**CCHA ESSENTIAL - "Need to know" items from this week in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association.**

**Alaska Fairbanks-** The Nanooks, who were involved in back-to-back ties for the first time in team history, have followed up an eight-game winless slide by going unbeaten in four straight games (2-0-2).

**Bowling Green-** The largest crowd in over eight years (4,956) saw the Falcons beat Notre Dame, 4-1, on Friday night and senior defenseman Taylor Christie open the scoring with his first college goal in his 108th career game on Rob Blake Bobblehead Night.

**Ferris State-** Sophomore forward Zac Pearson is tied for the league lead in shorthanded goals after notching his third of the season in Saturday's 5-3 loss to Miami. Half of his goals this season have come with the Bulldogs playing a man down.

**Lake Superior-** The Lakers, who have played a conference-leading nine overtime games, are 2-1-6 in those extra-session games. They've posted wins over Bemidji State and Notre Dame while losing at Colgate in the season's second game.

**Miami-** The RedHawks snapped their season-long road winless streak by sweeping a pair of games at Ferris State and, in the process, rewarding coach Enrico Blasi with his 100th career coaching victory on Saturday night.

**Michigan-** Northern Michigan defeated the Wolverines, 4-1 on Friday to end their 22-game, home-ice, regular-season winning streak in conference play and snap sophomore forward T.J. Hensick's 10-game point streak in which he had produced 10 goals and 19 points.

**Michigan State-** Former Spartans Ryan Miller (1999-2002) and Andrew Hutchinson (1998-2002) have been selected to participate in the AHL All-Star game for PlanetUSA on Feb. 14. Both Miller, named the top goalie in last year's game, and Hutchinson, who leads AHL defensemen in scoring with 33 points, are making their second straight All-Star game appearances.

**Nebraska-Omaha-** The Mavericks rebounded from a 1-5-0 December to record one of the best months in team history. They went 6-1-1 to match their victory total from January, 2002, which was part of a school-record eight-game winning streak.

**Northern Michigan-** The Wildcats, who won at Michigan, 4-1, on Friday despite registering a season-low 17 shots on goal, play their next five games on home ice where they own a 9-0-1 mark this season at the Berry Events Center.

**Notre Dame-** Irish senior goalie Morgan Cey has played in 105 games for the Irish, starting 101 of them, and is third on the all-time appearances list. Lance Madson (1986-90) is tops with 118 games played and Matt Eisler (1994-98), who saw action in 111 games for the Irish, is second on the list.

**Ohio State-** The Buckeyes, who scored six power-play goals in a sweep of Western Michigan, are 11-for-24 over the past four games with a man advantage for a 45.8 percent success rate. They also held the Broncos scoreless on 10 power-play chances.

**Western Michigan-** Junior forward Vince Bellissimo became the newest member of the Broncos' 100-point Club with a goal and an assist in Friday's 4-3 loss at Ohio State. He reached the milestone in his 96th career game. Classmate Brent Walton (99 points) and senior captain Pat Dwyer (97 points) are next in line for Century Club membership.

**CCHA-** The Road to the Joe Tour heads to the U.P. this weekend with stops in Sault Ste. Marie, Mich., on Friday for the Lakers/Ohio State game and Marquette, Mich., on Saturday for the Wildcats/UAF contest. Featuring a 15-foot inflatable replica of the Mason Cup championship trophy and an appearance by skating mascot Joe College, the Road to the Joe Tour is used to promote the CCHA's Super 6 playoff championship that is scheduled for March 16-20 in downtown Detroit.

## THIS WEEK'S MATCHUPS

### Friday & Saturday

#### BOWLING GREEN AT FERRIS STATE

The Bulldogs carry an eight-game undefeated streak (7-0-1) over the Falcons into Friday's game. They had won seven straight over the Falcons prior to a 3-3 tie on Dec. 6, 2004. Bowling Green State has a 47-37-10 lead in the all-time series but the Bulldogs own a 20-17-5 advantage in Big Rapids. Seniors Derek Nesbitt, with 5-5-10, and Jeff Legue, with 5-4-9, are the Bulldogs' leading scorers against BGSU in eight games apiece. Senior goalie Mike Brown is 6-0-1 with a 1.84 goals-against average and a .932 save percentage in seven career starts.

#### OHIO STATE AT LAKE SUPERIOR

The Buckeyes are unbeaten in nine straight games (7-0-2) against the Lakers and have won the past five meetings at Taffy Abel Arena, including 4-1 and 5-2 victories in their last visit on Nov. 8-9, 2002. It's a series featuring the two biggest teams in the CCHA with Buckeyes averaging 6-0, 196 pounds on a roster that boasts 15 200-pounders. The Lakers average 6-1, 193 pounds with eight players who tip the scales at 200 pounds or more. LSSU leads the all-time series, 65-45-9, including a 39-21-4 advantage on home ice. It's winter carnival weekend in the Soo with LSSU students being admitted free on Friday in an effort to break last year's student attendance record of 708.

#### MIAMI AT WESTERN MICHIGAN

The RedHawks, coming off their first two road wins of the season, are right back on the road for a two-game set at Lawson Ice Arena where the Broncos are 8-4-1 on the season. Western Michigan leads the all-time series, 46-37-8, including a 26-16-5 mark at home. The RedHawks sport a 7-4-3 record versus the Broncos in Enrico Blas's tenure behind the bench. The teams split a Nov. 19-20 series earlier this season at Miami with Western Michigan winning on Friday night, 2-1, thanks to a shorthanded overtime winner from junior forward Vince Bellissimo and the RedHawks getting two goals and an assist from senior Todd Grant in a 4-1 victory on Saturday night.

#### MICHIGAN STATE VS MICHIGAN (HOME-AND-JOE LOUIS ARENA)

The Spartans and Wolverines have split their last 15 meetings with a 6-6-3 record. Both games, Friday night at Yost Ice Arena in Ann Arbor, Mich., and Saturday night at Detroit's Joe Louis Arena, will be televised by FSN Detroit. Michigan swept a Nov. 18-20 home-and-home series by scores of 4-2 at Munn Ice Arena and 5-4 at Yost Ice Arena. But the Spartans posted a 2-1 overtime victory on Dec. 30 in the championship game of the 40th annual Great Lakes Invitational. Prior to that win, the Spartans' last three victories over Michigan had all been by shutout, including a 1-0 win on March 6, 2004 at the Joe in which Dominic Vicari made 34 saves and Mike Lalonde scored the only goal with less than six minutes remaining. Saturday's game marks the 35th meeting at the Joe between the two in-state rivals with Michigan holding a 17-15-2 advantage there. Twenty-six of the last 27 meetings between the Spartans and Wolverines have been decided by two goals or less, including five ties. Jason Ryznar leads Michigan with four goals and five assists in 13 contests against the Spartans.

#### ALASKA FAIRBANKS AT NORTHERN MICHIGAN

The Nanooks hit the road in search of their first road victory since Nov. 13 when they won at Lake Superior State. But they're up against a Wildcats team that is undefeated on home ice this season (9-0-1) and on a 12-game undefeated streak overall (11-0-1) at the Berry Events Center. The Wildcats dominate the all time series 16-2-4, and boast an 8-0-2 unbeaten record in Marquette. The 'Cats visited Fairbanks on Dec. 10-11 with the teams skating to a 2-2 tie in the series opener and Northern Michigan posting a 5-3 victory in the second encounter.

#### NEBRASKA-OMAHA AT NOTRE DAME

The Irish look to snap an eight-game losing streak when they continue a stretch of five straight home games with Nebraska-Omaha visiting the Joyce Center. This series is deadlocked at 7-7-1 after 15 all-time meetings. For the second year in a row, the series will be played at the Joyce Center where, last season, the Irish took 4-2 and 3-0 wins versus the Mavericks on Oct. 30-31. Notre Dame has won five of the last six meetings between the two schools, dating back to the first round of the CCHA playoffs in 2001-02. Friday's game, a 7:35 p.m. start, will be telecast by Comcast Local. Senior forward Anthony Adams leads UNO in career points against ND with 2-3-5 in nine games. Maverick sophomore goalie Chris Holt was 0-1-0 against Notre Dame last season with a 2.05 goals-against average and a .938 save percentage.

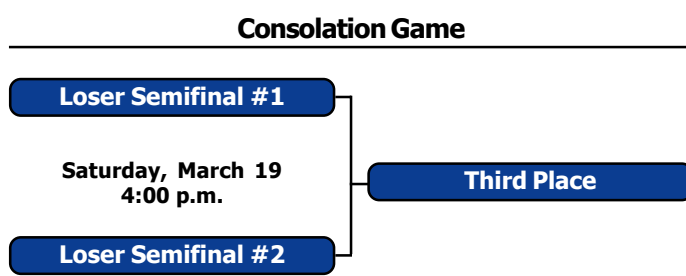
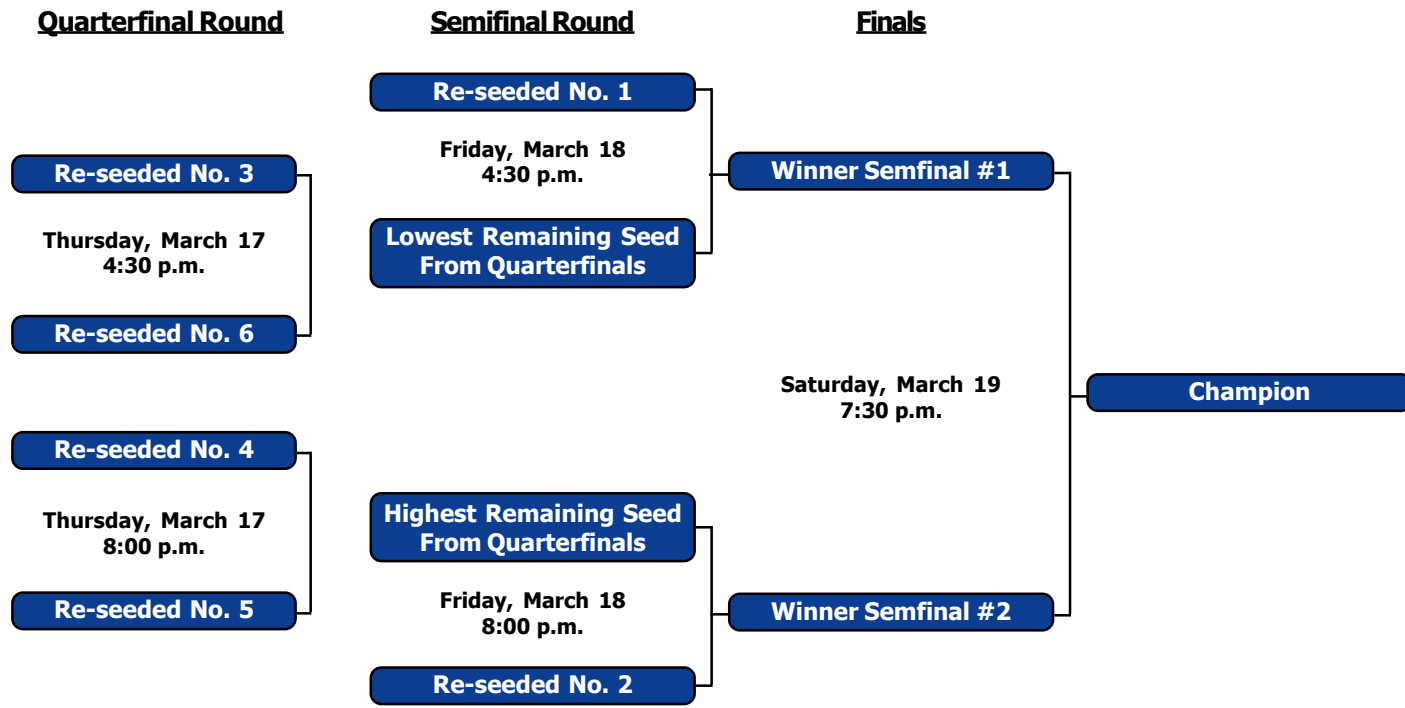

## CCHA Tournament Format/Tie-breakers

The CCHA Tournament begins with all 12 teams seeded based on the final regular-season standings. The top-six seeds will host a first-round, best-of-three series. The winners of the six first-round series will then advance to Joe Louis Arena for the CCHA Super Six Championship where they will be re-seeded based upon their regular-season finish. The top two remaining seeds will receive quarterfinal-round byes while the No. 3 seed will face the No. 6 seed and the No. 4 seed will take on the No. 5 seed. The lowest seed to advance from the quarterfinals will take on the No. 1 seed in the semifinals, while the No. 2 seed will play the other remaining team. The winners will then advance on to the CCHA Championship Game while the semifinal losers will play a third-place game prior to the championship contest. The winner of the CCHA Tournament will receive the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament and the Ron Mason Cup.

UAF is 2-4-2 for the month of January and 5-2-3 at home this season • FR F's scored all three goals against the Lakers. Aaron Lee had a goal each night while Kyle Greentree scored an extra-attacker equalizer on Friday with 1:01 to go in the third period • Greentree's goal was the first extra-attacker marker for the Nanooks since scoring one in a 5-4 loss to the University of Alaska Anchorage on March 6, 2004 • Greentree, with three goals in as many games, has 3-4-7 in the last eight games. He leads team freshmen in scoring and is third overall on the squad with 7-10-17 • UAF held LSSU scoreless in nine power-play opportunities on the weekend while also getting blanked on its seven chances • UAF outshot the Lakers 85-49 for the weekend, including a 51-26 margin in the first contest. He added a goal on Saturday to give him 1-4-5 in the past three contests • Eight of the Bulldogs' last nine contests have been decided by two goals or less and FSU is 2-6-1 in those nine encounters • SO F Zac Pearson registered his third career shorthanded goal, and third of the season, against Miami on Friday. The last time BGSU won two straight against the Irish was Feb. 10 and Feb. 24 of 1996 • BGSU is now 11-3-0 when scoring first and 1-6-3 when the opponent scores first • SR D Taylor Christie, who scored his first career goal in his 108th game in Friday's 4-1 win over Notre Dame, became the 19th different Falcon to tally a goal this season • JR F Mike Falk extended his career-long point streak to seven games with two goals in Saturday's 6-2 win at Notre Dame. The Davisburg, Mich., native has 4-4-8 during that stretch with nine of his season's 10 points coming in his last eight games • JR F Brett Pilkington finished with five assists in the sweep of the Irish and now has a team and career-high 18 assists to go along with his team-leading and career-high 21 points. Pilkington had 10-11-21 in 36 games last season • FR F Derek Whitmore's team-leading 10th goal improved his shooting percentage to a team-best 22.2 percent., which is also third-best in the CCHA. He has 10 goals on 45 shots taken.

They lost the two 60-minute games, which were sandwiched between the last six overtime contests, by a combined score of 13-0 • LSSU leads the CCHA in overtime games played with nine. Ferris State and Notre Dame follow with seven each • SO G Jeff Jakaitis totaled a career-high 49 saves in Friday's 2-2 tie. He stopped 22-of-23 shots in the third period. Jakaitis is currently ranked third in the CCHA in save percentage (.923) and fourth in average saves per game (30.62) • LSSU finished 0-for-9 on the power play at UAF and held the Nanooks to 0-for-7 for the series. The Lakers are scoreless on their last 47 power-play attempts and have gone 11 games without a power-play goal • For the second straight season, the LSSU-OSU series will pit the two biggest teams in the CCHA against each other. The ninth-ranked Buckeyes check in at an average height and weight of 6-0, 196 pounds and have a roster that boasts 15 200-pounders. The Lakers average 6-1, 193 pounds, but have only eight players who weigh in at 200 pounds or more • The Buckeyes visit on winter carnival weekend in the Soo.

### MIAMI

Miami did a few things it hadn't done in a long time over the weekend in a CCHA series sweep at Ferris State. Coach Enrico Blasi became the second coach in Miami hockey history to win 100 or more games with the 5-3 win on Saturday. The RedHawks had been winless on the road in 2004-05, at 0-7-2, heading into the series but picked up their first two road wins • It was Miami's first CCHA series sweep since taking two games from Notre Dame earlier this season and first sweep at Ferris State since the 2001-02 season • Miami won in overtime on Friday for the first time since Mar. 13, 2004 versus Lake Superior and won an overtime game on the road for the first time since Nov. 30, 2001 at Ohio State • FR G Charlie Effinger won both games in net for Miami and extended his winning streak to a career-high three games • The four goals in the third period on Saturday were the most scored by the RedHawks in one period this season • Three Miami players recorded their 10th goal of the season on Saturday with SO F Marty Guerin, SR F Todd Grant and FR F Nathan Davis now all in double figures • The RedHawks scored four goals in both games to improve to 10-1-0 when they score at least four times • Guerin has 22 points this season, 20 of those have come in Miami's 11 victories, including nine of his goals and all 11 of his assists • Miami has outscored its opponents 52-16 in games it has won and is 26-for-80 (.325) on the power play while allowing just five opponent power-play markers in 85 chances (.059).

Face-off is set for 7:35 p.m. both nights as the games will be televised by FSN Detroit • Over the course of the last 15 meetings between MSU and U-M, the series is tied at 6-6-3 • The Wolverines swept the first regular-season meeting of the season between the teams, posting a 4-2 win in East Lansing (Nov. 18) and a 5-4 in Ann Arbor (Nov. 20) • However, State posted a 2-1 OT win in the Great Lakes Invitational title game on Dec. 30, 2004 • Twenty-six of the last 27 meetings between the Spartans and Wolverines have been decided by two goals or less, including five ties • In MSU's last eight wins, the Spartans are averaging 3.31 goals per game, including a season-best eight goals vs. Lake Superior State (Jan. 21). In State's last five losses, the Spartans tallied eight goals (1.6 goals per game) • SR F Mike Lalonde has stepped up his play since returning to the line-up after missing five games (Nov. 27-Dec. 11) with a knee injury. The Chetwynd, B.C., native has registered 4-3-7 in eight games back. In comparison, in MSU's first 13 games, Lalonde tallied just 1-2-3. As a junior in 2003-04, Lalonde posted 22-18-40 in 42 contests • SR F Jim Slater needs just six more points to crack the top 30 on MSU's all-time scoring chart. Sean Berens (1994-98) is currently No. 30 with 158 points, while Lyle Phair (1981-85) is No. 29 with 159 points. The Lapeer, Mich., native, has played in 142 career games with 59 goals and 93 assists for 152 points.

The last previous home conference loss came Feb. 28, 2003, against Michigan State • The setback also ended U-M's five-game overall winning streak and four-game home winning streak against Northern Michigan. U-M last lost to NMU on Dec. 7, 2002, at the Berry Events Center. The last home loss to the Wildcats came on Oct. 27, 2001 • Red Berenson earned his 553rd victory on Jan. 29, leaving him just two wins shy of tying John MacInnes (555 wins) for eighth place on the all-time coaching wins list • SR F Milan Gajic, who scored in both weekend games, now has a career-high 14 goals on the season and also has 4-2-6 during a season-high five-game point streak • Michigan had a perfect weekend on the penalty kill. Northern Michigan went 0-for-7 with the man advantage during the series. U-M's penalty kill has been flawless in nine games this season, when doing so the Wolverines are 6-3-0 • The Wolverines had two goals with the man-advantage on Jan. 29. U-M is 9-0-0 this season when scoring multiple power-play goals.

Thomas, the leading freshman scorer in the country, needs two points to tie the UNO single-season scoring mark for freshmen, which was set by Parse last year. The two linemates have 11 of UNO's 28 power-play goals this season • The Mavs garnered two power-play goals in a game on Saturday for the first time in 10 games • Nebraska-Omaha had 20 former players on hand Saturday for "Back to the Bullpen" Alumni weekend and were introduced by former UNO hockey public address announcer Fred Brooks during one of the intermissions.

His first goal was against Michigan State on Oct. 23 • SR G Tuomas Tarkki is 4-1-1 over the past six games with a 1.32 goals-against average and a .954 save percentage • FR F Mike Santorelli scored his team-high 12th goal of the season on Friday but saw his three-game goal and point streak end on Saturday. OSU is 11-2-0 at home this year, with a 9-2-0 ledger in league play • SO F Matt Beaudoin led the way with a six-point weekend, with two goals and an assist in each game. Three of his goals came on the power play, while the other was shorthanded. He is on a four-game goal-scoring streak. He has a career-high 15 goals on the year and is tied with JR F Rod Pelley with a league-best 10 power-play goals • FR F Tom Fritsche had his first career hat trick and second four-point game on Saturday. He had entered the game with four goals on the year. Fritsche, who had an assist in the series opener, leads OSU with 31 points and a team-best 24 assists, a mark that is tied for ninth all-time in OSU history for assists as a rookie and a mark that is tied for third in the nation this season • JR G Dave Caruso made 28 saves against WMU Saturday for his second shutout of the season and the sixth of the career. He also drew two assists in the win • OSU was 6-for-11 on the power play in the series and has converted 11 of its last 24 power-play chances in its last four games combined, a success rate of 45.8 percent. The team has improved to 22.7 percent on the year and ranks sixth in the nation. OSU penalty killers held the Broncos, who came into the series first in the league on the power play, scoreless on all 10 chances.

The weekend sweep by Bowling Green gives the Irish eight consecutive losses. They have not won since beating Rensselaer, 2-1, on Jan. 2. The last time ND lost eight in a row was Jan. 25 to Feb. 15, 1997 • ND finished an 11-game month of January with a record of 1-9-1. Only one other time in the program's history have the Irish played 11 games in a month - January of 1977. That team went 5-5-1 in the 11 games • For the month of January, the Irish scored just 12 goals • JR F Matt Amado had a hand in all three Irish goals on the weekend. He set up SO F Michael Bartlett's power-play goal in the 4-1 loss on Jan. 28. He then scored one goal and assisted on the other in Saturday's 6-2 loss to the Falcons • Amado's even-strength goal at 19:14 of the second period in the Jan. 29 loss to BGSU was the first even-strength goal scored by a ND forward since Tim Wallace scored at even-strength at 9:09 of the third period on Jan. 2. That's a remarkable span of 536:01 (eight full games and parts of two others) • JR G Rory Walsh made his first appearance of the season in the 6-2 loss to the Falcons, giving up one goal while making 11 saves in 30:33 minutes of playing time. Walsh last played on Dec. 5, 2003 at Western Michigan. He has now played in four games in his Irish career • Bartlett's power-play goal in the 4-1 loss on Jan. 28 ended a ND goal drought of 187:13 minutes that went all the way back to the second period of the Jan. 18 game versus Michigan Tech. The goal also snapped an 0-for-29 run on the power play, a streak that started in the third period of the Jan. 15 game versus Ohio State • For just the second time this season, ND outshot its opponent in both games of the weekend series. The Irish outshot Bowling Green, 30-28, on Friday night at BGSU and 34-26 on Saturday at ND. The only other series that the Irish have outshot the opposition in both games came on Jan. 7-8 at Lake Superior State.

**"Some will look at the weekend and see that we got swept, 4-1 and 6-2. I look at the weekend and see that we generated a lot more scoring chances than we have in recent weeks. RedHawks SR F Todd Grant had two goals and an assist the next night to help the RedHawks answer with a 4-1 decision • WMU leads the all-time series, 47-38-8, owning a 26-16-5 edge in Kalamazoo • WMU is home for two games in a stretch that has the Broncos playing seven of nine on the road • Bellissimo became the latest member of the 100-point club, reaching the milestone in his 96th game with a goal and an assist in Friday's 4-3 loss at Ohio State • JR F Brent Walton (99 points) and SR F Pat Dwyer (97 points) are also on the verge of joining the Century Club • Dwyer halted a 14-game goal drought on Friday, lighting the lamp for the first time since Nov. 5. During that span, Dwyer accumulated nine assists to remain in the top five in team scoring • Dwyer, Bellissimo and Walton are among 33 CCHA players and 142 nationwide who have advanced to the Preliminary Voting phase for the Hobey Baker Award • WMU's potent power play has shut down the last three games (going 0-for-12) yet still ranks second-best in the league at 21.4 percent.

Bowling Green was victorious, 6-2, in the back end of a home-and home series with Notre Dame, Miami won, 5-3, at Ferris State and Ohio State overpowered visiting Western Michigan, 7-0. Michigan gained a split with visiting Northern Michigan with a 3-1 win over the Wildcats, Alaska Fairbanks and Lake Superior State tied, 1-1, and, in non-conference play, Nebraska-Omaha doubled Wayne State, 4-2.

**At Notre Dame, Ind.,** senior goalie Jordan Sigalet made 34 saves, junior forward Mike Falk scored twice and senior forward Ryan Minnabarriet collected a goal and two assists as Bowling Green completed a home-and-home sweep of the Irish with a 6-2 victory. Freshmen Derek Whitmore and Ben Geelan, along with sophomore forward James Unger added goals for the Falcons, who owned a 5-0 lead at one point. Junior forward Matt Amado and freshman forward Mark Van Guilder replied for the Irish, who are winless in eight games.

**At Big Rapids, Mich.,** sophomore forward Marty Guerin scored twice and freshman goalie Charlie Effinger made 31 stops as the Miami RedHawks followed up their first road win of the season with a sweep-clinching 5-3 victory over Ferris State.
