#### THE OPENING TIP

Cleveland State (8-21, 5-11 HL) opens play in the 2007 Horizon League Championship on Wednesday, March 7 at 8:00 p.m. EST at second-seeded UIC (18-11, 11-5 HL). Picked ninth in the preseason, the Vikings finished in a three-way tie for sixth place with Loyola and Youngstown State, earning the No. 7 seed. The Flames won both regular season meetings by comfortable margins and are 2-0 versus CSU all-time in the postseason. The Vikings are 6-12 in the league tournament

#### THE SERIES WITH UIC

UIC leads the all-time series by a 26-20 margin, claiming the last five meetings. Cleveland State is just 8-16 all-time in Chicago, including a 65-63 loss in the 2001 Horizon League Championship. The other postseason meeting was also a two-point victory by the Flames (79-77) — that coming in the 1996 MCC tournament in Green Bay.

#### FLAMES BURN VIKINGS TWICE THIS YEAR

Unfortunately for Cleveland State, UIC dominated play this year, winning the head-to-head meetings by scores of 72-46 (Jan. 4 in Chicago) and 68-54 (Feb. 3 in Cleveland). The Flames shot .441 from the floor, while the Vikings connected on just 32.3 percent of their field goal attempts, including a dismal 2-for-21 effort from three-point (.095). CSU held a 73-66 rebound advantage, but committed 49 turnovers compared to 36 for the Flames. Kailey Klein averaged 15.0 points to lead the Vikings, while Jessica Roque contributed a steady 10.0 ppg. Meanwhile, LaShonda Grant was the only UIC player in double-figures, averaging 19.5 points in the two wins.

#### NOTING THE VIKINGS

The Vikings played well despite losing at Butler, 83-79, on Saturday. CSU employs a three-guard system, with freshmen Kailey Klein (11.0 ppg, 4.1 rpg), Angel Roque (3.2 ppg, 2.4 apg) and Jessica Roque (8.4 ppg, 2.3 apg) handling the backcourt duties. The Vikings have been led in the post by senior Nicole Thomas, who is averaging 7.5 points and 7.0 rebounds. With freshman Stephaine Crosley (6.8 ppg, 4.0 rpg) missing 18 games with a leg injury and sophomore center Stephanie Youdath (5.4 ppg, 4.1 rpg, 1.8 bpg) struggling with back problems, senior Chenara Wilson (6.7 ppg, 3.4 rpg) has been solid in making 12 consecutive starts. Junior Brittany Korth (6.7 ppg, 2.5 apg) and sophomores Dominique Butler (8.0 ppg, 4.8 rpg, 1.9 spg) and Natalie Miller (4.4 ppg, 2.5 rpg) give the Vikings solid guard play off of the bench, while junior Robyn Hoying (3.4 ppg, 2.7 rpg) provides depth in the front court.

#### KLEIN, BUTLER HONORED BY LEAGUE

The All-Horizon League teams were released on Monday, and Cleveland State freshman Kailey Klein and sophomore Dominique Butler were among those recognized. Klein became the first Viking to earn newcomer of the year accolades in 13 seasons in the league, while Butler was named to the all-defensive squad for the second year in a row. Klein is CSU's seventh all-newcomer pick, while Butler is the fifth all-defensive honoree and the first to be recognized twice. (You can read more about their exploits later in the notes.)

### ON THE REBOUND

One of Cleveland State's greatest areas of improvement in Horizon League play has been the Vikings' work on the boards. CSU leads the league this year with a +4.8 rebound margin, compared to a -3.9 mark last season. Since the start of conference play, the Vikings have been out-rebounded just twice, posting a season-high +17 mark in the Feb. 17 game against No. 25 UW-Green Bay. At +1.6 overall, CSU is attempting to post just its second positive rebound margin since the 1982-83 season (2003-04 was the other).

### A LEAGUE OF HER OWN

Horizon League play has been just what the doctor ordered for freshman guard Kailey Klein. While her 26-point effort at Western Michigan on Dec. 7 was a brief glimpse of things to come, the Cherry, Ill. native has been much more consistent as of late, ranking fourth in league play with a team-best 16.3 ppg. Additionally, she ranks second in offensive rebounds (3.50 — just one board behind Traci Edwards), seventh in steals (1.56), eighth in rebounds (5.8) and 10th

in free throw pct. (.739). In CSU's 13 non-league games, she averaged just 4.0 points in 10.0 minutes of playing time, but now leads CSU at 31.8 minutes a game in league play, which ranks eighth.

### KLEIN MAJORS IN PHILANTHROPY

A big factor in Kailey Klein's consistent scoring output in Horizon League play has been her ability to get to the charity stripe on a regular basis. In CSU's 16 conference contests, she took 36 percent of the team's free throw attempts (119 of 331), making 88 to rank second on the squad at 73.9 percent. Thanks in part to a career-high 14 attempts at the stripe on Feb. 1 against Loyola, Klein ranked second the league in free throw tries. Overall, her 143 attempts stand just behind Mahogany Green's total in 1999-00 (144) which is 10th in CSU's season records.

### WILSON ENJOYS RESURGENCE

Center Chenara Wilson has excelled since moving into the starting line-up 12 games ago. She has averaged 10.5 points and 5.1 rebounds as a starter, after posting just 4.1 points and 2.2 boards in 17 contests off the bench. In the dozen games, Wilson has tallied seven double-figure efforts, including a career-high 19 points on March 3 at Butler and a pair of 18-point outbursts. The Cleveland native had quite a Senior Day to remember in the Feb. 24 win over Youngstown State, tallying 18 points and 10 rebounds to earn Horizon League Player of the Week honors for the first time in her career. She was 6-for-12 from the floor and 6-for-8 from the line while posting her second career double-double.

### WELCOME BACK CROSBY

Sophomore forward Stephaine Crosley finally made her return to the court last Thursday at Wright State, scoring three points in 10 minutes off of the bench. The Milwaukee native had been sidelined since Dec. 7 with a leg injury. She started CSU's first nine games, averaging 8.0 points and 4.8 rebounds.

### The Last Time Out...

Unfortunately for Cleveland State, it was only fitting that Butler's Jackie Closser would hit the winning shot on Senior Day as the Bulldogs defeated the Vikings, 83-79. Butler's all-time leader in three-point field goals, it was Closser's old-fashioned three-point play with 25 seconds remaining that provided the difference in the game. CSU's Kailey Klein led all players with 26 points.

The Vikings got out of the gates slowly, spotting the Bulldogs a 24-7 lead at the 12:35 mark. However, CSU dominated the next eight minutes of play, rattling off 24 of the next 29 points to take a 31-29 advantage with 3:59 remaining.

The teams eventually headed into the locker room with the score tied at 36-36.

The second half was a see-saw affair that featured 11 ties and 13 lead-changes. After trading baskets for the first seven minutes, Butler went on a quick 8-0 jaunt with a lay-up to go up 59-52 with 11:49 remaining.

The Vikings answered back immediately with a 9-2 burst thanks to six more points from Klein to knot the score at 61-61 at the 8:55 mark.

The teams continued to battle back and forth until back-to-back baskets by Nicole Thomas put CSU up 79-76 with 1:22 remaining. Tara Miller answered with a pair of free throws to bring the Bulldogs to within one.

After a defensive stop, Closser followed with her three-point play to put Butler ahead, 81-79, with 25 ticks remaining. CSU misfired on the ensuing position and Closser knocked down both free throws to close out the scoring.

Butler shot 46 percent for the game (28-61), while CSU knocked down 43 percent of its field goal attempts (29-67). The Vikings held a 41-37 edge on the boards, while committing a season-low eight turnovers, including just two in the second half.

In addition to tallying her sixth 20-point game in league play, Klein added a career-high nine rebounds. Wilson tallied a career-high 19 points and six rebounds, while Korth notched 11 points and five assists.

Susan Lester paced Butler with 18 points and 11 rebounds, while Miller added 17 points. Closser finished with 15 points and five assists.

**FRESHMAN SCORING RECORD FALLS**

Kailey Klein scored a CSU freshman record 33 points (tied for 13th-best overall) on Feb. 10 at Detroit to help the Vikings earn just their second win in 17 tries all-time at Calihan Hall. She also set or tied career-highs for field goals (10), three-pointers (4), rebounds (8), assists (4), blocks (1) and minutes played (38), while not committing a single turnover. She had 16 points in the first half and 17 in the final stanza, including a pair of free throws with 16 seconds remaining that provided the final margin. The last time a CSU player scored 30 or more points was on Jan. 5, 2004 when Ashley Schrock tallied 35 in a win at UIC.

**...AS PART OF RECENT BARRAGE**

Klein is averaging 18.4 ppg over the last 10 contests to raise her scoring average a team-high 11.0 ppg. With the season winding down, she is all but assured of becoming the first freshman to lead the team in scoring since Deb Taylor did so in 1987-88 (13.8 ppg). In addition to her 33 points at Detroit, she has topped the 20-point plateau five other times in conference play to rank third in the league with six 20-point performances. As the owner of a conference record 2,496 points in high school, Klein is no stranger to scoring outbursts.

**HOME, SWEET ROAD?**

While Cleveland State has picked up six of its eight wins this season in the Wolstein Center, the Vikings have struggled to shoot the ball consistently at home. On the road, CSU has connected on 38.9 percent of its shots from the floor, compared to just 36.0 percent at home. The numbers are also odd from the free throw line, with the Vikings making 70.8 percent on the road versus 67.4 percent in the Wolstein Center. Unfortunately, the dip in shooting has played a significant role in CSU losing five home games by a total of 11 points.

**DEPTH TAKES A HIT**

Before the season started, head coach Kate Peterson felt that despite having just 12 players on the roster, the Vikings were as deep as they had ever been in her four seasons at CSU. Talk about jinxing yourself. Since the beginning of the year, five different players have combined to miss a total of 41 games due to various maladies. Stephanie Youdath has missed 14 games with back problems, Dominique

Butler (four games) was out from Nov. 17-25 with a knee injury, Stephaine Crosley was sidelined 18 contests with a leg injury and Kailey Klein (one game) and Natalie Miller (four) have both sat out with various maladies. Peterson has had her full compliment of players to work with just three times this year: versus Buffalo (11/28), at Toledo (12/2) and against St. Bonaventure (12/4).

**THOMAS REDOUBLES EFFORTS**

Talk about senior leadership. Forward Nicole Thomas came into this season averaging 3.5 points and 4.7 rebounds in her first two seasons as a Viking. Finally healthy for the first time, the San Antonio native has been a solid presence in the paint for CSU, posting arguably the best game of her career at Loyola on Jan. 6, going 10-for-14 from the floor, with 22 points, 11 rebounds, five assists and three steals. The owner of a team-best six double-doubles (third in the league), she also ranks second in the league in rebounding (7.0) while scoring 7.5 ppg. The most amazing stat — considering her past health issues (11 games missed in two years) — is the fact that Thomas is third on the team in minutes played at 25.5 per game.

**THREE-POINT STREAK GROWS TO SIX**

Cleveland State's NCAA record run of 408 consecutive games with a three-pointer finally came to an end on Feb. 3 with an 0-for-12 effort against UIC. The Vikings had passed Louisville, whose 394-game streak came to an end in 2004-05, when junior Brittany Korth sank the record-breaking shot with 2:34 left in the first half against St. Bonaventure on Dec. 4. Prior to the game with the Flames, the last time CSU failed to drain at least one three-pointer was in a 78-55 loss at Cincinnati on Dec. 17, 1992. The Vikings made 2,366 triples during the streak — an average of 5.8 per game.

**...AND THE STREAK WILL LIVE UNTIL NEXT SEASON**

While it took Cleveland State more than 15 years to build its NCAA three-point streak, the Vikings' run atop the charts was in jeopardy of not even making it until the end of the season. However, Stanford's 403-game skein came to a halt with an 0-for-2 performance on Feb. 22 against UCLA. The longest active run now belongs to Canisius, who completed its season on Friday at 390 straight contests.

**BABY STEPS**

While eight victories might not seem like a lot, Cleveland State has shown vast improvement this season over the past two years. The Vikings' eight overall wins match their total from the past two years combined, while the five league victories are one more than the 2004-05 and 2005-06 squads put together. With six different underclassmen playing at least 16 minutes a game, the improvement is a sign of good things to come down the road.

contest in the Wolstein Center, topping the previous record of 14 set last year. In a bit of a scheduling oddity, the Vikings played at home just once in the month of January.

## YOUDATH "BACK" ON DL

Sophomore center Stephanie Youdath has missed 14 games this season due to a disc problem in her back. The Mentor, Ohio native sat out the first five games of the year and has missed nine more contests in 2007. Despite playing in just 15 games, she has blocked 27 shots — 30 percent of the team's total (90). Thanks to her career-best seven blocks against Wright State (one shy of the school record), Youdath's 1.80 per game average would easily outdistance the Horizon League leader (UW-Green Bay's Nicole Soulis: 1.61 pg) if she had played enough games to qualify. Youdath recorded 12 stuffs in limited action as a freshman two years ago at Marist.

## WHEN THE NUMBERS FALL, THE WINS INCREASE

Cleveland State's offensive output is relatively the same in its wins (64.8 ppg) and losses (61.6). Perhaps a bit odd — until you consider the fact that the Vikings are allowing nearly 20 fewer points (54.8 - 74.6) while holding their opponents to a significantly lower field goal percentage (.334 - .456) in the eight wins. In addition, CSU is doing a much better job of taking care of the ball in its victories, committing just 15.3 turnovers compared to 19.2 miscues in the losses.



## FINAL FOUR WILL ROCK CLEVELAND

Cleveland State continues its tradition of hosting first class NCAA events when the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Final Four comes to Cleveland for the first time. Along with the Mid-American Conference, CSU will welcome the top four teams in the nation to Quicken Loans Arena on April 1 & 3 for the national semifinals and championship.

## HALFTIME BLUES

The Vikings have made a bad habit of digging themselves an early hole this season, as Cleveland State has found itself ahead just six times at the half. The Vikings have trailed at the break 18 times — by an average of 11.1 points a game (they were also tied on five occasions). CSU has managed to rally from the deficit twice: on Nov. 21 against Colgate (trailed 33-39) and on Dec. 30 versus Wright State (18-24).

## FRESHMEN TAKE OVER BACKCOURT

On Jan. 20 at UW-Milwaukee, Kailey Klein and twin sisters Angel and Jessica Roque all earned a starting nod, giving Cleveland State a backcourt comprised entirely of freshmen. Jessica Roque has started all 29 games for the Vikings, while Klein has been in the starting line-up for the last 15 contests. Meanwhile, the game with the Panthers marked Angel Roque's debut among the starting five (she's now started 10 in a row).

## BUTLER AT IT AGAIN

After going without a steal in CSU's opening game, sophomore guard Dominique Butler made up for it in a big way against Niagara (Nov. 12) — matching her career-high with eight thefts. Thanks to recording at least three steals on eight different occasions, Butler's 1.9 steals per game once again leads the Horizon League. Last year, she averaged 2.9 spg to lead the league and rank 20th in the nation.

## ...AND REJOINS LEAGUE LEADERS

Due to the fact that she missed four games early in the year with a minor knee injury, Butler was not eligible to be ranked in the Horizon League stats until the conclusion of the Jan. 4 contest at UIC. Now having played the required 75 percent of CSU's games, the Milwaukee, Wis. native not only leads the league in steals, but is 13th in blocks (0.56), 14th in rebounds (4.8) and 30th in scoring (8.0).

## ON TARGET

There's no other way to put it — junior forward Robyn Hoying needs to shoot the ball more. On the year, she's making her field goal attempts at a team-best .513 clip (41-80) which would rank fifth in the Horizon League if she were averaging the minimum 3.0 field goals per game. In addition, she's made 69 percent of her free throws (9-13) and seven three-pointers after knocking down just one triple in her first two seasons.

## HOME, SWEET HOME

The Feb. 24 game with Youngstown State was Cleveland State's school-record 15th regular season

The pair is not unique on the team however, as Katie Baxter and Dominique Butler both have twin sisters as well. The Roques are one of four sets of twins competing for Cleveland State, joining Kristine

Last year, Ivory Latta and the North Carolina Tar Heels defeated Tennessee, 75-63, in front of 9,091 fans to win the Cleveland Regional and earn a berth in the Final Four. This season, the country's best teams will play right here in Cleveland to determine the 2007 national champion.

### CSU HONORS FIRST COACH

The Cleveland State Department of Athletics has announced the kick-off of the Jane Pease Endowed Scholarship Campaign. The goal of the drive is to endow the CSU's first women's basketball scholarship. A teacher and coach at Cleveland State and Fenn College for 38 years, Pease was first head coach in the history of the women's basketball program, directing the Vikings to a 28-20 mark from the inaugural season in 1973-74 through the 1976-77 campaign. She retired in 1982 after having also served as the first women's tennis coach at CSU. In January of 1984, she became the first woman inducted into the CSU Athletics Hall of Fame.

### CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

The Cleveland State women's basketball program added a trio of all-state honorees from a pair of state capitals on Nov. 8 — the first day high school student-athletes were able to sign. Justine Hayes (Madison, Wis.) and twin sisters Shawnice and Shawnita Garland (Charleston, W.Va.) all inked National Letters of Intent to attend CSU and play basketball beginning in the fall of 2007.

A 5-8 guard, Shawnice Garland was named first team all-state as a junior after averaging 19.7 points, 6.0 rebounds, 4.0 points and 2.0 steals for Capital High School. An all-conference pick as well, she was a third-team all-state pick as a sophomore.

Shawnita Garland, also a 5-8 guard, earned honorable mention all-state accolades for Capital head coach Steve Freeman after averaging 10.0 points and 5.0 assists.

A 6-0 forward, Hayes was an honorable mention all-state pick and the conference player of the year as a junior, averaging 14.7 points and 5.0 rebounds while shooting 45 percent from the floor and 77 percent from the free throw line. Playing for head coach Patrick Jost, she was Madison Memorial High School's leading scorer in all 21 games in 2005-06, while also lettering in volleyball and track.

### PETERSON IN MIDST OF FOURTH YEAR

The sixth head coach in 34 seasons of Viking women's basketball, Kate Peterson is 28-86 (.246) in her fourth year directing the Cleveland State program. In 2003-04, she guided the Vikings to a 12-16 record, including a school-record nine league wins. Prior to her arrival in Cleveland, Peterson spent six years as an assistant at Wisconsin, serving as the recruiting coordinator starting in 1998. She also worked at Eastern Illinois (1993-97) and Indiana (1991-93). A 1991 graduate of Wisconsin-Stevens Point, she earned Kodak All-America honors her senior season after setting the NCAA Division III record for three-point field goals per game at 3.85.

### CSU ON THE AIR

For the third year in a row, the women's basketball team will have all of its home games broadcast live over the internet. The women's program made its inaugural appearance over the airwaves towards the end of the 2003-04 campaign and has grown its visibility ever since. In addition, the radio broadcast will accompany the video streaming of all of CSU's home Horizon League contests.

**INTERNET PROVIDES LIMITLESS HORIZONS**

For the second straight season, all Horizon League men's and women's conference games will be available either via over-the-air television or via video streaming on the League's official web site at [www.horizonleague.org](http://www.horizonleague.org). All games (with the exception of those on ESPN) will be shown live on the web through a new partnership with College Sports TV Online, which also is the web provider for five league schools as well as the conference office.

The service, which is available for free, can be accessed on [CSUVikings.com](http://CSUVikings.com) or via the League's web site. Each broadcast will feature the radio play-by-play of the host school and video taken from at least three camera angles. For a complete schedule of all games, log on to [horizonleague.org](http://horizonleague.org).

**AND VALPARAISO MAKES 10**

The current 16-game Horizon League basketball schedule will undergo a change next year when Valparaiso joins the league as its 10th member. Currently a member of the Mid-Continent Conference, Valparaiso will bring its 17 sports into the Horizon League effective July 1, 2007. The addition of the Crusaders means that the basketball schedule will increase to 18 games next year with each team being paired with another league school as travel partners. CSU will pair with Youngstown State.

**LIKE FATHER, LIKE DAUGHTER**

Viking basketball has an interesting first this year as Dave and Stephanie Youdath are believed to be the first father-daughter combination to each suit up for Cleveland State. Dave, who lettered all four seasons from 1981-84 and was named Varsity "C" Player of the Year in both 1983 and '84, currently ranks 10th in school history with 1,306 career points. Stephanie, a 6-4 sophomore from Eastlake North High School, played her freshman season at Marist College and sat out last season after transferring to CSU in the fall of 2005.

**COME AGAIN?**

Last Thursday, Cleveland State took 19 more shots than Wright State, out-rebounded the Raiders 36-31 (including a 21-6 margin in the second half) and committed four fewer turnovers for the game (19-23). So the Vikings won, right? Not quite. WSU shot 62.5 percent in the second stanza (10-16), while going 8-for-14 from three-point for the game (57.1 percent).

**THE TURNOVER TALE**

Usually 27 turnovers would spell disaster for the team guilty of committing that many miscues. However, CSU was able to overcome that number against UW-Milwaukee on Feb. 15 by forcing the Panthers to commit 24 turnovers of their own while shooting just 30.0 percent from the floor (15-50). The Vikings, who had been 0-11 this year when committing more turnovers than their opponent, had not recorded more miscues in a win since a 31-turnover performance against Detroit on Feb. 9, 2002 (75-63).

**THAT 70s SHOW**

CSU's 77-74 win at Detroit on Feb. 10 was the first time the Vikings had won a game when allowing 70 or more points since defeating Akron by the exact same score on Dec. 7, 2004 — a span of 36 such contests.

**DOUBLE VISION**

Senior post players Nicole Thomas (12 points, 12 rebounds) and Chenara Wilson (12, 10) pulled off a rare double on Jan. 11 against Detroit, as each tallied double-doubles. The last time CSU had teammates record double-doubles in the same game was on Dec. 30, 2001, when Kim Brockway (19, 10) and Tonya Crum (12, 13) accomplished the feat in an 85-78 loss at Niagara.

**UP NEXT**

A win on Wednesday would earn CSU a semifinal match-up on Friday (March 9) against either Butler or Youngstown State at the site of the highest remaining seed. The championship game is slated for Sunday (March 11) at 1:00 p.m. EST on ESPNU.

**Game 1** — Miami had the final say in a see-saw affair, as Jenna Schone made a pair of free throws with 6.6 left to give the RedHawks an 86-64 victory. Cleveland State's Jessica Roque had knotted the score at 84-84 with a three-pointer just seconds earlier, but Schone was fouled on the ensuing inbounds play. Miami finished 29-of-35 from the line, while the Vikings were just 15-for-21, offsetting CSU's .451 mark from the field. Nicole Thomas paced the Vikings with a career-high 22 points and 15 rebounds and Stephanie Crosley added 15 points and nine boards.

**Game 2** — Cleveland State rallied from an 18-point deficit in the final 7:26 of regulation, only to fall to Niagara, 84-83, in overtime. Brittany Korth led the charge, scoring all of her team- and career-high 18 points after halftime. The Purple Eagles forced overtime with a bucket with 22 seconds remaining and withstood a pair of potential game-winners from Dominique Butler at the end of regulation and extra time. Nicole Thomas notched her second straight double-double with 17 points and a career-high 16 rebounds, while Butler tallied 13 points and a career high tying-eight steals.

**Game 3** — A 22-6 run by Ohio over the final 5:48 of the first half turned a four-point game into a 44-24 deficit as Cleveland State fell in Athens by an 87-64 score. The Bobcats shot 53.3 percent from the floor while limiting the Vikings to just a 34.4 percent mark. Stephaine Crosley tallied 12 points and six boards while Nicole Thomas added nine points and a team-high 11 rebounds. Ohio's Lauren Kohn went 10-for-14 from the floor, 4-for-6 from three-point and 6-for-8 from the line en route to a game-high 30 points.

**Game 4** — Cleveland State rallied from a six-point halftime deficit to pull out a 70-65 victory over Colgate. The Vikings offset an 18-rebound deficit by converting 24 Raider turnovers into 28 points, while committing just 12 miscues themselves. CSU trailed for the first 14 minutes of the second half before going ahead 59-57 on a Chenara Wilson jumper at the 5:56 mark. Angel Roque sealed the win with a pair of free throws with 13 seconds remaining. Nicole Thomas led the Vikings with 17 points and seven rebounds, while Brittany Korth added 14 points and four assists.

**Game 5** — Cleveland State played solid defense, but could not overcome a massive deficit at the free throw line as the Vikings fell, 62-52, at Long Island in the first game of the Turkey Classic. The Vikings shot just 38.0 percent from the field (19-50), but held LIU to an even lower 34.7 percent effort (17-49) in addition to grabbing a slight edge on the boards (37-33). The difference in the game however, proved to be at the free throw line, where the Blackbirds were 25-for-30, while CSU was just 10-for-12. Jessica Roque paced the Vikings with 17 points, while Natalie Miller added 14 points and seven boards.

**Game 6** — Cleveland State ran out of gas after charging back from a 10-point halftime deficit as the Vikings dropped a n 81-68 decision to the College of Charleston in the consolation game of the LIU Turkey Classic. The Vikings knotted the score just a little over five minutes into the second half, only to go through a four-minute dry spell that let the Cougars open back up a double-digit advantage. Jessica Roque led CSU with a career-high 25 points and five three-pointers, while Robyn Hoying added 10 points.

**Game 7** — CSU overcame a poor shooting night with its best defensive effort in nearly three years as the Vikings defeated Buffalo, 55-47. CSU used a 10-0 burst in the first half while holding the Bulls to just one field goal over the game's final six minutes as the Vikings closed with a 13-5 run after the contest was tied for the 10th time at 42-42. Stephaine Crosley paced CSU with 13 points and five rebounds, while Nicole Thomas added eight points and six rebounds. Jessica Roque's three-pointer with 6:11 remaining, not only gave the Vikings the lead for good, but pulled them within one game of the NCAA record for consecutive contests with a three.

**Game 8** — Toledo shot 52.7 percent from the floor en route to a 76-61 victory over Cleveland State. The Vikings endured an eight-minute stretch in the first half without a field goal that allowed the Rockets to open up a 25-5 lead. CSU began the second half with an 8-0 burst that trimmed the deficit to 11 (43-32), but could get no closer the rest of the way. The Vikings knocked down four three-pointers to match Louisville's NCAA record of 394 consecutive games with a triple. Dominique Butler and Jessica Roque paced the Vikings with 12 points each.

**Game 9** — CSU set an NCAA record with a three-pointer in its 395th straight game, but the Vikings could not overcome a 27 percent shooting effort in a 56-43 loss to St. Bonaventure. Tied 26-26 at the half, the teams traded baskets for the first five minutes of the second half, before the Bonnies went on an 11-1 run to open up a 13-point advantage (46-33) with 8:57 left to play. Brittany Korh led the Vikings with 13 points, including the record-setting three-pointer at the 2:34 mark of the first half. Kailey Klein chipped in with a career-high nine points and three rebounds.

**Game 10** — Western Michigan jumped out to a 30-10 lead eight minutes into the game and was never seriously challenged en route to a 93-79 victory over Cleveland State. The Broncos enjoyed large advantages in made free throws (29-13) and points off of turnovers (32-12), while Carrie Moore lived up to her billing as the nation's leading scorer with a game-high 30 points. Kailey Klein paced the Vikings with a career-high 26 points, while Stephanie Youdath tallied her first double-double with career-bests of 14 points and 15 rebounds.

**Game 11** — Akron's Sarah Tokodi hit a runner with 3.3 second remaining to propel the Zips to a 61-59 victory. The shot overshadowed a stunning comeback by the Vikings in the game's final minute. Trailing 59-52 with 52 seconds remaining, Dominique Butler proceeded to rattle off seven points and a pair of steals in a 33-second span to knot the score at 59-59 with 12 ticks left on the clock. CSU led 46-40 at the 13:11 mark, only to have Akron go on a 15-1 spurt over the next 7:10. Stephanie Youdath led all players with 16 points and three blocks, while Butler finished with 13 points and four steals.

**Game 12** — Leading by just five at halftime (41-36), Virginia erupted for 59 points in the second stanza to cruise to a 100-60 victory. The Cavaliers shot 69.2 percent from the floor (18-26) in the final 20 minutes, including a 7-for-11 performance from behind the arc (63.6 percent). Nicole Thomas notched her third double-double of the season with 12 points and 10 boards, while Dominique Butler added 14 points.

**Game 13** — Cleveland State overcame a dismal start en route to defeating IUPUI, 51-37, to snap a five-game losing streak. The Vikings scored only five points in the first 13 minutes of the game, but trailed just 10-5. CSU closed the half with a 14-4 burst and pulled away in the final 20 minutes as the Jaguars shot just 23.9 percent for the game. Jessica Roque tallied 12 points, seven rebounds and five assists for the Vikings, while Brittany Korth added 10 points and six boards. IUPUI's point total was the lowest by a CSU opponent since a 62-24 victory over Ashland on Feb. 8, 1983.

**Game 14** — Cleveland State couldn't buy a basket in the game's final 16 minutes in a 66-57 loss to Butler in the Horizon League opener for both schools. The Vikings opened the second half by making five of their first seven shots to open up a 39-31 advantage with 16:01 left to play. However, CSU would go just 2-for-28 the rest of the way en route to shooting just 26.5 percent for the game. The offensive struggles offset a season-low 10 turnovers and a 49-45 rebound advantage. Kailey Klein paced the Vikings with 21 points, seven rebounds and four steals, while Brittany Korth added 12 points.

**Game 15** — Making her first career start, Kailey Klein scored 16 of her 18 points in the final 20 minutes to help the Vikings rally from a 24-18 halftime deficit en route to pulling out a 60-47 victory over Wright State. CSU shot 43.3 percent in the second half (13-30), while limiting the Raiders to just an 8-for-28 effort (28.6 percent). Dominique Butler tallied 13 points, eight rebounds and three steals off of the bench, while Stephanie Youdath notched a career-high seven blocks — one shy of matching the school record.

**Game 16** — Cleveland State could not overcome a season-high 34 turnovers and a 12-minute field goal drought in the second half in a 72-46 loss at UIC. The Vikings went just 4-for-19 in the final 20 minutes as the Flames built on a 33-23 halftime lead. Jessica Roque finished with 10 points to lead CSU, while Stephanie Youdath added eight points and seven rebounds. UIC's LaShonda Grant led all players with a season-high 26 points on the strength of five three-pointers.

**Game 17** — Cleveland State put together its most complete performance of the year in an 80-57 win at Loyola. The Vikings shot a season-high 54.8 percent, while committing a season-low 10 turnovers. CSU made its first six shots and 9-of-11 to open up a 19-6 lead early on and a 40-23 bulge at the half. Loyola briefly cut the lead to four at the 10:48 mark of the second half, but could get no closer. Nicole Thomas posted 22 points and 11 rebounds for her fourth double-double, while Chenara Wilson and Dominique Butler tallied 18 and 17 points, respectively.

**Game 18** — Cleveland State let a nine-point halftime lead slip away in a 64-61 loss to Detroit. The Vikings shot just 9-for-26 in the second half (34.6 percent), while committing 23 turnovers. CSU had a chance to tie the game, but missed a lay-up with six seconds remaining and the Titans hit one-of-two from the free throw line to provide the final margin. Kailey Klein led the Vikings with 16 points, while Nicole Thomas (12P, 12R) and Chenara Wilson (12P, 10R) both tallied double-doubles.

**Game 19** — League-leading UW-Green Bay earned its 11th consecutive victory with an 82-39 victory over Cleveland State. The Phoenix shot 59.3 percent from the field (32-54), including a 10-for-17 mark from three-point (58.8 percent), while limiting the Vikings to a 12-for-47 effort (25.5 percent). Jessica Roque knocked down four three-pointers en route to a game-high 13 points, while Chenara Wilson added 11 points.

**Game 20** — Cleveland State could not overcome Traci Edwards' school-record 42-point effort as the Vikings fell at UW-Milwaukee, 75-68. Trailing by 13 with just under 15 minutes to play, Kailey Klein jump-started the Vikings with seven points in four minutes and Dominique Butler followed with 12 consecutive points to knot the game at 62-62. However, the Panthers hit a couple of key threes down the stretch to ward off the comeback attempt. Both teams shot 44 percent from the field, while the Vikings held a 38-34 advantage on the boards. Klein finished with 22 points, while Butler tallied 18 points, nine rebounds and four steals.

**Game 21** — Cleveland State was done in by a sloppy and sluggish first half in a 65-55 loss at Youngstown State. CSU committed 17 turnovers while going just 4-for-20 (20.0 percent) in the opening 20 minutes. YSU took advantage of a prolonged scoreless stretch by the Vikings (8:22) to turn a slim 9-6 lead into a 24-6 bulge with 5:35 remaining, eventually taking a 35-15 margin into the locker room. Brittany Korth led the Vikings with 11 points, five rebounds and four steals off of the bench, while Chenara Wilson added 11 points and seven boards.

**Game 22** — Another slow start proved to be Cleveland State's undoing in a 74-61 loss to Loyola. The Vikings went 7-for-28 (7-28) from the floor in the opening stanza en route to falling behind 31-17 at the break. CSU could get no closer than 10 as the Ramblers made two-thirds (14-21) of their shots in the second half. Loyola shot 50 percent for the game (28-56), while limiting the Vikings to a 21-for-56 effort (37.5 percent). Kailey Klein paced CSU with a game-high 23 points, going 10-for-14 from the charity stripe.

**Game 23** — UIC used a 13-0 run spanning halftime to seize control en route to a 68-54 victory. Cleveland State went 0-12 in the contest from three-point, ending its NCAA record 408-game streak with at least one triple that dated back to Dec. 17, 1992. The Vikings led 17-11 with 7:24 remaining in the first half, but would not score again until the 18:56 mark of the second half, when they were already trailing 24-17. Kailey Klein once again led CSU with a game-highs of 22 points and seven rebounds, while Natalie Miller chipped in 15 points.

**Game 24** — Kailey Klein's school freshman record 33 points propelled Cleveland State to a 77-74 victory at Detroit. Klein went 10-for-17 from the field, 4-for-7 from three-point and 9-for-12 from the line, adding eight rebounds and four assists. The Vikings erased an eight-point first half deficit to knot the score at halftime, 35-35. CSU pushed ahead by eight only to have the Titans rally to tie the score at 64-64 with 4:44 remaining. However, Klein (six points) and Dominique Butler (four) combined to score 10 points in the final 2:43 to pull out the win. Butler finished with 14 points, while Brittany Korth added 12.
