CCHA ESSENTIAL - "Need to know" items from this week in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association.

Alaska Fairbanks- Tavis MacMillan earned his first victory as head coach of the Nanooks thanks, in part, to the efforts of freshman forward Kyle Greentree, whose second goal of the game, with 4:05 remaining, was the winner in UAF's 5-3 decision at Western Michigan on Saturday.

Bowling Green- Freshman forward Derek Whitmore of Rochester, N.Y., scored in overtime to give the Falcons a 3-2 win over Windsor on Friday night and, one week earlier, had scored the overtime goal that ended BGSU's Orange-White intrasquad game.

Ferris State- The Bulldogs' underclassmen have accounted for nearly 65% (18-28) of the squad's points production this season with sophomore forward Matt Verdone (1-2-3) and freshmen forwards Matt Stefanishion (1-2-3) and Adam Miller (1-2-3) leading the way.

Lake Superior- The Lakers host Michigan this coming weekend in the annual Home-and-Joe series with Thursday night's contest at Taffy Abel Arena in the Soo and a rematch set for Saturday night at Joe Louis Arena.

Miami- Sophomore goalie Brandon Crawford-West extended his unbeaten record at Goggin Ice Arena to 15-0-2 with the RedHawks' weekend sweep of Notre Dame. They've won their first four games for the first time since the 1997-98 season when they opened with five straight wins en route to a 19-14-4 overall record.

Michigan- Junior goalie Al Montoya sports a 6-0-0 record against Lake Superior State, who the Wolverines play twice this coming weekend. The perfect mark is accompanied by a 0.50 goals-against average and .974 Spt.

Michigan State- Junior forward Colton Fretter, who sat out Friday's season opener, turned in a two-goal performance in Sunday's 5-1 win over UNH. It marked the third time in his career that the Atlanta Thrashers' draft pick has scored two goals in a game. The last time Fretter had two goals in a game was March 7, 2003 at WMU.

Nebraska-Omaha- The Mavericks, who were idle last week after capturing the championship of the fifth annual Mutual of Omaha Maverick Stampede, are off to a 2-0-0 start for the first time in program history. The school's best October record was posted in the 2001-02 season when the Mavs came out of the gate with a 5-1-0 record.

Northern Michigan- Bill Zaniboni, a redshirt freshman netminder, made 33 saves and also picked up an assist in earning his first college win on Saturday as the Wildcats ended a six-game losing streak to St. Cloud State with a 4-2 win over the Huskies.

Notre Dame- The five goals that the Irish have scored in their first four games represents the fewest scored by them through the first four outings in the 37-year history of the program.

Ohio State- It's been nearly 40 years since the Buckeyes opened league play with two road wins like they did this past weekend against Ferris State. The 1976-77 edition of the Buckeyes commenced league action with a two-win weekend at Lake Superior State.

Western Michigan- Daniel Bellissimo became the third freshman goalie in the past 10 years to lead the Broncos to victory in a season opener. The younger brother of WMU sniper and assistant captain Vince Bellissimo made 32 saves in a 5-4 win over Alaska Fairbanks last Friday night.

CCHA- Eight of the 12 CCHA teams have an NHL-drafted goaltender. The list is comprised of Bowling Green (Jordan Sigalet- BOS '01), Ferris State (Derek MacIntyre- SJ '04), Lake Superior State (Matt Violin- VAN '02), Miami (Brandon Crawford-West- PIT '01), Michigan (Al Montoya- NYR '04), Nebraska-Omaha (Chris Holt- NYR '03), Notre Dame (David Brown- PIT '04) and Ohio State (Ian Keserich- COL '04).

Christie (2-3-5) scored the game-winning goal each night on the power play as the RedHawks swept visiting Notre Dame to improve to 4-0-0 on the season.

Collins (0-2-2, +3) assisted on the tying goal with 1:42 to play on Saturday and then helped set up the overtime winner while helping OSU kill 18-of-20 power-play chances in a road sweep of FSU.

Crawford-West blocked 55-of-57 shots (.965) in a weekend sweep of Notre Dame while recording his fourth career shutout and extending his home-ice unbeaten streak to 15-0-2.

Greentree (3-1-4) scored his first college goal in a Friday loss and added two more goals, including the winner with 4:05 to play, plus an assist in Saturday's 5-3 victory at Western Michigan.

Brent Walton, WMU, JR, F (Elmira, ON): Walton fired four goals, including power-play and shorthanded markers, as the Broncos split with visiting UAF.

Jason Ryznar, UM, SR, F (Anchorage, AK): Ryznar had a goal and an assist in a 4-4 tie with New Hampshire, and a game-winning, penalty-shot goal and assist on Saturday versus St. Lawrence.

Kelly Czuy, UAF, JR, F (Edmonton, AB): Czuy (2-3-5) picked up two assists in a Friday loss and contributed two goals and an assist in Saturday's 5-3 road win at Western Michigan.

Dirk Southern, NMU, JR, F (Winnipeg, MB): Southern scored the game-winning goal and assisted on an insurance marker in the third period of a 4-2 win at St. Cloud State on Saturday.

Dominic Vicari, MSU, SO, G (Clinton Township, MI): Vicari blocked 30-of-31 shots, surrendering only a power-play goal, in a 5-1 victory over New Hampshire on Sunday.

Mike Adamek, LSSU, JR, F (Hollister, CA): Adamek, with a goal and two assists on the power play, figured in on all three goals scored by the Lakers during weekend losses at Colgate.

Zac Pearson, FSU, SO, F (White Lake, MI): Pearson scored one of his team's goals and assisted on the other in a 4-2 home-ice loss to Ohio State on Friday.

Andy Greene, MIA, JR, D (Trenton, MI): Greene picked up two assists in Friday's 4-2 win over Notre Dame and blocked nine shots in a weekend sweep of the Irish.

Bill Zaniboni, NMU, FR, G (Plymouth, MA): Zaniboni blocked 33 shots and also assisted on an insurance goal in posting his first college victory, 4-2, at St. Cloud State on Saturday.

Eric Werner, UM, SR, D (Grosse Pointe Woods, MI): Werner tied a career high for points in a game with a goal and two assists on Saturday in a 5-2 win over St. Lawrence University.

Daniel Bellissimo, WMU, FR, G (Toronto, ON): Bellissimo blocked 51-of-59 shots (.864) in a split with UAF, including 32 saves on Friday, when he won his collegiate debut.

Adam Miller, FSU, FR, F (Livonia, MI): Miller scored his first college goal, registered his first college assist and was +2 in a 4-2 loss to Ohio State on Friday.

THIS WEEK'S MATCHUPS

Thursday & Saturday

MICHIGAN VS. LAKE SUPERIOR (AT LAKE SUPERIOR & JOE LOUIS ARENA)

Last year, Michigan swept the Lakers 5-1 and 4-0 to overtake LSSU in the all-time series. The Wolverines now lead 45-44-6. The Lakers hold a 21-13-3 advantage at home, but trail U-M 9-4-0 at Joe Louis Arena. Michigan has won nine of the last 10 games against LSSU. The Lakers' last victory over U-M at Joe Louis Arena was March 18, 1995 (5-4 in overtime). They have not beaten the Wolverines at home since Feb. 22, 2001. Senior forward Milan Gajic and junior forward Jeff Tambellini lead the Wolverines with eight career points apiece against the Lakers. Gajic has a 4-4-8 line in 11 games while Tambellini has a 3-5-8 line in six games against LSSU.

Thursday & Friday

MIAMI VS. OHIO STATE (HOME-AND-HOME)

The CCHA championship banner from the Buckeyes' Super Six title last season will be raised in a pregame ceremony on Thursday at Value City Arena with the teams facing off again on Friday at Goggin Ice Arena. Ohio State leads the all-time series 51-46-6, with a 32-14-3 lead in Columbus, while the RedHawks leads the series in Oxford, 30-16-3. In the last 10, OSU owns a 6-4-0 edge. The Buckeyes and RedHawks split six games last season, with OSU taking a 4-3 overtime win in the Super Six semifinals. SR F JB Bittner leads the Buckeyes with four goals and six points against Miami in his career.

Friday & Saturday

MICHIGAN STATE AT NORTHERN MICHIGAN

Rick Comley makes his second trip as coach of the Spartans back to Marquette, Mich., where he started the Wildcats hockey program and ran it for 26 years. The Wildcats own a 5-3-0 record against their former coach, including victories at the Super Six in each of the past two seasons.

WESTERN MICHIGAN AT NEBRASKA-OMAHA

The Broncos and the Mavericks will meet for the 15th and 16th times this weekend. WMU holds a 6-5-3 series edge over the Mavs. Last season the teams were clustered together and Western went unbeaten in the four games with a 3-0-1 record. SO F Scott Parse led the Mavs last season in those four contests with 3-3-6. UNO's last victory over Western Michigan was on November 2, 2002. Their last victory against the Broncos in Omaha was on February 15, 2002.

BOWLING GREEN AT UNION

BGSU opens its regular season this weekend when it travels to Schenectady, N.Y., for a two-game series against Union College. The Dutchmen went 1-0-1 last season in Bowling Green, winning 3-1 and tying 1-1. The only other meeting between the two schools came Dec. 30, 1999, with BGSU winning in overtime, 5-4.

FERRIS STATE AT BEMIDJI STATE

Ferris State has a 3-1-0 lead over Bemidji State in the all-time series, dating back to the 1999-00 season. The Bulldogs are 2-0-0 on the road and 1-1-0 at home versus the Beavers. FSU swept the 1999-00 series (Nov. 12-13) in Bemidji, winning 8-0 and 4-2. Following a season's absence, the two teams split a two-game set in 2001-02 at Big Rapids, with the Bulldogs winning the opener (7-0) before dropping the finale 7-5. SR D Matt York has a team-high four points (0-4-4) in two career appearance against Bemidji State, while SR F Derek Nesbitt has three points (1-2-3) in two outings. SR G Mike Brown is 1-1-0 with a 2.04 goals-against average and a .925 save percentage in two appearances against BSU. FSU is 17-9-0 all-time against College Hockey America (CHA) teams and is 11-13-4 overall all-time versus Minnesota schools. FSU was 2-0-2 against CHA teams in the 2003-04 season.

ALASKA FAIRBANKS AT ALASKA ANCHORAGE

The four-game series for state bragging rights and the Governor's Cup opens with games at Sullivan Arena in Anchorage where, last weekend, the Seawolves beat Canisius and Minnesota to capture their second straight Nye Frontier Classic title. The Nanooks and SeaWolves split their four games last season, with UAF winning a shootout following the final game to retain custody of the Governor's Cup for a third straight year. Game two last season produced one of the most memorable finishes in Nanooks' history with UAF scoring three goals in the final 28 seconds of regulation time for a 5-3 victory.

Friday

BOSTON COLLEGE AT NOTRE DAME

After going 0-3-1 in the first four games to No. 4 Minnesota-Duluth and No. 9 Miami, the Irish return home to face No. 1-ranked Boston College on Friday, Oct. 22 at the Joyce Center. The game is played as part of the Notre Dame-Boston College football weekend. Boston College leads the all-time series 14-8-2. At the Joyce Center, the Eagles lead, 6-1-1. The only Notre Dame win in South Bend came on Dec. 22, 1975, a 6-5 Irish win. Since that game, the Irish are 0-4-1 versus BC at home. In the 2002-03 game, the two teams battled to a 3-3 tie. Last season, the Irish faced Boston College at Chestnut Hill with the Eagles ranked No. 1 in the country at the time. David Brown made 27 saves and Mike Walsh scored the only goal of the game at 14:56 of the third period to lead the Irish to a 1-0 upset win. That snapped an eight-game winless streak (0-6-2) for the Irish versus Boston College.
