



CCHA ESSENTIAL - "Need to know" items from this week in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association.

Alaska Fairbanks- The Nanooks, who host in-state rival Alaska Anchorage on Dec. 30-31 to complete Governor's Cup play, will be playing on New Year's Eve for the first time since 1994. They have won four straight Cups and seven of 12 overall.

Bowling Green- After a 19-day layoff, the Falcons will travel to Storrs, Conn., for the Toyota UConn Holiday Classic on Dec. 29-30. They'll be joined by the host UConn Huskies, Army and UMass. They've not faced any of the three other schools in 37 years of Falcon hockey.

Ferris State- The Bulldogs head to the Denver Cup on Dec. 30-31 in quest of their third straight holiday tournament title. Last year they defended their Badger Showdown title to become the first visiting team to capture back-to-back crowns.

Lake Superior- Sunday's 4-3 loss at Notre Dame, which leaves the Lakers with 14 conference points, ended the Lakers' unbeaten streak at seven games, their longest since the 1996-97 season when they won 10 in a row and finished fourth in the league. That year, they were 9-4-0 in the CCHA at the holiday break.

Miami- The RedHawks get back into action on Dec. 29-30 at the Ohio Hockey Classic in Columbus, Ohio. They play Rensselaer first and then either Ohio State or Holy Cross. At last year's event, Miami dropped a 4-3 decision to Colorado College, before skidding to a 3-3 tie with Minnesota State.

Michigan- The Wolverines will be without four regulars for the GLI. Sophomore forward Kevin Porter and freshmen defensemen Jack Johnson and Mark Mitera and will be skating for Team USA at the 2006 IIHF World Junior Championship while freshman forward Andrew Cogliano will be playing for Team Canada.

Michigan State- The defending Great Lakes Invitational champs are making their 31st tournament appearance with 10 titles and 21 championship game appearances to their credit. MSU is the only annual participant to have won the tournament in the last eight years with five tournament titles.

Nebraska-Omaha- The Mavericks will begin the second half of their season with a pair of non-conference games against Alabama-Huntsville and Yale. The game against the Chargers on December 29 will be UNO's first game in 19 days. The Mavs play host to six of its next nine games at the Qwest Center.

Northern Michigan- After playing in the second 0-0 tie in school history on Saturday, junior forward Pat Bateman scored just 18 seconds Sunday's 5-2 win over Western Michigan. The club record for fastest goal to start a game is eight seconds, which was set by Jeff Gawlicki against Minnesota-Duluth on Dec. 9, 1989.

Notre Dame- With Sunday's win versus Lake Superior State, Notre Dame finishes the first half with more overall wins (6) and CCHA wins (4) than the Irish had all last season. After 18 games this season, the Irish are 6-11-1. They were 4-10-4 after 18 games last season.

Ohio State- The Buckeyes entered the December break with a 7-2-1 ledger in their last 10 games, including three series sweeps. OSU averaged 3.3 goals a game over the last 10, while allowing just 1.7 goals an outing, to go along with 17.3 penalty minutes a game. The team had two shutouts and allowed just one goal on three occasions.

Western Michigan- Western Michigan skated to its first scoreless tie in school history covering a span of 1,220 games over 33 seasons -- with a 0-0 overtime decision at Northern Michigan (Dec. 17). Sophomore goalie Daniel Bellissimo made 31 saves to record his first career shutout while appearing in his 50th game.

CCHA - Michigan freshman forward Andrew Cogliano joins five other CCHA players (Miami's Nathan Davis, Michigan's Jack Johnson, Mark Mitera and Kevin Porter, Ohio State's Tom Fritzsche) at the 2006 World Junior Championship. Cogliano will represent Canada, while the other five players will play under NMU coach Walt Kyle for Team USA. The most participants from the CCHA in a given year was 2002 with 10 players from the league.

Two nights later, Vigier tallied his second marker of the week to help the Thrashers top the New Jersey Devils, 3-2. The Notre Dame De Lourde, Manitoba, native played for NMU from 1996-2000, scoring 61-64-125 in 152 games. During his senior season, Vigier led the NCAA with six shorthanded goals. In 120 career games with Atlanta, Vigier has 17-12-29 with 58 penalty minutes, including a 3-3-6 line through 20 games this season.

- JR G Jeff Jakaitis stopped all 14 shots in Saturday's 4-0 victory over UND to record his third shutout of the season and sixth of his career.
- Ward's goal at 17:18 of the third period in Sunday's 4-3 loss to UND was the Lakers' first goal with the goalie pulled in favor of an extra attacker since a 2-1 loss to Northern Michigan on Oct. 29, 2005.
- LSSU is 6-0-2 when it scores first, and 4-6-2 when the opponent scores first.
- LSSU will play its second former International Collegiate Hockey Association (ICHA) rival in a three-week span when it travels to Thunder Bay, Ont., for the TBAYtel Varsity Cup Tournament at Lakehead University on Dec. 28-31. - Sunday's matinee marked Northern Michigan's debut on *CSTV*. The 'Cats play at Western Michigan on Jan. 27-28 and the Saturday game, starting at 4:30 p.m., will be carried live by *FSN Detroit*.
- NMU and WMU could meet again on December 31 as both are entered in the annual Badger Showdown in Madison, Wis., with the 'Cats facing Wayne State and the Broncos up against the host Badgers in the semifinals.

- WMU will make its first holiday tournament appearance in four years (and just its third in eight years) when it competes at the Badger Showdown (Dec. 30-31) in Madison, Wis. The Broncos' last holiday tourney invite also occurred at a Big Ten school, as Jim Culhane's squad traveled to Minnesota for the 2001 Mariucci Classic. WMU owns an all-time record of 26-18-2 in holiday classics, having captured seven titles, the most recent being the 2000 Silverado Shootout.
- SR F Brent Walton is not only the Broncos' leading active career scorer, but the team's most durable performer as well. The assistant captain has yet to miss a game during his career, appearing in 130 consecutive contests. The school record is 161 by Scott Garrow (1988-92). Walton is averaging over a point per game at WMU, having amassed 132 points (57 goals, 75 assists) in 130 contests. He needs eight more points to break into the school's top 25 scoring list.
- Coming off a weekend series at Marquette, Western Michigan could face Northern Michigan a total of five times over a seven-week stretch. Both teams travel to the Badger Showdown for a possible meeting followed by a series in Kalamazoo in late January, marking the Wildcat's first visit to Lawson Arena in 47 months (since February, 2002). WMU has played 13 consecutive contests on Wildcat ice.

At Farmington Hills, Mich. - Notre Dame salvaged a home-ice split by beating Lake Superior State, 4-3, and Northern Michigan made it a three-point weekend with a 5-2 victory over visiting Western Michigan as the CCHA hit the holiday break with a pair of Sunday matinee contests.

At Notre Dame, Ind., senior forward Tim Wallace set up a goal and scored twice, including a goal just 41 seconds into the game, and junior defenseman Noah Babin contributed a goal and two assists to power the Irish to victory and end the Lakers' seven-game undefeated streak (6-0-1). Senior forward Mike Walsh was credited with the game-winning goal at 2:46 of the third period, which gave Notre Dame a 4-1 lead. The Lakers, who were outshot 31-27 on the afternoon, received markers from junior forward Trent Campbell and senior forwards Mike Adamek and Nathan Ward.

At Marquette, Mich., junior forward Pat Bateman quickly erased the memory of the previous night's scoreless tie with a goal just 18 seconds into the game and it was followed by tallies from senior forward Jamie Milam and freshman forward Nick Sirota, with his first college goal, as the Wildcats opened up a 3-0 lead after 20 minutes. Senior forward Brent Walton notched a power-play goal at 8:47 of the second period that ended a Broncos goal drought of 177:10 that dated back to Dec. 2 against Notre Dame. Junior forward Paul Szczechura narrowed the NMU lead to one with a shorthanded marker near the five-minute mark of the third frame.
