NANOOKS HEAD TO BOWLING GREEN TO FACE FALCONS

Alaska plays second two-game series of season with clustermate; teams split first series in Fairbanks in mid-December

FACE OFF

The Alaska Nanooks visit Bowling Green, Ohio this weekend for a two-game conference tilt against the BGSU Falcons. They are looking to snap a nine-game losing streak that began with a 6-4 loss to BGSU in Fairbanks on Dec. 9.

NANOOKS COVERAGE

This weekend's series will be televised local in Fairbanks on KFXF Fox 7. Bruce Cech will call the game.

Cech's call will also be simulcast live on the Fairbanks radio waves at KYSC 96.9 FM and KSUA 91.5 FM. The series against the Falcons will be available on the Internet through live audio streaming at <http://ksua.uaf.edu/> and live stats will also be available online also at <http://alaskananooks.cstv.com/>.

THE SERIES

The Nanooks have met the Falcons 38 times since their first meeting on Dec. 27, 1987, when BGSU defeated Alaska 6-4. The all-time series is tied at 17-17-4; however, the Falcons have a two-game advantage against the Nanooks on their home ice with a 9-7-2 record in Bowling Green.

IN RECENT HISTORY

As members of the same cluster the Nanooks and Falcons met twice already this season in Fairbanks. Alaska earned a 4-3 victory in the opener, before BGSU came back with a 6-4 win in the rematch.

The Nanooks are 4-1 against the Falcons in their last five contests and 6-4 in the last ten. Prior to this season, Alaska had swept BGSU in the previous two weekend rendezvous, more recently in Fairbanks last Feb. and the year before in the first round of the CCHA playoffs in Bowling Green. The pair of 6-3 wins at BGSU represented the Nanooks first series-sweep on the road in the post season and their first series sweep of the Falcons in their own venue.

WHERE THEY STAND

The Nanooks are 1-9-2 overall and 1-7-2 in conference when playing on the road. They are looking to snap a nine-game winless streak this weekend the longest since the 1999-2000 season, when they lost 12 consecutive games. That was also the last season in which the Nanooks only won a single game on the road all season. Although they went 1-15, 1-13 CCHA that season, nine of

Coaches Corner



Record at Alaska: 42-45-13
CCHA Record: 27-37-10

Tavis MacMillan enters his third season as head coach of the University of Alaska Fairbanks.

The Milk River, Alberta, native had an outstanding four-year career as a Nanook. He made an immediate impact during his time, opening his career at UAF by scoring 10 goals and 16 assists for 26 points. MacMillan upped that total to 35 points in his sophomore campaign by earning seven goals and 28 assists. His junior season was even better as MacMillan had 16 goals and an amazing 41 assists for 57 points. And as if that wasn't good enough, he saved the best for last, tallying 23 goals and 51 assists for 74 points in his senior season.

He is UAF's fourth all-time leading scorer with 192 career points. He tied teammate Dean Fedorchuk for the NCAA scoring crown (74 points) during the 1993-94 season, also garnering team MVP and scholar-athlete honors.

Following graduation, he won the U.S. Senior championships with the Alaska Gold Kings in 1994-95. MacMillan returned to UAF to serve as an assistant coach for seven years to Dave Laurion and then Guy Gadowsky.

In 2003-04 MacMillan decided to take a year away from the ice to fill an administrative position in the UAF Athletics Department as the NCAA Compliance Coordinator. After a year off he was ready to rejoin the coaching ranks at the helm of his alma mater.

"I am very excited and energized by the challenge of continuing this program down the path of success," commented MacMillan after accepting the head coaching position."

"I have worn the Nanooks Blue & Gold and I take great pride in the opportunity to lead this team. I foresee this being a seamless transition because Guy (Gadowsky) and I share many similar values on what this program should represent."

MacMillan and his wife, Deon, have three daughters, Taryn (11) Camryn (6) and Lauryn (4). They reside in Fairbanks.

the games they lost were by one goal and two were lost in an extra session. This season the Nanooks have lost two games in overtime (one on the road Jan. 12 at MSU) and four of their nine games lost on the road have been by a goal.

Alaska's only win on the road thus far this season was a 4-3 decision at Nebraska-Omaha on Nov. 4.

OUTLOOK ON THE FALCONS

The Falcons are facing adversity this season much like the Nanooks. They are riding a six-game losing streak, the second longest in the CCHA.

Last weekend they were swept by Northern Michigan in Marquette by a 4-1 tally both nights.

BGSU is led in scoring and assists by junior forward Jonathan Matsumoto, who has nine goals and 14 assists in 27 games this season, while junior forward Derek Whitmore has tallied a team-high 12 goals and seven helpers.

In goal, Jimmy Spratt has played the majority of the time this season. He is 4-14-1 with a .875 saves percentage and 3.88 goals-against average.

WHERE THEY STAND

Bowling Green bottoms out the conference rankings with just three wins in conference games this season it has six points. Despite having lost its last nine games (seven CCHA games) Alaska sits seven points ahead of BGSU with 13 points on five wins and three ties.

Notre Dame, Miami, Michigan State and Michigan make up the top four teams in the CCHA and are all within five points of one another.

WHO'S THE BOSS?

Scott Paluch is in his fifth season as head coach of the BGSU hockey team. The Chicago native played for the Falcons from 1984-88, helping lead the team to four-consecutive winning seasons (.655 winning pct.). He earned All-America and All-CCHA first-team accolades as a senior defenseman during the 1987-88 season.

He is 3-5-0 vs. Alaska and its third-year head coach, Tavis MacMillan.

LAST TIME OUT

The Nanooks losing streak continued after suffering their fourth weekend sweep in as many weeks, to Michigan at the Carlson Center last weekend in Fairbanks. They have dropped 11 of their last 12 outings and are approaching their longest losing streak since the 1999-2000 season, when they fell into a twelve-game losing streak.

The Wolverines overpowered the Nanooks in Friday's match-up netting two-goals a period, which they were unable to answer until the final frame. Alaska's two third-period goals Friday were too little to late, but built some confidence that carried over into Saturday's rematch. The Nanooks came out strong Saturday dominating the first period and a half of play and owning a 1-0 lead. It wasn't enough however; as Michigan knotted the game midway through the second period and went on to score four third-period goals to complete the sweep.

ROAD RAGE

Friday night will provide an opportunity for Nanooks to start a new season trend. Besides riding a nine-game losing streak going into Friday's showdown with the Falcons, Alaska is winless (0-4-2) on the first night of a two-game series when playing on the road, while they are 1-5-0 on the second night. Their only road win this season was a 4-3 triumph over Nebraska-Omaha on Nov. 4.

THE CENTURY CLUB

Senior center Curtis Fraser became the 27th member of the Nanook Hockey program's 100-Point Club on Jan. 19 when he notched an assist on sophomore forward Adam Naglich's power-play goal at 9:48 of the third period. He then added a second helper on junior forward Kyle Greentree's goal at 16:41 of the third period and a power-play goal of his own on Jan. 20.

He has 52-50--52 in 135 career games for Alaska.

**APPROACHING A CENTURY**

Greentree is just 10 points shy of joining Fraser in the 100-point club. As a junior he will potentially become the 28th skater in program history to accomplish the career feat, making him the youngest skater to do so since head coach Tavis MacMillan and Dean Fedorchuk joined the club during their junior seasons (1992-93). The youngest skaters in program history to join the club were Steve Moria and Eric Stokes, who each had registered 100 points amidst their sophomore season (1983-84).

TWO FOR TWO

Forwards Curtis Fraser and Adam Naglich were the only players to register points in both games against the Wolverines. Fraser led the effort with two assists Friday and a goal Saturday, while Naglich got a goal on Friday and added a helper Saturday night.

Friday's two-point performance by Fraser was his sixth multi-point game of the season.

HELPING OUT

Junior blueliner Darcy Campbell's two-assist effort against the Wolverines on Saturday night, moved him into the lead for assists on the team with 15. It marked his fifth multi-point game of the season and the fourth time that he got a pair of assists in a game.

THEY'LL TAKE YOUR FACEOFF

Fraser has emerged as the Nanooks top faceoff taker this season. He has won 187 faceoffs and lost 110 for 63.0 percent efficiency.

Rookie center Dion Knelsen, who has taken the draw the most times for Alaska this season, is second to Fraser with 194 wins and 175 losses for 52.6 percent efficiency.

TALE OF TWO HALVES

After losing only two of their first 10 contests (5-2-3) the Nanooks have lost eleven of the last 14 (2-11-1).

MR. NICE GUY

Alaska's rookie forward Brandon Knelsen is the least penalized player

on the Nanooks roster to play in every game this season. In 24 contests he has only assessed two minors for four penalty minutes.

Assistant captain Curtis Fraser has also made a noticeable effort to stay out of the penalty box this season, after being one of the leaders in penalty minutes in each of his first three seasons. Fraser has been whistled for six minors this season good for 12 penalty minutes, the second fewest amongst Nanook skaters who have played in all games this season.

POWER-FUL PLAY

Despite ranking sixth in the CCHA for its power play, Alaska has the second best power play overall with 20.4 efficiency (31 of 152).

POWER-PLAYERS

The Nanooks leading scorer, junior forward Kyle Greentree, has tallied just over half of his points this season on the power play. Nine of his 17 season goals and seven of his 14 assists (16 of 31 total points) this year were scored when the Nanooks were skating with a man-advantage. He has also registered 53 shots on goal during Alaska's 152 power-play attempts.

Sophomore defenseman Tyler Eckford and senior forward Curtis Fraser are tied for second best when Alaska's opponents are short-handed. Fraser has 6-6--12, while Eckford leads the D-men on the power play with 3-9--12.

MULTIPLICITY

Junior Kyle Greentree has nine multi-point games under his belt this season, including two four-point performances, three three-point games and four two-point showings.

In his career he has recorded 19 multi-point games.

HOME COOKING

The Nanooks play six of their remaining 10 conference contests on the Carlson's Olympic ice-sheet, where they are 6-4-2 this season. They have completed two series sweeps at home against Air Force, Oct. 13-13 and Ferris State, Oct. 27-28.

HE LOOKS GOAL-LORIOUS

Junior Kyle Greentree continues to pace the Nanooks for the third consecutive season. His 17 goals in 24 games this season have surpassed his goal output from a year ago and make him the Nation's seventh best goal scorer (0.71 goals per game). He is second in power play goals also with nine (0.38 ppg/g).

He is third the CCHA in goals per game with 14 (0.78) and first in power-play goals with seven (0.39) through 18 conference contests. He is also tied for third in the CCHA's Perani Cup standings with Western Michigan's Mark Letestu. They each have 27 total points.

ONE-GOAL GAMES

Four of the Nanooks last ten games have been decided by a single goal, including the three of the last five. Eight of their games this season have resulted in a one-goal margin. They are 3-5 in games decided by a single tally.

CALLING THE SHOTS

Alaska has outshot its opponent in half of the games this season and been outshot in the other half. The Nanooks are 3-7-1 with the disadvantage in shots and 4-5-3 when they hold the advantage. The Jan. 19 game against Michigan marked the first time that Alaska tied its opponent in shots on goal, each registering 31 apiece. The Wolverines won the contest 5-2.

LEADING THE D

Sophomore defenseman Tyler Eckford continues to lead the Nanook blueliners and is third overall in scoring with 19 points (5-14--19) in 24 games this season.

He is 13th offensively amongst the nation's defenseman averaging 0.79 points per game and third in the CCHA with 0.78 points per game.

TRIPLE THREAT

Alaska's third line, composed of senior forwards Lucas Burnett and Jordan Emmerson and sophomore forward Trevor Hyatt all snapped



scoreless streaks when they registered two points apiece against Michigan State Jan. 13. Hyatt notched a goal and an assist to end a three-game scoreless skid, while Burnett got his first points in as many games with two helpers. Emmerson, who had been out for five games with a wrist injury, got his first goal of the season and added an assist for his first multi-point game of the season and first points since he helped on a goal at Northern Michigan on Nov. 11.

DION KNELSEN IS 'A' OKAY

Rookie forward Dion Knelsen was named an 'A' Prospect by the National Hockey League's Central Scouting Service (CSS).

The 5-10, 180-pound center is the first player in Nanook history to be listed as an 'A' prospect and is one of only four collegiate players to be recognized as such and the only 'A' prospect in the CCHA.

Knelsen made his return to the ice against Lake Superior State after sitting out four conference games with a shoulder injury he sustained in practice before the Nanooks series at Nebraska-Omaha.

HIGH-FIVE FOR DION

Freshman Dion Knelsen is the only Nanook skater this season to register five points in a game. He had two goals and three assists against Air Force on Oct. 14, 2006. For his stellar performance he nabbed CCHA Rookie of the Week honors on Oct. 17.

The freshman phenom has 5-11--16 this season and is the fourth best scorer on the Nanooks' roster this season. He is seventh (0.75) in the CCHA and 22nd (0.89) in the Nation for rookie scoring.

SHORT STUFF

Junior left wing Aaron Lee's short-handed marker on Jan. 7 against the Buckeyes was the Nanooks second such goal in a three-game stretch and fourth of the season. Senior center Lucas Burnett also tallied one against Alaska Anchorage on Dec. 30.

BROTHERLY LOVE

Freshman left wing Jeff Lee notched

his first collegiate goal in the Nanooks 6-2 loss at OSU on Jan. 5 and his older brother Aaron Lee snapped a three-game scoreless skid with a goal on Jan. 7 against the Buckeyes.

FROZEN FOUR SKILLS CHALLENGE

Senior forward Curtis Fraser was one of 89 finalists named for the 2007 Frozen Four Skills Challenge.

The finalists were pared down from an original list of 181 student-athletes, who were nominated by their head coaches. A committee will select the 32 players that will compete in the event.

The second annual Skills Challenge will be held April 6 at the Scottrade Center in St. Louis and will be shown live on ESPNU.

THEY'RE GETTIN TRICKY

Senior centerman Curtis Fraser scored his second career hat trick on Dec. 10 against BGSU.

Junior forward Kyle Greentree has two hat tricks on the season after getting his first at UNO on Nov. 3 and his second on Nov. 25 against LSSU.

MUSPRATT'S BACK

Junior forward Ryan Muspratt made his return to the ice from a nine-month layoff because of a knee injury noticeable as he was the only Nanook to register a point in both games against the Lakers on Nov. 24-25.

While at Notre Dame on Dec. 2-3 he continued making strides netting a power-play goal in Alaska's 3-1 loss (Dec. 2).

EARLY SIGNEES

The Nanooks signed four new players to National Letters of Intent in during the NCAA Early Signing Period. They Nanooks' Class of 2007 includes center Ron Meyers of the Victoria Grizzlies (BCHL), forward Landon Novotney of
