Clemson vs. Miami (FL)

Clemson (17-7, 4-2 ACC), ranked as high as #11 in the nation, will play host to Miami (FL) (15-12, 3-6 ACC) this weekend in a three-game series at Doug Kingsmore Stadium. Game times are 7:15 PM (Friday), 7:00 PM (Saturday), and 1:00 PM (Sunday). All three games will be broadcast live on the radio by Clemson Tiger Sports Network. All three games will be televised live by CSS and will be available via webcast at ACCSelect.com in non-CSS markets only. Live stats will also be available at ClemsonTigers.com for all three games.

The Series

Clemson and Miami (FL) have met 42 times on the diamond, with the Hurricanes holding a 21-20-1 lead in the series dating back to the 1977 season. Last season, Clemson swept the Hurricanes in three games at Coral Gables by scores of 8-6, 6-2, and 14-1.

In 2005, Clemson won all four meetings between the two, including three games at Doug Kingsmore Stadium by scores of 15-5, 9-2, and 6-2, and one in the ACC Tournament at Jacksonville, FL by a score of 9-1. Therefore, since the Hurricanes joined the ACC in 2005, the Tigers have won each of the seven meetings, outscoring them by a combined score of 67-19. Clemson has also won 11 consecutive games against teams from the state of Florida.

The Tigers hold a 6-3 lead all-time in games played at Clemson, all of which have taken place at Doug Kingsmore Stadium. Clemson holds a 6-0 advantage in games played in the ACC regular season. Tiger Head Coach Jack Leggett is 12-9 against Miami as Clemson's head coach, including a 5-1 record at Doug Kingsmore Stadium. He was also 0-1 against Miami as the head coach at Western Carolina, therefore is 12-10 all-time against the Hurricanes.

The Starting Pitchers

In game-one, Miami will start freshman lefty Eric Erickson (3-3, 1.58 ERA) on the mound. The Sarasota, FL native has made five starts and two relief appearances for a total of 40.0 innings pitched. He has allowed 34 hits (.225 opponents' batting average) and nine walks with 38 strikeouts. He has also given up just one homer and has a save.

The Tigers will counter with junior righthander P.J. Zocchi (3-0, 2.70 ERA) on Friday. The Bronx, NY native has made six starts for a total of 30.0 innings pitched. He has yielded 30 hits (.261 opponents' batting average) and 11 walks with 30 strikeouts.

In game-two, the Hurricanes will send out junior lefthander Scott Maine (2-4, 4.68 ERA) on the mound. The Palm Beach Gardens, FL native has made seven starts for a total of 32.2 innings pitched. He has yielded 39 hits (.291 opponents' batting average) and eight walks with 27 strikeouts.

The Tigers will counter with sophomore lefty Ryan Hinson (1-1, 2.14 ERA) on Saturday. The Rock

Hill, SC native has made six starts for a total of 33.2 innings pitched. He has allowed 33 hits (.258 opponents' batting average) and 10 walks with 27 strikeouts.

In game-three, Miami will start junior righty Enrique Garcia (2-2, 2.43 ERA) on the mound. The Mechanicsville, MD native has made four starts and eight relief appearances for a total of 29.2 innings pitched. He has allowed 26 hits (.234 opponents' batting average) and six walks with 23 strikeouts.

Clemson will counter with junior righthander David Kopp (3-2, 3.58 ERA) on Sunday. The Margate, FL native has made seven starts for a total of 37.2 innings pitched. He has allowed 36 hits (.254 opponents' batting average) and 11 walks with 29 strikeouts.

The Hurricanes

Miami (FL), led by 14th-year Head Coach Jim Morris, enters the weekend series against #11 Clemson with a 15-12 overall record and 3-6 ACC mark. The team has not played a game since losing two of three games at Virginia last weekend. The Hurricanes are also 2-7 on the road this season.

Miami is hitting .276 as a team with a .396 on-base percentage thanks to 149 walks, an average of 5.5 per game. The Hurricanes have 26 sacrifice bunts and 45 stolen bases in 58 attempts as well.

Yonder Alonso has a team-high .374 batting average and .500 on-base percentage along with six homers and 28 RBIs. Freshman third-baseman Mark Sobolewski is hitting .330 with a team-best 30 RBIs, while Blake Tekotte is batting .329 with a team-high eight stolen bases.

The pitching staff has a 3.95 ERA and .249 opponents' batting average. The staff has also struck out 190 against 93 walks. Senior righthander Danny Gil has a 4.81 ERA and team-high two saves in 12 appearances. The team is fielding at a .962 clip as well.

The Tigers

Clemson enters the series against Miami (FL) with a 17-7 overall record and 4-2 mark in ACC play after beating Gardner-Webb 14-2 on Tuesday and Western Carolina 15-6 on Wednesday. The Tigers, who are 16-3 at home this season, also brings a #11 national ranking into the series.

The team is hitting .293 with a .372 on-base percentage. Clemson has raised its batting average 15 points in the last two games thanks to totaling 37 hits this week. Brad Chalk is hitting a team-best .425 with a .539 on-base percentage. He has reached base via a hit, walk, or hit-by-pitch in 50 straight games dating back to 2006. Doug Hogan is hitting .390 with four homers and 12 RBIs, and he is riding a current 12-game hitting streak.

The pitching staff has a 2.96 ERA and .233 opponents' batting average. It has combined to strike out 203 against 68 walks. Daniel Moskos has a team-high five saves, while Stephen Clyne has an 0.46 ERA and .169 opponents' batting average in 10 relief appearances. The team is fielding at a .969 clip as well.

Clemson has seven players from the state of Florida. Clyne (Parkland), Andy D'Alessio (Naples), Alan Farina (Chuluota), David Kopp (Margate), Buddy Munroe (Miami), Brock Schnabel (Winter

Haven), and Marquez Smith (Ocala) all hail from the Sunshine State. The Tigers' athletic trainer, Graduate Assistant Pat Hassell, also hails from the Miami area and attended Coral Gables High School.

Worth Noting

- In the Tigers' 17 wins, they are hitting .356 with runners in scoring position. In their seven losses, they are hitting just .146 (6-for-41) in that situation.
- Clemson is 3-4 when it commits one error and 8-2 when it commits two or more errors.
- Ben Paulsen had one homer and three RBIs in his first 19 games as a Tiger. In the last two games, he has seven hits, two home runs, and nine RBIs.

Polls

Clemson fell to the #11 spot in the **Baseball America** poll and #12 in the **Collegiate Baseball** poll on Monday after going 1-3 in four games last week. Clemson also fell to #11 in the **Sports Weekly** poll.

The Tigers' #1 ranking by **Baseball America** and **Collegiate Baseball** on February 12 was their first since February 27, 2006, when Clemson was ranked #1 by those same two polls. The Tigers have been ranked #1 for 20 weeks by at least one of the major polls in Head Coach Jack Leggett's 14th season at Clemson.

Clemson Has 174 Top-25 Wins Under Leggett

Clemson has a 1-2 record against top-25 ranked teams in 2007. In 14 seasons at Clemson, Head Coach Jack Leggett has 174 wins over teams ranked in the top 25. Only three times in his first 13 seasons has he had a losing record against teams in the top 25.

Tigers Tough to Beat at Home Under Leggett

In his 14 seasons, Head Coach Jack Leggett has a 625-266 overall record at Clemson, including a 258-127 mark against ACC teams. He has been especially tough in home ACC series, where he has a 133-30 (.816) record. The ACC team with the most success has been Florida State, who has won seven games in 21 tries at Doug Kingsmore Stadium. The Tiger skipper only added to his fine record in 2006 by sweeping all five home opponents in league play (15-0 record). Clemson has won 21 consecutive home ACC games dating back to 2005 as well.

Even when an opposing ACC team is victorious at Clemson, it usually means that team only won one of three games. In 55 ACC home series under



Leggett, Clemson has lost only four series...losing two of three to N.C. State in 1996, getting swept by Florida State in 2002, losing two of three to the Seminoles in 2004, and losing two of three to Georgia Tech in 2005. The Yellow Jackets also split a pair of games in a rain-shortened series in 1997.

Leggett Leading a Consistent Winner

Head Coach Jack Leggett has a 625-266 (.701) record at Clemson in his 14th season. The legendary Bill Wilhelm has the most wins of any Tiger coach with 1,161 in 36 seasons (1958-93) at Clemson. Leggett's 625 wins are second-most in school history. No other Clemson coach has more than 70 wins while in Tigertown.

Through Leggett's first 13 seasons at Clemson, he had 608 wins. Only three other programs (Florida State, Wichita State, Rice) have more wins over that span from 1994-06. Furthermore, he has led the Tigers to at least 39 wins every year he has been at the helm of the program. Clemson along with Florida State and Wichita State are the only three programs in the nation to win at least 39 games every year since 1994.

Leggett Reaches 1,000 Career Wins

Head Coach Jack Leggett, in his 14th season at Clemson and 28th overall, won his 1,000th game on March 25 in the Tigers' 5-0 victory at Maryland. He has a 1002-556 overall record, including a 625-266 mark at Clemson. At the age of 53, Leggett became one of the youngest coaches to reach 1,000 career wins. Leggett became the 29th head coach in Division I history to reach the 1,000-win mark. He also became the 10th active head coach at the Division I level to reach 1,000 career wins.

Tigers Have Won 21 Straight ACC Home Games

Clemson has won 21 consecutive ACC regular-season games at home, the second-longest streak in school history. The Clemson record for the longest ACC home winning streak is 26, set between the 1975 and 1980 seasons.

The current 21-game streak started with a three-game sweep of Miami (FL) in 2005, then Clemson won all 15 of its ACC home games in 2006. So far in 2007, the Tigers are 3-0 at home thanks to a three-game sweep of Duke.

Sunshine Streak

When Clemson finished off a three-game sweep of Florida State with an 11-2 victory at Doug Kingsmore Stadium on May 14, it gave Clemson a three-game series sweep of both Florida State and Miami (FL) during the 2006 season. From March 31 to April 2, Clemson won three straight over the Hurricanes in Coral Gables.

Clemson is just the second school in history and the first since 1948 to sweep (three games or more) Florida State and Miami in the same year. That year, Rollins won four straight from Florida State and four in a row from Miami. Both series were a pair of two-game, home-and-home series. It was the first year of Florida State's baseball program and just the fourth year of baseball for Miami.

Clemson swept Miami in both 2005 and 2006, and has seven consecutive wins over the Hurricanes. Clemson is the first school in history to record

a three-game sweep of the Hurricanes in consecutive years. Florida State came close in 2002 and 2003. The Seminoles recorded a sweep in Coral Gables in 2002, then won the first two games in Coral Gables in 2003 before the two teams tied in the last game of the series.

Clemson's seven-game win streak against Miami is the longest for any program against the Hurricanes since Florida State won seven straight in their series with Miami between 1990 and 1991. The record for consecutive wins by a program over Miami is 12 by Florida State from 1966-71. That is also the last time someone beat their eight straight games. That streak began when current Florida State Head Coach Mike Martin was a player for the Seminoles.

From 2005 to date, Clemson has won 11 consecutive games against teams from the state of Florida, dating to a 7-3 April 3, 2005 victory (second game of doubleheader) at Florida State.

Tigers Win Streak Over Hurricanes at Seven

Clemson swept #11 Miami (FL) in Coral Gables from March 31 to April 2 by a combined score of 28-9. And since the Tigers won all four meetings in 2005, Clemson improved to 7-0 against the Hurricanes since they joined the ACC prior to the 2005 season. In those seven games, Clemson outscored Miami 67-19. Two of Miami's first 14 ACC regular-season series were against Clemson, and only twice was Miami swept in three games. Both times were at the hands of the Tigers.

Lefties Lights Out

So far this season, Head Coach Jack Leggett has called upon five different lefthanders, including starter Ryan Hinson along with relievers Daniel Moskos, Matt Zoltak, Chris Fidrych, and William Bond. Hinson has a 2.14 ERA in six starts, Moskos has a 2.55 ERA and five saves in 15 relief appearances, and Zoltak, Fidrych, and Bond have combined to allow just three runs. Therefore in a combined 64.1 innings pitched, they have allowed only 55 hits and 16 earned runs (2.24 ERA) with 63 strikeouts.

Widmann Out Indefinitely Due to Neck Injury

Starting shortstop Stan Widmann (Hurst, TX) is out indefinitely due to a neck injury. The junior was hitting .409 in the Tigers' first six games of the season. He has one home run and six RBIs along with a perfect 1.000 fielding percentage in 25 chances in the field.

The 2007 season has marked his third straight year as Clemson's starting shortstop. He hit .307 in 67 games as a sophomore on Clemson's 2006 ACC Championship and College World Series team. He was also the Tigers' leading hitter for the eight NCAA Tournament games last year with a .387 batting average.

D'Alessio Likes 'Em Loaded

If you had to use one phrase to describe senior Andy D'Alessio (Naples, FL), it might just be "run-producer." The first-baseman has a knack for driving in runs in all kinds of situations. This season, he has 15 RBIs on 25 hits. In 2006, he totaled 85 RBIs on 78 hits. The 2005 season saw him do

the same, as he had 60 RBIs on only 58 hits.

But no stat has proved his value in producing runs more than his stats with the bases loaded. He is 0-for-3 with the bases loaded in 2007. But in 2006, he was 8-for-11 (.727) with two doubles, two home runs, and 23 RBIs with the bases full. In 2005, he was 6-for-9 with two home runs and 18 RBIs with the bases loaded. Therefore in his career (2004-07), he is 16-for-29 (.552) with four homers and 48 RBIs with the bases full.

D'Alessio Moving Up Home Run Chart

A year after Kris Harvey totaled 25 home runs in 2005, second-most in the nation, Andy D'Alessio provided the big bat in the Tiger lineup in 2006 with 23 long balls. This season, he has three homers, giving him 45 in his career, seventh-most in Tiger history.

Chalk Riding 50-Game Streak

Brad Chalk (Greer, SC) ended his sophomore season by reaching base safely in each of the last 27 games. And since he has done the same in all 23 games that he has played in 2007, he has reached base via a hit, walk, or hit-by-pitch in each of the last 50 games, showing his value to the team. He has hit safely in 45 of those 50 games as well.

Overall this season, the junior is hitting .425 with a .539 on-base percentage. He has walked 17 times, been hit-by-pitch four times, and struck out just nine times, a trend that has been evident throughout his career. He has walked 92 times, hit-by-pitch 21 times, and struck out only 49 times in 155 career games. He is also a .363 career hitter with a .476 on-base percentage.

Hogan Boosting Tiger Lineup

Junior catcher Doug Hogan is in his first year as starting catcher in 2007. And he wasted little time making an impact by blasting two solo homers in the Tigers' season-opening 14-0 win over George Mason on February 16. Hogan, who batted #9 in the lineup that game, entered the season with just one career homer, but became the second Tiger in as many years to hit two long balls in the season-opener. Tyler Colvin hit two home runs in the 2006 season-opener against James Madison as well.

Hogan added a long ball against High Point on February 21 and another against Pacific on February 23, giving him four home runs in 2007. He is also hitting .390 with five doubles, two triples, and 12 RBIs along with a current 12-game hitting streak. Not bad for a player who entered the season just 6-for-46 (.130) with a homer and seven RBIs in 46 career games.

Harbin Pulling Double Duty

Junior middle infielder Taylor Harbin (Travelers Rest, SC) has had to make the move from second base, where he was a preseason first-team All-American, to shortstop due to the loss of regular-shortstop Stan Widmann. Harbin's preseason accolades were due in a large part to his defensive prowess. He has done nothing to disappoint at the tougher defensive position of shortstop after starting there since game #7 of the season. Harbin has committed just one error in 94 chances at shortstop, good for an outstanding .989 fielding percentage.

Harbin has also been a "doubles" machine" since stepping onto the field for the first time in 2005. He entered the 2007 season with 48 doubles in his first two years, and he has eight this season, giving him 56 in his three-year career. That mark is tied for ninth-most in school history.

Johnson's Average Up After Moving Down

Freshman outfielder Addison Johnson (Pfafftown, NC) has raised his batting average significantly in recent weeks. He started the season as Clemson's leadoff batter, but is hitting just .143 in 49 at-bats at either the #1 or #2 spot in the order. So when Head Coach Jack Leggett decided to move Johnson down in the order to the #8 spot on March 10, his batting average has increased. At either the #7, #8, or #9 spot this season, he is 15-for-47 (.319).

Bunnell Goes From Club Team to Starter at 2B

In the fall of 2004, the beginning of his sophomore year at Clemson, David Bunnell (Charlotte, NC) tried out for the team as a walk-on but was cut. In the spring of 2005, he played on Clemson's Club team, then he did not play any organized baseball the following school year as a junior.

During the summer of 2006, Tanner Leggett, former Tiger (2003-06) and son of Head Coach Jack Leggett, recommended Bunnell to his father to work Clemson's summer baseball camps. The elder Leggett obliged and Bunnell got to know Clemson's coach.

Due to the loss of catcher Adrian Casanova and several infielders from the 2006 squad, Leggett invited Bunnell to join the team in 2007. Bunnell was slated to be a bullpen catcher and provide depth in the infield for the Tigers, but in January, freshman infielder Graham Stoneburner suffered a season-ending leg injury. So Leggett told Bunnell to continue taking ground balls on his own because he might need him to play in the infield.

After hitting a pinch-hit double in his first career plate appearance in the season-opener against George Mason on February 16, Bunnell did not play in the Tigers' next 10 games. But with no other Ti-



ger solidifying his name at second after Taylor Harbin moved to shortstop to replace an injured Stan Widmann, Bunnell earned his first career start there on March 9 against Memphis. He had a hit and reached base three times in the game. He also hit an early RBI single in the March 11 game and went 3-for-9 with two walks while not committing an error in 15 chances in the series.

Bunnell is currently battling for the starting spot at second, as he is hitting .258 in 31 at-bats this season. He also has a solid .962 fielding percentage, committing just two errors.

Although he has planned on 2007 being his one and only season with the program, he is still eligible to play in 2008 as a fifth-year senior. With his boisterous cheering section beyond the outfield fence, "D-Bunny" has made a name for himself in a varsity uniform.

Father Sees Son Go Deep, Part II

In 2006, former Tiger Tanner Leggett, son of Head Coach Jack Leggett, hit his only home run as a Tiger against Virginia Tech on April 28. It was a special moment for the elder Leggett, as he is Clemson's third-base coach and got to give his son an extra-long handshake after rounding third base.

Another thrilling moment for a Tiger coach occurred on February 21, 2007 against High Point. Freshman infielder Ben Paulsen, son of Assistant Head Coach Tom Riginos, hit a two-run homer in Clemson's six-run third inning. It was Paulsen's first hit as a Tiger, and it was key in Clemson's 11-3 win.

Then against Gardner-Webb on March 27, Paulsen had a career day. He went 5-for-5 with a double, homer, four runs scored, and six RBIs in Clemson's 14-2 victory. It was an extra-special occasion for the freshman, because his father was in the third-base coaching box in each of the at-bats. Head Coach Jack Leggett was not at the game, as he was with his ailing father in Vermont. It was the first time ever that Riginos was in the third-base coaching box in a game Paulsen was playing in.

Paulsen is 21-for-60 (.350) with three doubles, three homers, and 12 RBIs in 21 games (16 starts) this season.

Moskos Moving Up Charts

Junior lefthander Daniel Moskos (Alta Loma, CA) entered the 2007 season as one of the most prolific closers in the country after serving in the same role for Team USA during last summer when the club captured the gold medal at the world championships in Cuba. In 21.0 innings pitched, he had an 0.86 ERA and six saves, as he allowed just eight hits and four walks with 35 strikeouts.

He has kept up his impressive stats for the Tigers in 2007. In 15 relief appearances, he has a 2-2 record, five saves, 2.55 ERA, and .211 opponents' batting average. The hard-thrower has allowed 12 hits and five runs with 23 strikeouts in 17.2 innings pitched.

Moskos had 10 saves in 2006, which alone placed him 10th all-time in Clemson history in that category. With his five saves this season, he has 15 in his career, fifth-most in school history. He has also finished each of the last 40 games he has appeared and made 69 career relief appearances, seventh-most in Tiger history.

Clyne Had 31.1 Scoreless-Inning Streak

Senior righthander Stephen Clyne (Parkland, FL) pitched 16.0 innings over eight relief appearances this season before finally allowing a run at Western Carolina on March 20. He has allowed just 12 hits (.169 opponents' batting average) and four walks with 17 strikeouts while tallying a 3-0 record.

Clyne went the last 15.1 innings of 2006 without allowing a run, meaning he had a streak of 31.1 consecutive innings pitched over 16 relief appearances without allowing a run dating back to last season. That mark was just behind the school record of 32.2 consecutive scoreless innings pitched by Scott Berney. Berney, a starter, opened the 2000 season, his first and only as a Tiger, by not allowing a run until there were two outs in his 33rd inning on the mound that year.

Clyne's value to the team is as a long reliever, and he has done well in that role in his fifth season in the program. He has a 6-1 record, 2.35 ERA, and two saves in 45 career relief appearances (72.2 innings pitched). He has also allowed just one homer and 20 walks with 73 strikeouts, good for a 3.65 strikeout-to-walk ratio. Clyne is the only fifth-year senior on the 2007 team.

D.J. Playing a Different Tune in 2007

Sophomore utility player D.J. Mitchell (Rural Hall, NC) started all 13 postseason contests in right field in 2006 after Travis Storrer went down with an injury, and he performed well, hitting .311 in those 13 games. He has platooned in right field with Wilson Boyd and Alex Burg so far this season.

But unlike last year, he has added pitcher to his resumé in 2007. He did not appear on the mound in 2006, but had a successful summer with Thomasville in the Coastal Plain League. There, he had a 2.25 ERA and save in 16.0 innings pitched over nine relief appearances. Mitchell also earned the victory in a starting role in the league championship game.

Mitchell made his Tiger debut on the mound against George Mason on February 16. He pitched 2.0 perfect innings with a strikeout in the Tigers' 14-0 victory over the Patriots. Then against High Point

on February 21, he earned his first career win. In 4.0 innings pitched in relief, he allowed one run on three hits with six strikeouts in the Tigers' 11-3 win.

Overall in 2007, he is 1-0 with a 4.32 ERA in 16.2 innings pitched over six relief appearances and one start. He also has 16 strikeouts against only four walks and is holding opponents to a .219 batting average. He is playing an important role on the 2007 team with the unexpected preseason loss of righties Sean Clark and Graham Stoneburner.

Hinson Showing Consistency on the Mound

Sophomore lefthander Ryan Hinson (Rock Hill, SC) has been a weekend starter all season. In six starts, he is 1-1 with a 2.14 ERA along with 27 strikeouts against 10 walks in 33.2 innings pitched. He has also yielded just one home run.

He has been perhaps Clemson's most consistent starter in 2007. In each of his six starts, he has allowed two earned runs or less. In 2006, he made 18 relief appearances and one start. In only one of those 19 appearances did he allow more than two earned runs.

His nemesis in his career has been Georgia Tech. He has made four relief appearances against the Yellow Jackets, allowing eight earned runs in 7.0 innings pitched (10.29 ERA). Therefore in his other 57.1 innings pitched against all other teams, he has allowed just 13 earned runs, good for a 2.04 ERA. Overall in his career, Hinson is 5-1 with a 2.94 ERA in 18 relief appearances and seven starts.

Zocchi 10-0 on the Mound in His Career

Junior righthander P.J. Zocchi (Bronx, NY) is 3-0 with a 2.70 ERA this season as one of the team's top weekend starters. In 30.0 innings pitched, he has allowed 30 hits (.261 opponents' batting average) and 11 walks with 30 strikeouts. In his career, Zocchi has an unblemished 10-0 record and 3.02 ERA in 16 starts and 15 relief appearances (110.1 innings pitched).

Vaughn Valuable as Middle Reliever

Sophomore righty Matt Vaughn (Summerville, SC) struggled as a freshman, but in 2007, he has become one of the most valuable pitchers out of the bullpen for the Tigers. He is 2-0 with a 2.08 ERA and .227 opponents' batting average in 17.1 innings pitched over five relief appearances and one start. Vaughn has also struck out 20 against only four walks. Since allowing three runs in the first inning of his first outing of the year, he has pitched the last 16.1 innings while allowing just one earned run.

Future ACC Tournament Sites

The 2007 and 2008 ACC Tournaments will be played at The Baseball Grounds of Jacksonville (FL), where the tourney was played in 2005 and 2006. In 2009, the ACC Tournament will be held in Boston, MA at historic Fenway Park.

Tigers Take Two of Three From George Mason

Clemson, ranked #1 in the country, won two of three games over George Mason from February 16-18 at Doug Kingsmore Stadium. Tiger batters combined for a .272 batting average, while Clemson held the Patriots to a .194 batting average and outscored them 20-9. Brad Chalk had five hits and

walked three times, while Doug Hogan hit two home runs. Clemson's pitching staff had a 2.67 ERA and struck out 27 batters against eight walks. The starting rotation of P.J. Zocchi, David Kopp, and Ryan Hinson combined to allow just one run in 15.0 innings pitched as well.

In game-one on February 16, Clemson totaled 20 hits on its way to a 14-0 victory over the Patriots. It was the most runs by a Tiger team in a season-opener since 1989. Every Tiger starter had at least one hit, while Chalk, Taylor Harbin, and Hogan had three hits apiece. Hogan added two solo home runs and three RBIs. Clemson's eight-run seventh inning put the game out of reach. Zocchi pitched 6.0 innings, allowing one hit, no runs, and no walks with six strikeouts to earn the victory. George Mason managed just two hits and committed four errors.

In game-two on February 17, Jason Bour hit a three-run homer in the sixth inning to give George Mason the lead for good in its 5-1 victory over the Tigers. After Kopp pitched 5.0 scoreless innings, George Mason scored four runs in the sixth inning off two Tiger relievers. Clemson, who saw its 17-game home winning streak come to an end, totaled just two hits, while it committed three errors and threw six wild pitches. Lefthander Mike Modica pitched 6.0 innings, allowing one hit and one run to earn the victory. Andy D'Alessio's sacrifice fly in the fourth inning scored Clemson's only run of the game. Brad Chalk's 17-game hitting streak also came to an end, as he was 0-for-2 with two walks.

In game-three on February 18, Clemson rallied from a 4-2 deficit to defeat George Mason 5-4. The Patriots scored three runs in the fifth inning, but Marquez Smith hit a two-out, two-run homer in the seventh inning to tie the score. After getting out of a jam in the top of the eighth inning, the Tigers plated the go-ahead run in the bottom of the eighth when Harbin's sharp grounder to third was booted by Ryan Uphouse, allowing Hogan to score. The Patriots outhit the Tigers 8-6, but George Mason pitchers allowed nine walks. Daniel Moskos pitched the final 1.2 innings without allowing a hit or run to pick up the win. Clemson also stole four bases, but left 11 runners on base.

Tiger Bats Awaken in 11-3 Win Over High Point

Clemson, ranked #2 in the nation, scored six runs in the third inning en route to an 11-3 victory in six innings over High Point at Doug Kingsmore Stadium on February 21. The Tigers trailed 2-0 after the first inning, but a run-scoring single by Taylor Harbin followed by a double by Andy D'Alessio, a triple by Marquez Smith, and a two-run homer by Ben Paulsen, his first hit as a Tiger, highlighted the six-run third inning. Doug Hogan also added a two-run homer in the fifth inning, as Clemson totaled 12 hits in all. D.J. Mitchell pitched 4.0 innings in relief, allowing one run on three hits with six strikeouts to earn the win. The start was delayed over three-and-a-half hours by inclement weather, then the game was called in the bottom of the sixth due to thick fog in the area.

Clemson Sweeps Pacific in Battle of Tigers

Clemson, ranked #2 in the nation, swept Pacific in three games on February 23,24 at Doug Kingsmore Stadium. Clemson outscored Pacific 17-



10 and won two one-run games. Clemson hit .321 in the series to Pacific's .271, as Pacific left 33 runners on base and was just 4-for-36 (.111) with runners in scoring position. Pacific also scored first in all three games only to see Clemson rally to victory each time. Brad Chalk was 8-for-12 to lead Clemson, while Doug Hogan (7-for-13) and Stan Widmann (4-for-8) also had productive series. Clemson pitchers also combined for a 1.86 ERA and 31 strikeouts in the three games.

In game-one on February 23, Clemson overcame a 3-0 deficit to defeat Pacific 8-3. Clemson scored three runs in the fifth inning to tie the score. A dropped foul ball by Erik Hamren in the fifth inning allowed Taylor Harbin to double in a run and Marquez Smith to single home the tying run. In the sixth inning, Clemson scored five runs, highlighted by Smith's two-run single to cap the scoring. Hogan and Widmann added solo homers, while Chalk was 3-for-3 with two walks, meaning he reached base in all five of his plate appearances. Stephen Clyne pitched 5.1 innings in relief to earn the victory. He allowed just three hits, no runs, and one walk with five strikeouts.

In game-two, which was the first game of a doubleheader on February 24, Addison Johnson scored the winning run from second base in the 11th inning when shortstop Josh Powers' throw was errant to first base on Brad Chalk's infield single in Clemson's 4-3 victory over Pacific. Clemson matched Pacific's two-run second inning with two runs in the bottom of the second on Widmann's two-run single. Widmann had all three of Clemson's RBIs. Clemson left 12 runners on base, while Pacific stranded 11 baserunners. Pacific outhit Clemson 12-10, including four hits by Joe Oliveira, but Pacific could not come through with a clutch hit. Daniel Moskos earned the win thanks to 3.0 scoreless innings pitched in relief.

In game-three, which was the second game of a doubleheader on February 24, Smith's three-run homer in the fifth inning was the difference in Clemson's 5-4 win over Pacific. For the third straight game, Clemson faced an early deficit only to rally to victory. Pacific outhit Clemson 11-10, but it stranded 13 runners on base. Chalk paced the Tigers with a 3-for-3 performance, while Hogan added two hits along with an RBI. Righthander David Kopp did not allow an earned run in 5.0 innings pitched to earn the victory, while Matt Vaughn picked up his first career save by pitching 2.0 scoreless innings with three strikeouts.

Tigers Homer Past Winthrop 6-4

Taylor Harbin's two-run homer in the seventh inning proved to be the difference in #2 Clemson's 6-4 victory over Winthrop at Doug Kingsmore Stadium on February 28. The Eagles scored four runs in the fifth inning to take a 4-1 lead. But Andy D'Alessio hit a towering two-run homer in the sixth inning to cut Winthrop's lead to one run. After tying the score on an Eagle error in the seventh, Harbin's long home run later in the frame put the Tigers on top for good. Winthrop outhit the Tigers 10-8, but five of Clemson's hits went for extra bases. Stephen Clyne pitched 3.0 scoreless innings in relief of one-hit ball to earn the win, while Daniel Moskos pitched a perfect ninth inning to record the save.

Gamecocks Take Two From Tigers

South Carolina, ranked #4 in the nation, won both games of a home-and-home series against #2 Clemson on March 3,4. The Gamecocks outscored the Tigers 15-2 and outhit Clemson .167 to .284.

South Carolina hit three home runs on its way to a 12-0 victory over Clemson at Doug Kingsmore Stadium on March 3. The shutout broke Clemson's streak of 165 consecutive home games of scoring at least one run dating back to 2002. Justin Smoak had a game-high three hits and three RBIs, including a two-run homer. Phil Disher and James Darnell each hit three-run homers and totaled four RBIs, while the Tigers had just two hits the entire game. South Carolina also left just three runners on base and had 12 hits in the game. Harris Honeycutt pitched 7.0 innings, allowing two hits, no runs, and four walks with seven strikeouts to record the win.

Trent Kline's run-scoring single in the ninth inning lifted South Carolina to a 3-2 victory over Clemson at Sarge Frye Field on March 4. Clemson tied the score 1-1 on Marquez Smith's run-scoring single in the seventh inning, then took a 2-1 lead on Addison Johnson's RBI single in the eighth inning. With two outs and no one on base, South Carolina rallied for a run in the bottom of the eighth inning on Disher's RBI double. Andy D'Alessio and Smith each had two hits for the Tigers, who outhit South Carolina 8-7. Ryan Hinson pitched 6.0 strong innings in a starting role. He allowed only four hits, one run, and one walk with five strikeouts in a no-decision.

Tigers Blank Coastal Carolina 4-0

Four pitchers combined to lead #6 Clemson to a 4-0 shutout victory over #17 Coastal Carolina at Doug Kingsmore Stadium on March 7. Starter P.J. Zocchi picked up the win by pitching 5.1 innings, while Daniel Moskos struck out three of the four batters he faced to record the save. Matt Zoltak and Stephen Clyne combined with Moskos to pitch 3.2 hitless innings in relief. The Tigers did not allow an extra-base hit as well. Ahead 1-0 late in the game, the Tigers scored three runs in the eighth inning, highlighted by Marquez Smith's RBI double down the left-field line. Clemson outhit the Chanticleers 11-5, including three hits apiece by Smith and Brad Chalk, and two doubles by Taylor Harbin.

Clemson Wins Last Two Against Memphis

Clemson, ranked #6 in the nation, won two of three games over Memphis from March 9-11 at Doug Kingsmore Stadium. Clemson outscored Memphis by a combined score of 19-10 and had its only loss come in 10 innings. Clemson hit .301 to Memphis' .222 and stole nine bases while committing only two errors. Brad Chalk was 5-for-7 with three walks, three hit-by-pitches, and four steals, while Andy D'Alessio was 7-for-12 with a double and two home runs. Clemson's pitchers also had a 3.21 ERA and 28 strikeouts while allowing just four extra-base hits.

In game-one on March 9, Josh Irvin's two-run single in the 10th inning lifted Memphis to a 6-4 victory over Clemson. Memphis took a 4-0 lead in the fifth inning thanks to a two-run homer by Joseph Lieberman. But Clemson rallied with one run in the fifth and two in the seventh. Then with two outs in the ninth inning, D'Alessio hit a towering solo homer to right-center to tie the score. But Irvin's bases-

In game-three on March 11, five pitchers held Memphis to four hits in Clemson's 7-2 victory. Clemson scored two runs in the second inning and two more in the third. After Memphis cut Clemson's lead to 4-2 in the top of the fifth inning, Clemson responded with two runs in the bottom of the fifth inning on a wild pitch and RBI single by Addison Johnson. Johnson had two hits and a team-high two RBIs, as Clemson had 10 hits overall. Clemson also stole seven bases, including two each by Chalk and Taylor Harbin. Clemson Blanks Georgia Southern 3-0

Four pitchers combined to hold Georgia Southern to three hits in #6 Clemson's 3-0 victory at Doug Kingsmore Stadium on March 14. David Kopp earned the win by tossing 5.0 innings of two-hit ball, while Matt Zoltak, Stephen Clyne, and Daniel Moskos combined to pitch the final 4.0 innings to close out the win. Moskos also earned the save with a scoreless ninth inning. The Tigers upped their scoreless innings streak against the Eagles to 44 innings over the last five meetings. Ben Paulsen hit a run-scoring double in the sixth inning, then Doug Hogan's RBI single in the eighth gave the Tigers an insurance run. Clemson had 10 hits as a team as well.

Tigers Sweep Duke to Open ACC Schedule

Clemson, ranked #6 in the nation, swept Duke by a combined score of 22-12 in three games from March 16-18 at Doug Kingsmore Stadium. The Tigers hit .297 to Duke's .214 in the series, including a team-best 6-for-11 (.545) by Addison Johnson. Brad Chalk was also 5-for-10 (.500) with four walks. Daniel Moskos recorded two saves, while the Tigers had a 3.00 team ERA and 26 strikeouts.

In game-one on March 16, Clemson jumped out to a 6-0 lead and held on for a 6-4 victory over Duke in the Tigers' ACC opener. Clemson scored two runs in the third inning, then Taylor Harbin's three-run homer in the fifth inning put the Tigers ahead 5-0. Duke scored three unearned runs in the eighth inning after the first two batters were retired, then put the tying run on first base in the ninth before

Moskos shut the door to earn the save. Starter P.J. Zocchi pitched 7.0 scoreless innings of three-hit ball with eight strikeouts to record the win. The Blue Devils outhit the Tigers 8-6, but Clemson turned two crucial double plays in the game.

In game-two on March 17, Clemson totaled 12 hits, including seven for extra bases, in its 7-2 win over Duke. The Tigers scored four runs on five hits in the first inning, capped by Marquez Smith's two-run homer. Johnson led off the fourth with his first career home run, then a two-out, two-run single by Andy D'Alessio gave Clemson a 7-0 lead. Every Tiger starter had at least one hit, including two hits and three RBIs by D'Alessio. Ryan Hinson earned the win by allowing two runs on five hits in 6.1 innings pitched, while D.J. Mitchell pitched 2.2 scoreless innings in relief with four strikeouts to close out the game. Both teams were errorless as well.

In game-three on March 18, five Tiger relievers combined to pitch 7.0 scoreless innings in Clemson's 9-6 victory over Duke. Matt Vaughn earned his first career win by pitching 4.0 scoreless innings, while Moskos pitched a perfect ninth inning to record the save. The Blue Devils scored four runs in the first inning, but the Tigers answered with four runs in the bottom of the first, capped by J.D. Burgess' two-out, two-run single. Burgess, who was starting for an injured Harbin, tallied the first three RBIs of his career. Duke scored two more runs in the third inning, then Clemson regained the lead in the bottom of the third with three runs, including the go-ahead run on David Bunnell's two-out, run-scoring single. All nine Tiger starters scored a run, while only four of Clemson's nine runs were earned thanks to two costly Blue Devil errors.

Western Carolina Tops Clemson 6-3

Western Carolina scored five runs in the sixth inning to defeat #6 Clemson 6-3 at Hennon Stadium on March 20. D.J. Mitchell's first career homer, a two-run shot in the third inning, gave Clemson a 2-0 lead. With the Tigers leading 3-1, the Catamounts scored five runs on four hits in the sixth inning, highlighted by former Tiger John Ingram's go-ahead, run-scoring single to right field. All six of the Catamount runs came in the fifth and sixth innings, while they were retired in order in the other six innings. Clemson did not have a leadoff batter reach base all game and left seven runners on base to the Catamounts' two, as Western Carolina plated six of its nine baserunners in the game. Stephen Clyne's consecutive-scoreless-inning streak also came to an end at 31.1 innings, just shy of the school record of 32.2.

Terrapins Take Two of Three From Tigers

Maryland won two of three games at Shipley Field from March 23-25 despite Clemson outscoring the Terrapins by a combined score of 9-8 in the series. Clemson hit .238 in the series, including a team-best 4-for-11 performance by Andy D'Alessio. Clemson's pitching staff had a 2.13 ERA and struck out 30 against nine walks in the series. The Tigers also allowed just two extra-base hits, both doubles.

In game-one, Chad Durakis' walkoff double in the ninth inning gave Maryland a 4-3 victory over Clemson on March 23. Durakis' two-bagger was the only extra-base hit of the game, as Maryland



outhit Clemson 11-8. The Tigers had scored three runs in the ninth inning, highlighted by Alex Burg's two-run single up the middle, to tie the score. Terrapin starter Casey Baron pitched 8.0 superb innings, allowing four hits, no runs, and one walk with seven strikeouts, but did not factor in the decision. Clemson reliever Alan Farina struck out eight in 4.0 innings pitched, as four Tiger pitchers combined for 15 strikeouts.

In game-two, Maryland scored four runs in the fifth inning en route to a 4-1 win over Clemson on March 24. After scoring a run in the fifth, A.J. Casario hit a potential inning-ending, double-play grounder, but David Bunnell could not field the ball. The Terrapins, who had seven hits (all singles), made Clemson pay with three more runs in the frame. The Tigers, who had four hits, scored a run in the eighth on a double off the top of the fence in left field by Taylor Harbin, but the Tigers were 0-for-5 with runners in scoring position in the game. Ryan Hinson suffered his first career loss despite pitching 6.2 effective innings.

In game-three, Head Coach Jack Leggett picked up career win #1,000 in Clemson's 5-0 victory over Maryland on March 25. Leggett became the 29th coach in NCAA Division I history to reach the 1,000-win mark. David Kopp pitched 7.0 innings, allowing six hits, no runs, and no walks with five strikes to earn the win. Three Tiger pitchers combined to face just three batters over the minimum. Clemson scored three runs in the second inning and two more in the sixth inning. The Tigers had 12 hits and 19 baserunners, but stranded 12 on base. Five different Tigers had two hits apiece, while the Terrapins committed four errors.

Tigers Erupt in 14-2 Win Over Gardner-Webb

Ben Paulsen went 5-for-5 with a homer and six RBIs in #11 Clemson's 14-2 victory over Gardner-Webb at Doug Kingsmore Stadium on March 27. Paulsen became the first Tiger to total more than three hits and three RBIs in a game in 2007, as he hit a three-run homer in the third inning, and added a double and four runs scored. The Tigers had 21 hits in all, including hits by 12 different players and all nine starters. Taylor Harbin added three hits and two RBIs. Matt Vaughn pitched 5.0 effective innings in a starting role to record the win, while four relievers combined to pitch the final 4.0 innings to close out the game. Head Coach Jack Leggett was not at the game, as he was with his ailing father in Vermont.

Tigers Blast Western Carolina 15-6

Behind 16 hits, #11 Clemson defeated Western Carolina 15-6 at Doug Kingsmore Stadium on March 28. The Tigers scored in six straight innings beginning with the second frame. Ten different Tigers had at least one hit, while 12 different Tigers scored at least one run. Taylor Harbin had three hits and three RBIs, while Doug Hogan went 3-for-4 with a double and three runs scored. Ben Paulsen added a two-run home run and three RBIs, and Marquez Smith tallied three RBIs as well. Matt Zoltak earned his first career win, as he pitched 1.2 scoreless innings in relief. The Catamounts committed four errors, which led to seven unearned runs allowed by their pitchers.
