BERKELEY – With a program as steeped in history as the No. 16/22 California women's soccer team is, there are Golden Bear connections all over the world in collegiate and professional women's soccer. One of those connections comes to Edwards Stadium this weekend in San Francisco's assistant coach and former Bear Maite Zabala. Cal hosts USF on Friday, Sept. 17 at 1 p.m. and closes the weekend against Pacific on Sunday, Sept. 19 at 1 p.m., as well, at Edwards Stadium.

Zabala spent three years as an assistant coach with the Bears from 2004-06 after holding the volunteer assistant coach position from 2001-03 after graduating from Cal in 2001. With Zabala as a Cal player or coach, the Bears posted eight winning seasons and garnered seven NCAA Tournament bids, highlighted by a third-round appearance in 2005. As a student-athlete at Cal from 1997-00, Zabala emerged as the Bears' all-time leader for career shutouts with 26.5 and finished the 2000 season with the 10th-best goals-against average in the country at 0.64. All told, the Boise, Idaho, product recorded a .900 career GAA in 6,295 minutes of action. Zabala, who played professionally after Cal in the WUSA and the Spanish SuperLiga, garnered four All-Pac-10 honors, including first-team recognition as a sophomore and junior, and received the Bears' team MVP award during her final two campaigns. She led the Bears to three NCAA Tournament berths (1998, '99 and '00), the program's only Pac-10 title in 1998 and a school-record 17 wins in 2000.

Though San Francisco played two games at Edwards Stadium two weeks ago in the annual Cal Invitational, the Dons return to Berkeley to take on the Bears for the first time this season. The Bears own the series record with the Dons at 10-3-2 and won the last meeting, 4-0, in 2006. Hanna Haanes paces the Dons with four goals while Christina Moberg is close behind her with three scores and two assists to tie Haanes in points at eight. The Bears could see either Heather Haney (17 saves, 0.99 goals-allowed average) or Noelle Salter (eight stops, 1.67 GAA) in goal on Friday. The Dons are coached by fourth-year head coach Mark Carr, who led the Dons to a 7-7-5 record last season for the best finish the program has seen since 2004.

Cal brings a three-game winning streak against Pacific into this weekend with the Bears boasting the all-time record with UOP at 5-1-0. The Bears beat the Tigers, 3-0, in exhibition play to start the 2009 season, but have not met Pacific in an official capacity since 2005, which also saw a 3-0 Cal win on Sept. 14, 2005. Pacific defeated Hawaii, 1-0, in the Tigers' first game of the season – an opponent that Cal defeated, 8-1. Two weeks after the Bears tied in overtime, 0-0, with Santa Clara, Pacific lost to then-No. 9 SCU, 2-1, on Sept. 10.

Both the Dons and the Tigers will have their hands full with the Bears – who have scored four or more goals in each of their latest three contests. Cal outscored its past three opponents by a grand scoring margin of 18-2, including an 8-1 shellacking of Hawaii and last Sunday's 6-0 shutout over Long Beach State.

Leading the way is senior forward Alex Morgan, who will rejoin the U.S. senior national team in a few weeks. Morgan leads the country in scoring with her nine goals, averaging 1.5 scores and 3.17 points per game. Sophomore forward Lauren Battung leads the Bears with three assists. Cal has spread its 22 goals amongst nine scorers and its 14 assists across 10 Bears. Goalkeepers sophomore Lauren Hein and freshman Emily Kruger have split time in goal, producing a combined 0.78 goals-allowed average and two shutouts.

No. 14 Cal Opens 2010 Campaign With 2-1 Win Over LMU

BERKELEY - Whatever jitters the No. 14 California women's soccer team had at the beginning of its 2010 season opener, they did not last very long. The Golden Bears scored in the seventh minute and then took a 2-0 lead in the second thanks to an own goal by Loyola Marymount to defeat the Lions, 2-1.

"I thought we did very well," Cal head coach Neil McGuire said. "I think that we controlled the game for large parts of it. Obviously there is some nervousness, especially with the younger players, but I thought they all did extremely well."

The Bears established the tone of the match with a goal at 6:04. Sophomore forward/midfielder Lauren Battung passed to junior Miranda White, who chipped it in from the right side of the box for Cal's first goal of the season. The scoreboard remained stagnant, displaying the 1-0 Cal lead for a full 67 minutes, until 73:08, when the ball finally made its way pasts the posts again. Freshman Mekenna DeBack took her first shot of her Cal career at 72:41, but a LMU defender blocked it and the Bears earned a corner kick. Senior co-captain Emily Shibata took the corner from the far side and crossed it perfectly into the box. After a scuffle, a LMU player pushed the ball into the net to distance the Bears, 2-0, thanks to the own goal.

Not to be shut out, the Lions made things interesting in the 86th minute when Nickey Ha took a shot to the back left corner. Cal freshman keeper Emily Kruger tried to fall on it but it had crossed the line for a LMU score, bringing the count to 2-1, still in the Bears' favor. The Cal defense held steady in the last four minutes and helped secure the final 2-1 decision for the Bears. In what were mirror halves statistically speaking, the Bears took six shots and three corner kicks in both the first and second of the game. The Lions found themselves outshot by a margin of seven at 12-5, which is characteristic for McGuire's squad.

Although the Bears defeated Fresno State, 2-1, in exhibition play last week, this was the first official game for Cal's bevy of freshmen. Getting time on the field were freshmen Emi Lawson, who was the only freshman to start and play all 90 minutes, Emily Kruger, Bronwyn Studman, Kaitlyn Fitzpatrick, Kate Bennett, Grace Leer, DeBack and Rachel Mercik.

BERKELEY - In a testament to the adage of "there are no easy games," the No. 14 California women's soccer team and UC Irvine played to the maximum level for 110 minutes only to end in a 2-2 tie on Sunday afternoon at Edwards Stadium. The Golden Bears (1-0-1) took a 2-1 lead in the first half before the Anteaters (1-0-1) scored in the 89th minute to force overtime, in which neither team scored.

"There is no question that UC Irvine deserves tremendous credit," Cal head coach Neil McGuire said. "It was very difficult for us to play any high-tempo soccer because they took us out of our rhythm with their pressure. We're disappointed with the score and the result, but we're certainly not disappointed with our team's effort."

Irvine's second game-tying goal came at 88:14 when Courtney Goodson took a direct free kick and bent the ball around the Cal wall to knot the game, 2-2. The Bears registered two shots in the first overtime period and three in the second compared to Irvine's two, both of which came in the second, but neither team found the back of the net. Both the Bears and Anteaters now stand at 1-0-1 overall after the first weekend of play.

Cal got on the board in the 18th minute thanks to Alex Morgan after freshman Grace Leer passed her the ball. Morgan drew the keeper out, beat her to Morgan's right and then put the ball straight into the back of the net. From there, Irvine's Lexi Kopf was the next to score and tie the score for the first time, when she shot on an empty goal in the 34th minute. Shortly thereafter, the Bears proved yet another axiom true in that the five minutes following a score, the team that just scored is at its weakest. Just under three minutes after the Anteater goal, the Bears scored. Cal earned a corner, which Emily Shibata took but Irvine cleared. Shibata regained control of the rebound and served it in to the left. Morgan took two touches and sent it into the bottom right corner to put the Bears back in the lead, 2-1.

Morgan paced the Bears with two goals with Leer and Shibata assisting. Morgan led both sides with 10 shots, six of which were on goal. For Irvine, Nikki Forrest took three shots while goalie Danielle de Seriere made eight stops and allowed two goals.

BERKELEY - The No. 18/25 California women's soccer team and No. 8/10 Santa Clara added more fuel to their already heated Bay Area rivalry with a 0-0 double-overtime draw on Aug. 27 at Edwards Stadium. The Golden Bears (1-0-2) out shot the Broncos (2-0-1), 18-5, in front of a season-high 407 fans.

"Santa Clara came out with a plan to try to thwart our attack and gave us very little space in the back," Cal head coach Neil McGuire said. "Our players were very patient but they were also very diligent in the way that they tried to attack. I'm very, very proud of them."

The game had the same ending in terms of records to the 1-1 double overtime draw between the Broncos and Bears last season. However, in the 2010 rematch, the Bears' 13-shot margin reflects a much different match than when the Broncos out shot Cal, 14-11, last season. Senior forward Alex Morgan had a match-high seven shots, taking three on goal. For Santa Clara, Sarah Jackson had the squad best of three. The match saw the referee issue four yellow cards, three of which were on Broncos.

Freshman keeper Emily Kruger played all 110 minutes in goal, making her first collegiate. Kruger was credited with three saves, but those numbers are not indicative of how instrumental Kruger was in stopping the Bronco offensive attacks. Friday's game represented the first ranked opposition for the Bears in 2010.

There was a clear momentum shift towards the end of the first half. With 6:28 remaining on the clock, Danielle Brunache fired off a shot that Santa Clara keeper Bianca Henninger was able to punch out, awarding Cal a corner kick. Senior co-captain Emily Shibata took the corner, crossing it into Megan Jesolva, who shot it wide right.

The Bears had the final play of the first half when Morgan fired one into the goal with 1:43 left, but Henninger was there to make the save, diving to the right. The pass to Morgan came off a dynamic break from freshman Grace Leer to Hassett to Morgan. In the first overtime period, the Bears retained control for the majority of the 10 minutes. From 3:33-2:15, Cal took two shots and one corner. Morgan had the last look of the game in the 109th minute with a shot that missed wide. In the second overtime period, the Bears had two shots to Santa Clara's nil.

BERKELEY - After two double-overtime draws, No. 21/19 California inundated Rice with a 4-1 final score. Senior forward Alex Morgan had two goals while sophomore forward/midfielder Lauren Battung handled a penalty kick and the Owls had an own goal to account for the Golden Bears' four goals.

The first goal of the game came at 4:16, which is the earliest Cal had gotten on the board in the 2010 season. Megan Jesolva took a corner and crossed it perfectly into the goal mouth, where there was a scrum and the Owl goalkeeper Meghan Erkel accidentally kicked it in for an own Owl goal.

Roughly four minutes later Battung was fouled in the box, earning the Bears a penalty kick. Battung stepped up and absolutely fooled Erkel in goal. Battung shot to her right and the goalkeeper's left. Erkel did not attempt so much as a dive for it, and the Bears took a 2-0 lead with not even 10 minutes expired on the clock. In the 11th minute, the referee handed out the first of three yellow cards in the game, this one going to Rice's Hayley Williams. After 28 scoreless minutes, Rice poked one through. Korey Taylor took a left-footed shot to the left side of the net with Jordan McCray getting the assist credit. The Bears took a 3-1 lead into the locker room at halftime, outshooting the Owls, 8-1, in the first 45.

Cal added another two points in the 85 minute. Freshman Genessee Daughetee, who made her first start as a Golden Bear, crossed the ball into Morgan, near the top of the box. Morgan took her sixth and final shot of the game and was rewarded with a goal, upping Cal's differential to 4-1.

Junior midfielder Katrin Omarsdottir, who plays for the Icelandic national team, made her triumphant return to the pitch for the first time in 2010. After Morgan had a dangerous cross into her, Omarsdottir had a near shot after she juked her Owl defender by Erkel came out and fell on the ball. Overall, Morgan paced the Bears with six shots and two goals.

BERKELEY - The No. 21/19 California women's soccer team gave Hawaii a taste of the Golden State with an 8-1 victory over the Rainbow Wahine. Senior forward Alex Morgan netted a hat trick, bringing her weekend total to five goals. The Golden Bears, who also got goals from Lauren Battung, Katie Benz, Katie Suits, Mekenna DeBack and Kate Bennett, now stand at 3-0-2 overall while Hawaii is 2-4-0. Cal outshot Hawaii, 21-9, bolstered by a 13-shot second half. The match concluded the Cal Invitational, which saw the Bears be the only team to finish 2-0.

"We were better in possession than we've been in terms of - once we win the ball, can we keep possession and break down the opponent's team," Cal head coach Neil McGuire said. "We had to have more killer instinct, and I think we did have that today."

The Bears scored in the 24th minute when Morgan beat out three defenders. It was then Battung's turn at 36:49 with a shot to the back-left corner. That goal proved to be the ultimate gamewinner for Hawaii score with 2:11 to play in the first half. BERKELEY - Though the No. 19/18 California women's soccer team was not the first ranked opposition of the year for unranked Long Beach State, the Golden Bears proved too much for the 49ers to handle. Sunday morning saw Cal handout a lesson in the power of the Pac-10 with a 6-0 win over Long Beach State at Edwards Stadium. Senior forward Alex Morgan led the Bears (4-0-2) with two goals, her eighth and ninth of the season, to victory over Long Beach State (4-3-1).

"I think our intensity was very, very good from the start of the game to the end," Cal head coach Neil McGuire said. "No matter who was on the field, we played within our system. By doing that, we earned the shutout. The amount of goals scored is exciting for the players."

The Bears rained six goals and 19 shots over the Beach to take the nonconference victory, which was the third consecutive time the Bears scored more than four or more goals. Cal got goals from four different players - Morgan, freshman forward Rachel Mercik, sophomore defender Rachel Clark and freshman forward Mekenna DeBack - as well as a LBSU own goal.

For the first two goals of the game - Morgan and Mercik teamed up for two scores in the span of roughly eight minutes. Cal took a 2-0 lead into the halftime break, outshooting the Beach, 9-4, at the conclusion of the first 45. Thirty-one seconds into the second half, the Bears upped their lead to 3-0. Sophomore forward/midfielder Lauren Battung passed to Morgan, who dribbled around the defender and shot the ball into the right corner.

Long Beach State did nothing to help its own cause in the 48th minute, but rather increased Cal's lead to four with an own goal. After the fourth goal of the game, the Bear offense was silent for approximately 32 minutes, until Rachel Clark scored after Kate Bennett crossed ball to her on a corner. To close the game, Fitzpatrick assisted with 4:56 minutes remaining on the clock, crossing it into DeBack. DeBack, who played 23 minutes, shot it to the right side for her second goal of her Cal career.
