# 2007 OUTLOOK

## BEARS SHOOT FOR DEEP NCAA RUN

With a mix of experienced veterans, a No. 5-ranked incoming class and a motivated new coach, California looks to advance far into the NCAA Tournament this season.

Neil McGuire takes over a Cal program which posted a 12-5-5 overall record last season and advanced to the second round of the postseason. Last year marked the Golden Bears' third consecutive bid to the NCAA Tournament and eighth in the last nine seasons.

"It's always been my goal to be part of winning a national championship as a coach," said McGuire, who arrived in Berkeley after serving as the head coach at Texas Tech for the last two seasons. "There aren't many schools which offer the opportunity of a national championship in women's soccer, but Cal is one of them. If you look at the quality of the recruiting base in California, the magnificent academic reputation and the history of this program, I don't think there's anything finer than Cal."

Cal returns seven starters and six seniors who have all seen a lot of playing time for the Bears. Three of the returning starters are from Cal's dominant backline. Seniors Courtney Hooker and Kristine Relja and junior Nkechi Kanu played major roles in the Bears posting 12 shutouts and a 0.69 goals-against average last year. Hooker earned second-team All-Pac-10 honors, and Kanu was an honorable mention choice.

The Bears also feature two Pac-10 honor recipients in the midfield in senior Caroline Lea and sophomore Kelly Menachof. Lea garnered her second straight second-team conference selection, while Menachof was named to the first-ever Pac-10 All-Freshman team.

Cal looks for a collective effort from its frontline in 2007, as the Bears lost their top two scorers from last season—Katie Ratican and Julia Schnugg—to graduation. Senior forward Stephanie Wieger is Cal's top returner for points with nine and is tied with Menachof as the top returner for goals with three. In addition to Wieger, junior Valerie Barnes and sophomores Lisa Kevorkian and Torrey Delaplaine were part of the forward rotation in 2006.

McGuire believes he has assumed the reins of a deep, talented team that will suit his style of play.

"We want to be an up-tempo team," McGuire said. "We will be a team that attacks, looks to keep the ball on the ground and moves the ball so that everyone is involved. Our staff wants this to be a player-driven team. We're going to guide them, but they need to take ownership in their development as players and as a team."

## GOALKEEPERS

Cal's roster features four goalkeepers who will challenge for the starting nod. Sophomore Gina Pellegrini boasts the most experience playing for the Bears, posting a 0.15 goals-against average and four shutouts in eight games as a rookie.

Redshirt junior Nicole Jarbo performed well under tough circumstances in the 2006 NCAA Tournament. Jarbo, who had play 10 minutes through her first two seasons, started both postseason games for the Bears due to injuries to two other keepers. Jarbo recorded nine saves to help her team beat Auburn, 3-1, in the opening round and tallied two saves in the second round versus Florida State.

Freshman Jordan Kussmann comes to Cal after being selected a 2007 *Parade Magazine* All-American and earning a No. 12 national ranking by Soccer Buzz. Kussmann and all off the Bears' freshmen have spent time in the U.S. youth national team system.

Redshirt sophomore Rosie Aguilera, who transferred to Berkeley after seeing action in 14 games in 2005 for UC Irvine, could also be in the mix.

## DEFENDERS

Courtney Hooker and Kristine Relja have been fixtures in the center of the Bears' backline during their careers. Speedster Nkechi Kanu emerged as a starting outside back for the Bears a year ago. Hooker, a 2005 Soccer Buzz second-team All-American, and Kanu were both invited to a U.S. Under-21 National team camp last April.

Sophomore Brianna Bak gained valuable experience last year after Relja tore her ACL nine games into the season. Bak played in 18 games, making six starts, and headed in the game-winning goal against Stanford in the 89th minute.

Freshmen Megan Jesolva and McKenna-Louise McKetty are versatile and may impact Cal's defense. At No. 10, Jesolva has the distinction of being rated the highest by Soccer Buzz of any of Cal's newcomers. McKetty earned a top 75 rating by the national women's soccer Web site.

Redshirt freshman Jessica Mazura adds depth to Cal's backline and midfield.

## MIDFIELDERS

Seniors Caroline Lea, Caitlin Hannegan and Laurie Gartrell have a combined 160 games of playing experience for Cal. Lea spent time with the U.S. Under-20 and Under-21 National

teams over the last two years after beginning her collegiate career as one of the top 25 recruits in the country, according to Soccer Buzz.

Hannegan battled back from a knee injury as a sophomore to being a regular member of Cal's midfield rotation as a junior. She started 12 of the 21 games she entered last fall and netted her first collegiate goal in the Bears' NCAA Tournament win over Auburn.

Gartrell also saw time as a starter last season after serving as a reserve for two years. In 2006, she started 12 of Cal's 22 games and was one of 13 Bears who earned Pac-10 All-Academic recognition.

Kelly Menachof distinguished herself as one of the top rookies in the Pac-10 last season. Menachof competed in all 22 contests in 2006 and was tabbed as a starter for six of the Bears' final nine games.

Sophomore Katie Oakes and freshmen Emily Shibata (under-19 regional team) and Megan Jesolva should be in the rotation. Oakes played in 12 games as a freshman after being chosen one of Soccer Buzz's Top 100 newcomers.

## FORWARDS

Stephanie Wieger, Valerie Barnes and Lisa Kevorkian have the most experience in a Cal uniform. Wieger, a 2004 honorable mention All-Pac-10 selection, has a talent for scoring in big games. Five of Wieger's 11 career goals have come against ranked opponents, including in a 1-0 overtime triumph against No. 4 Santa Clara last season.

Barnes also has shown an ability to score timely goals for Cal. In 2006, she delivered the game-winning score in 1-0 victories over Indiana and Wisconsin, adding to her game-winning strike in a 2-1 decision over UTEP in the second round of the 2005 NCAA Tournament.

Kevorkian posted five points as a rookie, and after beginning last season as a reserve, she started six of the final nine games of the year.

Torrey Delaplaine, who was selected the Bears' Most Improved Player last fall, should also be a factor in the lineup. Redshirt sophomore Katherine Daiss played in 13 games as a freshman and looks to get back into the mix after redshirting 2006 due to a knee injury.

Cal's newcomers—junior Nikki Schrey and freshmen Alex Morgan and Natasha Richardson—have the potential to bolster Cal's offense immediately. Schrey transferred to Cal as Saint Mary's leader for points and goals the last two seasons, with a most recent effort of 13 points and five goals last year. Morgan is currently a member of the U.S. Under-17 National team and is listed as a top 50 recruit by Soccer Buzz, while Richardson has spent time in the U.S. Under-17 National team pool.

The Bears' frontline rotation could also benefit from Megan Jesolva, a 2007 *Parade Magazine* All-American, and McKenna-Louise McKetty, a three-year member of the Olympic Development Program regional team.

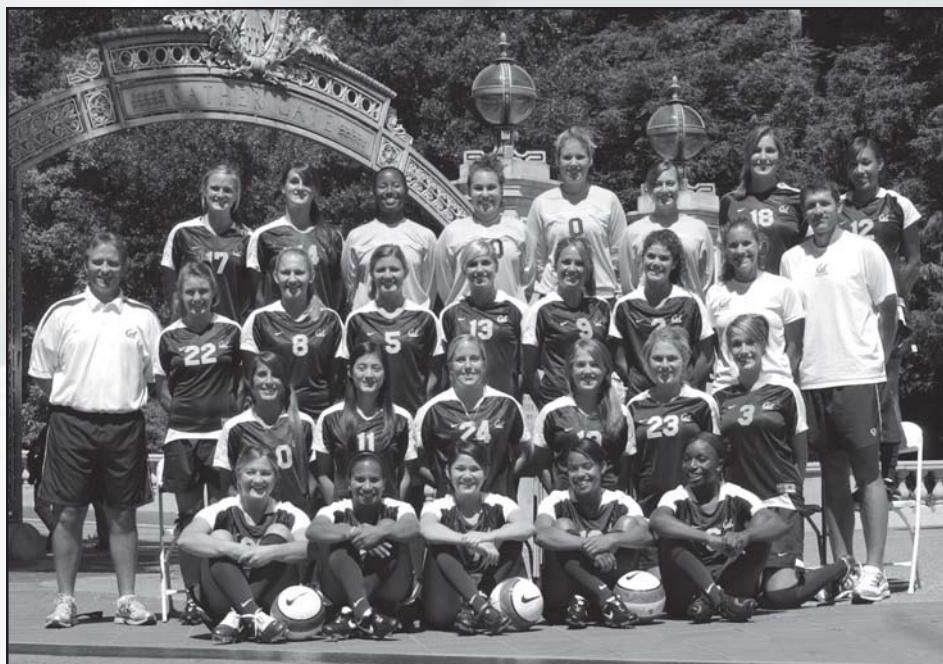

# HEAD COACH

## NEIL McGUIRE

**Head Coach  
First Season at Cal**

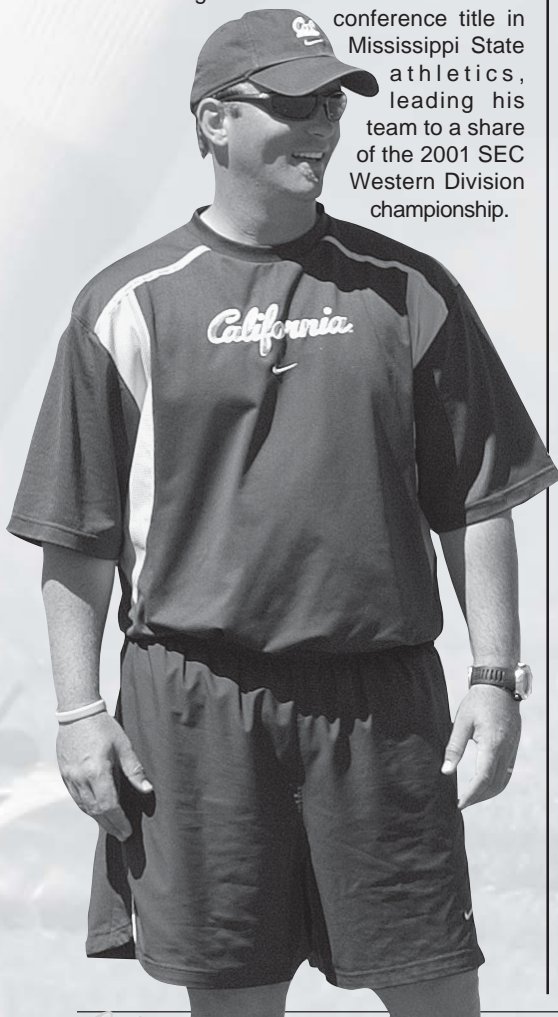
Neil McGuire, a regional under-19 coach who guided the Texas Tech program the past two seasons, joins the Golden Bears for his first season in 2007.



McGuire arrived in Berkeley with a proven track record of vast improvement at his two previous Division I stops. He served as head coach at Mississippi State from 2000-03, taking over a program that was just 4-16 the year before his arrival and, within two years, improved the Bulldogs' record by eight-and-a-half games.

McGuire averaged nine wins per season at MSU and established school records for overall wins and conference victories during the 2001 season. He was tabbed as the Southeastern Conference Coach of the Year when he guided the Bulldogs to the first-ever women's conference title in Mississippi State

athletics, leading his team to a share of the 2001 SEC Western Division championship.



McGuire then spent the 2004 season as an assistant at Texas, during which the Longhorns finished with a 15-7-2 overall record, placed third in the Big 12 Conference and notched a No. 16 national ranking.

In 2005, McGuire moved to Texas Tech as head coach and quickly proved his rebuilding skills again. The Red Raiders went from one-game winners in his first season to notch seven wins in 2006 – most for the program in seven years.

In addition to his collegiate experience, McGuire served as head coach of the Region 3 Under-19 team in 2002, 2004 and 2005.

McGuire's head coaching mark of 68-76-9 (.474) includes his time at Mississippi State and Iowa Central Community College, at which he was head coach from 1996-97. He also served as an assistant at Iowa State (1998) and Arizona State (1999).

A native of Edinburgh, Scotland, McGuire earned his associate's degree in physical education with an emphasis on coaching from Telford College in Edinburgh before relocating to the United States. Upon his arrival, McGuire attended Augusta State University (Ga.), at which, while earning a bachelor's degree in psychology, he was named first-team All-Peach Belt Athletic Conference four consecutive years.



He was also a three-time NSCAA all-region selection. McGuire earned his master's of education degree with an emphasis in sports administration in 2003.

McGuire's professional career includes time with the Falkirk Football Club in Scotland, the Des Moines Menace Professional Soccer Club and the Arizona Sahuaros Professional Soccer Club.

McGuire holds a United States Soccer Federation Class A license. He joins the University of California family with his wife, Jessica, daughter, Kelyn, and son, Ethan.

## ASSISTANT COACHES

## JENNIFER THOMAS

*Assistant Coach  
10th Season at Cal*

Jennifer Thomas, who anchored California's backline from 1982-85, enters her 10th season as an assistant coach for her alma mater.

Thomas is linked to Cal's recognition as a national soccer power and a consistent participant in the NCAA Tournament. During her tenure as an assistant, the Golden Bears have posted a record of 113-56-19 (.652), for an average of almost 13 wins per season, and have garnered eight postseason berths.

In 2005, the program advanced to the third round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1988, set a school record for goals-against average (0.47) and tied Cal bests for shutouts (14) and goals allowed (11). The 2000 team recorded a school-record 17 victories (17-3-1), and the 1998 squad was Pac-10 co-champions.

From 2001-02, Thomas also served as a sideline reporter and then as a color commentator for local broadcasts of the WUSA's San Jose CyberRays.

Before returning to Cal as a coach in 1998, Thomas spent the previous four years as the athletic director at Incline High School in Incline,



Nev., where she was responsible for coordinating and supervising the school's 31-sport interscholastic athletic department. While at Incline, she also acted as the soccer coordinator for the Nevada Interscholastic Athletic Association.

Prior to her duties as athletic director, Thomas founded and directed the FC Soccer Camps in Incline in 1993 and held that role until 2001. In addition to her own camp, she concurrently managed a similar camp in Incline, run by the American Youth Soccer Organization (AYSO).

Thomas brought five years of coaching experience with her to Cal. In addition to her duties as athletic director at Incline High, Thomas founded and coached the school's girls' varsity and junior varsity soccer teams. In 1997, she expanded her coaching responsibilities when she took over as head coach of the Sierra Nevada Soccer Club's under-19 girls' team. Thomas coached, administered and played on the Reno Rattlers in 1997.

Still an avid soccer player, she helped her over-30 club team to regional and national championships in 2003 and 2004.

An all-conference and all-region selection, Thomas graduated from Cal in 1986 with a bachelor's of arts degree in political economies of industrial societies. With Thomas patrolling the Bears' backline, they advanced to two NCAA Tournaments and made their first of three semifinal appearances in 1984. She earned a master's of arts degree in education from Stanford in 1991 and has a USSF "A" coaching license.

Originally from Portola Valley, Calif., Thomas and Rich Meyer reside in Berkeley with their son, Wyatt.

## BRIAN ZWASCHKA

*Assistant Coach  
First Season at Cal*

Brian Zwaschka, who served two seasons at Texas Tech under Neil McGuire, joins California as an assistant coach in 2007.

Prior to working for the Red Raiders in 2005 and 2006, Zwaschka was an assistant at Grand View College, an NAIA program in Des Moines, Iowa. In two seasons on the coaching staff at his alma mater, Zwaschka helped the Vikings to the national tournament, a No. 11 national ranking and two conference championships.

Prior to his stint at Grand View, Zwaschka was an assistant coach at Dowling High School in Des Moines, Iowa. Under his guidance, Dowling claimed the 2000 conference title.

Zwaschka was a player for Grand View from 1990-92, earning NAIA All-American and District 15 Player of the Year honors during his junior campaign. A three-year captain, he led the Vikings to district championships in 1990 and 1991, as well as the regional finals during the 1991 season. Zwaschka was also named to the NAIA all-conference first team and the academic all-conference team from 1990-92.

His most recent playing experience includes seven years with the USL's Des Moines Menace, which included time as a captain. He led the Menace to appearances in the final four in 1995 and the final three in 1998. He also played professionally in 1996 for the Connecticut Wolves, formerly of the A-league, where he was a Northwest Division champion.

In addition to the domestic game, Zwaschka gained significant playing experience on the international level in three countries. He spent one year with Hurlford United FC in Kilmarnock, Scotland, and a year with the Chelmsford City FC in Chelmsford, England. Zwaschka also played a year each with AS Saint-Leu VO 95, and AS Saint-Ouen L'Aumone in Paris, France.

Zwaschka's club experience includes time with the Iowa United Soccer Club (1997-98) and the Waukee Soccer Club (1995) as their head coach. He led the Iowa United Soccer Club to a state championship in 1998 and the Waukee Soccer Club to a gold medal at the Iowa Games.

Zwaschka is joined by his wife, Sara, their sons, Lochan and Jagozar, and their daughter, Bria.
