



## CCHA ESSENTIAL – "Need to know" items from this week in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association.

**Alaska Fairbanks-** The Nanooks won their fifth straight Governor's Cup, and eighth title in 13 years, with a 3-0 shutout of Alaska Anchorage on New Year's Eve. They won three of the four meetings against their in-state rivals this season.

**Bowling Green-** The Falcons defeated UMass, 3-2, and the host Huskies, 9-2, to capture the Toyota UConn Classic with sophomore forward Alex Foster earning MVP honors and senior goalie Jon Horrell and sophomores Jonathan Matsumoto and Mike Nesdill named to the all-tournament team.

**Ferris State-** The Bulldogs were denied the chance to win a third straight holiday tournament title when they were beaten in a shootout by No. 4 Boston College after a 3-3 tie at the Denver Cup. They defeated the host Pioneers, 3-2, in the third-place game.

**Lake Superior-** The Lakers went undefeated in regular-season, non-conference play with a 4-0-2 record. Their remaining 14 games in January and February are all against conference opponents, starting with a visit to Sault Ste. Marie this weekend by Western Michigan.

**Miami-** With a shootout victory over Ohio State in the final of the Ohio Hockey Classic, Miami took home just its second holiday tournament title and first since the 1997 Denver Cup, when the Red-Hawks downed Denver and New Hampshire.

**Michigan-** The Wolverines won a game for the first time this season when trailing after two periods in their 5-3 victory over Michigan Tech on Dec. 30. Trailing 3-2 after two periods, U-M scored three times in the final stanza. Michigan is 1-5-0 when down after two periods.

**Michigan State-** Senior forward Colton Fretter's goal against Michigan Tech in the semifinals of the Great Lake Invitational capped a run of three straight overtime wins by the Spartans in the tournament. Fretter notched a championship-clinching goal in overtime against Michigan last season after (then) captain Jim Slater had scored in an extra session against New Hampshire.

**Nebraska-Omaha-** Sophomore forward Bryan Marshall provided New Year's Eve heroics for the Mavericks by scoring with 34 seconds left in regulation time, and again just 19 seconds into overtime, to give them a 3-2 win over Yale of the ECAC Hockey League.

**Northern Michigan-** The Wildcats advanced to the championship game of the Badger Showdown for a fourth time, and suffered their fourth straight loss to the host team in the final as Wisconsin beat them, 5-1.

**Notre Dame-** Notre Dame finished the first half with more overall wins (6) and CCHA wins (4) than the Irish had all last season. After 18 games this season, the Irish are 6-11-1. They were 4-10-4 after 18 games last season.

**Ohio State-** The Buckeyes, for a second-straight year, finished second in the Ohio Hockey Classic, by virtue of a shootout loss to the second-ranked team in the country. Miami won the penalty-shot competition against the Buckeyes this year after Colorado College did so last season.

**Western Michigan-** The Broncos begin the second half of its season with a tough slate of conference games. They encounter third place Lake Superior State, frontrunner Miami and second place Michigan in the coming weeks. In addition, six of the next nine games will be played on the road.

**CCHA -** The conference needs a little help but still has a chance to win the Commissioners' Cup title with one game remaining and a 5-4-1 record. Northern Michigan can put the CCHA into the lead with a win over Wayne State in Marquette, Mich., on Feb. 4. A win by UConn of the AHA over Yale of the ECAC Hockey League the next day would then be required for the CCHA to claim the Commissioners' Cup in the second year of competition.

### Offensive

**Bill Thomas, UNO So., F (Pittsburgh, PA)**

Thomas had 3-2-5 in an 8-5 win over Alabama-Huntsville before setting up extra-attacker and overtime goals in a 3-2 decision over Yale.



### Defenseman

**Matt Waddell, OSU Jr., (Armstrong, BC)**

Waddell (2-1-3, +1) had a goal and an assist in a 4-0 win over Holy Cross and scored the Buckeyes' goal in a 1-1 tie with Miami at the Ohio Hockey Classic.



### Goaltender

**Jon Horrell, BGSU Sr., (Beckenham, England)**

Horrell blocked 70-of-74 shots (.946), including 40 in a 3-2 win over UMass, and was named to the all-tournament team as the Falcons won the UConn Classic.



### Rookie

**Brandon Svendsen, BGSU F (Roseville, MN)**

Svendsen had an assist in a 3-2 win over UMass and then scored the winning goal to go with another helper, while registering 11 shots on goal, in a 9-2 win over the host team in the UConn Classic final.

**Derek MacIntyre, FSU, SO, G (Stanwood, MI):** MacIntyre blocked 67-of-72 shots (.931) in a tie against Boston College and win over the host team at the Denver Cup.

**Wylie Rogers, UAF, SO, G (Fairbanks, AK):** Rogers stopped 59-of-61 shots (.967) and recorded his second career shutout in a pair of Governor's Cup victories over UAA.

**Scott Parse, UNO, JR, F (Portage, MI):** Parse, who leads the nation in points-per game average, had a goal and six assists in wins over Alabama-Huntsville and Yale.

**Jeff Zatkoff, MIA, FR, G (Chesterfield, MI):** Zatkoff ran his unbeaten streak to five games (4-0-1) with 32 saves, and another three shootout stops, in the Ohio Hockey Classic final.

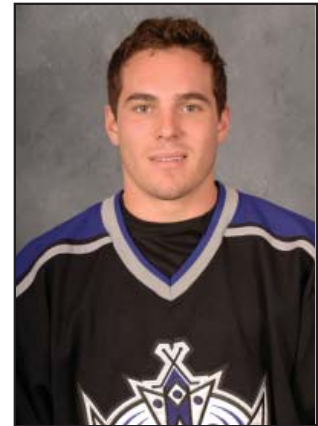

He followed that effort up with a goal in a 5-3 win over Colorado on Dec. 28 and a three-point performance, 1-2-3, against Phoenix on Dec. 29. Cammalleri was held off the scoreboard during the Kings' 3-2 win over Dallas on New Year's Eve, snapping his five-game goal streak. He is tied for fourth in scoring for the Kings, with 15 goals and 13 assists in 39 games this season. Donning the Maize and Blue from 1999-2002, Cammalleri posted 65 goals and 65 assists in 109 games.

### ALASKA FAIRBANKS

*"Anytime you do something five times in a row, it's pretty special." - UAF tri-captain Curtis Fraser on winning the Governor's Cup.*

- With 4-2 and 3-0 victories over Alaska Anchorage to win the Governor's Cup, UAF managed its first series and home-ice sweeps of the season.
- The Nanooks last series sweep in the regular season was over Michigan State on Feb. 11-12 last season. UAF's last sweep against UAA was on March 7-8, 2003 in Fairbanks, when UAF won 6-4 and 5-0.
- SO G Wylie Rogers earned his second career shutout over the Seawolves and is now 5-1-1 against UAA. He also boasts a 1.27 goals-against average and .954 saves percentage through seven games against the Seawolves.
- The 3-0 shutout marked the third time in four years that the Nanooks had kept the Seawolves scoreless in one of the four Governor's Cup series games.

Michigan returned to form the next night, however, going 2-for-7 with the man advantage versus Michigan Tech. U-M has multiple power-play goals in nine of 19 games. - UNO extended its winning streak at home to four games with a pair of non-conference victories last week. The Mavs are 6-1-0 this season outside of the CCHA with its only loss coming to Minnesota State, Mankato, who UNO meets on Tuesday.
- JR F Scott Parse tied a school record with five points (1-4-5) in last Thursday's win and leads the nation in scoring with 1.89 points per game. Parse's linemate, SO F Bill Thomas, is ranked sixth in NCAA scoring with 17-14-31.
- SO F Bryan Marshall has a flare for the dramatic. He now has tallied three game-tying goals with less than a minute to play in regulation time that have forced overtime over the last two seasons. His game-winning tally in overtime against Yale gives him six game-winners for his career.
- SR F and captain Mike Lefley returned to the lineup from injury for the first time since November 22 and scored his first goal of the season against Alabama-Huntsville.
- The Mavs tied a school record with eight goals in the game against Alabama-Huntsville. It was the most goals for UNO since February 19, 1999 against Bemidji State. UNO is tied for second in NCAA scoring with Michigan, averaging 3.95 goals per game.

- Colorado College struck for four power-play goals in a 6-3 win over the Spartans in the championship game of the Great Lakes Invitational. The last time Michigan State allowed four power-play tallies was a 6-5 overtime loss to Boston College in an NCAA West Regional game on Mar. 24, 2000. The Eagles netted five power-play goals and a shorthanded tally in that game, which also marked the last time the Spartans had allowed five or more special teams goals in a single game. MSU had not surrendered six goals in a GLI contest since a 6-1 loss to Boston University on Dec. 28, 2003.
- The Spartans fired 24 first-period shots in Thursday's 3-2 overtime victory against Michigan Tech at the GLI. The last time MSU had more than 20 shots in a single period was Feb. 11, 2005, when it sent 21 shots on goal in the third period of a 6-5 overtime loss at Alaska Fairbanks. MSU ended regulation with 48 shots and finished the game with 60 total, a season-high for a single game. MTU FR G Michael-Lee Teslak made a tournament record 57 saves. The previous tournament record was 46 saves by Colgate University's Geoff McMullen in 1970.
- SR F Colton Fretter's overtime winner against the Huskies was his second in as many games at the GLI. Fretter scored the overtime tally in Michigan State's 2-1 win over Michigan in last year's championship game after Jim Slater had scored in OT against New Hampshire in the semifinals. Fretter leads the Spartans with two game-winning goals. Six other players have single game winners for MSU this season.

• The Falcons captured the Toyota UConn Holiday Classic in Storrs, Conn., with a 3-2 victory over UMass in the semifinal and a 9-2 victory over the Huskies in the championship match. BGSU had four of the six players on the all-tournament team with SO F Alex Foster (MVP), SR G Jon Horrell, SO F Jonathan Matsumoto, and SO D Mike Nesdill all receiving tournament honors.

• The Brown and Orange are currently on a three-game win streak and have won four of their last five. In that span the Falcons are averaging 5.2 goals, while giving up just 3.2 tallies in the last five games. They have also scored nine power-play goals in their last 27 chances (.333).

• Nine different Falcons recorded goals and 13 different players picked up at least one point in the title game against the host Huskies.

The last time the Red and White went 10 games without suffering a loss was during the 1993-94 season. Miami went 10-0-0 from Jan. 7-Feb. 5 before suffering a 4-3 loss to Illinois-Chicago on Feb. 11.

• SO G Charlie Effinger extended his personal unbeaten streak to 12 games when Miami downed Rensselaer 3-2 in overtime at the Ohio Hockey Classic. He is 10-0-2 since beating Michigan State 4-1 on Jan. 8 of last season for his first collegiate victory. This season, Effinger is 6-0-2 with a 1.46 goals-against average and .944 save percentage. He ranks third in the nation in GAA and second in save percentage.

• Miami's win over Rensselaer gave head coach Enrico Blasi the 117th victory of his career. He needs just five more wins to surpass Steve Cady and become the winningest coach in Miami hockey history. Cady won 121 games in seven seasons at Miami.

• A pair of Miami freshmen recorded career firsts in Miami's 3-2 overtime victory over Rensselaer. Bill Loupee scored the first goal of his collegiate career to give Miami a 1-0 lead, while Alexandre Lacombe, appearing in his first game as a RedHawk, registered the first point of his career, assisting on Brad Robbins' first goal of the year.

### UNO pulls out last minute win against Yale

**At Farmington Hills, Mich.** - Alaska Fairbanks blanked Alaska Anchorage, 3-0, to capture the Governor's Cup for a fifth straight year and Nebraska-Omaha used last-minute and overtime heroics from Bryan Marshall to beat Yale, 3-2, in New Year's Eve non-conference action in the CCHA.
