INSIDE PITCH

The University of Cincinnati opens the 2008 baseball season, its 12th under head coach Brian Cleary, this weekend (Feb. 22-24) in Coral Gables, Fla., against Miami (Fla.). The Bearcats are picked to finish ninth in the BIG EAST Conference this year and return 19 letterwinners from the 2007 squad that finished with a 28-28 record. The Hurricanes enter the campaign boasting 21 returning letterwinners from a team that advanced to the NCAA Regional Tournament and finished 37-24.

Cincinnati at Miami (Fla.)

SCOUTING THE HURRICANES: Miami (Fla.) posted a 37-24 overall record and a 17-13 in the Atlantic Coast Conference a year ago. Miami earned an appearance in the NCAA Regional Tournament, before being knocked off by eventual College World Series participant Louisville. Five of the Hurricanes' top six hitters from 2007 return, while two of their three weekend starting pitchers are back. Junior first baseman Yonder Alonso has started 127 consecutive games over the last two seasons. A 2008 Baseball America Preseason First Team All-American, Alonso led the Hurricanes and ACC with 18 home runs and 74 RBIs, while hitting a team-best .376 in 61 games. Head coach Jim Morris is in his 15th season at Miami and has led the program to 10 trips to the College World Series.

NOTING THE BEARCATS: Cincinnati was chosen to finish ninth in the BIG EAST in a preseason poll of the league's coaches. *Baseball America* picked the Bearcats to finish fifth. The Bearcats are led by a trio of returning all-BIG EAST performers pitcher Dan Osterbrock, infielder Josh Harrison and outfielder Tony Campana.

OPENING IN THE SUNSHINE STATE: For the fourth time in as many years, the Bearcats start their campaign in the State of Florida. Returning to the home state of head coach Brian Cleary, the Bearcats are in search of their first victory in a season opener in four years. Owning a record of 4-7 on Opening Day under Cleary, UC's last victory in a season opener came on Feb. 13, 2004, with a 3-2 win at Duke.

STAFF ACE: As a freshman, Dan Osterbrock showed flashes of greatness, and in 2007 he was one of the BIG EAST's best hurlers. Osterbrock paced the BIG EAST with nine wins and finished the year with a string of six straight starts. His 2.67 ERA and .223 opponents' batting average were ranked fourth in the BIG EAST Conference. The Cincinnati native finished seventh in the BIG EAST with 82 strikeouts. The lefthander's 2007 totals put him third on UC's single season list in wins (9), eighth in innings pitched (94.1) and seventh in strikeouts (82).

OFF AND RUNNING: The Bearcats' running game was one of the nation's best last year and became the best effort in school history. The Bearcats swiped 130 bases in 2007, ranking as the highest total ever by a UC team. Tony Campana was the catalyst, setting a Cincinnati single-season record 60 stolen bases. In 14 games, Campana swiped multiple bags including a school-record six in the second half of a doubleheader at North Carolina A&T on Feb. 24, topping Ken Schneider's previous high of five set in 1991. Campana finished as the NCAA leader in steals at better than one per game. As a team, UC ranked fourth in the country with 2.32 stolen bases per game. Efficiency was also key for the Bearcats as they stole safely in 130 of 164 attempts for an 79.3 percent success rate.

LEAD-OFF TERROR: Tony Campana was a big impact at the top of the Bearcats lineup as a junior, while patrolling center field in all 56 of this season's games. A spark plug at with a UC single-season record 60 stolen bases and hitting .329. Campana had a career-best 18-game hit streak snapped on March 25, 2007, but gathered at least one hit in all but nine games this season. In addition to leading the nation in steals per game, Campana's hit parade moved him to 11th on the UC single season hits chart with 78.

LOOKING AHEAD: After the trip to Coral Gables, Cincinnati returns to Marge Schott Stadium on Friday, Feb. 29 at 4 p.m. to take on Chicago State in the first of four games. The Bearcats own a 3-1 advantage in the all-time series after sweeping a three-game series against the Cougars last season.

During his 11 seasons at Cincinnati, Brian Cleary has established himself as one of the top coaches ever to lead the Bearcats on the diamond. After taking over a struggling program in 1997, Cleary has led the Bearcats to 267 wins in his career, ranking second on the school's all-time win list behind the legendary Glenn Sample.

By building with youth, the 39-year-old Cleary has established a strong core of young athletes. He has upgraded the talent level within the program thanks to an emphasis on aggressive recruiting. Cleary has now set his sights on taking the program to the NCAA Tournament after a 30-plus year absence.

For the past four seasons, Cleary has rebuilt a team that should be poised to contend for BIG EAST championships upon the program's move. With the completion of the state-of-the-art Marge Schott Stadium and the signing of three straight top recruiting classes, Cleary's team should be one to watch in the BIG EAST for years to come.

In the fall of 2007, Cleary served as an assistant coach during the European Championships for the Great Britain National Team. During his stay in Europe, Cleary worked with the British pitchers, helping the squad capture second place, its best-ever finish at the championships.

2007 ended with UC holding a record of 28-28. At the season's conclusion, pitcher John Baird was the 12th draft pick of the Cleary tenure when Tampa Bay selected him in the 24th round of the Major League Baseball Draft.

The progression began to show dividends during the 2006 season as Cleary guided the Bearcats to their sixth 30-win season ever and first post-season appearance since 2001.

After two straight subpar seasons, the 2005 Bearcats showed an improvement of 10 victories, finishing the campaign with a 25-30 mark. Later in 2005, UC's recruiting class received honorable mention nationally from *Collegiate Baseball* magazine.

Cleary made an immediate impact

upon joining the Bearcat family. After inheriting a team that won only five games in 1996, Cleary pushed his teams to increased win totals each of his first four years. After winning 12 games in his first year, he increased that total to 15 in 1998, 30 in 1999 and 35 in 2000.

The 1999 squad posted a breakthrough 30-29 season, shattering 17 individual and eight team records and finishing as the eighth most improved team in the nation (12-game improvement). The 30 wins marked just the third 30-win season in UC's 115 years of baseball and the first winning campaign since 1995.

In 2000, the Bearcats won a school record 35 games and advanced to the finals of the C-USA Tournament. The squad also set four individual and eight school records.

In 2001, UC garnered 34 wins, the second-most in school history, and went 16-11 in Conference USA to finish tied for third. That finish is the best ever by a Bearcat team in C-USA. Kevin Youkilis was a third-team all-American and one of three Bearcats taken in the 2001 Major League Baseball Amateur Draft. Tony Maynard was named a freshman All-American, and Chris Hamblen was a finalist for the Johnny Bench Award, given to the top catcher in the nation. For his efforts, Baseball America named Cleary one of the top-10 coaches on the rise in Division I.

Cleary came to UC after three seasons at Tulane, where he helped the Green Wave to a 116-70 mark and two NCAA Tournament appearances. Cleary's efforts as an associate head coach, assistant coach and recruiting coordinator helped Tulane to the 1996 C-USA championship and a top-25 national ranking. In addition to his duties as recruiting coordinator, Cleary coached the hitters, infielders and baserunners and served as the team's third-base coach.

A 1990 graduate of Fairfield University, Cleary, a native of Boca Raton, Fla. earned four letters and was a two-time Metro Atlantic Conference All-Academic team pick.
