Join the experienced and knowledgeable Cal Women's Basketball Coaching Staff this summer at the 2008 Cal Basketball Camps. These camps will provide fundamental instruction with basketball specific drills, daily competitions, and 5 on 5 full court, officiated games. Game play focuses on overall skill development, incorporating all aspects of the game. Players are grouped according to both age and ability levels, placing players of similar abilities and positions in the same group.

## CAMP INFORMATION

### \*Individual Camp Sessions I & II - \$350

**Ages 9-13, Session I: June 16-19th, Session II: July 21-24**  
Purpose: To develop and improve individual basketball skills in a hard-working yet fun environment. To develop both basic and advanced skills, such as shooting, passing, ball handling, and footwork, through individual and group instruction with time allotted for practice, drills and games. Daily competition will allow campers to implement the skills they have learned. All campers are grouped by age and ability. The camp will also feature fundamental skill stations, games, contests, and guest speakers.

### \*Jr. Cub Camp - \$350

**Ages 5-8, Session I: June 16-19th, Session II: July 21-24**  
This camp is designed for young girls age's 5-8 who want to learn the fundamentals of basketball and have fun doing so. There will be many exciting games and competitions throughout the week that will incorporate the skills being taught during camp. Our staff makes basketball fun for these "young ones" by teaching basic concepts such as game rules and basketball court terminology. Come join us for one of the most exciting and fun camps here at Cal.

### \*Jam Fest - \$375 full day, \$300 1/2 day

**Full day - Session I: June 15th, Session II: June 29th**  
**1/2 day - July 27th**  
The Jam Fest is a one day team camp that guarantees all teams at least 4 games. All high school, junior varsity, middle school and AAU teams are welcome. You must have a minimum of 8 players per team. The focus of this camp is to play great competition, and to have the ability to work as a team with your coach to prepare you for your upcoming season. There will be two leagues, an A and a B, to differentiate levels of ability. All games will be played by regular high school rules, and certified officials will officiate all of the games. There will also be different clinics throughout the day, such as a post/guard college workout. This camp fills up quickly, spots are available on a first come first paid basis. ### \*Advanced Camp - \$425

**June 20-22**  
Our advanced camp is geared for the skilled and motivated high school player. Specialized teaching will be combined with an intense level of competition which will offer the opportunity to put newly learned skills into practice. Position-specific instruction will be provided by the Cal coaching staff and players. There will be sessions on NCAA rules, academic requirements. We want to help you take your game to a new level!

### EQUIPMENT

Participants should wear suitable athletic attire such as basketball shoes, shorts and t-shirts. Don't forget your knee braces, ankle braces, or any other necessary equipment.

### MEALS

Campers are to bring their own lunch and snacks. There will be pizza, drinks and snacks sold in the camp store daily. Meals will be provided for the Advanced Campers only. Resident campers will be provided with 3 meals per day (Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner) while commuters will be provided lunch only.

### FACILITIES

Located on the University of California campus, Haas Pavilion is the home of California Golden Bears Basketball. The University of California, Berkeley's Recreational Sports Facility may also be used for certain camps depending on camp enrollment. Both gymnasiums are located in the same building.

### MEDICAL
