Nine CCHA teams involved in tournament play

Farmington Hills, Mich. - Nine CCHA teams will participate in tournament action before the year is out, and six CCHA players will close out their year competing in the 2006 International Ice Hockey Federation's World Junior Championships in Vancouver, Kelowna and Kamloops, B.C.

Three events will feature a pair of CCHA squads when tourney action swings into high gear following the Christmas break. Michigan State gets the 41st annual Great Lakes Invitational underway against Michigan Tech of the WCHA, while Michigan and Colorado College of the WCHA meet in the other semifinal. Ohio State hosts the second annual Ohio Hockey Classic, hosting Holy Cross in the later game; Miami takes on Rensselaer of the WCHA in the early game. Northern Michigan gets holiday action started on Friday, Dec. 30, facing the CHA's Wayne State, while Western Michigan plays the second semifinal against host Wisconsin in the Badger Showdown.

Bowling Green is playing in the Toyota UConn Holiday Classic in Storrs, Conn., taking on Massachusetts in the early game. The Falcons will play either Army or Connecticut on Dec. 30. Ferris State, the two-time defending champions at the Badger Showdown, change up holiday tournaments this season to take on Boston College in the first semifinal at the Wells Fargo Denver Cup. The Bulldogs will face either Denver or Princeton in day two of competition.

Lake Superior is participating in the TBAYtel Varsity Cup, facing Lakehead, Calgary, St. Francis Xavier. The championship game, if necessary, is set for Dec. 31 at 2:05 p.m.

Six CCHA players will spend the holidays playing at the World Junior Championship tournament in British Columbia. Five players are on the U.S. squad, including UM defenseman Mark Mitera and Jack Johnson, UM forward Kevin Porter, OSU forward Tom Fritsche and MIA forward Nathan Davis. UM forward Andrew Cogliano is the lone CCHA representative on Team Canada.

In regular-season play, Nebraska-Omaha welcomes Alabama-Huntsville to town for a single game Dec. 29 and Yale on Dec. 31. Alaska Anchorage and Alaska Fairbanks face off in Fairbanks for the Governor's Cup title Dec. 30-31.

On December 29, 1994, Bowling Green forward Brian Holzinger is named the Most Valuable Player of the Bank One Badger Showdown at the Bradley Center in Milwaukee, Wis., despite a third-place finish

by the Falcons. Holzinger finished with five goals and three assists in two tournament games to garner the honors. The MVP of the Badger Showdown would be a vision of things to come for Holzinger, who would go on to be named the 15th recipient of the Hobey Baker Memorial Award for the 1994-95 season.

Notes: Bowling Green will face the University of Massachusetts for just the second time ever in round one of the UConn Holiday Classic. The Falcons played the Minutemen in the 1996 RPI/Marine Midland Bank Classic, losing 5-4 in the consolation game • UMass is coached by Don "Toot" Cahoon and enter the tournament with a 5-10-0 overall and 3-7-0 conference record • BGSU will either face the University of Connecticut or Army on Friday • The Huskies, coached by Bruce Marshall, who recorded his 250th career win on Dec. 8, 2005, are 5-6-0 in AHA conference games and 6-7-1 overall. UConn is led by Cole Koidahl (5-9-14) and Chris Myhro (8-6-14) • Army, who is 2-5-3 (AHA) and 4-9-3 overall, look to top pointgetters Luke Flicek (4-8-12) and Bryce Hollweg (5-5-10) to lead the Black Knights scoring charge • The Falcons' last Holiday Tournament win came against Union in the consolation game at the HSBC Holiday Tournament Dec. 30 in a 5-4 overtime win • Last year BGSU played in the Ledyard Classic against Dartmouth and Providence College.

Miami Notes: The RedHawks will take on Rensselaer on the 29th at 5:05 ET and then battle either Ohio State or Holy Cross at 8:05 ET on the 30th • At last year's Ohio Hockey Classic, Miami dropped a 4-3 decision to Colorado College before skating to a 3-3 tie with Minnesota State • Miami and Rensselaer have met just once previously with the Engineers earning a 9-1 win on Dec. 28, 1984. Miami and Ohio State have met twice already this season with the RedHawks winning both contests.

Ohio State Notes: The Buckeyes are hosting the second annual Ohio Hockey Classic Dec. 29-30 at Nationwide Arena in downtown Columbus. After the inaugural tournament featured two CCHA teams taking on two WCHA squads, this year's event includes Ohio State and Miami from the CCHA, ECAC Hockey League member Rensselaer and Holy Cross from Atlantic Hockey. The event features a true event format with the winners and losers facing off on day two • OSU opens the tournament against Holy Cross, a team they have never faced. The Buckeyes have played Rensselaer twice, with the last meeting on Nov. 7, 1980 in Troy, N.Y., an 8-5 RPI win. The first meeting between the teams was in the RPI Tournament Dec. 30, 1977, when the teams tied, 5-all. OSU leads the series with its CCHA scheduling partner Miami, 54-48-7 with the RedHawks sweeping the Buckeyes earlier this season (3-1 Nov. 4 in Oxford, 4-1 Nov. 5 in Columbus). In neutral site games with the RedHawks, OSU leads 3-2-0 • The Buckeyes finished second in the 2004 Ohio Hockey Classic. OSU downed Minnesota State in the opener, 5-1. In game two, OSU and Colorado College tied, 2-2, after regulation and a five-minute overtime period. The game went to a shootout to determine the tournament winner, with the Tigers downing the Buckeyes, 3-2, for the inaugural tourney crown • Buckeye SO F Tom Fritsche will miss the 2005 OHC while playing with Team USA at the World Junior Championship.

Michigan Notes: Michigan will be participating in its 31st Great Lakes Invitational. UM has played in 26 straight GLI's dating back to 1974 when it became a co-host along with Michigan Tech • The Wolverines hold a record of 41-28-1 in the GLI. In the semifinals, UM is 23-12; in the third-place game, 7-4-1 and 11-12 in championship games • Michigan has never faced Colorado College in the GLI. The Wolverines and Tigers do have a long-standing rivalry dating back to 1939 with UM holding a 57-35-3 advantage. Last season, CC knocked UM out of the NCAA tournament with a 4-3 outcome in the finals of the NCAA Midwest Regional. Michigan defeated CC two years earlier in the NCAA Midwest Regional final played at Yost Ice Arena. UM beat the Tigers in the 1996 NCAA Championship game for its eighth national title • The Wolverines are 7-6-1 in the GLI against Michigan State. The last meeting came in the 2004 GLI final, which was won by MSU, 2-1, in overtime. Michigan is 123-112-14 vs. the Spartans all-time. Earlier this season, UM and MSU tied 3-3 on Oct. 22 in Ann Arbor • The Maize and Blue holds a 16-10-0 edge when playing Michigan Tech in the GLI. The Wolverines and Huskies met in five straight tournaments with UM winning four in a row. Michigan is 114-90-4 versus the Huskies all-time • SR F Brandon Kaleniecki leads the current Wolverines in the GLI with three goals and three assists in six games. In the 2004 GLI, he was named to the All-Tournament Team for his goal in each game for UM.

Michigan State Notes: The Spartans, who are making their 31st GLI appearance, have won 10 GLI titles, including last season's tournament crown and are the only regular participant to win the GLI in the past eight years (five times) • MSU has finished second 11 times, qualifying for the championship game 21 times in their prior 30 appearances • SR F Colton Fretter netted three goals, including the tournament winning tally 9:24 in OT vs. Michigan in last season's GLI. Fretter pitched in a pair of goals during a 4-3 OT win over New Hampshire the night before • The Spartans are 73-44-3 all-time at Joe Louis Arena • In the opening game of the GLI, MSU will face Michigan Tech, who holds the series advantage, 77-72-2, while the Spartans dominate on neutral ice 20-4-0 and are 13-2-0 in the last 15 meetings between the two schools • The two teams did not meet last season and have not faced off against one another since a 7-2 MSU victory on Dec. 27, 2003 • SR F's David Booth (goal) and Colton Fretter (assist) each notched a point in the last meeting between the two schools • The only current Spartans to score against the Huskies • Michigan holds a 128-113-13 edge over the Spartans in the all-time series and an 18-16-3 record on neutral ice. The past three meetings have resulted in ties between MSU and UM • JR F Drew Miller paced the MSU attack last season with 4-3-7 in five games vs. the Wolverines • JR G Dominic Vicari made 82 saves as the teams tied each game of two game series Feb. 4-5 of last season • The Spartans trail the Tigers 33-44-1 in the all-time series, including a 5-10-0 mark in the last 15 meetings • Colorado College captured the last meeting between the two schools, 2-0, in the NCAA West Regional on March 22, 2002 • No current Spartan has registered a point against CC, nor has any goalie ever faced the Tigers.

Northern Michigan Notes: Northern Michigan is making its second trip in three years to the Badger Showdown. This time around the 'Cats will face Wayne State in the opening game. NMU is a perfect 4-0 against the Warriors and this will be the first neutral site meeting. The Wildcats won two in Detroit and two in Marquette. WSU and NMU will play two in Marquette in Feb. (3-4) • Walt Kyle will miss the Badger Showdown to coach the U.S. National Junior Team at the World Junior Championship in Vancouver, B.C.

Western Michigan Notes: WMU opens against No. 1 ranked Wisconsin then will face either Northern Michigan (for the third time in two weeks) or Wayne State • A CCHA entry has won the last two Showdowns as Ferris State defended its title last year • A meeting against Wayne State would be the first for WSU coach Bill Wilkinson against his former club. Wilkinson is the Broncos' all-time winningest coach, compiling 313 victories in 17 seasons.

Ferris State Notes: The Bulldogs open the Wells Fargo Denver Cup against Boston College, who has a 1-0 advantage in the all-time series after defeating FSU 9-6 at the Minnesota-Duluth Holiday Classic Dec. 28, 1983 • The Bulldogs have never played against Denver or Princeton • Boston College, presently 9-4-1 overall and 8-2-1 in Hockey East, is 8-2-0 in its last 10 outings and brings a two-game winning streak into the holiday tournament after sweeping a home-and-home league series against Massachusetts in its most recent action • Princeton is 4-10-0 overall and 2-8-0 in the ECAC this season to date under former Alaska Fairbanks coach Guy Gadowsky. The Tigers, who are 2-3-0 in their last five games, split a non-league home series against Alabama-Huntsville Dec. 9-10 at the Hobey Baker Rink in Princeton, N.J. • Denver sports a 11-7-2 overall record and is 8-4-2 in the WCHA after sweeping a league series at Minnesota-Duluth Dec. 16-17 • Denver won last season's Wells Fargo Denver Cup with a 4-0 victory over Northeastern in the championship game. The Pioneers notched a 9-4 decision against Air Force in the tourney's semifinal round • Ferris State has captured the holiday tournament championship in each of its last two seasons with both coming at the Badger Hockey Showdown in Madison, Wis. The Bulldogs defeated Wisconsin twice (3-1 in 2003 and 5-3 in 2004) to claim the tourney crown • Ferris State is 16-15-2 all-time in regular-season tournament contests while head coach Bob Daniels is 12-8-0 in those contests. The Bulldogs claimed third place at the Mutual of Omaha Maverick Stampede in Omaha, Neb., earlier this season. FSU dropped a 4-2 decision to New Hampshire in the tourney's opening game before registering a 5-2 triumph over Army in the third-place game • JR F Matt Verdone (4-0-4) and JR F Zac Pearson (0-4-4) are the Bulldogs' leading point getters in regular-season tournament outings this campaign while FR G Mitch O'Keefe is 1-0-0 with 2.00 goals-against average and a .846 save percentage.

Lake Superior Notes: Lake Superior will play its second former International Collegiate Hockey Association (ICHA) rival in a three-week span when it travels to Thunder Bay, Ontario, for the TBAYtel Varsity Cup Tournament at Lakehead University Dec. 28-31. The Lakers, who took on former ICHA opponent Bemidji State Dec. 9-10, will play Lakehead for the first time since November 16, 1987. Other former ICHA teams include Wisconsin State and St. Cloud State. The Lakers played in the ICHA through the 1972-73 season, which was the year they joined the CCHA • LSSU has an all-time record of 23-6-2 against Lakehead. The Lakers are playing St. Francis Xavier and Calgary for the first time in school history • LSSU and Lakehead have had one common opponent this season. Lakehead swept York 6-1 and 5-3 on Nov. 11-12. LSSU opened the season with a 5-1 exhibition victory over York • LSSU is 6-0-2 when it scores first, and 4-6-2 when the opponent scores first.

FARMINGTON HILLS, Mich. — Michigan sophomore forward Kevin Porter picked up two assists to help Team USA to an 11-2 win over Norway in the opening game of the IIHF World Junior Championship at the Pacific Coliseum in Vancouver, B.C., on Dec. 26.

Michigan freshman defenseman Jack Johnson and Ohio State sophomore forward Tom Fritsche both earned assists.

Three Wolverines highlight the U.S. roster including Porter, Johnson and freshman defenseman Mark Mitera. Miami sophomore forward Nathan Davis and Buckeye Fritsche are also on the team.

Last year, five Michigan players highlighted the 22-member United States National Junior Team roster. The 10-team tournament, which features the best players under 20 years old runs Dec. 26- Jan. 5.

The U.S. National Junior Team, which features 17 collegians, will go on to face Finland on Wednesday, Dec. 28 in the team's second game of the 2006 IIHF World Junior Hockey Championship in Vancouver, B.C.; Switzerland on Friday, Dec. 30; Canada vs. on Saturday, Dec. 31, to conclude competition against Group-A teams.

In Canada's opening game against Finland, Michigan freshman forward Andrew Cogliano posted two helpers to help the team to a 5-1 victory. Cogliano is the lone CCHA player on Team Canada's roster. Team Canada will face Switzerland on Wednesday, Dec. 28.

The teams split the first two games of the Cup series back in October with UAF prevailing in the first contest, 2-1, and UAA exacting revenge by the same score in the rematch.
- UAF, who will play a series in late December for the first time in 11 years, has captured four straight Governor's Cup titles and will look to capture its fifth to ring in the New Year. The Nanooks have won seven of the 12 Cup titles since the inception of the series between the teams in 1994.
- In UAF's modern hockey era (1980-present), the Nanooks are 1-4-5 in games played on Dec. 30 and 2-2-0 on New Year's Eve.
- In the 12-year history of the Governor's Cup series, four titles were decided by shootout after the teams split the regular four-game series. UAF has captured three Cup titles by prevailing in shootouts. The last Cup title decided via shootout was during the 2003-04 season when the Nanooks edged the Seawolves, 3-2, at the Sullivan Arena for its third consecutive title.
- SR F Kelly Czuy has 4-3-7 in 14 career games against UAA. JR F Curtis Fraser shares the scoring lead against the Seawolves with 3-4-7 in 10 games. JR D Jordan Hendry leads the blueliners with 2-4-6.

- The Irish will take a 13-day break for the holidays, returning to campus on Dec. 31 to begin preparations for the second half of the season. ND's next action comes on Jan. 6-7, 2006, when the Irish travel to Omaha, Neb., for a pair of CCHA games with the Mavericks.
- The Irish and Mavs have met 17 times in the all-time series with UNO, holding an 8-7-2 record. In Omaha, the series is tied at 4-4-1. This will be Notre Dame's first time playing in the new Qwest Center. Last season, the two teams met twice in South Bend with a 1-1 tie and a 6-3 UNO win. The last time the Irish played in Omaha was Jan. 3-4, 2003, with the Irish winning the opener, 5-3, before dropping the second game, 5-3.
- With Sunday's win vs. Lake Superior, Notre Dame finished the first half with more overall wins (6) and CCHA wins (4) than the Irish had all of last season. After 18 games this season, the Irish are 6-11-1. They were 4-10-4 after 18 games last season. After 12 CCHA games this year, ND is 4-7-1; last year, the Irish were 2-7-3 following the first 12 CCHA contests.
- SR F Mike Walsh collected his second game-winning goal of the season in the 4-3 win versus LSSU. For his career, he now has 19 career goals with seven of them being game winners. He needs just two more game-winning goals in his career to crack the all-time top 10 at Notre Dame.
