CCHA ESSENTIAL - "Need to know" items from this week in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association.

Alaska Fairbanks- The Nanooks, outscored 22-7 in being swept in a pair of two-game series at Michigan and Bowling Green, play eight of their next 10 games at home. Ferris State, Lake State, Michigan State and Miami will all visit the Last Frontier over the next five weeks.

Bowling Green- The Falcons have announced that Stanley Cup champion and Olympic gold medalist Rob Blake will be in attendance on Friday, Jan. 28 for "Rob Blake Bobblehead Night." The first 700 fans will receive a bobblehead doll while Blake and fellow BGSU alum Nelson Emerson will hold an autograph session prior to the game.

Ferris State- Senior forward Jeff Legue earned his 77th career assist in Saturday's 4-1 loss to visiting UNO to move past Chris Kunitz (1999-03) and into 16th place on the Bulldogs' career list for helpers.

Lake Superior- The 6-6-2 Lakers, tied with Michigan State for sixth place and the final home-ice playoff berth, are three points ahead of last season's conference pace. They were 4-7-3 at the midway point of the league schedule one year ago.

Miami- The RedHawks, who halted Northern Michigan's nine game home-ice winning streak with Saturday's 1-1 tie, remain winless on the road this season with an 0-7-2 record.

Michigan- The Wolverines' record through 24 games this season (18-5-1) is their best since 1997-98 (19-4-1) when the Wolverines went on to win their ninth NCAA national championship and second in three years.

Michigan State- Spartans head coach Rick Comley will coach this weekend against LSSU, the college team he both played and coached for. Comley was a four-year letterwinner (1967-71) for the Lakers and guided them to a 59-46-3 record, and a NAIA national championship, between 1973-76.

Nebraska-Omaha- The Mavericks' tie and win on the weekend against Ferris State marks the first time in 16 conference road series that the Mavericks earned two or more points, dating back to December 6-7, 2002 at Lake Superior.

Northern Michigan- The Wildcats, thanks to a 1-0 Friday night win over Miami, and 1-1 tie against the RedHawks on Saturday, earned more points in conference play (3) during the weekend than the number of goals they scored (2).

Notre Dame- The Irish play three games in five days in three different rinks this week. They meet Michigan Tech on Tuesday at Green Bay, Wis., and then host Wisconsin at home on Friday before skating against the Badgers on Saturday at Allstate Arena, home of the AHL's Chicago Wolves.

Ohio State- Less than 3,000 tickets remain for each game this weekend at Value City Arena where the Buckeyes host Michigan in a showdown between the CCHA's top two teams. The three largest hockey crowds in arena history have witnessed the Buckeyes take on the Wolverines, including an NCAA indoor on-campus record of 17,233 on Jan. 21, 2000.

Western Michigan- Junior forward Brent Walton stands second in the CCHA scoring race with 10-15-25. He's trying to become the third Bronco in the past five years to win the conference scoring crown joining Rob Collins (2002) and Mike Bishai (2001).

CCHA- The Michigan Wolverines are 15-1-0 in conference play this season for a winning percentage of .938. The best winning percentage by a CCHA regular-season champion was posted by the 1978-79 Bowling Green Falcons who won at an .896 clip with a 21-2-1 mark during a 24-game schedule. That edition of the Falcons featured CCHA Rookie of the Year George McPhee, now the general manager of the Washington Capitals, CCHA Player of the Year Ken Morrow, who would capture an Olympic gold medal and the Stanley Cup the following year, and CCHA First Team forward John Markell, now Ohio State's head coach.

Hensick (2-2-4, +4) had a goal, an assist and +2 ranking in both weekend wins over UAF, earning first-star honors in each contest.

Matt Hunwick, UM So. (Sterling Heights, MI)

Hunwick (1-2-3, +4) scored the game-winning goal in Friday's 5-2 win over UAF and set up two goals in Saturday's 5-2 win over the Nanooks.

Goaltender

Chris Holt, UNO So. (South Surrey, BC)

Holt, who blocked 67-of-70 shots (.957) in a tie and win at FSU, was the first star of Friday's game with 34 saves and the second star on Saturday with 33 stops.

Tom Fritsche, OSU F (Parma, OH)

Fritsche (1-2-3, +1) was the first star of Friday's win at Notre Dame with a goal and an assist, and then assisted on the game-winning marker on Saturday.

CCHA Notable Performers

Tuomas Tarkki, NMU, SR, G (Rauma, Finland): Tarkki stopped 49-of-50 shots (.980) in a win and tie against Miami, including 29 on Friday for his third career shutout.

Colton Fretter, MSU, JR, F (Harrow, ON): Fretter (1-3-4) collected three assists in a 5-4 loss at WMU on Friday and scored the Spartans' first goal on Saturday in a 3-1 win over the Broncos.

Brandon Crawford-West, MIA, SO, G (San Diego, CA): Crawford-West blocked 61-of-63 shots (.968) and was a game star each night as the RedHawks lost and tied at Northern Michigan.

Chad Kolarik, UM, FR, F (Abington, PA): Kolarik (0-4-4, +4) collected a pair of assists each night out as the Wolverines swept visiting Alaska Fairbanks by identical 5-2 scores.

Daniel Bellissimo, WMU, FR, G (Toronto, ON): Bellissimo blocked 75-of-81 shots (.926) in a series split with Michigan State, including a season-high 46 in Friday's 5-4 home-ice win.

Andy Greene, MIA, JR, D (Trenton, MI): Greene scored the RedHawks lone goal in Saturday's 1-1 tie at NMU and helped his team kill all 12 Wildcat power-play chances on the weekend.

Chris Mueller, MSU, FR, F (West Seneca, NY): Mueller drew an assist in each game and finished +3 for the weekend as the Spartans split a home-and-home series with Western Michigan.

Paul Szczechura, WMU, SO, F (Brantford, ON): Szczechura had a goal and an assist in Friday's 5-4 home-ice win over MSU, and scored the Broncos' goal in a 3-1 loss to the Spartans.

THIS WEEK'S MATCHUPS

Tuesday

NOTRE DAME VS. MICHIGAN TECH

Notre Dame will play its first-ever game at the Resch Center in Green Bay, Wis. Five members of the Irish - SR D Joe Zurenko, SO D's Noah Babin and Wes O'Neill, FR F Victor Oreskovich and FR D Dan VeNard - all played their junior hockey for the Green Bay Gamblers of the USHL, who skate in home games at the Resch Center. The game with Michigan Tech is the first for the Irish versus the Huskies since Dec. 30, 1994 when the two teams met in the Great Lakes Invitational's third-place game. Michigan Tech won that game, 8-6. Current Irish assistant, Layne LeBel, a 1994 MTU grad, had a goal and an assist in that game for the Huskies. All-time, Michigan Tech leads the series with a 34-22-2 record.

Friday & Saturday

BOWLING GREEN AT NORTHERN MICHIGAN

The Falcons take their 5-2-2 road record to Marquette, Mich., for a series against the Wildcats who are undefeated in 10 straight games (9-0-1) on home ice. The Falcons lead the overall series with the Wildcats, 30-22-6. However, the series is tied between the two teams in the last 10 match-ups, 4-4-2. Seven of the last 10 games have been decided by two goals or less, including three of the four match-ups last season. BGSU is 12-14-4 in Marquette. Senior forward Ryan Minnabarriet has 2-5-7 in 10 career games against the Wildcats.

FERRIS STATE AT ALASKA FAIRBANKS

Ferris State leads the all-time series with the Nanooks by a 23-15-1 margin. But UAF, which took three of four meetings against the Bulldogs last season, has the upper hand, 12-8-1, on the Olympic-sized ice of the Carlson Center. Senior goalie Mike Brown is 4-5-0 with a 2.90 goals-against average and a .910 save percentage in nine career appearances versus the Nanooks. Counting this series versus FSU, the Nanooks are playing eight of their next 10 games at home while the Bulldogs will play seven of their last 10 games at home when this series is completed.

LAKE SUPERIOR AT MICHIGAN STATE

The Lakers and Spartans, the two least-penalized teams in the CCHA, go into their weekend series tied for sixth place in the conference standings, although LSSU has a pair of games in hand. The Lakers, who are playing their first series in East Lansing since October, 2002, are 1-9-0 against the Spartans in the last 10 meetings. Their lone victory came on Jan. 3, 2003, in Sault Ste. Marie by a score of 7-1. Michigan State leads the all-time series, 57-29-8, including a 30-11-2 advantage in Munn Arena. Last season, the Lakers lost 8-5 at home and 2-1 at Joe Louis Arena in the annual Home-and-Joe Series. LSSU sophomore goaltender Jeff Jakaitis totaled a career-high 45 saves in the loss at JLA.

NEBRASKA-OMAHA AT MIAMI

The Mavericks, coming off a three-point road weekend against Ferris State, trail the all-time series with the RedHawks, 5-6-2. The RedHawks are riding a five-game undefeated streak against the Mavericks with the past four meetings taking place in Oxford, Ohio. Goggin Ice Arena is one of two CCHA rinks that UNO has never won a game in since joining the CCHA in 1999. The Carlson Center in Fairbanks is the other. Despite being winless in Oxford (0-4-2), UNO has managed to earn a tie in each of its last two visits to Goggin.

MICHIGAN AT OHIO STATE

This rematch of last season's Mason Cup final has attracted plenty of interest in Columbus. Less than 3,000 tickets remain for each game in the 17,500 seat Value City Arena. The top three hockey crowds in arena history have witnessed the Buckeyes take on the Wolverines, including an NCAA indoor on-campus record of 17,233 on Jan. 21, 2000. The Buckeyes and Wolverines met five times last season with Michigan holding a 3-2-0 edge but Ohio State winning the CCHA playoff title with a 4-2 victory at Joe Louis Arena. Michigan leads the all-time series against OSU, 56-24-11, which includes a 24-11-5 mark in Columbus. Senior goalie Al Montoya is 4-2-2 with a 2.27 GAA, a .923 save percentage and two shutouts against Ohio State. Junior forward Rod Pelley, the CCHA's power-play goals leader, has 4-1-5 in his career against the Wolverines.

WISCONSIN VS. NOTRE DAME

Friday's game, on campus, will be televised by CSTV. The scene on Saturday shifts to Rosemont, Ill., on the north side of Chicago. Notre Dame and Wisconsin have met 59 times with the Badgers holding a 36-16-7 edge in the all-time series. The two teams met last season in Madison with the Irish getting a 2-2 tie and a 3-1 win at the Kohl Center. The last time the Badgers played at the Joyce Center was Dec. 12, 1997, a 2-1 Wisconsin win. All-time at the Joyce Center, the Badgers have a 14-6-5 record versus the Irish. The game at Allstate Arena (home of the AHL's Chicago Wolves) marks the second time Notre Dame has played there. On Jan. 18, 2003, Notre Dame played Yale in Rosemont, dropping a 3-1 decision to the Bulldogs.

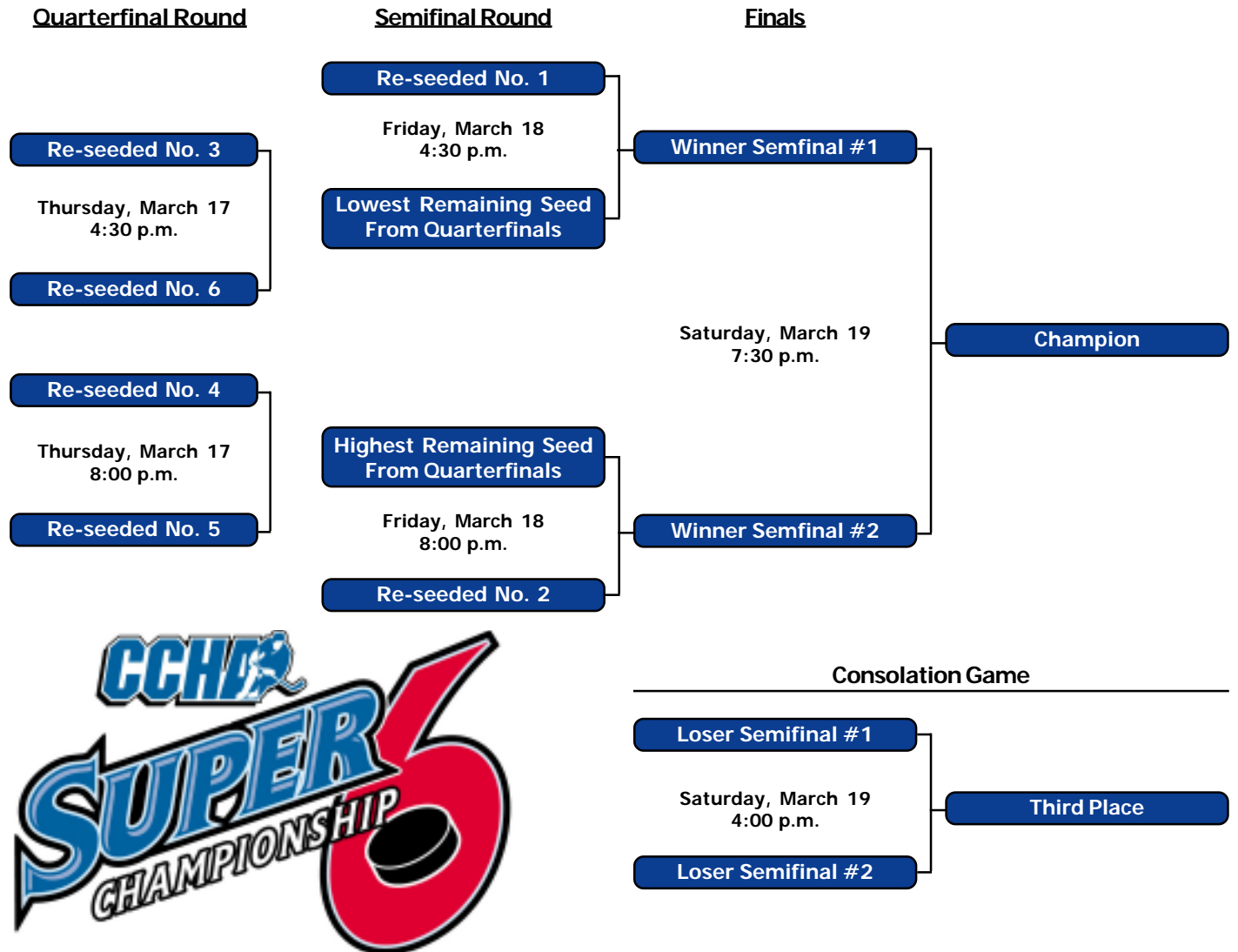

CCHA Tournament Format/Tie-breakers

The CCHA Tournament begins with all 12 teams seeded based on the final regular-season standings. The top-six seeds will host a first-round, best-of-three series. The winners of the six first-round series will then advance to Joe Louis Arena for the CCHA Super Six Championship where they will be re-seeded based upon their regular-season finish. The top two remaining seeds will receive quarterfinal-round byes while the No. 3 seed will face the No. 6 seed and the No. 4 seed will take on the No. 5 seed. The lowest seed to advance from the quarterfinals will take on the No. 1 seed in the semifinals, while the No. 2 seed will play the other remaining team. The winners will then advance on to the CCHA Championship Game while the semifinal losers will play a third-place game prior to the championship contest. The winner of the CCHA Tournament will receive the league's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament and the Ron Mason Cup.

Alaska Fairbanks returns home, following a tough four-game, 14-day road trip where the Nanooks were swept by Bowling Green and Michigan, and outscored 22-7. The Nanooks winless streak is now at eight games (0-7-1) with their last victory having occurred on Nov. 27, a 3-2 win over Notre Dame • The Nanooks return to Fairbanks this and the friendly confines of the Carlson Center this week to host Ferris State for their first series at home since hosting Northern Michigan on Dec. 10-11 • Eight of the Nanooks' next 10 games are at home where they are 3-2-1 this season • UAF went 4-for-16 (25%) on the power play on the weekend against the Wolverines. All of their goals came with a man advantage, boosting their power-play ranking from 11th to eighth in the CCHA • SO F Curtis Fraser has recorded five of his team-leading eight goals on the power play this season. He's tied for second in that category in the conference with four other players • The Nanooks held U-M off the scoresheet on six power-play chances in Saturday's game after the Wolverines cashed in on two of nine opportunities on Friday • SR G Keith Bartusch relieved FR G Wylie Rogers in Saturday's game and stopped 10-of-11 shots through 22:08 of playing time • The Nanooks trail the series against the FSU Bulldogs 15-23-1. Last year, as cluster mates, the teams met four times, with UAF sweeping FSU, 4-2 and 4-1, in Oct. and then splitting at FSU, 5-7 and 4-0, in Jan. UAF leads the series at the Carlson Center, 12-8-1.

The last time FSU competed in as many extra-sessions affairs was in the 2000-01 campaign when the Bulldogs played in eight, 60-minute plus games and registered a 1-2-5 ledger • SR F Jeff Legue (11-2-13) and SO F Mark Bomersback (3-7-10) have accounted for 27.4% (23-84) of the Bulldogs' total points production in CCHA play this season. The pair has also generated 38.9% (14-36) of the squad's total goal-scoring output in league action • Bomersback's 6-12-18 in 24 games equals his scoring total of a season ago when he accumulated 8-10-18 in 37 appearances • Legue picked up his 77th career assist in Saturday's 4-1 loss to UNO to move past Chris Kunitz (1999-03; 76 career assists) into 16th place on the school's all-time list. Legue is now two helpers away from tying Rob Collins (1998-02) for 15th place • The Bulldogs have outshot their opponents in 12 of the last 14 contests and are 6-6-2 this season when outshooting the opposition • SR D Matt York, who scored his first goal in 27 games on Friday, is one point shy of tying Keith Sergott (1992-96) for 11th place on FSU's scoring chart for defensemen. York has totaled 15-56-71 in 120 games while Sergott, a CCHA assistant referee, amassed 13-59-72 in 148 contests.

An autograph session with Blake, as well as BGSU's all-time scoring leader Nelson Emerson, is scheduled from 6-6:45 p.m. in the south end of the BGSU Ice Arena • JR D Don Morrison has already bettered his season point total from last year (2-9-11 in 38 games), with 2-11-13 in just 16 games this season. The defenseman's plus/minus rating of plus-4 is best among all Falcon blueliners • SR D Chris Pedota's first career goal on Jan. 7 against UAF made 18 different Falcons that have netted a goal in just 20 games. Seventeen Falcons scored a goal in 38 games last year • Nine different Falcons have reached double-digit point totals already through 20 games this season, led by FR F Jonathan Matsumoto with 9-8-17. Of those nine Falcons, four are freshmen, two are sophomores, two are juniors, and one is a senior • BGSU has recorded four-straight games with 35 or more shots on net. The Falcons netted a season-high 39 shots at Dartmouth (1-1 tie, Dec. 29), followed by 37 against Providence (3-2 loss, Dec. 30), 38 versus UAF (6-2 win, Jan. 7), and 35 versus UAF (6-1 win, Jan. 8). The Falcons are 5-2-1 in games with 30-plus shots • This is the fastest that BGSU has reached 10 wins in 20 games or less since 1995 when the Falcons started 10-2-1 • Of the 36 points recorded by BGSU on Jan. 7-8 against Alaska Fairbanks, 14 came from freshmen, including four each from Alex Foster (1-3-4) and Matsumoto (1-3-4).

LAKE SUPERIOR

Lake Superior State dropped to 1-6-1 against non-conference opponents after last weekend's 3-3 tie and 5-0 loss against Alabama-Huntsville. The Lakers fell to 1-2-1 against College Hockey America opponents • SR G Matt Violin started for the first time since suffering a knee injury on Nov. 26. He totaled 24 saves in the Lakers' 3-3 tie on Friday • Friday's game ended with all 10 skaters on the ice receiving double minors and 10-minute misconduct penalties. The cumulative effect of the disciplinary action makes the Lakers the second-least penalized team in the CCHA behind Michigan State • LSSU was 0-for-10 on the power play for the weekend against the Chargers. The Lakers have gone seven games without scoring a power-play goal (0-for-33) • LSSU begins a four-game road stretch against two teams (Michigan State and Alaska Fairbanks) that are trying to knock the Lakers out of sixth place in the CCHA standings. LSSU and MSU are currently tied for sixth with 14 points each, although the Lakers have two games in hand on everyone in the league except Bowling Green • LSSU is playing its first series in East Lansing since October, 2002. The Lakers are 1-9-0 against the Spartans in the last 10 meetings between the two teams. Their lone victory was a 7-1 win on Jan. 3, 2003, in Sault Ste. Marie.

MIAMI

The RedHawks traveled to Marquette to face a Northern Michigan team that was riding an eight-game winning streak. NMU knocked off Miami on Friday, 1-0, to extend its streak but Miami managed a tie on Saturday to halt the streak at nine games • SO G Brandon Crawford-West made 33 saves in Saturday's effort for Miami. It marked the seventh time this season that he had made at least 30 saves in a game • JR D Andy Greene scored the lone goal of the weekend for Miami. The goal, his fourth of the season and 15th of his career, gives him a team-leading 22 points this season • Greene's marker was the first Miami goal in over 102 minutes of play, dating back to the third period of game two of the Michigan State series on Jan. 8. It was Greene's first goal since scoring a pair in the second game of the season • Northern Michigan came into the series averaging 4.2 goals per game at home and Miami held the Wildcats to just one goal in each game • While the Miami power play failed to convert on a dozen opportunities in the series, the penalty-killing unit was a perfect 12-for-12 and is 16-for-17 in the last three games • The RedHawks are still winless on the road this season (0-7-2) and will have to wait until Jan. 28-29 when they travel to Ferris State for their next chance to break the slide • The Red and White will play host to Nebraska-Omaha this weekend in hopes of moving up in the CCHA standings • UNO has never beaten Miami in Oxford with the RedHawks leading the series at Goggin Ice Arena, 4-0-2 • Miami leads the all-time series 6-5-2 and is riding a five-game undefeated streak versus UNO • SR F Todd Grant and Greene are Miami's leading active goal scorers versus the Mavericks with two goals each.

MICHIGAN STATE

The Spartans dropped the first game of each series, except in the series against Miami • SO F Drew Miller tallied his first career hat trick, and the second by a Spartan this season, on Friday. SR F Ash Goldie scored three times against Notre Dame on Dec. 11 • JR F Colton Fretter, who scored MSU's first goal on Saturday, has at least a point in eight of MSU's last nine games, including four multiple-point games • SR F Mike Lalonde had his third multiple-point game of the season, tallying a goal and an assist on Saturday. With 49-47-96 in 139 career games, he needs just four more points to reach the century mark • SR F Jim Slater's empty-net goal on Saturday was his 150th career point. He has 58-92-150 in 140 games • The "ER" line tallied nine points on the weekend: a hat trick from Miller on Friday; a goal on Saturday and three assists on Friday from Fretter; and an assist each night by FR F Chris Mueller • Saturday marked the second time this season that the Spartans have won when their opponent scored the first goal of the game • The Spartans are 11-1-0 this season when taking the lead into the third period. On the flip side, State is 0-10 this season when trailing after 40 minutes of play.

Hensick, who leads the Wolverines in scoring with 15-17-32, was the first star of both weekend wins against visiting UAF with a goal, an assist and +2 rating in each outing • SO D Matt Hunwick pushed his career-best point streak to seven games with a goal on Friday and two assists on Saturday. He has 4-8-12 during the stretch • Against UAF, Hunwick and SO F David Rohlf became the 13th and 14th Wolverines to notch game-winning goals this season • JR G Al Montoya earned his seventh and eighth consecutive victories in the sweep of UAF to set a career-best winning streak of eight games, which dates back to Dec. 3, 2004 vs. Notre Dame • Michigan's offense continues to lead the nation in scoring as it tallied 10 goals over the weekend against Alaska Fairbanks. The Wolverines are averaging 4.38 goals per game • Michigan has swept its last six CCHA series, winning 12 straight within the conference. The Wolverines have won a record 22 consecutive home conference, regular-season games. U-M's longest CCHA home unbeaten streak is 28 games from Nov. 17, 1995 through Feb. 22, 1997 • Michigan improved its overall record against Alaska Fairbanks to 28-4-0. The tie and the win on the weekend against FSU marks the first time in 16 conference road series' that the Mavericks earned two or more points, dating back to December 6-7, 2002 at Lake Superior • UNO improved its record to 5-3-2 in Big Rapids, the most wins for the Mavs in any conference road city • FR F Bill Thomas and SO F Scott Parse ended three-game goal droughts with a goal and two assists apiece on Saturday • SO G Chris Holt has been steady in UNO's five-game conference unbeaten streak. Saturday's contest will be televised live on CSTV • The top three hockey crowds in Value City Arena have seen the Buckeyes take on the Wolverines, including an NCAA indoor, on-campus record of 17,233 on Jan. 21, 2000. Less than 3,000 tickets remain for each game this weekend in the 17,500 seat arena • SO F Bryce Anderson has a goal in each of the last three games, including the gamewinner against Notre Dame Saturday • Notre Dame's first-period power-play goal Friday ended OSU's streak of consecutive penalties killed at 29. The Buckeyes had not allowed a power-play tally in the last four games. The streak dated back to OSU's loss at Clarkson on Dec. 11. Since the Christmas break, Ohio State has stopped 36-of-38 (94.7 percent) opponent power-play chances • Ohio State held the Irish to less than 20 shots in both games of the series. Notre Dame had 19 in the opener and 18 in game two. OSU has held opponents to less than 20 shots four times this season, going 4-0 in those games • The Buckeyes are 8-1 at home this season but are coming off their first home loss, 3-2 in overtime, against Ferris State on Jan. 8 • JR F Rod Pelley's first-period goal Saturday, his team-best ninth power-play goal of the season, extended his scoring streak to four games.

In five January starts, Cey has given up eight goals for a 1.58 goals-against average. He has stopped 130-of-138 shots (.942) and is just 1-3-1 in those games. Despite a 3-7-4 record on the year, Cey has career bests with a 2.35 goals-against average and a .929 save percentage • SO D Noah Babin, who is on a four-game point streak with 1-3-4, has had a hand in each of Notre Dame's goals in the last four games. He scored the only Irish goal at Lake Superior State on Jan. 7 (1-1 tie) and then helped set up the lone goal on Jan. 8 (2-1 loss). He had assists on each goal the Irish scored in the losses to Ohio State. With 3-5-8, Babin has established career highs in goals, assists and points • JR F Tim Wallace, who played in his 101st and 102nd consecutive games for the Irish versus Ohio State, has not missed a game during his career. The Notre Dame record for consecutive games played is 114 and was set by defenseman Evan Nielsen between the 2001-03 seasons • Notre Dame's power-play goal in the first period of Friday's game snapped an 0-for-21 power-play drought for the Irish. Over the last eight games, Notre Dame is just 4-for-43 (9.3%) with the power-play • Through the first 23 games of the season, Notre Dame has played 11 games versus ranked teams. THOMAS LEADS MAVS PAST FSU

FARMINGTON HILLS, Mich. - Nebraska-Omaha wrapped up a three-point weekend with a 4-1 victory over host Ferris State. Elsewhere in CCHA action, Michigan State bounced back for split with Western Michigan, Northern Michigan goaltender Tuomas Tarkki turned in another solid performance in a 1-1 tie with Miami, Ohio State swept Notre Dame with a 3-1 win, and Michigan knocked off Alaska Fairbanks for the second straight night, 5-2. In non-conference action Lake Superior fell to Alabama-Huntsville, 5-0.

At Big Rapids, Mich., Nebraska-Omaha scored two goals in both the second and the third period to skate past Ferris State, 4-1. Freshman forward Bill Thomas and sophomore forward Scott Parse paced the Maverick offense with a goal and two assists. Goaltender Chris Holt picked up the win, making 33 saves, including 15 in a scoreless first period, for UNO. The victory marked the second road win of the season for Nebraska-Omaha.
