Last Time Out

The Razorbacks advanced to the NCAA Super Regional with an 11-6 victory over Oral Roberts in the Wichita Regional. Arkansas got a two-run home run from Michael Conner and a solo home run from Nick Pitts in the first inning as the Hogs jumped out to a 5-1 lead on ORU. The Golden Eagles tied the game at 5-5 in the fourth inning, but Arkansas regained the lead in the top of the fifth and never relinquished it. Relief pitcher Scott Woods threw four innings allowing one run, earned, on five hits with four strikeouts to earn the win.

Arkansas vs. Clemson

The Razorbacks and Tigers have met three times, all coming in NCAA postseason play. Arkansas claimed a 6-5 victory at the 1987 NCAA South Regional in Huntsville, Ala. The Razorbacks then eliminated the Tigers from the tournament with a 4-2 victory. Clemson returned the favor in 1999 when Arkansas hosted its first-ever regional. Clemson eliminated the Razorbacks with a 12-4 victory.

Razorbacks Face Reba Again

Arkansas will get its second crack at Clemson starter Steve Reba Friday night in the first game of the NCAA Super Regional. Reba was the starter in the 1999 regional game when the Tigers bounced the Hogs 12-4. Reba pitched six and two-thirds innings allowing three earned runs with six strikeouts to earn the win.

All-Tournament Razorbacks

Arkansas placed six players on the Wichita Regional All-Tournament Team following their victory over ORU in the championship game. Nick Pitts (1B), Clay Goodwin (3B), Kirk McConnell (LF), Michael Conner (CF), Scott Woods (P) and Andrew Wishy (DH) were each named to the team. Pitts was voted the tournament's Most Outstanding Player after hitting .538 (7-for-13) with two home runs, five RBI, one double, a 1.077 slugging percentage and a .600 on-base percentage.

Arkansas In the Polls

For the first time since the end of the 1999 season the Razorbacks are ranked among the top 25 teams in the country. In this week's *Collegiate Baseball* poll the Razorbacks are ranked 18th in the nation. Arkansas is ranked 25th in the latest *Baseball America* poll. The No. 18 ranking is the highest for the Hogs since the end of the 1999 season when *Collegiate Baseball* had the Razorbacks ranked 17th in the final poll.

Wishy Heats Up

Over the last two weeks sophomore Andrew Wishy has been the Razorbacks hottest hitter. Wishy has posted a .500 batting average, going 20-for-40 in the last 14 games. Wishy has driven in 11 runs and scored 14 in that span and has a .600 slugging percentage and a .592 on-base percentage. Wishy was hitting just .250 before going on his recent tear with a .387 slugging percentage and a .395 on-base percentage.

Razorbacks Strike First

Over the last nine games the Razorbacks have scored in the first inning six times, including all three games in the Wichita Regional. Arkansas has scored 16 runs in the first inning during that stretch including scoring

three or more runs four times. The Razorbacks have gone 6-3 in those games, losing the only three games they did not score in the first inning. The Hogs failed to plate a run in the first inning against Auburn in game two of the final weekend of the regular season and both games against South Carolina in the SEC Tournament.

Razorbacks Place 12 On SEC Honor Roll

Arkansas earned the second-highest number of student-athletes to be named to the 2002 Southeastern Conference Baseball Academic Honor Roll as 12 Hogs earned academic honors. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must: 1) have a 3.0 grade point average for either the past year (two semesters or three quarters) or a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher for their career; 2) be a sophomore or higher in terms of academic classification; and 3) have 24 semester or 36 quarter hours toward a degree. The 2002 SEC Baseball Academic Honor Roll is based on grades from the 2000-2001 academic calendar. The honor roll members are: Cody Clark (3.78); Jeff Fletcher (3.53); Clay Goodwin (3.66); Aaron Graves (3.04); Brett Hagedorn (4.00); Jeff Hoefler (3.16); Brian Kirby (3.11); Justin Leraris (3.33); Wes McCrotty (3.75); Josh Merryman (3.53); Jonathan Richmond (3.47) and Andrew Wishy (3.78)

Shut Down

Sophomore RHP Scott Roehl has slammed the door on the opposition in his last three relief appearances. In that span, Roehl has pitched 10.0 innings and allowed just three hits and two runs, one earned, while striking out eight. Roehl has gone 1-0 with one save in those three appearances. The Somers, Wis., native went four and two-thirds innings against Auburn in the SEC Tournament to earn the win. Roehl gave up just one hit and fanned three. Roehl then shut the Oklahoma Sooners down, going two and two-thirds innings allowing one run, unearned, on one hit and striking out four to earn his fourth save of the season. Roehl also worked one and two-thirds innings against ORU in the title game of the Wichita Regional, giving up one run, earned, on one hit with one strike out.

Getting Defensive

Defense has been a major factor in the Razorbacks late-season turnaround. Arkansas has committed 80 errors this season, the fewest in 10 years. The 1992 squad committed just 64 miscues in 57 games for a .980 fielding percentage. Arkansas made 47 errors over the first 30 games of this season for a .961 fielding percentage. In the last 30 games, the Razorbacks have committed only 33 errors for a .971 fielding mark. The Razorbacks are third in the SEC in fielding percentage with a .966 mark.

Isaacson Joins 20 Win Club

Senior RHP Charlie Isaacson earned his 20th career victory Friday in the first game of the NCAA Wichita Regional. Isaacson went six and one-third innings giving up four runs, all earned, against the Oklahoma Sooners in earning the win. Isaacson's career record now stands at 20-15, tying him for ninth on the Arkansas career list. Isaacson is 13th Razorback to record 20 wins in his career.

Wild Things

The Arkansas bullpen was uncharacteristically wild in game two against Oral Roberts in the Wichita Regional as it surrendered six walks in four innings of work. The six base on balls is the most in any outing for the Razorbacks relief hurlers this season. The staff had not allowed more than two walks in the last 16 appearances prior to that game. The last time the staff walked more than two batters was on April 30, in the final regular season game against Oral Roberts. For the season, the Razorback bullpen has walked 79 batters in 247.2 innings while striking out 190. The Arkansas bullpen is averaging 2.9 walks per nine innings this season.

Youth Movement

The Razorbacks boast one of the most inexperienced lineups among the 16 teams heading into this weekend's NCAA Super Regional. Arkansas has four freshmen (two true, two redshirt) in its everyday lineup. True freshman Kirk McConnell led the Hogs in batting average for most of the season while starting in left field. True freshman shortstop Scott Hode was designated for a redshirt season before being forced into action to shore up a struggling defense more than a month into the season. Hode has made 10 errors in 42 games at short. Redshirt freshman Scott Bridges has shined since making the move from shortstop to his natural position at second base. Bridges currently leads the Hogs with a .315 batting average and has committed just two errors in 31 games at second. Redshirt freshman Clay Goodwin was the starter at third before going down with a separated shoulder. Goodwin missed 25 games with the injury, but has posted a .305 batting average with 19 RBI in 29 starts.

Three For McConnell

True freshman Kirk McConnell is tied for the most triples in the Southeastern Conference this season. McConnell has seven triples, one more than the rest of the team combined. The Magnolia, Ark., native is tied for ninth on the Arkansas single-season list. The seven triples is the most for a Razorback since Jeremy Jackson hit eight in 1998.

Offense Produces In Regional

The Razorbacks scored 26 runs in the three-game regional in Wichita over the weekend en route to the regional title. Arkansas averaged 8.7 runs per game in the tournament and 12.7 hits per contest. Arkansas scored seven runs or more in the three games, while only having scored seven or more runs five times in the 20 previous games.

Razorbacks vs. Top 25 Teams

Arkansas was one of only four teams in the Southeastern Conference to finish the regular season with a winning record against top 25 teams this season. The Hogs posted an 8-7 mark against those teams, joining South Carolina (12-9), Alabama (9-8) and LSU (12-10) as the only teams with a winning record against nationally ranked foes. Arkansas recorded wins over nationally-ranked Long Beach State (No. 21), Alabama (No. 11), South Carolina (No. 4), Ole Miss (No. 12) and Oklahoma (No. 18) during the season.

Arkansas vs. 2002 Regional Teams

The Razorbacks have played 11 of the 64 teams in this year's NCAA Regionals during the regular season. Arkansas played five conference foes (Alabama, Auburn, Georgia, LSU, South Carolina) and six non-conference teams (Long Beach State, SMS, SEMO, Oklahoma, Oral Roberts, Wichita State). The Razorbacks posted a 13-18 mark against those teams, going 6-8 against non-conference opponents and 7-10 against SEC teams. The Razorbacks won the season series against ORU (2-0) and Auburn (3-1), while losing series to Long Beach State (1-2), Wichita State (0-1), SEMO (0-2), LSU (0-3), Georgia (1-2) and Alabama (1-2). The Hogs split with South Carolina (2-2) and Oklahoma (1-1).

Broom Work

Arkansas recorded its first three-game sweep of a conference foe in just over a year with its sweep of the Ole Miss Rebels. Arkansas swept No. 1 LSU in Fayetteville on May 4-6, last season. The last road sweep for the Hogs came in 1999 when Arkansas took three games from the Florida Gators in Gainesville on April 2-4. The Razorbacks now have two sweeps of SEC teams this season including a two-game sweep of South Carolina on April 5-6. The last time Arkansas swept two SEC series in the same season came in 1999 when the Hogs swept Tennessee, Kentucky, Mississippi State and Ole Miss at home and Florida on the road.
