CCHA ESSENTIAL - "Need to know" items from this week in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association.

Alaska Fairbanks- The Nanooks have to wait until Jan. 7 at Bowling Green to try and snap a four-game conference winless streak. It's their first such winless stretch since the 2002-03 season when they suffered three losses and two ties during a five-game slide in the months of January and February.

Bowling Green- Senior goalie Jordan Sigalet announced on Saturday that he suffers from multiple sclerosis, an inflammatory disease of the central nervous system. Diagnosed in March of this year, the 2004 All-Conference First Team member has missed just three games due to complications from the disease, including one this past Saturday.

Ferris State- Freshman goalie Derek MacIntyre, a San Jose NHL draft pick, made a season-high 34 saves and freshman defenseman Adam Welch scored his first college goal to lead the Bulldogs to their first conference road win of the season on Saturday, 2-1, at Miami.

Lake Superior- Sophomore Dominic Osman, the Lakers scoring leader as a freshman, is sidelined for the season after undergoing emergency back surgery last week. Osman was airlifted from Omaha, Neb., to his hometown of Detroit last Thursday for an operation to repair two herniated discs.

Miami- Junior defenseman Andy Greene assisted on three of the four goals scored by the RedHawks over the weekend to take over the team scoring lead. The team captain is on a six-game point streak in which he has collected eight points, all assists.

Michigan- The Wolverines are just the third team in history to be represented by five players on the U.S. National Junior Team. Minnesota placed a record six players on the 1979 squad in the tournament's third year of existence while Boston University put five players on the 1992 U.S. roster.

Michigan State- Senior forward Ash Goldie collected his first career hat trick, and first goals in six games, in Saturday's 4-1 win over Notre Dame. He had scored twice in a game three times before, most recently against Bowling Green on Jan. 17, 2004.

Nebraska-Omaha- The Mavericks head home for the holidays having already matched their win total from all of last season. Saturday's 5-1 win over Lake Superior State gives the Mavs an 8-7-1 record. They finished last season with an 8-26-5 mark.

Northern Michigan- The Wildcats' power-play, which had been dormant during a six-game stretch and 0-for-34 slump, got back on track in a tie and win at Fairbanks. The 'Cats went 4-for-9 with the man advantage, including the game-winning goal by freshman Mike Santorelli on Saturday.

Notre Dame- Dave Poulin's next win in a CCHA game will be the 100th of his career. In his 10th season behind the Irish bench, he is currently 99-133-39 in conference games.

Ohio State- Friday's 2-2 draw at Clarkson of the ECACHL means the Buckeyes have earned a pair of ties by Christmas. Last season, the Buckeyes were not involved in a tie in 42 games played.

Western Michigan- This week's trip to Minnesota for a two-game, non-conference series against Bemidji State of the CHA is a homecoming of sorts for a pair of Broncos. JR F Mike Erickson and SR D Jim McNamara skated for Minnesota and St. Cloud State, respectively, before transferring to WMU.

CCHA- Michigan, Bowling Green and Nebraska-Omaha have shown the greatest improvement in the conference standings at the holiday break when comparing this season to last season. The league-leading Wolverines, who were tied for fourth place after a dozen games last season, have improved by seven points while the Falcons and Mavericks each show a five-point improvement. At the other end of the spectrum, Miami, which topped the standings at this time last year, has suffered a nine-point drop over 12 games while Notre Dame has seven fewer points and Michigan State is down five points.

WESTERN MICHIGAN AT BEMIDJI STATE

Coming off of a bye week, Western Michigan travels to Bemidji State this weekend for its first-ever encounter against the Beavers. Once the series is completed, WMU is off for the holidays until meeting Michigan on Jan. 7-8. Jim Culhane's squad is 4-0-0 in non-league action, having swept College Hockey America opponents Niagara and Alabama-Huntsville. The Brown and Gold own a 22-10-3 record against non-conference opponents over the last five seasons. During that same period, the Broncos have gone 10-2-0 against the CHA. The trip to the state of 10,000 lakes marks a homecoming for JR F Mike Erickson and SR D Jim McNamara, who skated for Minnesota and St. Cloud State before transferring to WMU.

Saturday & Sunday

LAKE SUPERIOR AT ST. LAWRENCE

The Lakers play their second ECACHL opponent of the season when they travel to upstate New York for a Saturday-Sunday series against St. Lawrence. The Lakers opened the regular season with two losses at Colgate and wrap up the first half of the schedule in Canton, N.Y. LSSU leads the all-time series against St. Lawrence, 10-4-3, but the teams are even (3-3-2) when playing in Canton. The Lakers posted a 2-2 overtime tie and 4-2 victory over the Saints in Sault Ste. Marie, Mich., on Oct. 31 and Nov. 1, 2003. Sophomore forward Dominic Osman, who had two goals and an assist in the Lakers' 4-2 victory over St. Lawrence last season, won't have a repeat performance in Canton. He will miss the remainder of this season to recover from last week's emergency back surgery. Last Thursday, prior to the Lakers' pre-game skate in Omaha, Neb., he was taken to an Omaha hospital with severe back pain. Later that day, he was air-lifted to a hospital in Detroit, his hometown. Preliminary reports indicate that the surgery to repair two herniated discs was successful, and Osman, who led the Lakers in scoring as a freshman, is expected to resume his academic schedule at LSSU next semester. St. Lawrence is 3-1 against CCHA opponents this season. The Saints defeated Michigan State, 3-1, and lost to Michigan, 5-2, on the road on Oct. 15-16. They swept a home series against Miami, 6-4 and 4-3, on Oct. 29-30.

THIS WEEK IN CCHA HISTORY



On Dec. 14-15, 1985, Michigan State forward Mike Donnelly was named CCHA Player of the Week after finishing a productive weekend series against Ohio State. Donnelly got off to a fast start on Friday night, scoring five times to tie Bowling Green's Jamie Wansborough for the most goals scored in a single CCHA game. The Spartans won the game, 6-5, in overtime. Donnelly would add a hat trick the next night, increasing his weekend total to eight, as Michigan State would go on to set an NCAA single-season record for goals scored with 59, leading the Spartans to a national championship. Eight of those goals came from Mike Donnelly "This Week in CCHA History."

The Nanooks tied and lost against visiting Northern Michigan at the Carlson Center despite outshooting the Wildcats, 84-60, in the two-game series. The series marked a season-high for shots against an opponent. UAF is third in shots per game in the conference and overall with 33.75 and 33.86 averages, respectively • The Nanooks record in the all-time series against the 'Cats falls to 2-16-4 • SO F Curtis Fraser turned in a three-point performance against NMU, notching the game tying-goal and an assist in Friday's match-up, and another marker in Saturday's action. Fraser, the Perani Cup second star in both games, has 7-6-13 on the season. He leads the Nanooks in goals and is second in total points • The Nanooks scored their first 5-on-3 power-play goal of the season in Friday's tie • The UAF power play was 2-for-14 against Northern Michigan, tallying a power-play goal in each game of the conference series for only the second time this season. The first back-to-back production came at Western Michigan, when the Nanooks were 3-for-12 against the Broncos. UAF had gone 2-for-32 with a man advantage in the previous four contests • The Nanooks have two weeks off for the holiday break and will resume conference play on the road against Bowling Green, January 7th and 8th.

MacIntyre, who started in place of ailing SR G Mike Brown, had turned aside 33 shots on Oct. 16 in a home game against Ohio State • Friday's 3-3 overtime tie at Miami was the 19th extra-session outing against the RedHawks. The Bulldogs are 3-4-12 in those games with the last four all occurring in Oxford • SR F Jeff Legue had his nine-game point streak snapped in Saturday's win. Legue, who had a goal and an assist in Friday's tie, recorded 10-4-14 during his streak • Legue is two points shy of tying Murray Winnicki (1985-89) for 14th place on the school's all-time points list. FARMINGTON HILLS, Mich.- Ferris State picked up a 2-1 victory over host Miami, completing a three-point weekend in Oxford. In CCHA conference play elsewhere, Alaska-Fairbanks fell to Northern Michigan, 5-3, Michigan swept Bowling Green with a 5-4 win, and Michigan State and Nebraska-Omaha earned splits with a 4-1 over Notre Dame and a 5-1 win over Lake Superior, respectively. In Potsdam, N.Y., Ohio State fell to Clarkson, 3-1.

At Oxford, Ohio, freshman defenseman Adam Welch and sophomore forward Matt Verdone each scored even strength, third period goals to lead Ferris State to a come from behind 2-1 victory over Miami at Goggin Ice Arena. The two third period tallies were more than enough for Bulldog freshman Derek MacIntyre who made 34 saves. Brandon Crawford-West, a sophomore, kicked aside 43 FSU shots and was the hard luck loser between the pipes for the RedHawks.

At Bowling Green, Ohio, the Wolverine offense didn't miss a beat, pouring in five goals en route to knocking off Bowling Green for the second straight night. Forward David Moss scored his second goal of the contest, a power-play tally at 6:52 of the third period, giving Michigan the lead for good. Sophomore defenseman Matt Hunwick notched two assists to complete a five-point weekend. FARMINGTON HILLS, Mich.— Michigan sophomore defenseman Matt Hunwick recorded a hat trick and sophomore forward T.J. Hensick chipped in two goals as Michigan beat visiting Bowling Green, 8-3, at Yost Ice Arena. Elsewhere, Notre Dame defeated Michigan State, 3-2, in overtime, Ferris State and Miami battled to a 3-3 tie while Northern Michigan and Alaska Fairbanks skated to a 2-2 draw. In non-conference action, Ohio State and Clarkson tied, 3-3.

At Ann Arbor, Mich., the Wolverines spotted Bowling Green a 3-0 lead after one period and then fired eight unanswered goals for an 8-3 victory that vaulted them into first place in the conference standings. Senior forward Steve Brudzewski scored a pair of goals and senior forward Alex Rogosheske contributed a short-handed marker in the opening frame for the visitors.
