FOOTBALL PREPS FOR 53RD AUTOZONE LIBERTY BOWL AGAINST VANDERBILT

- ▶ The University of Cincinnati football team has accepted a bid to play Vanderbilt University in the 53rd AutoZone Liberty Bowl on Dec. 31, 2011 at Liberty Bowl Stadium in Memphis, Tenn. The game will kickoff at 3:30 p.m. ET and air on ABC. The Bearcats will be playing in their 13th bowl game and first since 2009. UC is 6-6 all-time in post-season games and will be making its first trip to the AutoZone Liberty Bowl. UC won its third BIG EAST Championship in four years and is one of the most improved teams in the NCAA FBS after more than doubling its win total of four from a year ago.

THE SERIES

- ▶ The 2011 AutoZone Liberty Bowl will make the eighth meeting between the Bearcats and Vanderbilt in a series that dates back to 1898. The teams have not met since Oct. 8, 1994 and the Commodores have won three straight in the series.

THE COACHES

- ▶ BUTCH JONES is in his second season at the helm of the UC program. Jones has more than doubled the program's win total from a year ago and will lead the Bearcats to their 13th all-time bowl game. He has won three conference championship as a head coach (2007, 2009 at Central Michigan, 2011 at Cincinnati) and holds a 40-24 overall record and a 27-10 mark in league games.
- ▶ JAMES FRANKLIN is in his first season at Vanderbilt after spending time as an assistant at Maryland, Kansas State and a stint with the Green Bay Packers. This is his first matchup as a head coach against UC.

STREAKS, STORYLINES, SIDEBARS ...

- ▶ The University of Cincinnati, one of the five oldest football programs in college football, is in its 124th football season with an all-time record of 560-553-51 (.503).
- ▶ Cincinnati clinched a share of the BIG EAST title - its third in the last four seasons. The Bearcats finished the regular season 9-3 overall and 5-2 in BIG EAST play.
- ▶ UC will be making its 13th appearance in a postseason bowl, including its fifth in the last six seasons.
- ▶ UC Head Coach Butch Jones earned his third conference championship as a head coach (2007, 2009 at Central Michigan, 2011 at Cincinnati) and his 40th career victory.
- ▶ During the season, UC went 71 days without playing a true home game at Nippert Stadium. Following the Bearcats 44-14 win over N.C. State on Sept. 22, UC played home games against Louisville (W, 25-16 on Oct. 15) and West Virginia (L, 24-21 on Nov. 12) at Paul Brown Stadium in downtown Cincinnati.
- ▶ In its final six games of 2011, UC faced four road games, one at PBS and one game at Nippert Stadium, putting together a 4-2 record despite losing starting QB Zach Collaros for the regular season with three games to go.
- ▶ UC leads NCAA FBS in sacks (3.58) and tackles for a loss (8.92).
- ▶ UC recorded 40 sacks over the last 10 games of the regular season.
- ▶ UC leads BIG EAST, ranks 11th nationally in turnover margin (0.9/+11).
- ▶ LB JK Schaffer ranks third in the BIG EAST in tackles, averaging 8.8 per game. He finished with 105 tackles in the regular season, the third straight year he has eclipsed that mark, making him only the fifth UC player all time to do so.
- ▶ DT Derek Wolfe leads the BIG EAST and ranks sixth nationally with 19.5 tackles for a loss and ranks third in the league and tied for 12th in the FBS with 9.5 sacks.
- ▶ RB Isaiah Peard was one of three 1,000-yard rushers in the BIG EAST Conference, tallying 1,110 yards along with a league high 14 touchdowns. Peard is the first UC back in 25 yards to have 1,000-yards rushing in back-to-back seasons. He also became just the third UC RB all time to eclipse 3,000 career rushing yards.
- ▶ QB Zach Collaros missed the final 3.5 games of the regular season after suffering a broken right ankle against West Virginia. Prior to his injury, Collaros 154-of-243 for 1,860 yards and 14 touchdowns. His 140.1 pass efficiency rating still ranks second in the BIG EAST. He is rehabbing and working towards playing in the Liberty Bowl.

- ▶ UC and VU both played Connecticut and Tennessee in 2011. Both were victorious over the Huskies (UC W, 35-27; VU W, 24-21) and both fell to the Volunteers at Neyland Stadium (UC L, 45-23; VU L, 27-21/OT).

UC-VANDY TIES

- ▶ VU OL coach Herb Hand and UC Head Coach Butch Jones were on the West Virginia staff together from 2005-06.
- ▶ UC Co-Defensive Coordinator Tim Banks and VU Head Coach James Franklin were on the Maryland staff together from 2003-04. Frankling coached the wideouts while Banks mentored the inside linebackers. Vandy offensive Coordinator John Donovan was also on the Maryland staff with Banks from 2003-06.

MITCH'S MISSION

- ▶ The Bearcats adopted Mitch Stone, a 13-year old brain cancer patient, through the Friends of Jaclyn Foundation in 2009.
- ▶ Mitch, a Cincinnati native who attends Nagel Middle School, was diagnosed with a primitive neuroectodermal brain tumor (PNET) in Feb. 2009.
- ▶ He underwent surgery to remove the tumor, four bouts of chemotherapy, and 31 radiation treatments.
- ▶ Mitch has been cancer free since November of 2009.
- ▶ The Stone family has dubbed his battle Mitch's Mission.
- ▶ Mitch has attended numerous games and practices, and has led the team out of the tunnel on three occasions.
- ▶ Student-athletes, coaches, and support staff wear red white and blue wrist bands that say 'Mitch's Mission.'
- ▶ UC was the first NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision team to adopt a child through FOJ.
- ▶ In December of 2009, Mitch started 'Mitch's Mission', a non-profit organization that raises funds to send children with cancer and blood diseases to summer camp.

UC-LIBERTY BOWL TIES

- ▶ Liberty Bowl Executive Director Steve Ehrhart coached Steve Stripling as a freshmen at Colorado in 1971.

UC-MEMPHIS TIES

- ▶ Memphis entrepreneur Michael D. Rose is a 1963 graduate of and longtime donor of UC.

UC IN LIBERTY BOWL MEMORIAL STADIUM

- ▶ The AutoZone Liberty Bowl marks UC's 17th all-time game at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium and its first since 2003.
- ▶ The Bearcats are 4-12 all time in the stadium with all 16 games coming against the University of Memphis.
- ▶ UC was victorious in two of the past three games it played in the River City.

WINNING ON THE FIELD

- ▶ Over the past four seasons, the stats for the UC football program read like this: 46 wins, four bowl games, including a pair of Bowl Championship Series matchups, three BIG EAST Conference Championships and a 77% graduation success rate.
- ▶ In terms of national scope, UC is only one of two BCS AQ programs, along with Oregon, to have won a share of its conference title three times in the past four years.

WINNING OFF THE FIELD

- ▶ Along with its three league championships in the past four years, UC has also put together a 77% graduation success rate (GSR) for student-athletes entering school from 2001-04, well above the 21 school average of 64%.
- ▶ Of the 21 BCS AQ universities who have won conference championships over the past four seasons, UC ranked third behind only Penn State (84%) and Connecticut (78%), each of which won only a single league title in the past four years.
- ▶ In the conference rankings, the BIG EAST (73.4%) leads the ACC (66.6%), SEC (64.9%), BIG (64.6%), Pac-12 (55.9%) and Big 12 (51.4) with its league champions' graduation rate over the past four campaigns.

SCHAFFER LEADS ACADEMIC TOP-5

- ▶ During the 2011 fall quarter, UC was led on the field and in the classroom by LB JK Schaffer.
- ▶ The senior captain was a First-Team All-BIG EAST honoree and also was the only UC player to earn a 4.00 GPA this quarter.
- ▶ Rounding out UC's Academic Top-5 were: OL Eric Lefeld (3.94),

CLEANING UP THE AWARDS

- ▶ Eight University of Cincinnati football student-athletes earned All-BIG EAST Conference honors, and the Bearcats took home three of the top individual awards.
- ▶ Head Coach Butch Jones was named BIG EAST Coach of the Year, RB Isaiah Pead the league's Offensive Player of the Year and DT Derek Wolfe the conference's Co-Defensive Player of the Year.
- ▶ Along with Pead, who was a unanimous first team selection, and Wolfe, DB Drew Frey, OL Randy Martinez, P Pat O'Donnell and LB JK Schaffer also earned First Team All-BIG EAST honors.
- ▶ OL Alex Hoffman and QB Zach Collaros both earned spots on the league's second team.
- ▶ The last time a BIG EAST team owned piece of Offensive POTY, Defensive POTY and Coach OTY in one season was Miami (FL) in 2001 (Ken Dorsey, Ed Reed, Larry Coker).
- ▶ Pead is UC's first offensive player of the year honoree, Wolfe its first defensive player of the year while Jones' coach of the year award is the fourth in last five years for UC.

LEADERSHIP STARTS AT THE TOP

- ▶ Head Coach Butch Jones is in his second season at UC and is the 2011 BIG EAST Coach of the Year.
- ▶ Jones guided the Bearcats to their third conference championship in four years, led the team back to a bowl game after a 1-year hiatus and helped the program more than double its win total of a year ago.
- ▶ He earned his third league championship as a head coach (2007, 2009 at Central Michigan, 2011 at Cincinnati) and his 40th career victory in the season finale against Connecticut.

CLASSROOM NEWS & NOTES

- ▶ The UC football team won its third BIG EAST Conference Championship in four years this season and also posted some championship numbers in the classroom.
- ▶ The Bearcats' overall team GPA for the fall quarter was a 2.73 which is a significant improvement over the in-season GPA of 2.69 the Bearcats posted in the fall of 2010.
- ▶ Forty-three student-athletes achieved a 3.0 GPA or better while 23 student-athletes earned spots on the Dean's List, with quarter GPAs of 3.4 or above.
- ▶ First-Team All-BIG EAST selection J.K. Schaffer finished the quarter with a 4.0 GPA in criminal justice.
- ▶ Tomaz Hilton and John Hughes both earned their degrees this fall, joining seven student-athletes on the roster, Tom DeTemple, Steve Hancock, Alex Hoffman, Randy Martinez, Shane Popham, Rob Trigg and Orion Woodard, who had previously earned diplomas.

THE ALL-AMERICAN

- ▶ DT Derek Wolfe, the BIG EAST Conference Co-Defensive Player of the Year, earned spots on five All-America teams.
- ▶ He was named a Second-Team All-America selection at DT by the Associated Press, Scout.com, SI.com and Yahoo! Sports.
- ▶ Wolfe also earned a Third Team All-America nod from Phil Steele Magazines.
- ▶ Wolfe leads the BIG EAST and ranks sixth nationally with 19.5 tackles for a loss and ranks third in the league and tied for 12th in the FBS with 9.5 sacks. Wolfe sits in fourth place on the UC career sacks list with 19.5 and 10th place on the UC career tackles for loss list with 35.0.

- ▶ He was a first-team all-BIG EAST choice this season and posted 64 tackles, which ranks fourth on the team.
- ▶ He is UC's sixth all-American since 2007, joining Terrill Byrd (2007), Trevor Canfield (2008), Mardy Gilyard (2009), Kevin Huber (2007, 2008), and Mike Mickens (2007, 2008).
- ▶ Wolfe is the fifth DT to win the BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year award, joining the likes of Warren Sapp and Dan Klecko.
- ▶ Wolfe also finished strong in the classroom, posting a term GPA of 3.667 in his criminal justice major.

CAPTAIN COMEBACK?

- ▶ QB Zach Collaros missed the final 3.5 games of the regular season after suffering a broken right ankle vs. West Virginia.
- ▶ He returned to practice five weeks post-surgery and is preparing to play in the AutoZone Liberty Bowl.
- ▶ Prior to his injury, Collaros, a Second-Team All-BIG EAST selection, was 154-of-243 for 1,860 yards and 14 touchdowns.
- ▶ His 140.1 pass efficiency rating still ranks second in the BIG EAST
- ▶ Collaros has 24 starts under center at UC and is the school's all-time leader in completion percentage (.627).
- ▶ He is 473-of-754 for 6,198 yards and 50 TDs, making him only the second UC QB all time to throw for more than 5,000 yards and have 50 passing TDs along with Gino Guidugli.
- ▶ Collaros currently ranks second in career touchdown passes (50), fourth in career passing yards (6,198) and career pass completions (473) and fifth in career pass attempts (754).

CLOSING STRONG

- ▶ WR Anthony McClung led UC in all receiving categories in 2011.
- ▶ McClung caught 46 balls for 675 yards and five scores.
- ▶ He was named the BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Week following his performance in the regular season finale against Connecticut, grabbing eight catches for a career-high 142 yards with two touchdowns.
- ▶ He had a team-high five TD receptions in the regular season.

STRONG ON AND OFF THE FIELD

- ▶ Drew Frey, UC's starting strong safety, won UC's Brig Owens Outstanding DB award at the postseason banquet.
- ▶ Frey, a First-Team All-BIG EAST selection, was second on the team with 67 tackles. He added 2.5 tackles for a loss, a pair of interceptions which included a pick six in the season finale, six pass break ups, eight passes defended and two QB hurries.
- ▶ Frey accomplished all this despite missing practice time due to academics. The junior finished the quarter with a 3.667 GPA in his Architectural Engineering major.

SHORING UP THE BACK END

- ▶ DB Wesley Richardson started 12 games at free safety, quarterbacking a much improved UC defense.
- ▶ He ranked third on the team with 66 tackles, including 37 solo stops, five passes defended, four pass break ups a forced fumble and interception.

A MAN IN THE BACKGROUND

- ▶ LS Tom DeTemple had 125 snaps without a miss this year and also added a tackle on kick coverage. UC led the BIG EAST in net punting behind the snapping of DeTemple and kicking of Pat O'Donnell, the First-Team All-BIG EAST punter.

BALANCE AMONG RECEIVERS

- ▶ UC's Top-Four receivers, McClung (48), Kenbrell Thompkins (44), DJ Woods (37) and Isaiah Pead (36) all finished within 12 receptions of each other.

BIG EAST GOES WEST • ADDS FIVE

- ▶ The BIG EAST Conference formally announced the addition of five prestigious universities to its ranks Dec. 7, bringing its football membership to 10 and securing a strong core group of FBS schools as it expands into two divisions and works toward its goal of staging an annual conference football championship game.
- ▶ The University of Central Florida, University of Houston and Southern Methodist University have accepted full membership into the BIG EAST while Boise State University and San Diego State University will compete as members in the sport of football.
- ▶ UCF, Houston and SMU will begin competing in all BIG EAST-sponsored sports in the 2013-14 academic year, while Boise State and San Diego State will start competing in football in the 2013 season.
- ▶ This expansion clearly moves the Conference far beyond its origins in the Northeast.
- ▶ With these five new members, the Conference will continue to have the single largest media footprint in college football, spanning literally from coast to coast and all the major regions in between.
- ▶ In effect, the BIG EAST will be the first truly national college football conference.

BIG FOOT REIGNS

- ▶ P Pat O'Donnell, a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award, finished with a net punting average of 43.9 yards per kick, including 25 kicks dropped inside the 20 and a league high 15 boots of 50 yards or more.
- ▶ O'Donnell, the First-Team All-BIG EAST punter, also handled the kickoff duties, averaging 63.9 yards per kick and giving the opponent an average starting field position on the 27-yard line.

ACADEMIC HONORS

- ▶ OL Austen Bujnoch took home the C-Club Strothman Award for Academic Excellence at the team banquet.
- ▶ Bujnoch, who started 12 games at right guard, had a 3.667 GPA in his history major this past quarter.
- ▶ Bujnoch's older brother Digger, a UC letterwinner from 2004-07, won the same honor following the 2007 season.

NOTING DEFENSIVE IMPROVEMENT - THE DEHNER FILES

- ▶ Poking around some of the regular season defensive stats, the numbers backed up the obvious on-field improvement.
- ▶ After finishing last year 68th in total defense, nationally, UC finished 46th this season.
- ▶ Here's a chart of some of the statistical improvements from 2010 to 2011:

A DOMINANT DEFENSIVE FRONT

- ▶ In addition to leading the NCAA FBS in sacks and tackles for a loss in the regular season, UC also finished first in the nation with 318 negative sack yards created.
- ▶ The next closest team in the country, Stanford, finished with 26 yards less than that.
- ▶ UC was tops in the nation in TFL, with 8.92 per game. No. 2 in the country was USF with 8.08. No. 3 was Marshall with 7.92. That means, outside of one team, UC was a full TFL per game better than the rest of the country in that category.

THE BLACKCAT DEFENSE

- ▶ UC leads NCAA FBS in sacks (3.58) and tackles for a loss (8.92).
- ▶ Five Bearcats rank in the BIG EAST Top-20 in sacks and four are ranked among the Top-20 in tackles for a loss, both league highs
- ▶ The Bearcats recorded 40 sacks over the last 10 games of the regular season.
- ▶ UC leads BIG EAST, ranks 11th nationally in turnover margin (0.9/+11).
- ▶ UC is second in the BIG EAST in rushing defense (92.7, 11th in FBS).
- ▶ UC is one of seven FBS teams to hold opponents under an average of 100 yards on the ground in 2011. Eight rushing

TDs allowed is the fewest in the BIG EAST and is tied for fifth nationally.

YOU GIVETH, WE TAKETH

- ▶ UC's 30 turnovers gained were tied for ninth best in the nation and more than doubled the team total of 14 from a year ago.
- ▶ The Bearcats 14 interceptions was a +6 on the team's eight from 2010. Seven players had interceptions in 2011, with Schaffer and Deven Drane leading the way with three apiece.

ADDING TO THE TOTAL

- ▶ Cincinnati's six defensive touchdowns this season (three interception returns and three fumble returns) are the most since the 2002 Bearcats posted seven touchdowns via the defense (four interception returns and three fumble returns).

HEART & SOUL

- ▶ LB JK Schaffer, a First-Team All-BIG EAST honoree, ranks third in the conference in tackles, averaging 8.8 per game.
- ▶ He finished with 105 tackles in the regular season, the third straight year he has eclipsed that mark, making him only the fifth UC player all time to do so.
- ▶ The other four are: Hassan Champion, Phillip Curry, Brad Jackson and Karl Woods.
- ▶ He is the BIG EAST's leading active tackler with 328 stops.
- ▶ He is also be just the fourth player in BIG EAST history to hit 100 tackles in three-straight seasons, along with Dan Morgan from Miami (FL) (1998-2000), H.B. Blades from Pittsburgh (2004-06) and Gerald Hayes, also from Pitt (2000-02).

THE GUY GUY

- ▶ RB Isaiah Pead, the BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Year, was one of three 1,000-yard rushers in the BIG EAST Conference, tallying 1,110 yards along with a league high 14 touchdowns.
- ▶ Pead is the first UC back in 25 yards to have 1,000-yards rushing in back-to-back seasons.
- ▶ He also became just the third UC RB all time to eclipse 3,000 career rushing yards.

SUPER SUBS

- ▶ QB Munchie Legaux started the final three games of the season for injured Zach Collaros, going 2-1 and throwing 5 TD passes.
- ▶ The sophomore notched career highs in each start, finishing the regular season finale 15-of-35 for 217 yards and three TDs.
- ▶ At Syracuse, UC used a two-QB system with Jordan Luallen acting as a key spark off the bench at the Carrier Dome. The sophomore transfer ran the ball eight times for 77 yards in the win.

FRESHMAN MAKING AN IMPACT

- ▶ WR Alex Chisum had a strong campaign, earning more playing time as the season went on, including a pair of starts. Chisum had 18 catches for 290 yards and two TDs.

STAYING INVOLVED

- ▶ UC's tight ends, Blake Annen, Travis Kelce and Adrien Robinson, combined for 20 catches and five TDs.

DON'T LEAVE THESE GUYS OUT

- ▶ The UC offensive line did a tremendous job all season long, finishing second in the BIG EAST in sacks allowed, giving up just 1.5 per game.
- ▶ The OL lost starter Sean Hooley midway through the season,

but redshirt freshman Eric Lefeld, a converted DL who has put on over 45 lbs since arriving at UC, filled the void and helped lead UC to the title.

- ▶ Randy Martinez (First Team) and Alex Hoffman (Second Team) earned All-BIG EAST honors.

AN UNLIKELY STORY

- ▶ K Tony Miliano, a redshirt freshman walk-on who won the kicking job in camp, was 16-of-22, including a 7-for-7 mark on kicks of 20-29 yards, and a pair of season-long 48-yard kicks.
- ▶ He had two three-field goal games (NC State, at Syracuse) and set a career high with four makes inside always tricky Heinz Field. He was also 43-of-46 on extra points.

WELCOME HOME

- ▶ Following the 44-14 win over NC State inside Nippert Stadium on Sept. 22, UC went for 71 days without playing at Nippert, ahead of this weekend's Dec. 3 game against Connecticut.
- ▶ UC's next two home games against Louisville (10/15) and West Virginia (11/12) will take place at Paul Brown Stadium.

THE FLASH

- ▶ True freshman Ralph David Abernathy IV showed he has a bright future ahead of him, averaging 24.7 yards per return (37 ret./914 yards) with a long run back of 74 yards at Syracuse.
- ▶ He ranked 41st nationally and fourth in the BIG EAST.

LOOK OUT FOR THESE GUYS

- ▶ A pair of true freshmen, OL Daniel Murray and DL Silverberry Mouhon were named UC's offensive and defensive Scout Team Players of the Year, respectively.

SPECIAL TEAMS ACE

- ▶ Senior Orion Woodard has amassed 23 tackles this season, all on special teams.
- ▶ He tallied four tackles in a game on two occasions, vs. Louisville and at Syracuse, and added three apiece against Connecticut and at Pittsburgh.

TROPHY GAMES

- ▶ UC won all three of its rivalry games for the third time in four years, retaining both the Victory Bell (Miami OH) and Keg of Nails (Louisville) and reclaiming the River City Rivalry Trophy (Pittsburgh), filling the Richard E. Lindner Center trophy case.

I CAN SEE FOR YARDS AND YARDS AND YARDS

- ▶ RB Isaiah Pead leads the BIG EAST in scoring, averaging 7.0 points per game and ranks second in rushing (92.5 ypg).
- ▶ His 14 TDs (11 rush, 3 rec) is the most of all BIG EAST players.
- ▶ With his fourth carry of the game Syracuse, RB Isaiah Pead (3,139) became the third UC player all-time to eclipse 3,000 career rushing yards. He joins Reggie Taylor (1983-86/4,242) and DeMarco McCleskey (1998-02/3,487).
- ▶ Pead had his first career punt return in the 2nd quarter, a 34-yarder, marking UC's longest punt return of the 2011 season.
- ▶ He tallied 80 yards on the ground, topping 1,000-yards rushing for the second-straight season.
- ▶ He is the first UC player in 25 seasons (Reggie Taylor/1984-86) to break the 1,000-yard plateau in back-to-back seasons.
- ▶ Pead added a career-best nine receptions for a career-best 112 receiving yards, including a 69-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter. It was his first career 100-yard receiving game.
- ▶ He totaled a game high 246 all-purpose yards on 28 touches,

an average of 8.8 yards per touch.

- ▶ He is in sole possession of third place in school history with 26 career rushing touchdowns.
- ▶ His career mark of 6.07 yards per rush ranks seventh among active NCAA FBS players.

GOING STREAKING

- ▶ UC has won 21 consecutive home non-conference games at Nippert Stadium, dating back to a three-overtime, 30-24 win over Temple on Sept. 20, 2003.

TWO-HEADED MONSTER

- ▶ QBs Muncie Legaux and Jordan Luallen split time at Syracuse Saturday with Luallen providing quite the spark of the bench.
- ▶ Luallen, the sophomore transfer, came into the game on UC's first drive of the second quarter, completing his first career pass, a 9-yarder to WR Kenbrell Thompkins. Luallen was 2-of-2 on the drive for 10 yards and also added 31 rushing yards on four carries. For the game, he finished with 77 yards rushing on eight attempts (9.6 ypc) and was 2-of-3 passing for 10 yards.
- ▶ Legaux completed his first career TD pass, hitting TE Travis Kelce for a 2-yard score late in the second quarter, which gave UC a 10-6 lead. He later connected with Pead on a career-long 69-yard pass for a touchdown with 9:13 left in the game.
- ▶ Legaux finished 13-of-22 for 169 yards and 2 TD.

THE KID CAN KICK

- ▶ K Tony Miliano got UC on the board with a 27-yard field goal with 9:08 remaining in the first half at Syracuse.
- ▶ He added a 22-yard attempt in the third quarter, and later a career-long tying 48-yarder.

ENDING THE DROUGHT

- ▶ The Bearcats' 2-yard TD pass from QB Muncie Legaux to TE Travis Kelce with 2:06 left in the first half at Syracuse snapped a 101:14 scoreless streak, dating back to the fourth quarter of the West Virginia game.

CATCHING THE FLASH

- ▶ KR Ralph David Abernathy IV's third-quarter-opening kickoff return of 71 yards at Syracuse was the longest of the season for UC and the Bearcats' longest kick return of any kind since Mardy Gilyard's 99-yard kickoff return for a touchdown against Pittsburgh in 2009.

NIPPERT STADIUM

STREAKING AT HOME IN NON-LEAGUE PLAY

- ▶ UC has won 21 straight home non-conference games at Nippert Stadium, dating back to a 30-24 win over Temple in three overtimes on Sept. 20, 2003.
- ▶ UC is 15-0 on the home turf in non-conference play since the 2007 season.

SELLOUTS AT NIPPERT

- ▶ Including the 2010 campaign, Nippert Stadium has enjoyed a total of 21 sellouts in its lengthy history.
- ▶ Four of UC's six home games in 2009 were sellouts.

NIPPERT STADIUM

- ▶ Construction began on UC's home field, Nippert Stadium in 1916 and was completed in 1923.
- ▶ UC has used the Nippert site as a playing field since 1902, making it the second-oldest playing site in the nation for college football behind Penn's Franklin Field (1895).
- ▶ Among NCAA FBS schools, Nippert is the third-oldest stadium still in use, behind Bobby Dodd Stadium (Georgia Tech - 1913), Davis Wade Stadium (Mississippi State - 1914) and ahead of Wisconsin's Camp Randall Stadium, which was built in 1917.
- ▶ Head coach Butch Jones calls Nippert the 'Wrigley Field' of college football.

GOING STREAKING

- ▶ UC had a 14-game Nippert Stadium winning streak snapped in 2010 against USF. The streak dated back to the 2008 season.
- ▶ Spanning the 2008-09 seasons and the first two home games at Nippert in 2010 (UC played Oklahoma at Paul Brown Stadium), marked the first time in UC history the Bearcats went undefeated at home in back-to-back seasons.
- ▶ The school-record streak of 15-straight wins was set during a span from Nov. 8, 1952-Nov. 13, 1954.
- ▶ Ten of the Top 12 crowds in Nippert history, including a stadium record of 35,106 against Illinois in 2009, have occurred since 2007.
- ▶ Since 2007, UC has set four-straight attendance records and over 800,000 fans (853,281) have come through the Nippert and Paul Brown Stadium turnstiles.

CHARTING THE NON-CONFERENCE OFFENSE

COMPARING THE OFFENSE - NON-CONFERENCE PLAY (FROM THE PDJ FILES)

- ▶ Through five non-conference games, UC has shown great offensive balance with 1,104 yards rushing and 1,096 yards passing, an average of 440.0 yards per game.
- ▶ It's 1,104 rushing yards are the team's most in non-league play over the past five seasons.

A RARE OCCURENCE

- ▶ UC was held to a season-low 225 yards in the loss at Rutgers.
- ▶ It was the Bearcats' lowest offensive total since posting 212 yards at Ohio State on Sept. 16, 2006.
- ▶ The output against Rutgers snapped a 71-game streak of posting at least 230 yards of total offense.
- ▶ The three points scored was UC's lowest total since being shut out by West Virginia on Nov. 9, 2005, a span of 75 games of scoring seven or more points.

PEAD GETTING IT DONE AT PBS

- ▶ RB Isaiah Pead has compiled 444 rushing yards on 60 carries for three touchdowns (7.4 yards per carry) in three career games at Paul Brown Stadium.
- ▶ Pead ran 19 times for 113 yards with two rushing touchdowns against WVU.
- ▶ He ran 21 times for 145 yards against Louisville on Oct. 15 this season and 21 times for 169 yards against Oklahoma in 2010.

INTO THE FIRE

- ▶ QB Munchie Legaux was thrown right into the action in relief of Zach Collaros against West Virginia.
- ▶ He ran eight times for 77 yards and one touchdown and completed 10-of-21 passes for 144 passing yards, giving the Bearcats a lead late in the game and putting them in position to kick a game-tying field goal with three seconds left.
- ▶ Legaux registered his second career rushing touchdown with a seven-yard score at 4:25 in the third quarter.

MUNCHIE?

- ▶ Munchie Legaux, sophomore QB from New Orleans, La. and Edna Karr High School saw action as a receiver for UC in 2010.
- ▶ He was a three-star recruit by Rivals.com, Scout.com, and ESPN.com and rated as the No. 12 dual-threat quarterback nationally by Rivals.com
- ▶ His full name is Benton Shannon Legaux.
- ▶ The nickname Munchie has existed since age 2 when family members tickled by the sight of his attempts to chew food minus two front teeth replaced Benton Shannon with Munchie.

BEHIND ENEMY LINES

- ▶ The Bearcats defense registered a season-high 18 tackles for loss against the Mountaineers.
- ▶ UC leads the NCAA FBS with an average of 8.67 tackles for a loss per game.
- ▶ Five Bearcats recorded multiple tackles for loss against WVU. DL Walter Stewart and Dan Giordano set career highs with three TFL, while Derek Wolfe (3), JK Schaffer (3) and John Hughes (2) tied their career-best marks.

THE MAN IN THE MIDDLE

- ▶ DT John Hughes blocked a 39-yard Tyler Bitancurt field goal attempt in the third quarter of the WVU game. It was the first blocked kick by the UC defense this season and the first blocked FGA for the Bearcats since Dec. 18, 2004 against Syracuse (Adam Roberts).
- ▶ Hughes also posted a career-high two sacks against the Mountaineers.

GOING BOWLING

- ▶ UC is bowl eligible for the first time since the 2009 season.
- ▶ The Bearcats have played in 12 bowl games, including a pair of Bowl Championship Series appearances, over 123 seasons with a 6-6 overall mark.

MAD PEEPS

- ▶ The attendance of 48,152 at Paul Brown Stadium for the WVU game marked the highest attendance figure for a Cincinnati home BIG EAST conference game.
- ▶ It also was the third-highest number for any UC home game in school history behind Ohio State (66,319) on Sept. 21, 2002 and Oklahoma (58,253) on Sept. 25, 2010.

SEEING RED

- ▶ Cincinnati wore red pants as part of its uniform for the first time since 1993.
- ▶ The WVU game served as UC's annual Ring of Red Game.

SECOND HALF ADJUSTMENTS

- ▶ The UC defense came up strong in the second half against Pittsburgh, holding the Panthers to three three-and-outs, a turnover on downs, a fumble and interception.
- ▶ On Pitt's first six drives of the game, they scored three field goals, a pair of touchdowns, tallied 269 yards of offense and only punted once to lead 23-13 with 13:21 left in the game.
- ▶ On their final eight drives, the Panthers gained 51 yards and only one first down, punted four times, lost a fumble, had a pass intercepted and missed a field goal.

MILIANO COMES THROUGH AT HEINZ

- ▶ K Tony Miliano was named the National Placekicker of the Week by the The College Football Performance Awards after tying the UC single-game record with four field goals made in UC's 26-23 win at Pittsburgh.
- ▶ Heinz Field is known for its tricky kicking conditions, but Miliano had no trouble, connecting on kicks of 27, 40, 32 and 41 yards.
- ▶ It marked the eighth time in school history a kicker has hit four field goals in a game and the first time since Jacob Rogers did it in 2009 at Connecticut.
- ▶ It was Miliano's second career multiple field goal game.

2011 CINCINNATI FOOTBALL

GREEK DANCING

- ▶ QB Zach Collaros had rushing TDs of 7 and 3 yards at Pittsburgh, his third game of the season with multiple rushing TDs. He has eight rushing scores in 2011 and 16 for his career.
- ▶ Collaros was 19-of-32 for 244 yards and two interceptions.

CHANGING THE TEMPO

- ▶ DB Camerron Cheatham had his second interception of the season and third of his career at Pittsburgh late in the third quarter on a Tino Sunseri pass that was tipped by DL Walter Stewart.
- ▶ Cheatham is sixth on the team with 49 tackles and also has six passes defended and four pass break ups.

GETTING ACADEMIC WITH THE GSR

- ▶ UC once again ranks among the top BCS Conference schools in the most recent NCAA Graduation Success Rate.
- ▶ For the class entering in 2004, UC achieved a GSR of 79, which is above the federal rate of 63 for all college students who started school in 2004.
- ▶ UC ranks No. 2 in the BIG EAST and 18th among FBS schools.

HOFFMAN A VERSATILE CHOICE

- ▶ OL Alex Hoffman leads the offense with his 37 career starts.
- ▶ What makes that note unique is that Hoffman, now the starter at LT, is at his third different starting position and fourth slot overall in three years.
- ▶ As a sophomore, he was an All-BIG EAST RG, and last year he started at RT. He has also played LG and was a Second-Team All-BIG EAST honoree as a senior at LT.

TURNING THEM OVER

- ▶ UC is +11 on turnover margin (0.9) and has 30 turnovers gained, which ranks tied for ninth nationally.
- ▶ A year ago, UC had only 14 turnovers gained and ranked No. 119 in the nation with a -15 turnover margin (-1.25).
- ▶ The Bearcats have 14 interceptions and 16 fumble recoveries over 12 interceptions and seven fumbles lost.
- ▶ UC's number of TDs gained in 2010 was 13.
- ▶ In 2010, UC did not have its 13th takeaway until the season finale against Pittsburgh on Dec. 4, 2010 and only had 14 takeaways the entire season.
- ▶ UC's turnover struggles of a year ago have been well documented with 14 fumbles lost and 15 interceptions thrown.
- ▶ UC's interceptions (8) and sacks (27) from 2010 were its lowest totals since 2005 (7 interceptions, 24 sacks).

MAKING OPPONENTS PAY FOR MISTAKES

- ▶ In a season-long trend, UC continues to take advantage of opponent turnovers.
- ▶ UC has scored 128 points off 30 opponent turnovers (17 touchdowns and three field goals) this season.
- ▶ UC has scored on 20 of 30 forced turnovers.

BALANCING IT OUT

- ▶ Spend five minutes with any head coach and you will likely hear the words offensive balance.
- ▶ In 2011, UC has run 819 offensive plays with 456 (56%) rushes and 363 (44%) pass attempts.
- ▶ The Bearcats' 175.0 rushing yards per game is second in the BIG EAST while the 392.8 yards of total offense ranks third.
- ▶ UC is averaging 33.5 points per game which ranks 28th in the NCAA FBS while ranking second in the BIG EAST.
- ▶ A year ago, when UC led the BIG EAST in total offense (417.3 ypg) the run pass split was 52% passing to 48% rushing.

ONCE MORE INTO THE BREACH

- ▶ Freshman OL Eric Lefeld made his first collegiate start against Louisville at right tackle, spelling an injured Sean Hooley.
- ▶ He also started at USF, spelled Hooley in the second half at Pittsburgh and started against West Virginia and at Rutgers.
- ▶ The UofL game marked the first time in six games in 2011 UC did not start the same combination of offensive linemen.

OH CAPTAIN MY CAPTAIN

- ▶ UC will feature something new in 2011 as the team will have two season-long captains for the first time since 2006.
- ▶ Senior quarterback Zach Collaros and senior linebacker J.K. Schaffer were unanimous selections by the team as UC's permanent captains for the 2011 season.
- ▶ The team will elect two additional captains for each game.

COMEBACK ON THE ROAD

- ▶ QB Zach Collaros finished a seven-play, 70-yard game-winning drive with a 2-yard TD run with 12 seconds remaining to give the Bearcats a 37-34 win over USF.
- ▶ Down 27-20, UC scored 20 points in the final 15 minutes, getting TD runs of 2- and 3-yards from Collaros, and a 30-yard strike from Collaros to true freshman WR Alex Chisum.
- ▶ Starting the game-winning drive with 1:27 remaining, Collaros was 4 of 6 for 69 yards on the winning drive. WR Kenbrell Thompkins' 33-yard reception gave the Bearcats a first down at the South Florida 22. Collaros also threw 21 yards to Anthony McClung on the march.
- ▶ A USF pass interference call on WR DJ Woods set up Collaros last-second scamper.

THOMPKINS FOR THE CENTURY MARK

- ▶ WR Kenbrell Thompkins had six catches for 114 yards at USF, his first career 100-yard game.

BATTLE LOST FOR THE SEASON

- ▶ DB Dominique Battle will miss the rest of the season after suffering a torn right ACL in the win over USF.
- ▶ Battle underwent successful surgery performed by Dr. Angelo Colosimo, UC's Director of Orthopedic Services, on Friday, Oct. 28 at University Hospital.
- ▶ Battle missed all but three games of the 2009 season after suffering a torn left LCL.

COLLAROS NAMED BIG EAST PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- ▶ QB Zach Collaros was named the BIG EAST Conference Offensive POTW following UC's comeback win at USF.
- ▶ Collaros accounted for 410 yards of total offense and five touchdowns in a 37-34 win at USF, moving Cincinnati into sole possession of first place in the BIG EAST standings and making the Bearcats bowl eligible.
- ▶ He completed 26 of 41 passes for 389 yards and three touchdowns (6, 21, 30) and rushed for 21 yards and two touchdowns on 10 carries.

HOLDING THE LINE

- ▶ USF broke a streak of nine quarters that the UC defense had not allowed an offensive touchdown.
- ▶ The Bearcats held the league's top rushing offense (USF) to 86 yards on the ground and an average of 2.4 yards per carry.
- ▶ Over the last four games, opponents are averaging 31.8 rushing yards per game.
- ▶ UC limited Miami (Ohio) to minus-3 yards and N.C. State to minus-26 yards.
- ▶ The Bearcats lead the BIG EAST and rank second nationally to Alabama, giving up 72.7 rushing yards per game.

WRAPPING UP THE KEG OF NAILS

- ▶ Cincinnati's 25-16 win over Louisville marked the first Bearcats victory after trailing after three quarters since their 45-44 win at Pittsburgh on Dec. 5, 2009.
- ▶ The Bearcats have won the last four meetings against the Cardinals for the Keg of Nails, the rivalry's traveling trophy.

PEAD CONTINUES TO IMPRESS

- ▶ RB Isaiah Pead was named the BIG EAST Conference Offensive Player of the Week and the Rivals.com BE POTW following the win over Louisville.
- ▶ Pead rushed for 153 yards and a touchdown on 20 carries in a 25-16 win against the Cardinals.
- ▶ Pead keyed Cincinnati's comeback from a 16-7 halftime deficit by breaking free for a 50-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter that gave the Bearcats the lead for good.

LONG TIME BETWEEN TWO POINT CONVERSIONS

- ▶ QB Zach Collaros found TE Adrien Robinson in the end zone for the two-point conversion to give UC a 22-16 lead against UofL.
- ▶ It was UC's first two-point conversion since Dec. 5, 2009 at Pittsburgh, a span of 18 games.

THE RARE GOOSE EGG

- ▶ The 27-0 decision over Miami (OH) marked UC's first shutout since a 31-0 win over Eastern Kentucky on Sept. 2, 2006.
- ▶ It's the first UC shutout in the series since Sept. 25, 1976 (UC W, 17-0) and the first UC shutout of MU in Oxford since 1898.
- ▶ It was UC's first shutout over an FBS team and its last shutout on the road was a 16-0 win at Virginia Tech on Sept. 16, 1995.

DING DING

- ▶ UC defeated Miami (OH) for the sixth straight year, marking the first time in the 116-year old series a team had won six consecutive games over another.

ALL THEY NEED IS A PLACE TO STAND

- ▶ On the opening drive of the third quarter, Miami (OH) had a 66-yard pass play from Zac Dysert to Nick Harwell which put the ball on the UC one-yard line.
- ▶ With their backs against the wall, the Bearcats defense held and MU missed a 34-yard field goal attempt.
- ▶ Four plays later, UC scored to take a 13-0 lead.

ANYTHING THIS GUY CAN'T DO?

- ▶ LB JK Schaffer recovered a fumbled Miami punt snap and returned it 17 yards for the touchdown.
- ▶ It was the first touchdown of his career.

DUO EARN BIG EAST PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

- ▶ P Pat O'Donnell and LB J.K. Schaffer were named the BIG EAST Conference Special Teams and Defensive Player of the Week, respectively, following UC's 44-14 win over NC State.
- ▶ O'Donnell was pivotal in establishing field position against the Wolfpack, averaging 59.7 yards on three punts, pinning the NC State inside the 20 twice. The Wolfpack's average starting field position in the first half was its own 17-yard line, which helped the Bearcats build a 24-7 halftime lead.
- ▶ Schaffer had a team-high nine tackles with an INT to key the UC defense. His 16-yard interception return set up a Cincinnati scoring drive and helped the Bearcats take an early 21-0 lead.

THE ALL-NAME TEAM

- ▶ UC sophomore quarterback Munchie Legaux and freshman defensive lineman Silverberry Mouhon were two of 25 players named to CNBC sports business reporter Darren Rovell's 2011 College Football All-Name Team.

MILESTONE ANNIVERSARY

- ▶ Former UC kicker Henk Hartong, who kicked the first soccer style field goal 50 years ago this season, served as an honorary captain for the NC State game.

I DUB THEE THUNDERFOOT

- ▶ UC punter Pat O'Donnell booted the second-longest punt in school history when he kicked a 76-yard punt at 11:39 in the first quarter of the NC State game.
- ▶ It was two yards shy of tying the school record of 78 yards, held by Mike Connell against Louisiana-Lafayette in 1976.

HERE'S WHERE A NEGATIVE IS A POSITIVE

- ▶ The UC defense limited N.C. State to minus-26 yards rushing.
- ▶ It was the third-lowest rushing total for a UC opponent in school history and the fewest since allowing minus-37 yards to Wichita State in 1974.

NIPPERT STADIUM - IN 3D

- ▶ The UC-NC State game was a part of Blackout night at Nippert Stadium and was televised by ESPN and ESPN3D.
- ▶ It marked the first football game in BIG EAST Conference history televised on ESPN3D.
- ▶ UC moved to 4-1 in ESPN Thursday Night primetime games.

YOUNG GUN TO LOOK OUT FOR

- ▶ RB Jameel Poteat earned his first career rushing touchdown, a seven-yard run, at 14:26 in the fourth quarter against Akron, to give UC a 59-0 lead.
- ▶ Poteat recorded 10 rushes for 55 yards - both career highs - including his first collegiate touchdown, a seven-yard run.

FIRST TIME'S THE CHARM

- ▶ Isaiah Pead has scored on his first carry in two of UC's first three games. Pead had a 40-yard touchdown run in the season-opener against Austin Peay and broke free for a 65-yard touchdown against Tennessee.
- ▶ He added a 1-yard TD scamper on UC's first drive against Akron, giving him three scores in three games on the ground on the Bearcats' opening drives.

THE BEST OFFENSE

- ▶ Cincinnati scored three defensive touchdowns in the Bearcats' 59-14 win against Akron, finding the end zone on two interception returns and a fumble return.
- ▶ After a forced fumble by Derek Wolfe, Maalik Bomar scooped the ball and returned it 54 yards for the score in the first quarter.
- ▶ On the first play of the second quarter, Dominique Battle returned an interception 36 yards for a TD and Camerron Cheatham added a 53-yard pick six with 1:41 left in the first half to complete the touchdown trifecta.
- ▶ It marked UC's first fumble recovery ran for a touchdown since Angelo Craig returned a fumble recovery 16 yards for a score at Syracuse on Nov. 24, 2007.
- ▶ It also marked UC's first defensive touchdown since Brandon Underwood returned an interception 20 yards for a score at Hawaii on Dec. 6, 2008.
- ▶ It was the first time UC had two interception returns for touchdowns since a game against Memphis in 1998.
- ▶ Cincinnati is the first BIG EAST team to score three defensive touchdowns since Miami did it in a 41-10 win against West Virginia Sept. 23, 2000.

LOOKING BACK AT ROCKY TOP

- ▶ The attendance at Neyland Stadium was 94,207, marking the largest crowd UC has played in front of since playing in front of 84,476 at Oklahoma on Sept. 6, 2008.
- ▶ RB Isaiah Pead carried five times in the first quarter for 104 yards and a touchdown, an average of 20.8 yards per carry.
- ▶ QB Zach Collaros completed his first six passes of the game.
- ▶ Collaros completed a 13-yard touchdown pass to TE Adrien Robinson. It was Robinson's third career touchdown, the first TD for a UC tight end in 2011 and Robinson's first TD since the Oklahoma game on Sept. 25, 2010.
- ▶ WR DJ Woods tallied nine catches for 111 yards, the fifth 100-yard receiving game of his career.

POTENT POTPOURRI FROM THE OPENER

- ▶ The Bearcats moved to 77-38-10 in home openers.
- ▶ Cincinnati's 72-10 win was its largest margin of victory since it defeated Southeast Missouri State, 70-3, on Sept. 12, 2009.
- ▶ UC's 72 points were its most since it beat Kentucky Wesleyan, 115-0, on Oct. 22, 1921.
- ▶ Cincinnati's 41 points in the first half was its most in one half since Nov. 20, 2010 against Rutgers.

OFFENSE COMES OUT HOT

- ▶ Cincinnati's offense was clicking on all cylinders in the Bearcats' 72-10 win against Austin Peay.
- ▶ UC had 12 offensive possessions, scored touchdowns on 10 of them, had a field goal on another, and was stopped on downs on its lone non-scoring drive.
- ▶ UC's scoring drives ranged from a one-play, 40-yard drive to a 14-play, 95-yard possession that started the second quarter.

YOUNGSTERS MAKING DEBUTS

- ▶ Twenty six student-athletes made their first appearance in the season opener for UC, including eight true freshmen, eight redshirt freshmen, six transfers and four others.
- ▶ Eight true freshman played in the opener, marking their first collegiate action, including: WR Ralph David Abernathy IV, LB Clemente Casseus, WR Alex Chisum, LB Dwight Jackson, RB Jameel Poteat, RB Akise Teague and LB Nick Temple.
- ▶ Eight redshirt freshman played for the first time, including: Demetri Beal, Camaron Beard, Brad Harrah, Eric Lefeld, Dyjuan Lewis, Corey Mason, Tony Miliano, Solomon Tentman,
- ▶ Junior college transfers Damon Julian, Malcolm Murray and Kenbrell Thompkins all played in their first collegiate game.
- ▶ Transfers Jordan Luallen and Shane Popham all saw their first action in the Red and Black.
- ▶ Other first-timers included: Adam Dempsey, Anthony King, Sean McClellan, Dan Sprague

YOUTH MOVEMENT 2011

- ▶ UC features 20 seniors in 2011 after on 12 a year ago.
- ▶ UC starts five seniors on defense after having the nation's youngest BCS defense a year ago.
- ▶ Over half of UC's roster, 57 of UC's 105 players (18 sophomores, 39 freshmen), are at a sophomore level or below.

NOTING THE SIGNING CLASS

- ▶ Of UC's 30-member signing class, five were state champions (Chisum, Jackson, Moore, Phillips, Teague), two were four-star recruits (Murray, Poteat), 21 were three-star recruits, three hail from the City of Cincinnati (Coyne, Mitchell, Murray), and two were Mr. Football Award Winners in their respective states (Teague-Ohio, Temple-Ind.).

FAMILY LEGACY

- ▶ Freshman running back Ralph David Abernathy IV has a family name that should ring a historical bell.
- ▶ Abernathy's late grandfather, Ralph Jr., was a leader in the American Civil Rights Movement, a minister and a close friend of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.
- ▶ His father, Ralph III is a former Georgia State Senator.

ANOTHER OUTSTANDING RECEIVER IN THE MAKING

- ▶ True freshman WR Alex Chisum is yet another record-setting member of UC's 2011 signing class.
- ▶ Chisum helped lead Sandy Creek HS to a 15-0 season and a GHSA 4-AAA State Championship in 2010.
- ▶ He caught 69 passes for 1,426 yards and 11 touchdowns, breaking three of former Sandy Creek and now NFL standout Calvin Johnson's school records Chisum was named the Georgia Coaches AAA State Offensive Player of the Year and a AAA First-Team All-State honoree.
- ▶ He also earned a spot on the 2010 U.S. Air Force Medium Schools All-American Team.

BEARCAT OLYMPICS

- ▶ When Head Coach Butch Jones arrived on the UC campus in January of 2010, he instituted the Bearcat Olympics.
- ▶ The program, which runs through the offseason, features players grouped into nine teams that compete in a number of activities, including academics, community service, and workouts.
- ▶ The culmination of the program's winter conditioning

UC THIS & THAT

WHAT IS A BEARCAT?

- ▶ The University of Cincinnati Bearcats were born on Oct. 31, 1914, during the second half of that hard-fought football game between UC and the University of Kentucky.
- ▶ UC cheerleader Norman "Pat" Lyon, building on the efforts of fullback Leonard K. "Teddy" Baehr, created the chant: "They may be Wildcats, but we have a Baehr-cat on our side."
- ▶ The crowd took up the cry: "Come on, Baehr-cat!"
- ▶ Cincinnati prevailed, 14-7, and the victory was memorialized in a cartoon published on the front page of the student newspaper, the weekly University News, on Nov. 3. The cartoon, by John "Paddy" Reece, depicted a bedraggled Kentucky Wildcat being chased by a creature labeled "Cincinnati Bear Cats."
- ▶ The name stuck, but not immediately. Following Teddy Baehr's graduation in 1916, the name dropped out of use, at least in print, for a few years.
- ▶ On Nov. 15, 1919, Cincinnati played at Tennessee. Cincinnati Enquirer writer Jack Ryder's dispatch on the game was the first time that the major media called UC's teams "Bearcats."
- ▶ The word first appeared in print circa 1889 as a synonym for the giant panda. "Bearcat" is a simple translation of the Chinese word for panda-xiong mao-which means "bear-cat."
- ▶ There is no definitive example of what a Bearcat actually is, but two theories are that it could reference the Red Panda or the Binturong.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF UC

- ▶ The University of Cincinnati, Ohio's premier urban research university, traces its origins to 1819.
- ▶ Today, the University of Cincinnati is classified as a Research University (Very High Research Activity) by the Carnegie Commission and is ranked as one of America's top 25 public research universities by the National Science Foundation.
- ▶ U.S. News has ranked UC in the Top Tier of America's Best Colleges. The Chronicle of Higher Education calls UC a "research heavyweight."
- ▶ Forbes and Delta Sky magazines have named UC one of the world's most beautiful campuses.
- ▶ UC is the largest employer in the Cincinnati region, with an economic impact of more than \$3 billion.

- ▶ Among the historic faculty or alumni of the University of Cincinnati are found President and later Chief Justice William Howard Taft; Albert Sabin, developer of the oral polio vaccine; Nobel Peace Prize winner and U.S. Vice President Charles G. Dawes; Pulitzer Prize-winning cartoonist Walt Handelsman; sports greats Sandy Koufax, Oscar Robertson, Jack Twyman and Tony Trabert; and Tony Award winner Faith Prince.

schedule, Night of Champions is one of the key components of the Bearcat Olympics.

- ▶ Each of the nine Bearcat Olympics teams competed in eight events at Night of Champions, including a bat relay, buddy relay, farmers walk, fast man relay, obstacle course, touchdown celebration, water balloon toss and bench press contest.

SIGMA SIGMA

- ▶ Two UC football players, Zach Collaros and JK Schaffer, hold the unique honor of being members of Sigma Sigma.
- ▶ A local honor fraternity, Sigma Sigma was founded in the summer of 1898 and lists its most important function as teaching loyalty to the University of Cincinnati.

DOUBLE DUTY

- ▶ UC radio play-by-play man Dan Hoard has added duties entering 2011 as the voice of the NFL's Cincinnati Bengals on the Bengals Radio Network.
- ▶ He joins Bill Hillgrove (Pittsburgh Panthers/Pittsburgh Steelers), Wes Durham (Georgia Tech/Atlanta Falcons), and Gene Deckerhoff (Florida State/Tampa Bay Buccaneers) as the only broadcasters in the country to handle radio duties for both an NCAA FBS and NFL team.

CRANKING OUT THE YARDAGE

- ▶ UC surpassed 600 yards of total offense twice in 2010, with a season high 661 coming against Rutgers and 609 yards vs. Miami (OH).
- ▶ UC produced 567 yards of total offense in the 2011 opener against Austin Peay.
- ▶ Over a six-game span, UC averaged 478.5 yards of total offense, 32.7 points per game, 184.0 yards rushing and 294.5 yards passing along with 16 passing touchdowns and 10 rushing scores.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

- ▶ The University of Cincinnati football team achieved an all-time team record with its 2.9 team grade point average in the 2011 Winter Academic Quarter.
- ▶ The team GPA, reflecting 83 student-athletes enrolled in classes, is an all-time high for the Bearcats football program.

- ▶ Thirty-eight of the 83 players (46 percent) achieved a 3.0 or better for the quarter, while 11 student-athletes ranked between a 3.5 and 4.0.
- ▶ Defensive lineman Eric Lefeld (Coldwater, Ohio/Coldwater) took home top GPA honors with his 3.956.
- ▶ Since Coach Jones' arrival in the winter of 2009, the team GPA has stayed consistently above a 2.7.
- ▶ In 2010, 19 student-athletes were named Academic All-BIG EAST and John Goebel (Milford, Mich./Brother Rice) earned the 2010 American Eagle Outfitters BIG EAST Football Scholar-Athlete of the Year award.
- ▶ UC was awarded the 2011 BIG EAST Academic Excellence Award, recognizing the top team GPA among the league's eight football schools.

CHANGING BODIES

- ▶ Director of football strength and conditioning Dave Lawson has led an overall change of body type for the Bearcats.
- ▶ Two of the biggest benefactors of the change have been DE Walter Stewart and OL Andre Cureton.
- ▶ When he arrived at UC, Stewart was a 216-pound outside linebacker. Today he takes the field as a 245-pound def. end.
- ▶ Cureton went the opposite way, arriving at UC at 364 pounds. He suited up on opening day at 295 pounds.
- ▶ When Lawson arrived at UC, there were only four Bearcats who could crack 400 lbs. on the bench press, a number that now is over 18.

TAKE ME TO HIGHER GROUND

- ▶ For the past 12 years, the UC football has called the Higher Ground Conference and Retreat Center in West Harrison, Ind., its preseason training home.
- ▶ The 280-acre facility is located about 30 miles from campus and has served as the Bearcats training camp location since the lead up to the 1999 season.
- ▶ Among many amenities, Higher Ground features a pair of 100-yard FieldTurf practice fields, ample living and meeting spaces and no distractions from football.

OFF-CAMPUS TRAINING SITES

- ▶ The University of Cincinnati is one of seven schools who spend time at an off campus site during football training camp.
- ▶ The Bearcats 14-day stay at the Higher Ground Conference & Retreat Center in West Harrison, Ind. ranks as the longest visit among the six NCAA FBS schools this season.
- ▶ But is not the furthest camp distance from campus. That honor goes to UNLV, which travels yearly to Ely, Nev., a 248-mile trek from its Las Vegas, Nev. campus.

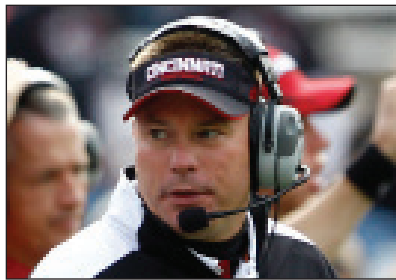

Butch Jones, named the head coach at the University of Cincinnati on Dec. 16, 2009, is in his second season with the Bearcats. Since arriving in Cincinnati, Jones has made an immediate impact, building a staff of championship-level coaches and teachers, as well as an atmosphere of competition and family, while also overseeing an academic program of great success. The team's GPA has stayed consistently at a 2.7 or above since Jones' arrival. In the winter 2010 quarter, 37 players achieved a GPA of 3.0 or above with 13 between a 3.5 and 4.0. Nineteen players were named Academic All-BIG EAST and John Goebel earned the 2010 American Eagle Outfitters BIG EAST Football Scholar-Athlete of the Year award. UC was honored with the 2010-11 BIG EAST Team Academic Excellence Award.

In 2010, the Bearcats led the BIG EAST in scoring offense (27.1 ppg), total offense (417.3 ypg), passing offense (260.7 ypg), first downs (21.9 pg), third-down conversions (45.6 pct.) and touchdown passes (27). Wide receiver Armon Binns and quarterback Zach Collaros were both First-Team all-BIG EAST selections while five other teammates earned all-BIG EAST honors.

In four years as a collegiate head coach, Jones holds a 31-21 mark, a 22-8 record in conference play, three bowl appearances, and a pair of league championships.

Prior to leading the Bearcats, Jones spent three seasons at Central Michigan University, leading the Chippewas to a pair of Mid-American Conference Championships and three-straight bowl appearances from 2007-09.

At Central Michigan, Jones continued that program's renaissance, going 27-13 over the past three seasons, including a 22-3 mark in league games, winning a pair of MAC Championships (2007, 2009), playing in three-straight bowl games, and earning a postseason ranking of No. 23 in 2009. He is the only coach in CMU history to lead the team to consecutive bowl games and is the first in MAC history to do it in his first three seasons as head coach.

Jones coached 32 all-MAC performers, including two-time MAC Offensive Player of the Year and 2009 MAC Vern Smith Leadership Award winner Dan LeFevour, and two-time MAC Special Teams Player of the Year Antonio Brown. Under his tutelage, 13 student-athletes earned Academic all-MAC accolades.

LeFevour had an NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision Record 148 career touchdowns (101 passing, 46 rushing and one receiving). His 101 career passing TDs, are the most in MAC history.

CMU was 22-3 against MAC opponents during Jones' tenure, including victories in the 2007 and 2009 MAC Championship Games. The Chippewas were 12-1 in MAC road games under Jones and earned two-straight wins over Big Ten teams.

In 2007, Jones became only the ninth first-year head coach to lead his team to a Mid-American Conference championship. The Chippewas' eight victories marked the second-most of any CMU coach in his debut season, and Jones was one of three first-year head coaches nationwide to coach in a bowl game.

A native of Michigan and a former offensive coordinator at CMU, Jones returned to Mount Pleasant after spending the 2005 and 2006 seasons as an assistant coach under Rich Rodriguez at West Virginia University.

Jones spent a total of 11 seasons as an assistant at the Division I-A level. He served as the offensive coordinator at three different schools, spanning eight seasons, and worked directly with 24 all-conference selections in 15 years as a full-time position coach.

A 1990 graduate of Ferris State University where he was a two-year letterman on the football team, Jones broke into the coaching ranks while still an undergraduate by serving as intern for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers from 1987-89.

Jones, 42, and his wife Barb are the parents of three children: Alex, Adam, and Andrew.

CINCINNATI (AP) - Isaiah Pead ran for Cincinnati's first two touchdowns, and Zach Collaros threw for the next four—all in the first half—leading the Bearcats to a 72-10 victory over Austin Peay.

The Bearcats dominated, scoring the third-most points in their history. Cincinnati scored on six of its seven first-half possessions. Pead ran 40 yards for a touchdown on the Bearcats' first play. He also scored on a 13-yard run and finished with 87 yards.

Collaros, the Big East's top returning passer, played only the first half and was 12 of 19 for 134 yards. His 34-yard pass to D.J. Woods completed a 95-yard drive in the second quarter. Collaros also threw a pair of touchdown passes to Anthony McClung in the last 39 seconds of the first half for a 41-0 lead.

Their opener in head coach Butch Jones' second season was much better, though played in front of a crowd of 23,282. Last year, they went to Fresno State and got beat 28-14 in 94-degree heat, wearing down as the game went along. No such problems on Saturday in 93-degree weather against an overmatched opponent.

Cincinnati won the coin toss, and freshman Ralph David Abernathy IV returned the kickoff 60 yards. On the Bearcats' first play, Collaros handed off to Pead and threw a downfield block on safety Amius Smith, opening the way for the Big East's top returning runner to go 40 yards untouched.

The Bearcats had a 14-play, 95-yard drive in the second quarter that left the Governors' defense running on fumes. Collaros threw a 34-yard pass to D.J. Woods, who ran past cornerback Sheldon Wade to make the catch for a 27-0 lead.

Collaros threw a 39-yard touchdown pass to McClung with 39 seconds left, and Cincinnati recovered a fumble on the kickoff. Austin Peay dropped seven defenders into pass coverage, but Collaros found McClung wide open in the middle of the field for a 29-yard touchdown that made it 41-0.

Cincinnati went with its reserves in the second half.

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. - The University of Cincinnati football team fell to University of Tennessee 45-23 Saturday before a Neyland Stadium crowd of 94,207.

After Cincinnati tied the score 14-14 midway through the first quarter, Tennessee produced 21 straight points to build a lead the Bearcats were unable to overcome.

Cincinnati halfback Isaiah Pead rushed for 155 yards on 14 carries to lead the Bearcats attack. Senior quarterback Zach Collaros went 21-34 for 230 yards and two touchdowns. Senior receiver D.J. Woods had a team-high nine receptions for 111 yards. Junior receiver Kenbrell Thompkins, a one-time Volunteer signee, recorded career highs in catches (four) and receiving yards (58).

On the opening possession of the game, the Bearcats needed just three plays to score after Pead took his first carry down the right sideline for a 65-yard touchdown.

Tennessee responded with a seven-play scoring drive on their first possession, punctuated by a two-yard TD run by tailback Marlin Lane that tied the score 7-7 with 9:53 remaining in the first quarter.

Volunteers place kicker Michael Palardy recovered his own on-side kick on the ensuing kickoff to give Tennessee possession. Four plays later, Bray threw a 33-yard streak down the left sideline to sophomore receiver Justin Hunter for a touchdown.

Trailing 14-7, Cincinnati went on a five-play, 80-yard drive that ended with a Collaros touchdown pass to tight end Adrien Robinson, tying the score 14-14 with 6:38 left in the first quarter.

Cincinnati made the first defensive stop of the game after senior defensive back Dominique Battle forced Lane to fumble, which was recovered by UC linebacker Ben Pooler at the Bearcats 28-yard line. Cincinnati could not capitalize on the turnover and punted for the first time for either team on its third possession.

Through the first quarter both teams combined for 342 yards, including Pead's 104 yards rushing on five attempts, his sixth career 100-yard performance.

CINCINNATI - Following a stellar performance by the defense, the University of Cincinnati football team defeated Akron 59-14 at Nippert Stadium. Wide receiver DJ Woods led the offense with two catches for 62 yards, while linebacker Clemente Casseus paced the defense with five tackles.

Zach Collaros was 10-of-16 for 157 yards as one of four quarterbacks who saw action against UA. The Bearcats got off to a quick start with the help of senior running back Isaiah Pead, who touched the ball multiple times before capping a nine-play, 60-yard drive with a one-yard rushing touchdown. It marked the third-straight game he recorded a rushing touchdown and was the third-consecutive game UC scored on its opening drive.

After the Zips were forced to punt, the Bearcats marched down the field, yet again, on its next drive, which was highlighted by a 50-yard reception by senior wide receiver DJ Woods. Collaros pitched in another rushing touchdown - his first of the season - to make the score 28-0.

The defense recorded its third touchdown of the day when Camerron Cheatham picked off Moore and ran it back 53 yards to make the score 49-0 heading into the locker room.

Akron threatened to score on the opening drive of the second half, but Deven Drane denied any Zips' points by catching his first-career interception in the end zone with 10:38 left on the clock.

Following a field goal by freshman kicker Tony Miliano, the two teams traded two possessions each before freshman running back Jameel Poteat ran in his first-career touchdown - a seven-yard rush - to make the score 59-0.

CINCINNATI - After a dominating defensive performance, the University of Cincinnati football team (3-1) defeated the NC State Wolfpack (2-2), 44-14, at Nippert Stadium in front of 28,431 fans.

Two of UC's touchdowns came from takeaways, while the defensive held NCSU to -26 rushing yards. Isaiah Pead lit up the offense, recording his second 100-yard rushing game of the season with 167 yards, while Zach Collaros went 25-of-34 for 263 yards and two touchdowns, in addition to two rushing touchdowns.

Following one scoreless possession each, Pat O'Donnell kicked a 76-yard punt - the second longest in Bearcat history - pinning the ball at NC State's 3-yard line. Just as the Wolfpack was gaining yardage, Drew Frey made his first pick of the year, which eventually allowed Pead to continue his streak, putting Cincinnati's first points on the board for the fourth-consecutive game.

Kenbrell Thompkins converted a third-and-17 situation with a 44-yard reception and the Bearcats found themselves in the endzone a second time to give the hosts the 14-0 lead with 8:34 remaining in the first quarter.

JK Schaffer continued the defensive domination when he grabbed an interception with one minute remaining in the first quarter and then, as if by second nature, Collaros and company brought it in for another touchdown to make it 21-0.

Later on, Tony Miliano capped a nine-play, 54-yard drive with a 26-yard field goal to give Cincinnati the 24-7 edge heading into the locker room.

UC didn't show any signs of letting up in the second half, as sophomore wide receiver Anthony McClung single-handedly gave the Bearcats 57 yards on the drive and allowed for a 48-yard field goal by Miliano to increase the lead, 27-7.

After a scoreless NCSU drive, Cincinnati began its longest drive of the evening, which was highlighted by a 25-yard touchdown pass to Pead.

OXFORD, Ohio - Isaiah Pead ran for a pair of touchdowns, and Cincinnati's dominating defense opened the second half with a goal-line stand that set up a 27-0 victory over Miami of Ohio.

Cincinnati (4-1) has won the last six games in the nation's oldest nonconference rivalry, played 116 times since 1888. The Bearcats' defense made this one a reference point--Cincinnati's first shutout in Oxford since a 22-0 victory in 1898.

The Bearcats overcame a season-high four turnovers, including Zach Collaros' two end-zone interceptions and his fumble at the Miami 12-yard line. Collaros was 16 of 30 for 251 yards and scrambled 15 times for 89 yards against a defense that emphasized pass coverage.

It was Cincinnati's first shutout since a 31-0 win over Eastern Kentucky on Sept. 2, 2006. The Bearcats' last shutout in the rivalry--played for the "Victory Bell" traveling trophy--was 17-0 in Cincinnati. Miami finished with minus-3 yards on 38 rushes. Miami hadn't been shut out at home since 1983, the year Yager Stadium opened.

Cincinnati's defense opened the second half with a goal-line stand that crushed Miami's chances of a comeback. Zac Dysert surprised Cincinnati with a 66-yard pass down the middle to Nick Harwell, who was tackled at the 1-yard line by safety Drew Frey. After two runs lost a yard, Harwell was called for pushing off to get open on a catch in the end zone. Mason Krynski hooked a 34-yard field goal try, starting a celebration on the Bearcats sideline.

Three plays later, Collaros completed a 72-yard pass to tight end Adrien Robinson, who made a juggling at-the-knees catch while safety Pat Hinke interfered with him. Pead's 3-yard run made it 13-0.

Cincinnati then put it away with two touchdowns in an 89-second span. Pead scored on a 4-yard dive, and linebacker J.K. Schaffer returned the ball 17 yards for a touchdown off a bad snap on a punt attempt for a 27-0 lead late in the third quarter.

CINCINNATI - The University of Cincinnati beat the Louisville Cardinals 25-16 at Paul Brown Stadium to win the Battle for the Keg of Nails for the fourth-straight year. It was a career-high day for senior defensive lineman Derek Wolfe, who had a career-best in tackles (11) and tackles for loss (2.5) in front of 40,971 fans for homecoming weekend - the third largest home crowd in UC history.

The windy field conditions provided a battle of its own for senior quarterback Zach Collaros, who went 18-of-26 for 152 yards and relied heavily on senior running back Isaiah Pead, who finished with 20 carries for 153 yards - his eighth career 100-plus rushing game. Collaros pitched in an additional 22 yards on 13 rushes.

The UC offense got off to a slow start, but the defense managed to hold the Cardinals to two field goals to make the score 6-0 after the first 15 minutes.

After a scoreless 10 minutes to start the second quarter, UC forced Louisville to a three-and-out on its own seven-yard line. The Bearcats got the ball back in UofL's territory, where it began its first productive drive of the afternoon - a four-play, 37-yard scoring drive capped with a 26-yard touchdown pass to Woods to give the Bearcats the 7-6 lead with five minutes left in the half.

Cincinnati's offense began clicking on all cylinders as they marched 53 yards down the field to UofL's one-yard line. Faced with a fourth-and-goal situation, Collaros ran it for the touchdown to pull within two of the guests, 16-14, after three.

Cincinnati wasted no time adding points, this time in way of Pead, who ran 50 yards to the endzone to make it his sixth-straight game with a rushing touchdown. Following the 16-second drive, senior tight end Adrien Robinson caught a two-point conversion pass to make it, 22-16, with 12:13 remaining.

Freshman kicker Tony Miliano tacked on an 21-yard field goal in the final minutes to make the final score 25-16.

TAMPA, Fla. - Zach Collaros threw for three touchdowns and ran for two fourth-quarter scores, helping Cincinnati come from behind in the closing minutes Saturday to stay atop the BIG EAST Conference standings with a 37-34 victory over South Florida.

The senior quarterback finished a seven-play, 70-yard game-winning drive with a 2-yard TD run with 12 seconds remaining. Collaros also scored on a 3-yard run and threw a 30-yard TD pass to Alex Chisum to help Cincinnati (6-1, 2-0) wipe out a 10-point deficit early in the final quarter and finished 26 of 41 passing for 389 yards.

B.J. Daniels threw for 409 yards and three TDs for South Florida (4-3, 0-3). His 10-yard scoring pass to Andre Davis put the Bulls ahead 34-30 with 1:27 remaining.

However, that was more than enough time for Collaros to pull out Cincinnati's fifth straight win.

Collaros threw TD passes of 6 yards to Isaiah Pead and 21 yards to Adrien Robinson in addition to his fourth quarter throw to Chisum, who made a leaping catch before tumbling in the end zone. Kenbrell Thompkins had six receptions for 114 yards, including a 33-yarder that helped the Bearcats get into position for the winning score.

Daniels' scoring throw to Griffin finished a 10-play, 80-yard drive and was the first offensive touchdown allowed by Cincinnati's defense in 10 quarters. Murray's TD on the opening drive of the second half gave the Bulls a short-lived 17-10 lead that Collaros erased with a six-play, 80-yard march that Thompkins kept alive with a 39-yard reception on third-and-2 from the Bearcats 40.

South Florida regained the lead on Bonani's second field goal of the game. Daniels, who completed 31 of 47 passes, put the Bulls up 27-17 with his TD pass to Shields late in the third quarter.

Collaros was 4 of 6 for 69 yards on the winning drive. Thompkins' 33-yard reception gave the Bearcats a first down at the South Florida 22. Collaros also threw 21 yards to Anthony McClung on the march.

PITTSBURGH, Pa. - Butch Jones' rebuilding plan at Cincinnati is ahead of schedule. Way ahead.

Zach Collaros threw for 214 yards and ran for two touchdowns as the Bearcats took firm control of the Big East race with a 26-23 win over Pittsburgh on Saturday.

Isaiah Pead rushed for 118 yards and Tony Miliano kicked four field goals for Cincinnati (7-1, 3-0 Big East), which won its sixth straight to take a major step toward winning the program's third conference title in four years.

Not bad for a program picked to finish fifth in the league in the preseason. Seems like a long time ago now.

Cincinnati appeared to be in serious trouble after the Panthers took a 23-13 lead midway early in the third quarter on Tino Sunseri's 4-yard toss to tight end Hubie Graham.

Yet Cincinnati rallied doing what it's done all season: Forcing opponents into careless turnovers and turning them into points.

Pitt led by a touchdown late in the third quarter when Sunseri appeared to scramble for a first down. The ball popped out, however, and the Bearcats recovered at the Pitt 27. Cincinnati needed just three plays to tie it at 23, with Collaros plunging over from 3 yards out for his second touchdown of the game.

It took the Bearcats all of three plays to get it back again. Sunseri tried to throw the ball in double coverage and instead it wound up deflecting into the hands of Camerron Cheatham, who returned it to the Pitt 26.

The pick led to Miliano's fourth field goal of the game, and the Bearcats held on. Barely.

The Panthers had one last chance as Sunseri frantically drove them from the Pitt 11 to the Cincinnati 33 with 14 seconds remaining. Harper came on to send the game to overtime. His 50-yarder never had a chance, sailing wide right and sending the Bearcats storming onto the field.

CINCINNATI - The No. 23/18 University of Cincinnati football team (7-2, 3-1 BIG EAST) was handed its first BIG EAST loss when it was defeated by West Virginia (7-3, 3-2 BIG EAST), 24-21, on Saturday afternoon in Paul Brown Stadium. It was the largest conference crowd in UC history with 48,152 fans.

Senior quarterback Zach Collaros went 7-of-11 for 70 yards before leaving the game due to injury midway through the second quarter, while backup quarterback Munchie Legaux completed 10-of-21 passes for 144 yards and one rushing touchdown.

Collaros was injured on a sack in the end zone. The senior fumbled and it resulted in a WVU TD.

Senior running back Isaiah Pead finished with 19 rushes for 113 yards and two touchdowns, while senior JK Schaffer leads with nine tackles. The UC defense had 18 tackles for loss against WVU.

After trailing for the majority of the game, the Bearcats had a chance to tie things up as time expired, but a blocked Tony Miliano field goal resulted in the West Virginia victory.

The Bearcats forced the Mountaineers to a three-and-out on the opening possession and took quick control of the ball game in a three-play, 54-yard drive capped by a 40-yard rush by Pead to give UC the early lead just one minute in.

A blocked field goal by sophomore Deven Drane sparked a momentum shift at the 8:48 mark of the third quarter. Legaux ran it 65 yards to the WVU 31-yard line to begin the ensuing drive, but the Mountaineers stopped the scoring drive and Miliano's field goal attempt went wide left to keep the score 17-7.

Legaux pulled the Bearcats back into the game with 4:25 remaining in the third quarter with the help of Pead, who tacked on 45 yards to pull UC within three, 17-14. As the Mountaineers were driving down the field on its next possession, junior defensive lineman Walter Stewart recovered a WVU fumble, allowing Pead to add another touchdown to give the hosts their first lead since its first touchdown, 21-17.

PISCATAWAY, N.J. - Rutgers' Jawan Jamison rushed for a career-high 200 yards and two touchdowns and surprising Rutgers moved into a share of first place in the Big East Conference with a 20-3 victory over Cincinnati.

Picked to finish last in the conference's preseason poll, Rutgers (8-3, 4-2) limited Cincinnati to a season-low 225 total yards while holding sophomore Munchie Legaux to 158 yards passing in his first start for the injured Zach Collaros.

Jamison carried 34 times and scored on runs of 12 and 1 yard as the Scarlet Knights handed the Bearcats (7-3, 3-2) their second straight loss and snapped a five-game losing streak against them. It also averaged a 69-38 loss last season, a game in which Cincinnati had 661 yards in total offense.

The victory moved Rutgers into a tie for first place in the league with Louisville (6-5, 4-2), which beat Connecticut Saturday. Cincinnati, West Virginia and Pittsburgh are a half game back.

Tony Miliano cut the deficit to 7-3 with a 47-yard field goal after Cincinnati could generate only 18 yards in eight plays after getting the ball at the Rutgers 48 following a short punt.

Rutgers pushed the lead back to seven points when San San Te capped a 23-play, 82-yard second-quarter march that consumed close to 10 minutes. Chas Dodd (19 of 33 for 173 yards) converted three third-down passes on the drive and Jamison converted two other third downs with short runs.

After getting a first and goal at the Bearcats 1, Cincinnati brought down fullback Michael Burton for a 4-yard loss and Rutgers had to settle for three points.

Jamison pushed the lead to 17-3 midway through the third quarter capping an 11-play, 94 yard drive on which he has runs of 22 and 29 yards with his short TD run.

JK Schaffer tied a season high with 13 tackles to lead the UC defense which spent over 38 minutes on the field.

SYRACUSE, N.Y. - University of Cincinnati senior running back Isaiah Pead had 246 all-purpose yards and a pair of touchdowns to help lead the Bearcats to a 30-13 win over Syracuse.

Pead finished with a career-best nine catches for a career high 112 yards, 80 yards rushing, and a pair of punt returns, the first of his career, for 54 yards. He had a 24-yard rushing touchdown on the first offensive play of the third quarter and also scored on a 69-yard strike from sophomore quarterback Munchie Legaux.

Pead cracked the 1,000-yard mark for the second-straight season, becoming the first Cincinnati back to do so in 25 years. He also became just the third UC player to eclipse 3,000-career rushing yards.

Legaux, making his second collegiate start in place of an injured Zach Collaros, teamed with fellow sophomore QB Jordan Luallen to keep the Orange defense off balance.

Legaux finished 13-of-22 for 169 yards, two touchdowns and no interceptions. Luallen ran the ball eight times for 77 yards, a 9.6 yards per carry average, which included a 48-yard scamper that put the Bearcats on the 1-yard line.

Syracuse was unable to gain any kind of field advantage the entire game, starting no better than its own 26. The Bearcats did, though, and none better than on the second-half kickoff.

Freshman Ralph David Abernathy IV returned the kick 71 yards, failing to beat the only defender left between him and the end zone as kicker Ross Krautman made a saving tackle at the Orange 24. It went for naught when Pead scored on the next play for a 17-6 lead.

Another freshman, kicker Tony Miliano connected on field goals of 27, 22 and a career-long tying 48 yards while punter Pat O'Donnell played a key role with four punts for an average of 54.0 yards per kick. He dropped three balls inside the 20-yard line with only one touchback and had a long kick of 61 yards.

CINCINNATI - The University of Cincinnati football team (9-3, 5-2 BIG EAST) won the BIG EAST Conference Championship for the third time in four years when it defeated Connecticut (5-7, 3-4 BIG EAST), 35-27.

The defense was the story all afternoon, which recorded 13 tackles for loss and six sacks. Senior linebacker JK Schaffer led with 11 tackles, giving him 104 for the season, while senior defensive tackle Derek Wolfe has 10 tackles, a career-best 5.0 tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks. The defense scored two touchdowns against the Huskies, bringing its season total to six.

On the offensive side, sophomore quarterback Munchie Legaux and sophomore wide receiver Anthony McClung finished with career highs. Legaux completed 15-of-35 passes for a career-best 217 yards and three touchdowns, while McClung had a career-high 142 yards and two touchdowns on eight catches.

On the Huskies opening possession, two penalties pinned the visitors as their own five-yard line. Faced with third-down, Stewart took the ball directly from quarterback Johnny McEntee's hands in the end zone to give the hosts the early 7-0 lead less than five minutes into the game.

The UC defense continued to dominate, this time by way of junior safety Drew Frey, who picked off McEntee and ran it in for his first career touchdown to give the Bearcats the 14-0 lead with just over one minute remaining in the first quarter.

The offense followed suit on its next possession, as Legaux marched his team down the field in a six-play, 58-yard drive, capped by a 22-yard touchdown to freshman wide receiver Alex Chisum to increase the Cincinnati lead, 21-0, with 13:13 left in the half.

UC kept rolling as Legaux connected with McClung three times on its next possession, including a 13-yard touchdown pass to make it 28-3 with less than two minutes remaining.

The teams exchanged possession before Connecticut concluded the half with a 46-yard field goal to make the score 28-6 heading into the locker room.
