UPCOMING MATCHES

November 8 at Duke (ACC Tournament), Durham, NC 7 pm

THIS WEEK SCHEDULE--Clemson will play at Duke in the first round of the quarterfinal round of the ACC Tournament in Durham, NC. Match time is set for 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday evening. Duke is seeded third, while Clemson is seeded sixth.

THE SERIES--This will be the 52nd meeting between Clemson and Duke on the soccer field. Duke leads the overall series 24-23-4. The series started in 1939. In matches in Durham, NC, Duke leads 15-7-2. In the ACC Tournament, when the two teams meet, Clemson leads the series 2-1. The last time Clemson and Duke met in the ACC Tournament was in 1998 when the Tigers defeated the Blue Devils in the ACC Tournament Finals in Winston-Salem, NC.

CLEMSON UPDATE--Clemson is now 8-8-1 overall, 4-4 in the ACC. The Tigers are led in scoring by Brynjar Benediktsson with seven goals and five assists for 19 points. Austin Savage has six goals and four assists for 16 points. Cody Mizell has 72 saves this year and a 1.38 goals allowed average.

DUKE UPDATE--The Blue Devils are 10-6-2 overall, and 4-3-1 in the ACC this season. Andrew Wenger leads Duke in scoring with 17 goals and eight assists for 42 points. Duke defeated Clemson, 5-2 during the regular season behind a hat trick and an assist from junior Wenger.

INJURY UPDATE--Clemson has two players out for the season. Nick Burton is out after having surgery, and Francklin Blaise has a hip injury. Both players are seniors. Burton played in only three games and Blaise has not played any this season. Senior Riley Sumpter is off the team. He has played in eight games this year and did not score this season.

CLEMSON CONTINUES TO IMPROVE--The Tigers are 8-8-1 overall and 4-4 in the ACC this season. The eight wins are the most for the Tigers in a single season since 2006. That year, the Tigers won 13 and advanced to the NCAA's Final Four. The four ACC victories are the most conference victories since the 2001 season. It is also the first .500 season for league victories since 2006, when that team had a 3-3-2 record in the ACC. Clemson has defeated two top 20 teams this season. The Tigers defeated #14 Boston College on October 4 and number-one Maryland on October 28.

CLEMSON IN THE ACC TOURNAMENT--Over the years, Clemson has a 13-18-4 record in the 23 years of the ACC tournament. Clemson has a 6-11-2 record in the quarterfinal round and a 1-0 record in the first round match. The Tigers are also 4-4-2 in the semifinal round and have a 2-3 record in the Championship game. Clemson won the ACC tournament in 1998 and 2001. The ACC tournament was started in the 1987 season. Prior to the 1987 season the ACC Champion was determined by the regular season. The Tigers won 11 ACC Titles prior to the 1987 season. Overall the Tigers have won 13 total Atlantic Coast Conference Championships. The Tigers have won three regular season titles since the 1987 season (1990, 1993, and 1998).

Latest Clemson Goals Scored in the second overtime period

Brynjar Benediktsson scored with only :10 seconds left in the second overtime period in leading Clemson to a 2-1 victory over Gardner-Webb at Clemson, SC on September 27.

This marked the second game in a row that Benediktsson has scored the game winner in the second overtime period with only seconds remaining. On Friday, September 23, Benediktsson scored the game winner with only :29 seconds remaining in the second overtime period to give the Tigers a 2-1 win over N.C. State.

Brynjar Benediktsson now holds the Clemson record for the latest goal scored in an overtime period with time constraints with only :10 seconds remaining.

Clemson's earliest goal scored to start the game

Clemson freshman Amadou Dia scored on a header goal just :24 seconds into the Wake Forest match on September 9. This was the quickest goal scored to start a match in the history of Clemson men's soccer. The previous record for the fastest Clemson goal scored was :25 seconds by Austin Savage in 2010 vs. N.C. State and :39 by Wolde Harris vs. Vanderbilt on September 4, 1994.

Clemson's Latest Goal Scored in Regulation Record Tied

Freshman Iain Smith scored one goal and had an assist in leading Clemson to a 2-0 upset win over 14th-ranked Boston College at Historic Riggs Field in Clemson, SC Friday, October 14.

Two oddities occurred in this match. With only one second left in regulation, Iain Smith scored his first goal of the year (89:59). This tied the Clemson record for the latest goal scored in regulation in school history. Jimmy Glenn scored with one second remaining in the Tigers' 2-1 upset-win at number-one ranked Virginia in Charlottesville, VA on October 10, 1993.

The other strange oddity is the Tigers' goalkeeper, Cody Mizell had an assist on the play.

MIZELL IN GOAL FOR THE TIGERS--Cody Mizell has a 1.38 goals against average along with 72 saves. He has recorded three solo shutout this season. Mizell has played in 16 matches this season has started 16.

He had a career-high 10 saves in the upset win over 14th-ranked Boson College on October 14. Last year he was a freshman All-American as selected by Collge Soccer News and Soccer America.

OVERTIME GAMES THIS SEASON--Clemson has played in three over-time matches this season. The school record for most overtime matches in a season is nine set by the 2002 Tigers. This season, Clemson is 2-0-1 in overtime matches.

CLEMSON LEADS THE ACC FOR MOST ALL-ACC HONORS--Over the years, 98 different players have earned 191 first or second team All-ACC honors since Clemson first fielded a men's soccer squad in the 1967 season. The 191 All-ACC selections is the most among the ACC schools.

FASTEST GOAL EVER IN CLEMSON HISTORY--Against Wake Forest on September 9, freshman Amadou Dia scored on a header goal just :24 seconds into the match. This was the quickest goal scored to start a match in the history of Clemson men's soccer. The previous record for the fastest Clemson goal scored was :25 seconds by Austin Savage in 2010 vs. NC State and :39 by Wolde Harris vs. Vanderbilt on September 4, 1994.

NOONAN IS IN HIS SECOND YEAR AS HEAD COACH OF THE TIGERS--Mike Noonan, who took Brown to 10 NCAA Tournament appearances and eight Ivy League Championships in 15 years, is in his second year at Clemson.

Noonan is Clemson's fifth coach in the 75-year history of Clemson Soccer. The Clemson program has won National Championships in 1984 and 1987 and has won 13 Atlantic Coast Conference Championships.

ACADEMIC HONORS--The men's soccer team earned a 3.06 GPA for the 2011 spring semester, which was the highest mark among the male sports at Clemson. The men's soccer team has had the highest GPA among male sports for the last six spring semesters. Of the 21 players on the roster for Head Coach Mike Noonan's team, 13 made the honor roll for the spring semester. Tiger soccer player Keegan Priest, who graduated in just three years, is now in the Clemson MBA program.

NIGHT HOME MATCH RECORD--Clemson has a 201-31-16 record in home matches played at night since 1980. The first home night match was on September 24, 1980, as the Tigers defeated UNC-Charlotte 1-0.

NON-CONFERENCE HOME GAMES--Clemson has a 451-114-40 record against non-conference opponents when playing at Clemson .

AGAINST THE ACC--Clemson has a 76-46-11 record against Atlantic Coast Conference teams in the regular season at home.

FORMER TIGER BRUCE MURRAY NAMED TO THE NATIONAL SOCCER HALL OF FAME--Bruce Murray, who helped lead Clemson to two national Championships in men's soccer in 1984 and 1987 and later starred with the U.S. Men's National team has been named to the National Soccer Hall of Fame.

CLEMSON VS. NUMBER-ONE RANKED TEAMS--Over the years, Clemson is 8-16-3 vs. number one-ranked teams. At Clemson, the Tigers have a 4-4-1 mark when playing number-one ranked teams. Clemson defeated number-one ranked Maryland 2-1, at Clemson on October 28.

TIGERS NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-ACC--Two Clemson Men's Soccer Players Bo Godwin and Alex Stockinger were named to the 2010 Academic All-ACC Men's Soccer Team as announced by Commissioner John Swofford.

HEAD COACH MIKE NOONAN INDUCTED INTO THE CONNECTICUT SOCCER HALL OF FAME--Clemson Head Men's Soccer Coach Mike Noonan was inducted into the Connecticut Soccer Hall of Fame on Thursday, January 27, 2011, in ceremonies at Farmington, CT. Noonan played on the Staples High School 1978 state championship team. A four-year starter and two-time first-team All-American at Middlebury College, he played professionally in Sweden and with both the Major Indoor Soccer League and American Indoor Soccer Association.

Mike started the men's soccer program at Wheaton College. He moved on to the University of New Hampshire, then Brown University.

CLEMSON HAS DEFEATED EVENTUAL NATIONAL CHAMPION THREE TIMES DURING THE REGULAR SEASON--Clemson has defeated the eventual national champion three times in the history of the program. In 2009, the Tigers defeated Virginia 1-0 at Charlottesville, VA. In the 2008 season, Clemson defeated Maryland at Clemson as Michael Brooks came off the bench and scored three goals in only 47 minutes of play. On October 10, 1993 at Charlottesville, VA, the Tigers former Tiger All-American Jimmy Glenn scored the winning goal at the 89:59 mark (one second remaining in regulation). This was the latest goal that the Tigers have ever scored to win a match in regulation.

TWO FORMER CLEMSON PLAYERS PLAYED IN 2010 WORLD CUP--Defender Oguchi Onyewu and midfielder Stuart Holden played for the United States on the 2010 World Cup Team.

Holden played at Clemson in 2003 and 2004. He was named second team All-ACC in 2004.

Onyewu played for Clemson in the 2000 and 2001 seasons and was named to the Soccer America MVP team in 2001 and was named a NSCAA All-American in 2001. Onyewu was a Hermann Award Finalist in 2001.

During his career at Clemson, Onyewu was named first-team All-ACC in 2000 and 2001.

HENRY ABADI INDUCTED IN THE CLEMSON HALL OF FAME--Former Clemson All-American Henry Abadi was selected to the Clemson Athletic Hall of Fame in May, 2010. Abadi played for Clemson in the 1972 and 1973 seasons. Abadi was named an All-American in 1973 and first-team All-ACC in 1972 and 1973. He set the Clemson record for most goals in a season with 32 in 1973 and set the school record for most points in a season with 71 in 1973. He holds the Clemson career record for most hat tricks with seven.

CLEMSON SETS ATTENDANCE RECORD IN THE SOUTH CAROLINA GAME ON SEPTEMBER 2--Ben Myers and Amadou Dia both scored goals in leading Clemson to a 2-0 victory over South Carolina in a men's intercollegiate soccer match at Clemson, SC on September 2. A crowd of 7,423 was on hand at Historic Riggs Field. This set a new regular-season attendance record at the facility
