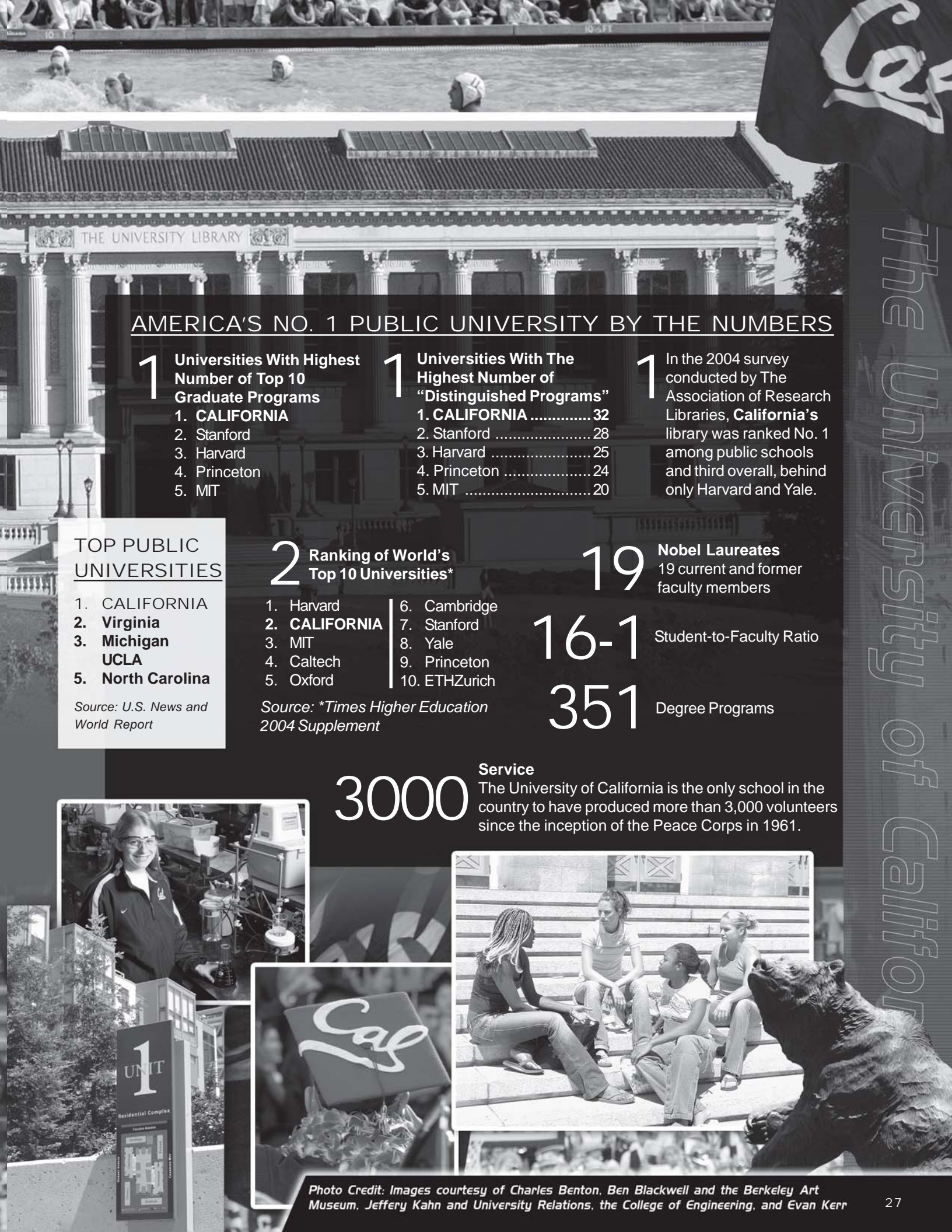
