CCHA ESSENTIAL - "Need to know" items from this week in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association.

Alaska Fairbanks- The Nanooks continue their 14-day road trip with a Friday-Saturday night series at Michigan's Yost Ice Arena, where they are 2-14-0 since first playing the Wolverines there on Feb. 13, 1987.

Bowling Green- Led by 1-3-4 from both Alex Foster and Jonathan Matsumoto, freshmen were responsible for 14 of the 36 offensive points generated by the Falcons in a home-ice sweep of Alaska Fairbanks that gives them 10 wins in the fewest number of games since the 1995-96 campaign.

Ferris State- Junior defenseman Andrew Winnik's overtime goal on Saturday snapped a 10-game losing streak for the Bulldogs at Columbus, Ohio, that dated back to Nov. 18, 1995 and also halted the Buckeyes 13-game winning streak at Value City Arena that included an 8-0-0 mark this season.

Lake Superior- The Lakers' three-point weekend performance against visiting Notre Dame included a 2-1 overtime victory on Saturday that featured a 41-save performance from sophomore Jeff Jakaitis, the tying goal with 28 seconds left in regulation time from sophomore Matt Restoule and the winner from sophomore Jeff Rainville just 56 seconds into the extra session.

Miami- Freshman goalie Charlie Effinger started both games against visiting Michigan State and blocked 60-of-65 shots on the weekend while earning his first collegiate victory in Saturday's 4-1 decision with a 34-save, Perani Cup first-star effort.

Michigan- The Wolverines scored a dozen goals in a home-and-home sweep of Western Michigan to regain the distinction of being the top-scoring team in the nation. They have 95 goals in 22 games this season for a 4.32 goals-per game average.

Michigan State- Sophomore Dominic Vicari recorded the 10th shutout of his career in State's 4-0 win at Miami on Friday. He's third on MSU's all-time whitewash list, just two behind Chad Alban (1994-98), who is a distant second to the school and NCAA all-time leader Ryan Miller (1999-2002), who had 26.

Nebraska-Omaha- The Mavericks improved to 9-2-1 this season at Qwest Center Omaha with a sweep of Northern Michigan by identical 3-1 scores. Their next six conference games are on the road, where they own a 1-7-0 mark this season.

Northern Michigan- Both of junior forward Matt Ciancio's goals this season have come against Nebraska-Omaha. He scored on Dec. 4 in a 6-3 home-ice victory and recorded his team's lone goal in Friday's 3-1 loss.

Notre Dame- Hard-luck sophomore forward Matt Williams-Kovacs is sidelined for the season after breaking his right wrist in Friday's 1-1 tie at Lake Superior State. Earlier this season, Williams-Kovacs suffered a broken right ankle and missed 14 games.

Ohio State- The Buckeyes equaled a team record, first set during the 1969-70 season, on Friday with their 13th straight home-ice win, a 3-1 win over Ferris State. But on Saturday the Bulldogs edged the Bucks, 3-2 in overtime, to hand them their first loss at Value City Arena since Jan. 24, 2004, against Michigan State.

Western Michigan- Coming off of a home-and-home set against Michigan that started at Yost Ice Arena where they've have now dropped 14 straight games, the Broncos engage Michigan State in a home-and-home set that finishes at Munn Ice Arena, where they're winless in 15 starts (0-12-3) dating back to their last victory there on Dec. 12, 1993.

CCHA- Four CCHA alumni rank among the top 25 scorers in the American Hockey League this season. Mike Cammalleri (Michigan) of Manchester stands third on the strength of 23-27-50 in 36 games. Andy Hilbert (Michigan) of Providence is sixth on the chart with 19-23-42 in 39 contests. J. P. Vigier (Northern Michigan), who skates for Chicago, is 18th with 14-21-35 in 35 outings while Ryan Kesler (Ohio State) has recorded 16-17-33 in 36 games for Manitoba. Ryan Miller (Michigan State) is 18th among AHL netminders with a 2.31 goals-against average but his 18 victories for Rochester rank tied for second in the league.

THIS WEEK'S MATCHUPS

Friday & Saturday

NEBRASKA-OMAHA AT FERRIS STATE

Nebraska-Omaha, holding down third place in the CCHA standings with an 8-7-1 record, starts a stretch of six consecutive conference games on the road. The Mavs are 9-2-1 on home ice but just 1-7-0 away from Qwest Center Omaha this season. UNO has an 8-5-1 series lead over Ferris State, including a 4-3-1 mark in Big Rapids, Mich., with those four wins representing the most by UNO in any CCHA city since joining the conference in 1999. The last eight outings between the teams have been decided by three goals or more and Ferris State is 5-3-0 in those encounters. Senior forward Jeff Legue (0-7-7) and senior defenseman Matt York (1-5-6) are the Bulldogs' top pointgetters versus UNO in eight career games. Sophomore forward Scott Parse led UNO in scoring last year against the Bulldogs with 1-3-4 in four games.

MIAMI AT NORTHERN MICHIGAN

The RedHawks went 2-1-0 last year versus NMU, including a 4-0 win in the CCHA Tourney. The Wildcats lead the all-time series, 24-8-1, but Miami has taken four of the past five meetings. The RedHawks' 3-2 win at Marquette on Jan. 21 last season was just their second ever on the road at NMU, and first since Nov. 14, 1981. JR D Matt Davis, SO F Matt Christie and JR D Matt Greene each have four points in their careers versus Northern Michigan.

ALASKA FAIRBANKS AT MICHIGAN

The Nanooks conclude their 14-day road trip against the Michigan Wolverines, who have won 20 straight regular-season conference games at home, including a 7-0 mark this season. UM dominates the all-time series 26-4-0, including a 14-2-0 record at home. The Wolverines took the first 18 meetings of a series that started in 1987, but the Nanooks have won four times in the past dozen meetings. Last year the teams split in Fairbanks, when the Wolverines won Friday's game, 4-1, and the Nanooks took the second encounter, 5-3. Anchorage, Alaska, native Jason Ryznar has four goals in seven career games against UAF while junior goalie Al Montoya sports a 3-1-0 record with a 2.50 GAA and .919 Spct.

MICHIGAN STATE VS WESTERN MICHIGAN (HOME-AND-HOME)

Friday's game in Kalamazoo, where the Spartans are 22-16-1, will be televised on Comcast Local. In Saturday's rematch, the Broncos will be trying to win at Munn Ice Arena for the first time since Dec. 12, 1993. They are winless in East Lansing, Mich., in 15 straight games (0-12-3). The Spartans have won four straight games in the series, outscoring Western Michigan 23-10 along the way.

OHIO STATE AT NOTRE DAME

The Buckeyes sport an 8-1-3 mark against the Irish in the past 12 meetings. That lone win was authored by junior goaltender Rory Walsh, who was making his first career start in Oct. of 2003. The two teams opened conference play last season with a split at Value City Arena before OSU emerged victorious in a thrilling Super 6 Quarterfinal by twice rallying from a two-goal deficit to post a 6-5 overtime win.

ALABAMA-HUNTSVILLE AT LAKE SUPERIOR

LSSU will play its final non-conference series by hosting CHA-leading Alabama-Huntsville, the first get together between the two programs. LSSU is 1-5-0 in non-conference action and 1-1-0 against College Hockey America opponents, having split a series with Bemidji State, also at home, on Dec. 3-4. UAH's veteran coach, Doug Ross, is a Dearborn, Mich., native who played at LSSU during the 1971-72 season. The former winger was a member of the Soo Lakers 1972 NAIA National Championship team that was inducted into the LSSU Sports Hall of Fame in 2001. Ross transferred to Oakland Community College and was named most valuable player of the Midwest Junior College Hockey Association Tournament the following year.

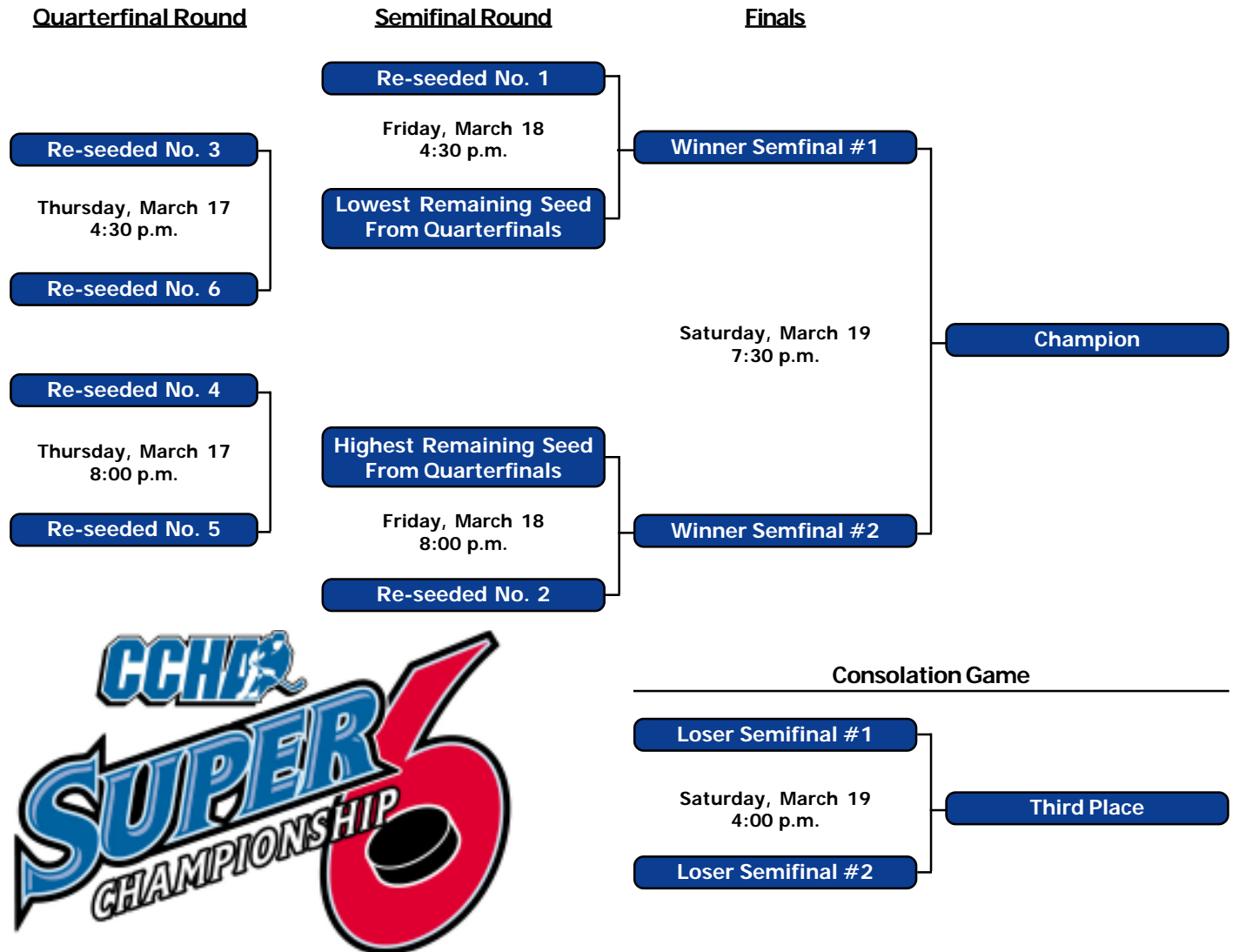

2005 CCHA Tournament Bracket

CCHA Tournament Format/Tie-breakers

The CCHA Tournament begins with all 12 teams seeded based on the final regular-season standings. The top-six seeds will host a first-round, best-of-three series. The winners of the six first-round series will then advance to Joe Louis Arena for the CCHA Super Six Championship where they will be re-seeded based upon their regular-season finish. The top two remaining seeds will receive quarterfinal-round byes while the No. 3 seed will face the No. 6 seed and the No. 4 seed will take on the No. 5 seed. The lowest seed to advance from the quarterfinals will take on the No. 1 seed in the semifinals, while the No. 2 seed will play the other remaining team.
