In just over one year on the job, Steve Weir has made quite an impression on the Cleveland State golf program.

The 2006 graduate of CSU, Weir led the men's team to the 2008 Horizon League Championship and a berth in the NCAA Central Regional in his first season at the helm. For his efforts, he was voted the Horizon League Coach of the Year by his peers.

Guiding a team that set the season scoring average by four shots, Weir had a hand in two golfers being selected to the all-league team, including Horizon League Championship medalist Jake Scott.

Weir also led the women's program to a fourth place showing at the league tournament as the Vikings set the single season scoring average record by more than five shots.

Weir returned to CSU in the summer of 2007 with a familiarity to the Viking program, having served as an assistant coach to the men's and women's squads in 2006-07. He has also been the Assistant Golf Professional at Pine Hills Golf Club in Hinkley since April, 2007.

He had an outstanding collegiate career, spending time at Kent State and Baldwin-Wallace before enrolling at CSU in September of 2005.

In his lone golf season as a Viking, Weir earned first team All-Horizon League honors in 2006 and was a two-time Horizon League Golfer of the Week.

He was second on the team in stroke average (75.3) in 2006.

He carded a school-record, eight-under-par 63 en route to a runner-up finish at the Belmont Intercollegiate and finished second at the Dayton Spring Invitational, helping the Vikings win the team title by eight shots.

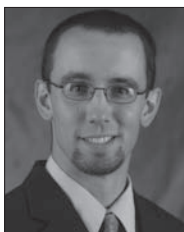
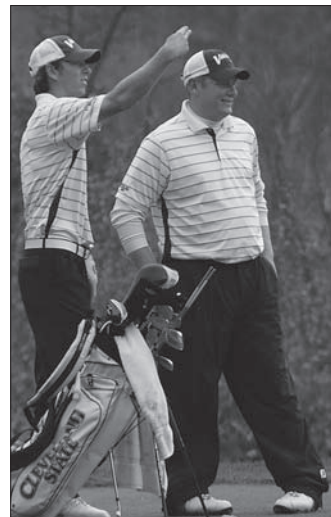
Weir was a large factor in the Vikings claiming the 2006 Horizon League Championship and

advancing to the NCAA regionals, shooting rounds of 70-72-74 (216) and finishing 11th overall.

In 2005, Weir captured the Greater Cleveland Amateur Championship and also advanced to the match play portion of the U.S. Amateur Public Links Championship.

At Baldwin-Wallace, Weir holds the best season average in school-history when he posted 75.2 strokes per round in the fall of 2003, including a low round of 70.

Weir and his wife of one year, Alicia, reside in Berea.

Nathan Miklos is in his second season as an assistant coach for the Cleveland State men's and women's golf teams.

A native of Hermitage, Pa., Miklos joined the staff after serving as an assistant golf coach at Shawnee High School in Lima, Ohio from 2005-07. He also served as the Assistant Golf Professional at Shawnee Country Club from 2006-07.

Miklos is no stranger to the Horizon League circuit as he was the head women's coach at Loyola from 2003-05. During that time, he led the squad to the 2004 Horizon League Championship and was named the co-coach of the year.

The 2005 Rambler squad was recognized by the National Golf Coaches Association for having one of the top-25 grade point averages in college golf with one student-athlete earning a spot on the 2005 Division I All-American Scholar Team.

Miklos also had a one-year stint (2002-03) as the assistant men's and women's golf coach at his alma mater, Grove City College. He helped lead the women's team to the conference championship as the team set a new conference scoring record (587), as two players placed in the top-five.

As a player at Grove City, Miklos led the Wolverines to a pair of conference championships and was named the conference MVP in 2001. A two-time team captain, Miklos earned first team all-conference accolades for three seasons and second team honors once.

Miklos graduated from Grove City in 2002 with a Bachelor's of Art and also earned his Master's of Sport Science in 2005 from the United States Sports Academy in Daphne, Ala.



2008-09 WOMEN'S SEASON PREVIEW

The future has arrived for the Cleveland State women's golf team.

Despite a roster that is small in stature, the Vikings have the experience and the talent to improve upon last season's fourth place finish at the Horizon League Championship.

In addition, the Vikings set the school-record for lowest team scoring average (335.4) by more than five strokes.

"This is a big year for us because we return a good nucleus with five strong players," second year head coach Steve Weir said. "We played well at times last season, but were rarely able to put together two or three great rounds in a tournament. The experience that we gained last season should make us that much more competitive this year."

The experience factor carried through the entire season for CSU, culminating at the final round of the Horizon League Championship when the Vikings posted a school-record 318.

"That was a great way for us to end last season because we put four good scores up," Weir said. "It also gave the team something to build on over the summer and it shows them that they are capable of posting a low number."

The two players who will once again lead the Viking charge are junior Katie Broere and senior Mallory Wyderka, who were consistently CSU's top two finishers last season.

Broere is coming off her sophomore campaign in which she led the team with an 81.8 average, the

second lowest in program history. She had four top-10 finishes, including an eighth place showing at the Northern Illinois Invitational when she set the school-record with a 72 in the final round.

"Katie has the opportunity to have a special season for us," Weir said. "She has worked hard on her game and we will need her to consistently shoot in the mid to high 70's or low 80's this season."

Wyderka was just as good as Broere last season, posting four top-10 finishes of her own and ranking second on the team in scoring average (82.7). She carded a career-low 74 at the IPFW Fall Invitational, which was tied for the school-record until Broere broke it in the spring.

Wyderka enters her senior season with a career scoring average of 83.9, second all-time at CSU.

"Mallory has all the traits you could ask for in a senior, especially when it comes to leadership" Weir said. "She manages the golf course very well and has the ability to be one of the elite players in the league this year."

Junior Laren Beese joined Broere and Wyderka as the only golfers to play in all 20 rounds last season, finishing third on the squad with an 86.0 scoring average. She played better during the fall season, averaging 83.5 in eight rounds and finishing as CSU's top golfer at the Detroit Invitational.

"Laren has put a lot of time and effort into her game and we will need her to be consistent for us in the middle of the lineup," Weir said. "She has a nice, smooth swing and is capable of putting up some low scores for us."

Senior Ashley Davidson and junior Kim Dulski both played at the bottom of CSU's lineup last season and will once again be counted on to follow suit this season.

After a slow start in the fall, Davidson turned things around in the spring with a 19th place show-

ing at the Northern Illinois Invitational and 17th at the league championship. She carded a season-best 77 in the final round of the league tournament, tying for the fourth lowest round of the day.

Dulski provides the Vikings with a steady veteran presence after averaging 87.7 per round last season. She posted a career-low 79 at the IPFW Invitational, bettering her previous career low by seven shots.

Freshmen Victoria Asetline and Brittany Keiter round out the seven-player roster and will attempt to slide into the lineup in their rookie seasons.

"There is no question that Tori and Brittany have the talent to crack our lineup," Weir said. "There is always a learning curve for freshmen, but I expect them to perform well this season."

Asetline played on a co-ed golf team at Fremont Ross High and was part of three district qualifying teams. She had a 99.5 average playing all her rounds from the boys tees in high school.

Keiter was a highly accomplished player at Barrington (Ill.) High, earning all-state honors three times. She was a four-time all-conference selection, winning the league championship as a junior and the regional title her sophomore season. Her teams placed in the top-10 at the state tournament in each of her four seasons.

2008-09 MEN'S SEASON PREVIEW

For the Cleveland State men's golf team, high expectations are quickly becoming the norm. And with good reason.

The Vikings won last season's Horizon League Championship and advanced to the NCAA Central Regional Championship for the second time in the last three years.

And as second year head coach and 2008 Horizon League Coach of the Year Steve Weir, knows, this year's squad has the talent and the ability to defend the league championship.

"We have had a lot of success the last few seasons and I expect us to once again be in contention for the league title," Weir said. "Everybody played good golf over the summer and I expect that to carry over to this season."

One of the most encouraging signs for Weir is that he returns Horizon League medalist Jake Scott as well as sophomore Kent Monas, who finished third at the league championships.

Add to the mix juniors Kyle Cobb, who won the Greater Cleveland Amateur Championship in August, and Patrick Elber, and the Vikings have a majority of the pieces to make a run at another championship.

"Having four players back from a championship team is a nice luxury to have," Weir said. "But this is a new season and we can't take anything for granted. We have to continue to work hard and play consistent golf."

Scott, who became just the second golfer in CSU history to claim the Horizon League individual title, will once again anchor the team at the No. 1 slot. A first team All-Horizon League selection in each of the last two seasons, Scott set a school-record with his 72.7 scoring average last season. The lone competitor to break par at the league championship last season, Scott posted eight top-10 finishes, including a victory at the Kent State

Invitational when he blasted the field with a six-under-par 134 (69-65).

Scott was listed as one of the top-50 players in the country to watch by *golfworld.com* in its pre-season preview.

"I expect Jake to have another big year for us," Weir said. "He has displayed outstanding leadership skills and has consistently shown the younger players what it takes to compete at this level."

Monas quickly made the adjustment to the collegiate game last season, going out as CSU's No. 2 golfer in a majority of the events. Monas, who had four top-10 finishes, was second on the team with a 74.5 scoring average, the third lowest in school history. He proved his mettle and worth to the team at the league championship, playing in the final group for all three rounds and sinking a par putt on the 54th hole to seal the title for CSU.

"Kent had a very solid freshman season for us," Weir said. "He really matured as the year progressed and has all the tools to be a very special player. He continues to get better and better as he learns more about his own game."

Cobb and Elber provide the Vikings with a veteran prescense, having played in big tournaments throughout their careers.

Cobb averaged 75.8 strokes last season, including a career-low 68 at the IPFW Fall Invitational where he tied for sixth place. He proved his worth to the team in the second round of the league championship. After shooting a 44 on the front nine, Cobb rebounded with a three-under-par 33 on the back nine as the Vikings counted his 77 as their third lowest score, eventually winning the team title by one shot.

Elber, playing predominantly in the fifth spot for CSU last season, averaged 76.1 shots per round. However, he saved his best for the league championships, finishing third among CSU golfers and 17th overall with rounds of 76-79-74.

"Kyle and Pat are both experienced players and we need them to take on a bigger roles this season," Weir said. "Each of them worked hard on their games over the summer and I expect that to translate over to this season."

With the top four slots on the team fairly secure, Weir will need

to find someone to fill the void left by Doug Barber, an all-conference pick last season.

Hoping to step in and contribute are sophomores Kellen Erdman, Shane Swanson and Derrick Williams and freshman James Boxley.

"We are going to need at least one of those four players to come in and take the final spot in the lineup," Weir said.

Erdman played in just two rounds last season, but did fire a 73 at Sand Ridge G.C. in the CSU Invitational. He is a product of St. Edward High, missing all-state honors by one shot as a senior.

Swanson played in three events last season, averaging 79.4 per round, including a career-low 68 at the IPFW Fall Classic. Williams, who received limited action as a freshman, took last season as a redshirt. An accomplished player at Southview High, Williams was a four-time all-league selection and the league player of the year as a junior.

Boxley could be the wild card in the group after he finished 17th at the state tournament for Miamisburg High.

"James has a lot of potential and can make an impact on our program from day one," Weir said. "If he doesn't try to force things to happen, he will quickly adjust to the collegiate game and be able to help us in the lineup."

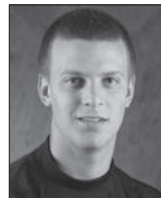

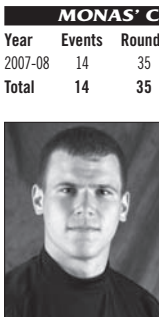

Celebrating its 30th anniversary in 2008-09, the Horizon League continues to aspire toward its goal of being one of the nation's leading athletics conferences while being recognized as a leader in the development of student-athletes as leaders and role models.

The Horizon League membership features ten public and private institutions that have impressive academic reputations and a storied tradition of broad-based athletic programs. Current membership includes Butler University, Cleveland State University, the University of Detroit Mercy, the University of Illinois at Chicago, Loyola University Chicago, Valparaiso University, the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay, the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, Wright State University and Youngstown State University.

The Horizon League's primary focus is on adding value to the educational experience through its four platforms of athletic performance, academic achievement, community outreach, and personal responsibility and accountability. It is the League's belief that athletics is a powerful and visible resource tool that can be used to enhance student-athletes' collegiate experience. The Horizon League's goals are to enhance the holistic university experience for the student-athlete, to create an affiliation of institutions with similar athletic goals, and to adhere to the principals of integrity, diversity, excellence and growth.

The Horizon League sponsors competition in 19 sports—nine for men (baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, swimming and diving, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field and tennis) and ten for women (basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, swimming and diving, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field, tennis and volleyball). In all sports, all teams participate in their respective postseason League championships regardless of regular-season performance, allowing

all student-athletes an opportunity to qualify for NCAA championships. The League receives automatic bids to NCAA championships in baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's tennis, and women's volleyball.

The Horizon League is headquartered in Indianapolis, the "Amateur Sports Capital of the World," with offices in the Pan American Plaza (201 S. Capitol Avenue), located a block from Lucas Oil Stadium and just minutes from Conesco Fieldhouse, the State Capitol Building, Victory Field and the NCAA national office.

A PROUD HISTORY

Founded on June 16, 1979, as the Midwestern City Conference with six charter members, the League changed its name to the Midwestern Collegiate Conference in 1985 and added women's sports for the 1986-87 academic year. Charter members of the conference included current members Butler and Loyola as well as the University of Evansville, Oklahoma City University, Oral Roberts University and Xavier University. Among other current members, Detroit joined in 1980, and Cleveland State, UIC, Green Bay, Milwaukee and Wright State came aboard in 1994 in the largest non-merger conference expansion in history, with Youngstown State joining in 2001 and Valparaiso in 2007.

On June 4, 2001, the Horizon League unveiled its current name and ushered in a new dynamic direction that has brought the League closer to its stated goal of being one of the nation's top ten conferences with a focus on enhancing the student-athletes experience by upgrading the League's market.

ATHLETIC SUCCESS

In the past few years, the Horizon League has enjoyed unprecedented success on the national stage, highlighted by three Sweet Sixteen appearances (Butler 2003, 2007; Milwaukee 2005) and eight wins in the NCAA Men's Basketball Championship in the past six seasons. In other sports, League teams have won at least one game in their respective NCAA Championships each of the last six seasons in men's soccer (Milwaukee 2002-05, UIC 2006-07), with UIC just one win away from the College Cup in 2007. In softball, League teams won a game in the national tournament four straight years earlier in the decade (UIC 2002, 2004; Wright State 2003; Green Bay 2005) while advancing into the second round in women's soccer three of the last four seasons (Detroit 2004, Milwaukee 2005-06). Green Bay's women's basketball team added to that résumé with a victory in the 2007 NCAA Women's Basketball Championship. Butler's Victoria Mitchell became the League's first NCAA individual champion when she won the 3,000-meter steeplechase at the 2005 NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships and then finished fourth at the 2005 NCAA Cross Country Championships.

GOVERNANCE

The Horizon League is governed by a Board of Directors comprised of the ten member institutions' chief executive officers. Dr. David Sweet, President of Youngstown State, serves as Board Chair through June 30, 2010. Ron Strollo, Executive Director of Intercollegiate Athletics at Youngstown State, serves as chair of the Executive Council, and Christine Moeller, Assistant Athletic Director/Senior Woman Administrator at Cleveland State, is the Second Delegate, while Sheila Patterson of Cleveland State serves as chair of the Faculty Athletics Representatives.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Horizon League student-athletes also excel in the classroom as more than 500 have been named to the Academic Honor Roll each of the past seven semesters for carrying a grade-point average of 3.2 or better, including more than 600 for the fall 2007 and spring 2008 semesters. Forty-eight student-athletes were named to ESPN The Magazine/CosIDA Academic All-District teams in 2007-08, while 14 earned Academic All-America honors, including a pair of first-team selections.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

In addition to its athletics success, the Horizon League has secured a well-earned reputation for its community service initiatives. Each January, member institutions partner with local elementary schools for an art, music and essay contest highlighting the life of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. with winners recognized at League games on the weekend of MLK Day.

The Horizon League Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) also has continued a tradition of working with youth in Indianapolis during its annual summer meeting, while the League, its schools and fans donate to Komen for the Cure for breast cancer awareness during its annual women's basketball championship. On campus, student-athletes have raised money and awareness for such causes as breast cancer, diabetes and hurricane relief, while hosting blood drives, neighborhood clean-ups, Big Brother/Big Sister programs and more.

SPORTSMANSHIP

One of the Horizon League's points of emphasis is fostering collegial environments for competition among student-athletes, coaches, administrators and fans in a pro-active approach. Among the vehicles is the Ethical Conduct Pledge, which is signed each season by student-athletes, coaches, officials, and campus and League administrators. Its purpose is to make all the involved groups aware of the Horizon League expectations of behavior during conference events.

DEMOGRAPHICS

Horizon League institutions boast a combined enrollment of more than 130,000 plus nearly a quarter-million living alumni centered in the League's Midwest footprint. League media markets include five of the nation's top 35 in Chicago, Detroit, Cleveland, Indianapolis and Milwaukee, covering more than 10 million television households.

HORIZON LEAGUE NETWORK

The Horizon League is a recognized leader in video streaming, through the Horizon League Network (HLN), having produced more than 800 free, live events in the past three years, with plans to web cast more than 400 during the 2008-09 academic year. In addition to live games, HLN includes highlight vignettes of all 19 League championships, weekly highlight videos during the basketball season and other special programming.

McCAFFERTY TROPHY

The Horizon League annually awards the McCafferty Trophy in recognition of its all-sports champion in honor of its first commissioner, James J. McCafferty. Cleveland State won its first McCafferty Trophy in school history following the 2007-08 academic year. The Vikings also captured their first Men's All-Sports Award, while Milwaukee claimed the women's honor for the third straight year and seventh time in the past eight years.



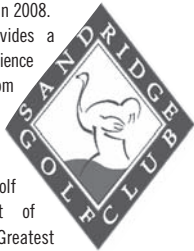
SAND RIDGE GOLF CLUB • CHARDON, OHIO

The Cleveland State men's golf team will always have fond memories of Sand Ridge Golf Club. On May 18, 2006, the Vikings made their debut in NCAA Regional competition on their home course. While the Vikings wound up 26th in the event — which was won by Oklahoma State in rainy, blustery conditions — it was an experience that Doug Barber, Ben Grandy, Mike Rutgers, Jake Scott and current CSU head coach Steve Weir will not soon forget.

The course has also played host to top-notch fields at the CSU Invitational for the last three years (2005-07) and the Telich Sun Life Financial Invitational in 2008.

Sand Ridge provides a premier golfing experience on a world-class Tom Fazio course to a membership of devoted enthusiasts. Ranked 52nd on Golf Digest's 2005 list of "America's 100 Greatest Courses," the club's facilities and Sand Ridge Cottages are simple yet elegant, engineered to complement and accentuate the golfing experience, while the environmentally sensitive design reflects the area's natural beauty.

Fazio's development of a routing plan was influenced by the five natural wetlands present on Sand Ridge's acreage. Not only is the course's beauty enhanced by the wetland's presence, but Sand Ridge is the first course in Ohio, and one of a select few in the world, to be designated as a Certified Audubon International Signature Sanctuary.

"TECHNOLOGY AND TECHNIQUE FOR A BETTER GAME"



On Feb. 12, 2004 Cleveland State officially dedicated the John Telich Sr. Golf Technology Center. Housed in the Physical Education Building, the facility provides CSU's men's and women's teams a first class facility in which to train year-round, giving them an advantage over much of their competition.

First-year head coach Brian Varsey noted how fortunate he was to inherit such a first-class facility.

"We are grateful for the generosity of Mr. Telich in providing for a unique complete environment for our student athletes to learn and grow. As a team and an athletic department we are proud it has his name and embodies his continued commitment to Cleveland State University golf. We wouldn't be where we are today without him."

The Tech Center provides a year round home for the Viking golf program. It contains a three-station, full swing practice area as well as a recently-completed five hundred-square foot contoured putting surface. The tech center also includes a sophisticated video monitoring system and an equipment storage area. A separate

lounge area with couches and a television completes the tech center, offering relaxation space for the golfers to unwind after a hard days' work.



The tech center is divided into two rooms, with one providing a three-station hitting net and an equipment storage area. The other room contains a 500-square foot putting green and a player lounge.
