#### Coastal Carolina In Season Openers

Coastal Carolina is 3-4 in season openers, including a 2-3 record when opening the season on the road.

The Chanticleers won their first three season openers, including the program's first-ever contest — a 21-14 victory at home versus Newberry on Sept. 6, 2003. Coastal also claimed season-opening wins at Morehead State (28-7) in 2004 and at Elon (17-10) in 2005.

Since 2006, Coastal has dropped four straight season openers, including a 23-20 home loss to Elon in 2006, a 23-18 road loss at Delaware State in 2007, a 66-10 road loss to 222nd-ranked Penn State in 2008 and an 18-0 road loss to Kent State in 2009.

#### Coastal Picked 3rd in Big South Preseason Poll

The Big South coaches and media members have picked Coastal Carolina to finish third in the preseason poll, while David Duran, Quinton Davis, Josh Norman and Danny Bonifas were named to the preseason all-conference team.

The Chanticleers return 60 lettermen and 22 starters from last season. Big South co-champions from 2009, Liberty and Stony Brook, were picked ahead of the Chanticleers with the Flames edging the Sea Wolves for the top spot. Rounding out the preseason picks include Charleston Southern fourth (who Coastal hosts Nov. 20 for the regular-season finale), Gardner-Webb fifth, VMI sixth and Presbyterian seventh.

Duran makes the preseason All-Big South team after earning first team all-league honors in 2009. The junior led the conference tight ends in both receptions (19) and receiving yards (273), while ranking second on the team in both. Davis ranked eighth in the Big South in sacks, helping the Chants pace the conference, as well as

producing seven tackles for loss. **Norman** is coming off a banner season, earning All-America and first team All-Big South honors. The junior set a conference record with eight interceptions in 2009, ranking third in the nation in the category. **Bonifas**, a senior leader, had served primarily as the team's snapper for extra points/field goals through his career, but stepped in last season after an injury to handle both the long and short snapping duties.

## Preseason Honors

In addition to **David Duran**, **Quinton Davis**, **Josh Norman** and **Danny Bonifas** being named preseason All-Big South by the league's coaches and media, there were several other honors bestowed upon the Chants this preseason.

- **David Duran (Jr., TE):** after being a first team All-Big South pick in 2009, Duran was named 2010 preseason first team All-Big South by the league's coaches/media as well as Phil Steele's Magazine.

- **Tim Franklin (Jr., OG):** named 2010 preseason second team All-Big South by Phil Steele's Magazine.

- **Marcus Lott (Jr., S):** made the move from corner to safety in the preseason, but was still listed as 2010 preseason first team All-Big South in Phil Steele's Magazine.

- **Josh Norman (Jr., CB):** after a record-setting 2009 where he was named All-American, Norman was named preseason second team All-American and first team All-Big South by Phil Steele's Magazine, as well as being tabbed preseason All-Big South by the league's coaches/media.

- **Desmond Steward (Jr., LB):** after being a second team All-Big South pick in 2009, Steward was a 2010 preseason first team All-Big South pick by Phil Steele's Magazine.

- **Chris Walls (Sr., LB):** named 2010 preseason second team All-Big South by Phil Steele's Magazine.



## The Best Secondary in the FCS?

Coastal Carolina returns three of its four defensive backs from 2009, including All-American Josh Norman at corner and preseason all-league picks Marcus Lott and Dominique Davenport.

Norman, a preseason All-American, was listed on The Sports Network's Top 10 FCS defensive backs list this preseason. He shattered the league record and tied for second in the nation in interceptions with eight. (He ranked third in interceptions per game nationally at 0.73 per game.) Norman also led the league with 15 pass breakups and tied for eighth nationally at 1.36 per contest. In addition, he led the team with two blocked kicks.

Lott was a standout corner last season, but made the move to safety this season. He had two picks, tying for 12th in the Big South in interceptions (0.18/game). Lott helped the Chants' defense rank 15th nationally and second in the Big South in pass defense, allowing just 160.55 yards per game. In addition to his two picks, had five pass breakups to rank eighth.

Davenport, who was coming off an injury-riddled 2008, finished third on the team with 56 tackles and 20th in the Big South (5.0/game) in 2009. He also ranked eighth in the conference in tackles among defensive backs. Davenport picked off three passes, ranking second on the team, fourth-tied in the league (0.27/game) and 87th in the nation.

The final spot in the four-man backfield will be filled by one of three players, including Tarvorris Jolly, Tre Henderson and Dontavious Johnson. Jolly, who began his career at North Carolina, is in his second and final year with the Chants. He played in 10 game sin 2009, getting 15 stops and a pick. Henderson played in all 11 games as a redshirt freshman in 2009, mostly seeing action on the special teams. Johnson played in five games as a redshirt freshman at Hofstra in 2009.

**Young, But Experienced**

Other than the offensive skill positions and the specialist, Coastal Carolina does feature many seniors. In fact, minus those two groups, Dominique Davenport (S), Chris Walls (LB) and Seth Smalls (LG) are the only seniors listed as starters.

Of the 11 players listed on the depth chart at wide receiver, running back and quarterback, six are seniors. Coastal lost All-American fullback Tommy Fraser and his team-best 671 rushing yards, but returns the next five top rushers from 2009. Among the specialist, placekicker Josh Durham and punter Ben Erdman are both seniors as is long snapper Danny Bonifas.

That is not to say that Coastal Carolina is not experienced on offense. Junior TE David Duran was a first team All-Big South pick last season, junior RG Tim Franklin and junior RT Bryan Brooks started all 11 games last season. Redshirt freshman Jamey Cheatwood, who has secured the starting left tackle spot, is the only player on offense with no experience, while sophomore starting center Pat Williams played in six games in 2009.

On defense, where Coastal returns 14 of its top 17 tacklers from 2009, three sophomores and a junior are listed up front, including preseason All-Big South Quinton Davis and Hofstra transfers Johnny Hartsfield and Chris Thomas. Joining the senior Walls on the linebacking corps are junior Desmond Steward, who led the Chants in tackles in 2009 and was a second team all-league pick, and sophomore Andrae Jacobs, who played in all 11 games last season.

**The Hofstra Trio**

Hofstra dropped its football program after the 2009 season, allowing those players to transfer to any school and play immediately. Coastal Carolina picked up three of those players and all three are figuring prominently.

Defensive tackle Johnny Hartsfield, listed as the starting defensive tackle, came to Coastal in January and was with the team this spring. Chris Thomas and Dontavious Johnson came after the spring semester ended. Thomas turned in an impressive pre-season camp and has earned the starting spot at defensive end, opposite preseason All-Big South pick Quinton Davis. Johnson too has performed well in camp and is one of three battling for the open spot at corner back.

**Keeping O'Neal Healthy**

Senior running back Eric O'Neal has not been able to showcase his talent, battling injuries throughout his career. In fact, he missed most of the final five games of 2009. O'Neal's last surgery required his ligament to be screwed to his bone, which has proven to be successful to date.

Despite his limited time, and Coastal's young history, O'Neal still ranks sixth on the school's all-time rushing list (1,107 yards).

**Allen Returns Home**

Saturday will be a home game for one Chanticleer as true freshman running back Jeff Allen returns to his hometown of Morgantown. A product of Morgantown HS, Allen was a second team All-State selection at defensive line in 2009 and helped the Mohigans to the state playoffs.

**Childers Makes Move to TE**

Junior Jamie Childers sent 2009 sharing time at quarterback, completing 27-of-53 passes for 289 yards and three TDs. He added 163 rushing yards — fourth-best on the team — with three rushing TDS — second-best on the squad.

With transfer quarterback Aramis Hillary coming from South Carolina, the backlog at QB behind third-year starter Zach MacDowall left some talented players on the sideline.

"Any coaches' job is to put the best players on the field," head coach David Bennett said. "As a staff, we looked and saw a big, fast, talented kid standing on the sideline a lot so we asked Jamie to move to tight end. He causes a lot of match-up problems due to his size and speed and will really benefit our other talented tight end David Duran."

Childers had an excellent camp at tight end, causing problems for Coastal's talented defensive backfield. However, do not be surprised if Childers still does not see some snaps at quarterback this season.

## What is a Chanticleer?

A Chanticleer (SHON-ti-cleer) gives Coastal Carolina University one of the most unique nicknames in all of sports. Chanticleer comes from Chaucer's Canterbury Tales and came to the University when it was a member of the University of South Carolina system from 1954-93.

A Chanticleer is a rooster who rules the barnyard with cunning and wit. His competitiveness never wanes as he battles to the end, using his brains to come out on top every time.

## MacDowall Seizes Starting Role for Senior Season

Coastal Carolina has basically only had two starting quarterbacks since the programs' inception in 2003. Current Miami Dolphin Tyler Thigpen manned the reigns from 2003-06. Now, senior Zach MacDowall will be entering his third year as the starter (2008, '09 and '10). While he was the starter in '09, MacDowall sharing playing time with Jamie Childers last season due to some inconsistent play at times, throwing 11 picks versus just nine touchdowns. His first season (2008) was better, throwing just six INTs with 16 TDs.

However, all of that is behind him and he has entered 2010 with a new attitude and determination. The transformation started in the summer when he conducted workouts with the receivers, even getting extra work when asked by his teammates. MacDowall also came into camp in the best shape of his career. He had a productive camp, throwing just one interception in five scrimmages.

Despite his struggles at times in 2009, MacDowall still owns the school career record for completion percentage (58.4) and passing efficiency (132.9 rating).

In addition to he and Thigpen owning the CCU passing record book, MacDowall also ranks 10th on the school's career rushing list (401 yards) and sixth-tied on the school's all-time rushing TD list (8).

## New Coaches But Lots of Continuity

Coastal Carolina has three new coaches, although one of those is in his second stint with the Chants. New to the staff is assistant head coach/special team coordinator/wide receivers coach Maurice Drayton, offensive line coach Patrick Covington and defensive tackles coach Jamel Smith. While this is Covington's first year as assistant coach at Coastal, the former All-American from Furman was an assistant strength and conditioning coach with the program in 2006.

Coach Bennett started the program in 2002 and offensive coordinator Kevin Brown and defensive coordinator Curtis Walker have been by his side the whole time, as have running backs coach Keith James and safeties coach Drew Watson. Cornerbacks coach Mike Castellano joined the staff for its first year of competition (2003) and is in his eighth year with the program. Defensive Ends coach Grant Cain is in his sixth year with the program — fourth as a full-time staff member.

In addition to the coaching years together, Brown, Walker, Cain and Castellano played at Catawba while Bennett was there as an assistant and head coach.

While Gary Smallen is "just" in his fifth year in the program, Bennett was an assistant under then head coach Smallen at Newberry from 1988-90.

Watson played for both Smallen and Bennett at Newberry and coached one year with Bennett on the Newberry staff.

## FBS Flavor

Coastal Carolina has several players who have been a part of FBS programs, including redshirt freshman kicker Grant Clayton (Louisiana-Monroe), junior tight end David Duran (Michigan State), sophomore quarterback Aramis Hillary (South Carolina), senior corner back Tarvorris Jolly (North Carolina), senior quarterback Zach MacDowall (Wake Forest) and sophomore offensive guard Kenneth Page (Clemson).

## Tough Way to Open; Home Slate No Picnic

Coastal Carolina will open the season playing four of its first six on the road, including games at FBS #24 West Virginia and FCS #6 Richmond. After opening at West Virginia, the Chants will travel to Towson and, in addition to Richmond on the road, will play at Presbyterian.

Coastal's home games in September include six-time FCS national champion Georgia Southern and Delaware State.

The good news is Coastal will close the season playing three of its final five at home. However, two of those games will be with 2009 co-Big South champions Stony Brook and Liberty along with rival Charleston Southern.

## Keeping It Real

Coastal Carolina plays in Brooks Stadium with Benton Field being natural grass. Prior to last season, Coastal Carolina only had played 10 games on artificial turf. However, last year, the Chants played on artificial turf in four of its six road games.

For its history, Coastal has played 65 of its 79 games on natural grass. The Chanticleers are 46-19 (70.8) on natural grass and 30-10 (.750) at home thanks to a 5-0 mark in Brooks Stadium in 2009.

When playing on artificial surfaces, Coastal Carolina is just 4-10 in its seven years.

## A Good Start is Good

In seven seasons, Coastal Carolina is 32-5 (.865) when scoring first in a game.

Going a step further, Coastal Carolina is 37-7 (.841) all-time when leading at the half. Coastal is 21-3 when leading at the half at home and 16-4 when doing so on the road.

## Get to 200 and Win is a Near Lock

In seven seasons, Coastal Carolina is 33-4 (.892) when rushing for 200 or more yards in a game. The only losses have been in the 2005 season finale versus Charleston Southern and losses in 2008 to Georgia Southern, Presbyterian and Liberty.
