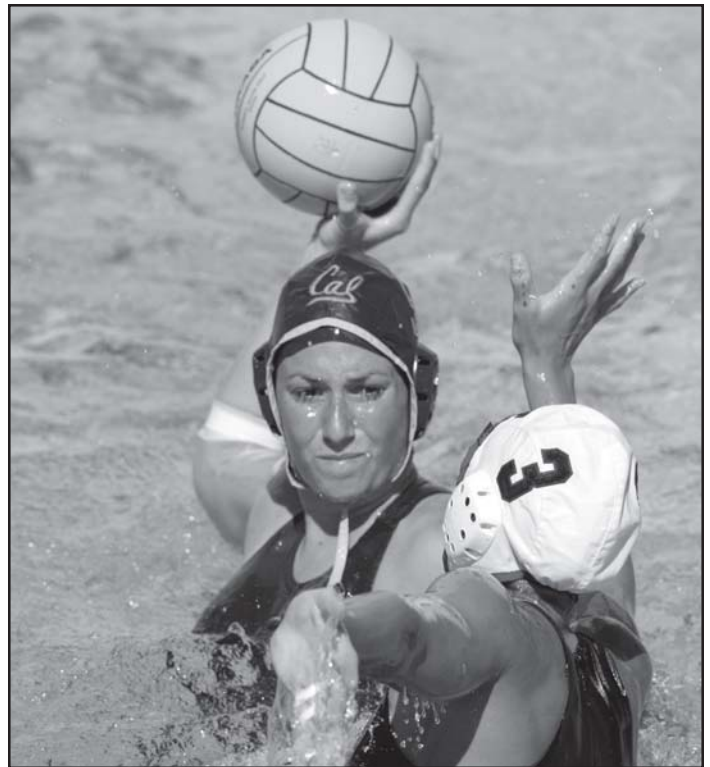

## PROSPECTS LOOK GOOD FOR 2006 GOLDEN BEARS

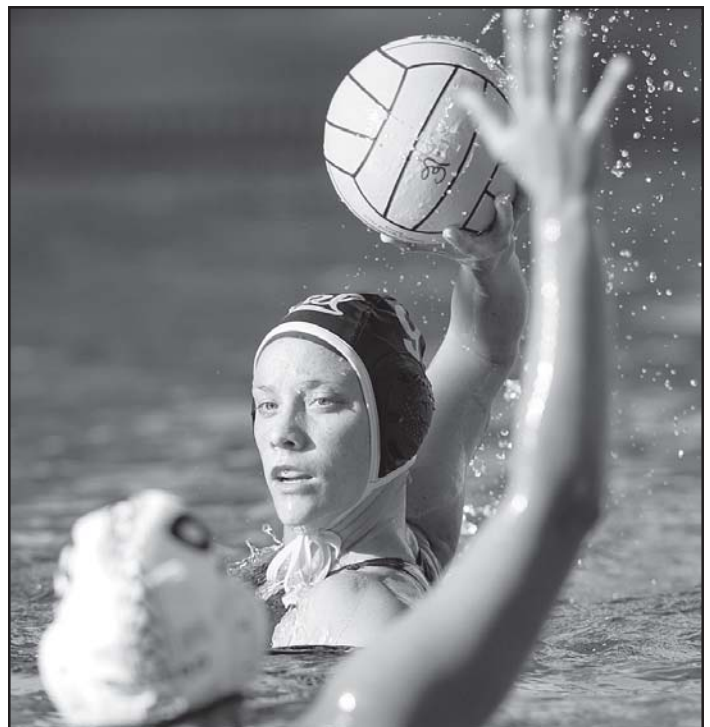
**F**eature a new coach with an Olympic attitude, combined with an experienced senior class and a pair of returning All-Americans, and the prospects for the 2006 California women's water polo team definitely start to look good.

The Golden Bears will be striving for a spot in this year's eight-team NCAA Tournament and have brought in former United States men's Olympic coach **Richard Corso** to help Cal vie for a position among the nation's elite. With a wealth of experience at the highest levels of national and international water polo, Corso will be cultivating the senior class of **Allison Gold, Katie Card, Breana Allison, Brittani Llorente, Lauren McGee and Holly Farlin** – plus junior All-American **Elsie Windes** and the rest of an eager young Bear squad that is ready to flourish under the direction of a world-class coach.

"I think it will be important for our team to take on the sport as an academic discipline," explained Corso. "The key for us will be tactics, technique, fitness and psychological preparation. Our players need to learn how to be students of the game. If we can do that, we will put ourselves in a position to qualify for the NCAAs and earn a medal."

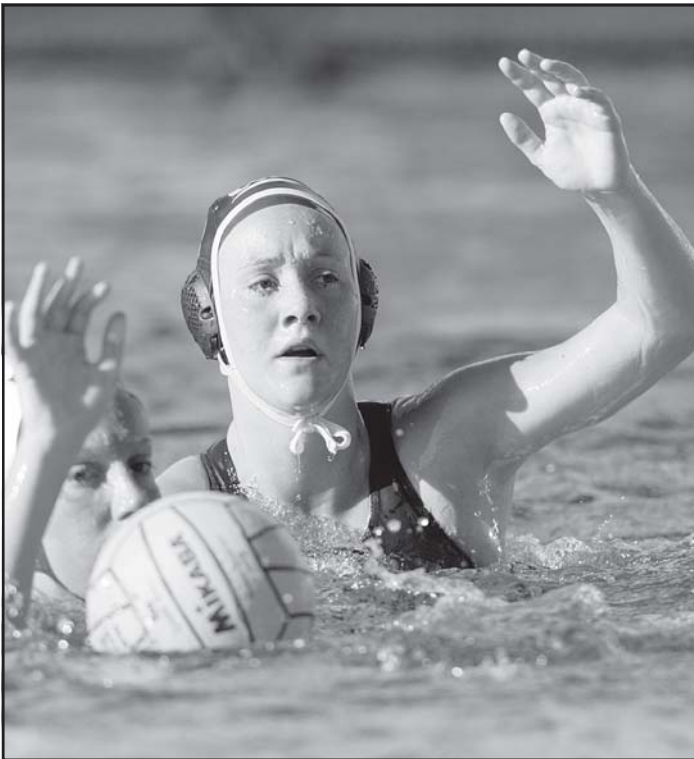
An honorable mention All-America last year after a stellar performance during the MPSF Tournament, Gold led the Bears with nine goals in the four tournament matches at Spieker Aquatics Complex. An outstanding outside shooter, she was second on the team in scoring last season with 44 goals and was Cal's leading scorer in 10 of 28 matches. Gold enters her final year with 92 career goals.

Card is another talented driver who is a strong offensive player and one

of the team's top swimmers on the counterattack. She scored 17 goals as a sophomore, 11 goals last season and 12 goals in six exhibition matches against Canada in January. Allison is considered a top two-meter defender

and netted 17 goals as a sophomore and eight goals last season, including goals against San Jose State and Long Beach State in the MPSF Tournament. Llorente is a talented offensive player as well, scoring 21 goals as a junior with four goals in the MPSF Tournament. McGee is one of Cal's top offensive threats at two-meters, finishing last season fourth on the team with 22 goals, while Farlin possesses a strong left-handed outside shot, scoring eight goals against Canada, and is the team's fastest swimmer on the counterattack.

Undoubtedly the Bears' most decorated player is Windes, a two-time All-American and a member of the USA Senior National Team. She led Cal in scoring with 51 goals last season, earning third-team All-America, second-team All-MPSF and MPSF All-Tournament honors. Windes recorded five goals during the MPSF Tournament, including a pair of goals in the fifth-place victory over Long Beach State. As a freshman, she earned honorable mention All-America accolades – Cal's first freshman to ever be selected as an honorable mention All-American – as well as second-team All-MPSF honors, and was a member of the MPSF All-Freshman Team. Windes has already tallied 84 goals in two seasons.

Sophomores **Vanessa Lindsey** and **Molly Hayes** will be counted on for continued production after scoring 12 and 11 goals, respectively, last year as true freshmen. Lindsey is one of the Bears' most improve players offensively at two-meters, while Hayes is a top offensive driver. Fellow sophomores **Katya Eadington** and **Rebecca Dreyfuss** and redshirt freshman **Paige Lorenz** will also be in the running for increased playing time this season.

Defending the goal for Cal this year will be 6-3 sophomore **Heather Stuart**, who competed in nine matches last season as a true freshman, recording 36 saves. Stuart has taken over the Bears' full-time goalie duties and has thrived, impressing the Cal coaching staff with her improvement in all aspects of her game. The Bears have an impressive back-up at goalie in true freshman **Lauren Burke**, who was an All-CIF goalie at Los Alamitos High School and is a member of the USA Junior National Team.

Cal has a pair of true freshmen field players who already have shown they are ready to be immediate contributors. Two-meter standout **Stephanie Schnugg** has performed well in early season competition. A member of the USA Junior National Team, Schnugg is the daughter of Peter Schnugg, who was a standout water polo player at Cal, leading the Bears to the 1973 national title and earning All-America and NCAA Player of the Year honors. Two-meter defender **Melissa Wheeler** is the Bears' other top newcomer, tallying 11 goals in six exhibition matches against Canada and providing speed on the counterattack.

"Every time the team comes to the pool they are improving," said Corso. "This group is working real hard. We are not talking about being good this season – we are talking about being great. We are looking to overachieve."

# CAL COACHING STAFF

## RICHARD CORSO

*Head Coach  
First Year*



One of the most highly respected and successful water polo coaches in the world has now joined the Golden Bear family.

Richard Corso, who has served as head coach for both the United States Men's Olympic Team and the Canadian Men's National Team, was

selected in August to be the new mentor for the University of California women's water polo program. Corso not only brings with him a superior knowledge of the sport of water polo, he possesses a competitive attitude that is sure to get the most out of his student-athletes.

"The opportunity to coach at the world's premier public university, and to work with student-athletes that are ranked in the top 10 of all Division I schools is an Olympic coach's dream," said Corso. "Cal's teams foster a special culture that values academics and athletic success."

One of water polo's most innovative thinkers in terms of training and match tactics, Corso's creed is defensive, attacking water polo. He served

as the United States Men's Olympic Team head coach from 1992 to 1996, leading the United States to a seventh-place finish at the 1996 games in Atlanta and a gold medal at the 1995 Pan American Games. The 1996 Olympic team included current Cal men's coach Kirk Everist, plus other former Bear standouts Gavin Arroyo, Troy Barnhart, Chris Humbert and Chris Oeding.

Prior to assuming his role with Team USA, Corso served as head coach of the Canadian National Team, which finished fourth at the 1991 Pan American Games. He also gained international experience as the head coach of the USA National Junior Team (1984 to 1988), and as goalkeeper coach for the 1984 silver medal-winning and 2004 Olympic teams.

Most recently, Corso had served as head of the Harvard-Westlake School Aquatic Program in Los Angeles from 1986 through 2005. In that role, he was responsible for virtually all aspects of the

nation's premier high school squad. Since 1986, Harvard-Westlake water polo teams had combined to win 40 league championships, two CIF titles and seven CIF silver medals. Additionally, 82 Harvard-Westlake student-athletes were named to All-America squads. Corso was named CIF Coach of the Year four times and California Coach of the Year in 1992. He also served as Harvard-Westlake's Associate Director of Admissions.

"We are ecstatic to have attracted an individual of Rich's talent and accomplishments," said Cal Athletic Director Sandy Barbour. "He has a tremendous record of success at the highest levels of the sport. He also truly understands our mission at Cal. I am confident that our women's water polo program will now take its place among our menu of successful intercollegiate athletic programs."

Corso began his head coaching career at Yale, where he led a club-varsity squad, and had previous coaching stops at UCLA, where he was assistant men's swimming and water polo coach, and at Stanford. During his 10 years at UCLA, Corso helped the men's swim team to an NCAA runner-up finish in 1981 and an NCAA title in 1982, and an NCAA runner-up finish in men's water polo in 1979.

Taking over as the United States National Team coach following the 1992 Olympics, Corso inherited a squad that had lost eight of 13 members. He brought a new level of collaboration with the United States Olympic Committee to the sport, and emphasized the importance of sport science,

sports psychology and computer-video tape analysis that was demonstrated to all of the USA water polo coaches. Corso led his 1996 Olympic team to within one goal of the medal round in Atlanta, losing to gold-medalist Spain. His energy, preparation, commitment and professionalism will have a lasting influence on American water polo for years to come.

A native of Queens, New York, Corso swam and played water polo at Southern Connecticut University, earning a bachelor's degree in physical education in 1977. He then completed his master's in kinesiology at Cal State Northridge in 1982, and earned a second master's degree in coaching science from Moscow State University in 1999. Corso and his wife, Catherine, have two children, daughters Meredith and Meghan.



## SERELA KAY

*Assistant Coach  
First Year*



Serela Kay, a former standout collegiate women's water polo player, and assistant coach for USA Water Polo's Future's National Team, is in her first season as an assistant women's water polo coach for the University of California.

Kay, 27, comes to Berkeley with 17 years of water polo experience, both as a player and a coach. With the USWP Future's National Team, she is responsible for implementing the selection process that whittled 150 athletes down to a 40-member team in preparation for international competition, and ultimately the development of future Senior National Team players.

Prior to working with USA Water Polo, Kay was the director and senior head coach of the Santa Barbara Water Polo Foundation from September 2004-August 2005. She was also an assistant men's and women's water polo coach at Princeton from July 2002 through August 2004, and was named USA Water Polo Women's Elite Northeast Zone Coach of the Year in 2003.

As an athlete, Kay was a four-year starter and team captain as a senior, leading UCLA to National Collegiate titles in 1997, 1998 and 2000. She was a member of the USA Junior National Team from 1995-97 as well, helping Team USA to a gold medal at the 1996 Junior Pan American Games in Havana, Cuba.

Kay graduated from UCLA in 2000 with a degree in psychology, with a specialization in business and administration. She received a Master of Sport Science in Sport Management degree from the United States Sports Academy in 2004.

## MELANIE vonHARTITZSCH

*Volunteer Assistant Coach  
First Year*



Former Cal water polo standout Melanie vonHartzsch begins her first season as a volunteer assistant coach for the Golden Bears after serving as the team's assistant coach in 2002. Bringing a wealth of experience to the Cal program after competing for the Bears from their

inaugural varsity water polo season in 1996 to 1999, vonHartzsch helped Cal to three national runner-up finishes and a combined 117-27 record (.813) as a player.

A three-year team captain in water polo, vonHartzsch was also a three-time All-MPSF selection, and a second-team All-American and team MVP as a senior in 1999. She finished her Cal career with 113 goals and was a member of the Bears' water polo club team that won the Senior National Championship in the summer of 1998. As a freshman, vonHartzsch began her Cal athletic career as a member of the women's swim team, before switching over to water polo.

vonHartzsch was the head girl's water polo coach at Miramonte High School in Moraga, Calif. in 2001 and 2002, and was the coach of the Golden Bear Water Polo Club in the summer of 2001.

After earning her undergraduate degree in interdepartmental studies, with a focus in human motivation, in 1999, vonHartzsch went on to earn a Master's degree from the Cal School of Education in a program called Athletes and Academic Achievement. While completing her Master's, vonHartzsch also worked for the Cal Athletic Study Center until May of 2002.

Freas. Folker, from Pietermaritzburg, South Africa, competed for South Africa's national team in several world-class events such as the 2000 Olympic Games, 1999 World University Games, 2001 World Championships and 2001 Goodwill Games (World All-Star Team). With the Golden Bears, Folker's duties include overseeing the team's weight and dryland programs, as well as guiding the team in its nutritional requirements.

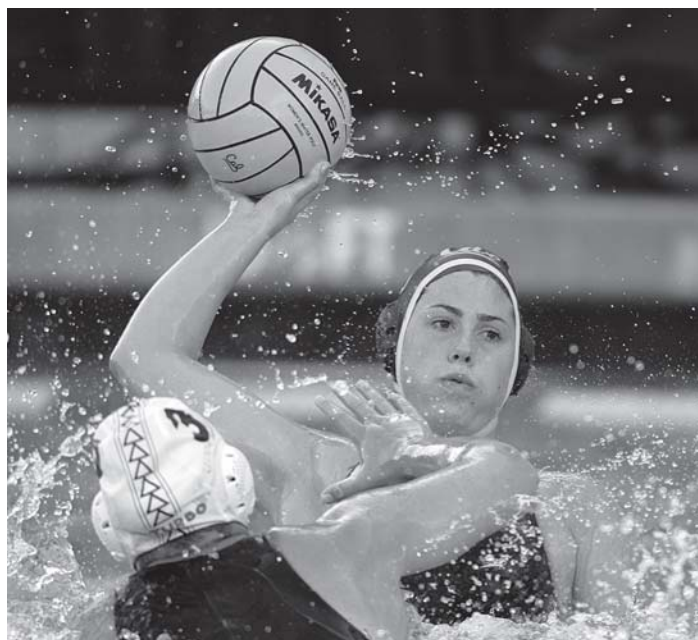
