CCHA ESSENTIAL- "Need to know" items from this week in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association.

Alaska- The Nanooks got a goal and two assists from sophomore forward Dustin Sather to edge British Columbia, 3-2 on Friday in a game played on ice dyed pink to help recognize Breast Cancer Awareness Month.

Bowling Green- Senior defenseman Kevin Schmidt led the way with a goal and an assist in Saturday's 5-1 exhibition win over Wilfrid Laurier. Schmidt, who led all Falcon defensemen with 25 points a season ago, now has a line of 1-4-5 in four career exhibition contests.

Ferris State- Senior forward Brendan Connolly, the team's top returning goal scorer, notched a pair of goals in the Bulldogs' 4-1 exhibition win over the Windsor Lancers on Sunday afternoon at Ewingleben Ice Arena.

Lake Superior- The Lakers, who return nine of their top 10 scorers, open the season with the second annual Superior Cup. LSSU plays host to WCHA reps Minnesota-Duluth on Friday and Michigan Tech on Saturday. The Lakers tied at UMD, 2-2 and lost, 4-3 at MTU last season.

Miami- The RedHawks won their exhibition game against Ryerson University on Saturday night in dramatic fashion as senior forward Alexandre Lacombe scored a power-play goal with five seconds left to give Miami a 4-3 win.

Michigan- The Wolverines season opens with two home games vs. St. Lawrence from the ECAC. Last season, U-M was 9-1-0 against non-conference opponents, including wins over Boston College, Boston University (2), Clarkson, Minnesota and Wisconsin. The lone loss came against Minnesota in the second game of the season.

Michigan State- Senior captain and goalie Jeff Lerg leads the Spartans into their 68th season of varsity hockey beginning Friday night at Boston University in the Ice Breaker Tournament. Lerg is one of just three Hobey Baker finalists from last season that has returned to college hockey.

FREE "HAVE FUN, PLAY HOCKEY" CLINICS SET FOR 2008-09 SEASON

Boys and girls ages 5-11 can experience the fun of organized hockey for the first time at no charge

The CCHA, FSN, RBK, the Detroit Red Wings, Tim Hortons, and Perani's Hockey World plan on hosting "Have Fun, Play Hockey" clinics at all 12 CCHA member school locations and throughout Metro Detroit during the 2008-09 season. The free clinics, open to boys and girls ages 5-11, who have not played organized hockey, began Saturday, Sept. 20 in Big Rapids, Mich. Pre-registration is required.



Nebraska-Omaha- The Mavs get their first action on Monday, Oct. 13 with an exhibition game against visiting Manitoba. The Mavs dropped their first game as a varsity program to the Bisons in 1997 but have beaten them in 10 of 11 meetings since.

Northern Michigan- Freshman forward Andrew Cherniwchan scored a pair of third-period goals to help lift the Wildcats to a 4-1 victory over Toronto in exhibition play at the Berry Events Center.

Notre Dame- Tonight's 'Drop The Puck' guest speaker is Brian Burke, executive vice-president and general manager of the Anaheim Ducks and the general manager of the 2010 U.S. Olympic hockey team. Previous guest speakers at the event include; Scotty Bowman (2005), Ed Olczyk (2006) and Steve Yzerman (2007).

Ohio State- Hard-hitting senior captain Zach Pelletier fired a hat trick to lead the Buckeyes to a 9-3 exhibition win over York University. Pelletier, who sat out last season because of injury and earned his degree in criminology in the spring, was playing his first game in 18 months.

Western Michigan- Senior forward Patrick Galivan, who led the team in scoring last season, fired one goal and helped set up two others to pace the Broncos to a 5-2 exhibition victory over the University of Windsor on Saturday night at Lawson Ice Arena.

CCHA- Former LSSU Laker Brian Rolston captured the mythical NHL/CCHA alumni scoring championship last season when he tallied 31 goals and 28 assists for 59 points for the Minnesota Wild. Rolston, who is now back with the New Jersey Devils, who he played for from 1995-2000, also led all former CCHA skaters in the 2005-06 campaign with a career high 34-45-79 chart.

THIS WEEK'S MATCHUPS

MIAMI VS OHIO STATE (HOME AND HOME)

• The all-time series between Ohio State and Miami is tied, 56-56-10. Ohio State leads 34-19-6 in Columbus and the RedHawks lead, 33-20-4 in Oxford. The Buckeyes are looking to stop a six-game losing and seven-game winless streak vs. the RedHawks. The teams met five times last year, with Miami winning each meeting. Each of the last three meetings was decided by one goal, including a 4-3 Miami win Feb. 29 in Oxford in the last game of the regular season.

KENDALL HOCKEY CLASSIC

• The Alaska Nanooks venture south to Anchorage where they face Northeastern Friday and Connecticut Saturday. Alaska is 0-1 against the Northeastern Huskies and 3-1 against the Connecticut Huskies.

• Alaska visits the Sullivan Arena this weekend to play in the Seawolves' tournament and UAA will reciprocate the following weekend, making the trek to Fairbanks to join the Nanooks, the Maine Black Bears and the Mercyhurst Lakers in the inaugural Brice Alaska Goal Rush Oct. 17-18 at the Carlson Center. The Nanooks and the Seawolves will not meet in either tournament and they will have to wait until Feb. 27-28 for the Alaska Airlines Governor's Cup to settle in-state bragging rights this year.

RIT & NIAGARA AT BOWLING GREEN

• Bowling Green split with the two teams last year in Niagara, N.Y., and Rochester, N.Y., to begin the regular season. The Falcons, who host the Purple Eagles on Saturday, fell 2-0 at Niagara to begin the weekend, despite holding a 32-20 margin edge in shots. BG rebounded in Rochester with a 5-3 victory over the Tigers. SR F Derek Whitmore tallied two goals to lead the Falcons in his return home, while FR G Nick Eno earned his first collegiate win in net with 29 saves on 32 RIT shots.

• BG is 11-5-2 all-time against opponents from College Hockey America and 9-2-0 against Atlantic Hockey Association opponents.

CANISIUS AT FERRIS STATE

• It's the first time the two teams have met. Ferris State has compiled a 14-3-0 (.824) all-time record against Atlantic Hockey Association (AHA) teams, which includes a 7-2-0 home mark.

• The Golden Griffins, picked for seventh in the AHA preseason poll under third-year head coach Dave Smith, defeated Western Ontario, 6-2 in exhibition action on Sunday.

SUPERIOR CUP

• NMU will host Michigan Tech on Friday and UM-Duluth on Saturday. Last year, the 'Cats defeated MTU, 3-2 and were blanked by UM-Duluth, 4-0 with both games on the road against their WCHA opponents. NMU is 60-44-11 all-time against the Huskies and 32-31-4 all-time against the Bulldogs. Over the past five games the 'Cats are 3-1-1 against MTU and 2-3-0 against UMD. JR D TJ Miller scored his lone game-winning goal last season against MTU in the first game.

• Friday's opponent for LSSU, Minnesota-Duluth, leads the all-time series against LSSU, 6-3-3, but 11 of the 12 games have been played in Duluth. The only other game was played in Detroit in 1993. Michigan Tech is making its first trip to Sault Ste. Marie since Dec. 12, 1998. Last year's game was the first meeting between the two Upper Peninsula opponents since Dec. 30, 1999.

NIAGARA & RIT AT WESTERN MICHIGAN

• Western Michigan leads the all-time series, 7-5-0, but dropped two games at Niagara last season.

• Niagara is 1-5-0 at Lawson Ice Arena, with the only victory coming in Jim Culhane's first season in 1999-2000. The Purple Eagles defeated the Broncos, 3-2 in overtime, after losing 2-1 the previous night.

• RIT won the only previous meeting between the two teams, 4-3, in the 1985 Syracuse Invitational. Head coach Jim Culhane was in his junior year with the Broncos at the time.

ST LAWRENCE AT MICHIGAN

• Coach Red Berenson is 17-7-2 in his career against opponents from the ECAC. He is 4-0-0 versus St. Lawrence and its head coach, Joe Marsh. The last ECAC team that U-M took on was Clarkson in the 2008 East Regional final, which the Maize and Blue won 2-0 to advance to the Frozen Four.

• The last Michigan penalty shot to be attempted and converted came vs. St. Lawrence on Oct. 16, 2004, when Jason Ryznar scored on Mike McKenna en route to a 5-2 win at Yost Ice Arena.

MICHIGAN STATE AT ICE BREAKER TOURNAMENT

• MSU faces off against Massachusetts in the first game on Friday. The Spartans are 2-0 all time against the Minutemen. The first meeting came in the 1998-99 season, a 3-1 MSU win; the most recent was a 6-1 decision during the 2001-02 campaign.

• Spartans hold a slight edge, 8-7-0 on Saturday's opponent and tournament host Boston University. The last meeting of the teams came in the first round of the 2007 NCAA Tournament, when MSU handled the Terriers, 5-1 en route to its national title.

NOTRE DAME AT DENVER (HALL OF FAME GAME)

• This is Notre Dame's second appearance in the Hall of Fame game as the Irish lost, 7-3 to Minnesota on Oct. 7, 2000 at the XCel Energy Center in St. Paul, Minn.

• Notre Dame and Denver have met 47 times in the all-time series with the Pioneers holding a 34-10-3 edge in those games. The two teams were members of the WCHA for 10 seasons from 1971 to 1981 with Denver going 28-8-2 in those seasons against the Irish. The two teams met last October in South Bend with the Irish taking a 4-3 win in the series opener and the Pioneers winning the second game, 3-1 to snap a 10-game winless streak versus the Pioneers.

- The Nanooks secured a 3-2 win over the visiting University of British Columbia Thunderbirds on Friday to close out their exhibition schedule undefeated. The Blue and Gold outscored their exhibition opponents, 7-2.
- SO F Dustin Sather led the Blue and Gold offensively through its exhibition schedule, notching two goals and three assists in the pair of contests against the USA Hockey's NTDP U-18 team and the UBC Thunderbirds.
- Nanook goaltending tandem of SR Chad Johnson and FR Scott Greenham combined to turn away 40-of-42 shots (.955) in the pair of tune-up contests and managed to hold the opponents scoreless for more than 109 minutes, before UBC's Jordan Inglis struck midway through the third period on Friday.
- JR F Brandon Knelsen proved a helpful linemate, dishing out four assists to his teammates in the course of the Nanooks exhibition games.

- Nine different skaters posted a point in the Bulldogs' 4-1 exhibition win over the University of Windsor on Oct. 5 at Ewingleben Sports Arena. SR F Brendan Connolly scored twice and SO D Scott Wietecha had a goal and an assist. FSU improved its series record against Windsor to 5-1-0 and has outscored the Lancers 29-9 in those six meetings.
- Ferris State sports a 9-17-3 all-time mark in season openers heading into Friday's game versus Canisius. That includes a 2-0 non-league loss to Union last Oct. 12 in Schenectady, N.Y.
- The Bulldogs are 12-15-2 (.448) in home openers dating back to the 1979-80 season, which includes a 3-8-0 mark in the last 11 games. The Bulldogs skated to a 6-2 non-conference triumph over Wayne State in last season's home opener on Oct. 19.
- Ferris State returns 14 of its top 15 point leaders from last season, including junior forward Cody Chupp, the top producer with 11-19-30. Overall, the Bulldogs welcome back 88.9% (97-109) of their goal-scoring output and 80.6% (224-278) of their point production from a season ago.
- Chupp is the 37th captain in Ferris State history. He replaces three-year captain Adam Welch.
